

FROM THE DIASPORA

Louis: I am happy to share with you that I have successfully defended my thesis and

completed my Ph.D. studies on February 21. At this moment, I express my sincere gratitude to all the members of the Delhi Jesuit Province and the JST Jesuit Community (Berkeley) for their love and support. I extend my sincere thanks to Fr. Varkey Perekkatt, who missioned me to the Jesuit School of Theology of Santa Clara University for studies, and Fr. Sebastian Jeerakassery, who has continually supported me since 2016. I am grateful to Fr. Timothy P. Kesicki, the President of the Jesuit Conference of the United States and Canada, for providing financial assistance for the successful completion of my studies. I was hoping to move to Pune, the place of my next mission, on March 20, but due to the current crisis and lockdown, I could not fly as scheduled. Since, in a short period, COVID-19 has rapidly spread in many states of the US, the State of California has declared "Stay at Home Order" for entire California from March through May 3, 2020. In Berkeley, we are entirely shelter-in-place. I am looking forward to returning to India as soon as it is safe to fly. Together with you, I pray for an end to the COVID-19 that is gripping our world today.

Tony: I spent part of March at Prothrapur Parish assisting them. Conducted a meeting for 20 *pracharaks* (catechists) of that parish. We discussed some of the major issues affecting our parish especially family life and how to resolve them through concrete action plan. At Port Blair I had recollection for MC sisters, AC sisters and Diocesan priests of South Andaman. Our CRI recollection which was planned was cancelled. Our Emeritus Bishop Alex was supposed to come here for Chrism Mass

and visitation of diocese which was cancelled due to Covid-19. I was planning to accompany him and visit all the parishes of Andaman before leaving this place but this plan too didn't materialize. At Andaman & Nicobar we don't have any cases of Covid-19 as yet but the tourists who had visited till mid-March could leave behind traces of this virus. From Mid-March all precautions are taken and no tourists are allowed to enter the island. No petrol and diesel are provided for private vehicles including transport vehicles. As a result, there is no movement of vehicles on the road, just like self-imposed curfew. Only essential stores like groceries, fish and meat and dairy products are allowed to keep open. Since all the flights and ships are cancelled we are totally cut off from the rest of the world. After 70 years we are having this sort of situation here. All our church services are totally banned and church gate is locked as per Diocesan Administrator's instruction. No daily Mass in neighbouring convents. We are having severe water crisis for last few days. Even tankers are not allowed to operate since diesel is not supplied to them. I have lot of quiet time for relaxation, reflection, prayer and prepare some programs. Hope and pray this situation will improve soon.

Sahayog: The month of March began with a surprise visit by General Fr. Arturo Sosa, our Regional Assistants and Fr. Pierre Balanjre from Rome. On their way from Kathmandu to Kohima Region they missed their flight in Delhi on March 1; so they decided to stay overnight in Navjivan-Sahayog. After a good night's rest they departed immediately after breakfast on the next day. Many Jesuits residing in Delhi got opportunity to interact with the dignitaries. Thank you, Fr. General, for your unscheduled visit and blessings on us. On the 8th, the community celebrated the birthday of K.P. George with Mass in the evening and a delicious dinner organized by our Minister **Fr. Arun Panackal**. Within eight days followed another birthday celebration, **Fr. Sebastian Jeera's** 50th birthday on the ides of March. The Delhi Province members who came for the Leadership Training also joined the

birthday celebrations besides the usual crowd. **Fr. John Chathanatt** returned from Kerala after his research tour on 16th. He brought a lot of goodies from God's own country and the community relished them. Everyone in the community strictly observed the 'Janata Curfew' declared by Prime Minister on 22nd and appreciated with clapping those who serve silently the people in our country. **Fr. Alex Chinnapparaj** was admitted in Fortis Hospital on 23rd as he had developed acute chest congestion. After almost a week of treatment in the hospital, he is back in the community and now is resting and recuperating. **Fr. Ed Daly** is still in Jivodaya Hospital. His health has improved considerably, but not enough to be back at Sahayog. **Fr. Xavier Ignatius** who was out in Kohima to carry out Revisor's work managed to return home by the last flight from Guwahati. In spite of all the difficulties, our Minister Arun manages to feed the community and keep the members in good cheer.

NRC: In NRC March began with a retreat by an SMI Sister guided by **Fr. K.P. George** while Missionaries for Christ (Couples and Singles for Christ) ended their retreat on the same day. Then from 2nd to 6th the Global Disciples had their training program in which 45 people attended. Although another program by EFICOR was to follow but due to the disturbed atmosphere it had to be cancelled. However, the North Zone Leadership Training Program was successfully carried out without any apprehension from 16th. This program was conducted by Fr. George Sebastian of XLRI, Jhajjar and Fr. Sebastian Jeera. There were twenty-eight participants from the six NZ Units. Before serious problems popped up all were able to get back to their own places. Two SMI Sisters under the guidance of Fr. T.K. John made their retreat from 22nd. From 24th on Navjivan Renewal Centre was shut down in view of the rising pandemic. Announcements about future programs will be made at appropriate time.

Before the commencement of Holi holidays the Principal **Fr. Dominic** had a meeting with the teachers wherein a number of observations were shared and new decisions regarding leave and other things were informed. Parents of wards, who were detained in Stds 9 and 11, continue to press for the promotion of their wards with the principal even though their marks were never near the neighbourhood of the qualifying percentage. In the pervading ambience of COVID-19 the State Govt declared Section 144 on 19th thus bringing

to a grinding halt the Board exams and the evaluation of Board papers. All the repair and whitewashing works came to a standstill. As soon as the Janta Curfew culminated at 9 pm on 23rd news reached that from midnight on the State would enter into Lockdown till March 31, thus becoming the first state to announce a full scale lockdown in the country. As the prevailing situation wasn't conducive for a tete-a-tete between parents and teachers on PTM day the result was posted on the website of the school. With the announcement of the nationwide Lockdown by Prime Minister from March 25 to April 14 all grandiose plans of reopening the school on March 29 fizzled out. To make best use of the confinement the teachers are engaged into online tutoring of the students. A Std 10 student qualified after many rounds of tests to be among 5 students pan India to participate in the Hanoi International Maths Olympiad. In the recently announced Kishore Vigyaanik Protsahan Yojana results two Std 12 Xavierites secured 22nd and 278th ranks pan India.

Parish: March, dedicated to St. Joseph, began with a series of programmes starting with the diocesan level Marriage Preparation Course. Three "to be couples" from the parish participated in the programme from 8th to 10th. The Parish Women's Commission made sure that the International Women's Day was celebrated with due preparation on 8th with specially prepared Prayer of the Faithful and refreshments for all after the Mass. The plan to visit the families had to be cancelled because of the Covid-19 alert. Bishop interacted with the Jesuit Community while enjoying a good lunch. All the other programmes of the month were affected by the Corona virus alert. Hindi retreat on 20th had to be cancelled. Celebration of the feast of St. Joseph had to be limited to the minimum with the celebration inside the Church. From then on we are in the grip of the restrictions of Corona alert commencing with Janata curfew on 22nd to this day praying earnestly for the *achche din* to revisit us.
