FROM AROUND THE PROVINCE

BHURKUNDA

Pathalgadi (erection of stone slate depicting family tree etc.) is a traditional custom of the Munda tribes. Such was the occasion with Fr. Primus Kerketta in his village to be ceremoniously attended by him and other priests of the area. Fr. Primus was adequately accompanied by his local team and as the report goes, it was very successful and was peacefully accomplished. Patratu lake resort and Patratu valley have attracted visitors and tourists of all hues and of far and wide. Some take this occasion to spend sometime to pray in our church and to dine at our place and visit the eye catching

sights. In recent visitors' line were Apostolic Carmel (AC) and CMCs. ACs of Hazaribag with their entire staff came in 2' buses and CMCs came with their teachers and Fr. Christopher Kujur. Brand new 'mandars (drums) and Missionary morrhas (reclining chairs made of bamboos and plastic straps) were much awaited pride possessions of our community, though devoid of legendary cane type. Iron tablets are a must in schools for class 6 and above classes, distributed freely by the Government. Classes 5, 6, and 7 will appear their board final examination for the first time this month. Other board exams passed out

favorably and well. Our students have excelled in Silverzone International Olympiads in Science, Maths, General Knowledge and International Talent Hunt winning 5 gold, 2 Silver and One bronze medals. Contest's language base is English and our students are of hindi medium, and yet have braved and some cracked it well. Bravo.

BOKARO ST. XAVIER'S

February marked the countdown to **Fr. Tom Keogh's** permanent return to Australia. There were innumerable farewells: different sections of the school, alumni, religious communities and other well-wishers. On the one hand it felt good for **Tom** to know how much people loved and appreciated him and valued his contribution to their lives as well as to the school; on the other hand, all these farewells were strenuous. **Fr. Arun Minj** took great care to ensure that **Tom** was healthy and strong enough to undertake the long journey to Melbourne. On the eve of his departure, **Frs. Sushil Lakra** and **Bob Slattery** drove down to Bokaro to say good bye to him. On March 2nd **Fr. PJ James** and Mr. Anjan Sinha accompanied him to Ranchi airport. **Sch. Arockia Sasi Kumar** accompanied **Tom** all the way to the international terminal of Kolkata airport. **Tom** spoke to **Arun** both from Singapore, where he stayed till March 7th and upon arrival in Melbourne.

The more painful farewell was that of **Fr. Geoffrey Meagher**, who part of the school was for 14 years since 1991. On March 5th the staff organised a prayer service in gratitude for the former Principal (1997-2005) who was recognised by them as 'a noble person', 'most spiritual', 'most sensitive to each person's problems,' 'always positive' and someone who 'faced problems in a smiling way.' The next day was declared a school holiday. A good number of the staff and some alumni and friends were present at the funeral in Sitagarha.

On February 13, after five years, **Fr. James** had the relief of bringing to a closure the case filed against him by ABVP in Hazaribag. **Fr. Provincial** set his visitation the next day to be able to bid good bye to **Fr. Tom** before the JCSA meeting at Kathmandu. **Fr. Arun** used the extended Mahashivratri weekend to teach the novices at Sitagarha.

The school exams began on February 10th lasted about two weeks. The ICSE/ISC exams started on February 4. Meanwhile, classes started on 4th March for Std X and XII. On the 8th Sr. Manjula FCC left Bokaro after serving as Vice Principal of the Social Service School for about five months. The Hindi section reopened on the 11th. Orientation session for the parents of the new Preparatory class was held on 29 February. The first day of Prep class will be on March 18. All others begin their new academic session on 19th. A new Enterprise Resource Planning [ERP] system for better management of the school has been set up and training sessions for the staff are under way. Parents also will be invited to join the sessions after the school reopens. **Fr. Arun** and two other teachers are confined in the evaluation centre for ISC English in the school.

HAZARIBAG, ARRUPE NIWAS

The team members of the Assistancy Development Office who visited Arrupe suggested that complete information be given on the non-formal schools that the Province is running so that a source of funding may possibly be found. Therefore **Fr. Bob** and his assistant Sushil Bhengra have started visiting these schools. The five schools run by the Tarwa unit have been visited and 16 schools run by Prerena. There are still at least 20 more schools run by Prerena to be visited and then schools in other areas. These two hour schools are trying to make up for the minimum knowledge the students get in government or private run schools, and

the children who are suffering are from very poor families, usually bhuiyas.

Fr. Geoff Meagher's elder brother, Robert, and two of his sisters, Helen and Michelle stayed with us after being with **Geoff** in the Calcutta hospital till his death. They were at the funeral, and left on 9th March.

Two nieces of the late **Fr. Lou Lachal**, Kathleen Marcelle Maclurcan and Mary Brabenec are visiting the old stamping of their uncle. Mary and Kathleen have for many years been key supporters of the Hazaribag Jesuits mainly through their work annually for the Maytime Fair.

Fr. Gyan went to Daltonganj and Mahuadanr for Budget meetings and came with gratitude for all the works our men are doing.

Fr. Francis went to Pune with **Frs. John Tirkey, Roshan kerketta & Vinod Toppo** to attend a programme on Advance Finance management. He also went to Bokaro, Patki and PTEC Sitagarha for the budget meetings. Every Saturday and Sunday he is busy with his degree classes at Radha Govind university Ramgharh.

We deeply mourn the demise of **Fr. Geoff** who was a very energetic and lively member of the province. We were all surprised, when he was diagnosed with an advanced cancer.

We are very grateful to the doctors and sisters of Holy Family Koderma for taking care of **Fr. Geoff** during his stay at the hospital. Many thanks to **Fr. Tony Herbert** and **Fr. The Christianised tradition was warmly accepted by the villagers making it a big annual celebration. So far in the entire prefecture, only the Chomnaom community celebrates this festivity.

We had workshop on "assimilation and implementation of **Universal Apostolic Planning** for two days from 19th to 20th of February in Battambang and 19 February was the anniversary of the promulgation of the UAPs confirmed by Pope Francis. 26 Jesuit missionaries, 13 collaborators and a few staff participated in it. **Fr. Tony, sj** the president of Jesuit Conference of Asia Pacific emphasised on the assimilation and implementation of

UAPs, call for audacity, personally, communally and institutionally, in what ways should the UAPs be mainstreamed in our life and Jesuit Mission in Cambodia. I went to the parish for the ash Wednesday, evening mass. Day by day heat is increasing in Cambodia; we are enjoying eating ripe mangoes and other seasonal fruits in the communities.
