

VISIT OF FR. GEORGE




Fr. George Mutholil, S.J., the newly appointed **General Counsellor and Regional Assistant of South Asia** in place of Fr. Lisbert D' Souza, S.J., visited Patna Province from 14 to 23 July 2019. He began the visitation on 15 July with Manthan, Khagaul followed by Gyanodaya, Khaspur and XTTI Campus.. In the days that followed, he went on to visit our communities in Bettiah, Gaunaha, Ratanpurwa, and Muzaffarpur. He visited St. Michael's, Kurji Parish, Sanjivan Niwas and FMSK on 18 July. The next three days, he visited our communities in Ara, Sasaram, Aurangabad, Bodhgaya and Barbigha. Returning to St. Xavier's, Patna on 21 July, he interacted with the Jesuits of Patna at St. Xavier's in the evening. This was followed by a Eucharist and a fellowship meal. He met the Jesuits at St. Xavier's, Patna on the following day and in the evening, he met the Archbishop of Patna. 

DIASPORA

Berkeley, USA: The Spring semester was quite hectic. I had some additional courses to complete to fulfill the degree requirements. By the end of May all the students at Jesuit School of Theology had little time to sleep because of various deadlines for the submission of papers. As I began the summer vacation in June, I could breathe a sigh of relief from the entire academic buzz. As a part of one of my courses, I got a chance to go for the Camino Ignatiano (Ignatian pilgrimage) to Spain. The pilgrimage started on 17 June from Loyola and ended on 02 July in Rome. We were 20 of us—10 Jesuits and 10 lay persons. It was a great spiritual experience to walk the roads which Ignatius walked as a pilgrim. We had to do a lot of walking. We walked more than 190 kms on foot during the summer heat, rain, steep mountains, blisters and so on along the way. We visited most of the places like Arantzazu, Montserrat, Verdu, Javier, Manresa, Barcelona, and La Storta which had left on Ignatius a lasting impression in his spiritual transformation.



The whole journey provided a chance to relive and reimagine the life of Ignatius thus enriching my knowledge of the spirituality of our Society as well as adding flesh and blood to my theoretical learning. In Rome, **Fr. Joseph Puthenkulam** was generous to take me around to show me some important churches and monuments associated with our Jesuit history. He also cooked a sumptuous dinner at the end in the Biblicum for some scholastics and priests from India which added some more flavor and taste to my visit to Rome. After a long travel, I am back in Berkeley preparing for the Fall semester next month.
