Peace of Christ!



PHILOSOPHICALLY SPEAKING

On 18 March in honour of second year scholastics an 'Alvida' day was organized, which included the Eucharistic Celebration, a cultural evening and a farewell meal. NOVITIATE LIFE

► AUTOMATION 2020

Xavier Technical Institute (XTI) Sevasi organised the 4th National Automobile Competition 'Automation 2020' on 13-14 February on its campus. This was in collaboration with Tata Motors Ltd and SKIP (Skills for Progress -a national organisation of private technical schools) Tata Motors runs a one-year automobile training programme known as LEAP (Learn Earn and Progress) in which the students study theory in an Institute and practical training in automobile workshops. In 2013 a pilot project for the same was conducted at XTI Sevasi, LEAP is now conducted in sixty Institutes across the country.



Thirty-five LEAP Institutes participated in 'Automation 2020'; four students from each institute took part in different competitions related to the automobile industry. Fifty heads of SKIP institutes and top officials from Tata Motors were also present for the closing ceremony. Little Flower Institute from Kerala won the overall championship. Several XTI trainees also won prizes. Participants and visitors were impressed by the meticulous

planning, the hospitality, the logistical arrangements, the trophies and mementoes designed and produced by XTI and also with our green campus. 'Automation 2020' was on all parameters the best Autotech Fest so far. (Sch. Allwin)



WOMEN'S DAY

International Women's Day cum 'Lok Utsav' 2020 was celebrated with great fervor by St Xavier's Social Service Society (SXSSS) at the Diamond Jubilee Hall of St Xavier's High School, Loyola Hall on the theme 'Towards Equality through Union'. Over one thousand two hundred women and men from ninety slum settlements participated in the celebrations.



The dignitaries included Ms. Swetal Alpesh Patel (the Chief Guest), Ms. Mini Joseph (Assistant Police Commissioner, Women Cell, and Ahmedabad), Ms. Rupali Prabhat Vijh (entrepreneur running a Pre School called Kids Paradise) and Shree Ghanshamdas Khatvani (Proprietor of Dipti Brand) **Fr Isaac Rumao**, Director, SXSSS was also on the dais. In their addresses, the speakers praised the women for their immense contribution in the



building of family, society and nation at large. Emphasis was also given to the importance of women playing a more proactive role in society and the need to be more united in fighting against all kinds of oppression. The cultural programs gave the women an opportunity to exhibit their talents before a large audience. The programme ended with a sumptuous meal served to all. DESCRIPTION CITIZENSHIP CONCERNS

Since mid-December, **Fr Cedric Prakash** has been conducting awareness programmes and seminars all over the country on the Citizenship Amendment Act (CAA), the National Population Register (NPR) and the National Register of Citizens (NRC). He has been conducting these programmes at the invitation of the local Diocese, CRI or civil society groups. The programmes included those in the Archdiocese of Gandhinagar, the Diocese of Ahmedabad and two (in Baroda and Netrang) for the Diocese of Baroda. Fr Cedric was also invited to address the National Convention of the Forum of Religious in Justice and Peace (22-24 February, Varanasi) and the National Convention of the Indian Catholic Press Association (29 February, New Delhi)

WELLINION CURRENT REALITIES

A one day workshop for about eighty participants, on the current realities in the country, was organized for village leaders, school teachers and catechists in Pimpri on 14 March. The workshop was a joint venture of 'Shakti' (Songhad) and Catholic Church Pimpri. The workshop aimed to prepare the people on the factuality of the CAA, NPR and the NRC and their impact on tribal and the marginalized sections of society. The resource persons Mr. Rameshbhai and Mr. Rajeshbhai from Shakti explained the detailed understanding of the CAA and the registers and how they would affect the tribals negatively. During the discussions both women and men raised pertinent



issues with regard to tribal society. In the action plan, the participants felt that they should enlighten other villagers who could not participate in the workshop and that they would take up the issue with other stake holders in the area. This may help to garner support at the macro level to protest the CAA, NPR and NRC. (Fr. Robert Christi SJ)

>> IN-SERVICE TRAINING

A two-days (17-18 March) training workshop for the staff of Sangath, Modasa was held. The contents of the workshop included self-development, social management and the importance of teamwork.

Among the other topics covered were women empowerment, farmer's mandal, youth skill training and women cooperative the staff benefited from the workshop and gained confidence in realizing the task or work entrusted to each one individually and in team as a whole. At the end the director **Fr. Arulanandam** and the staff planned the activities for the coming year.



>> VERMICULTURE TRAINING AT MODASA

Sangath conducts vermiculture training for farmers regularly. Through these trainings the farmers are realizing the utility of organic manure in crop cultivation. Interested farmers and others are welcome to Sangath, Modasa for on-site training on how to prepare organic manure in a simpler way. The training is free and accommodation will be provided.
