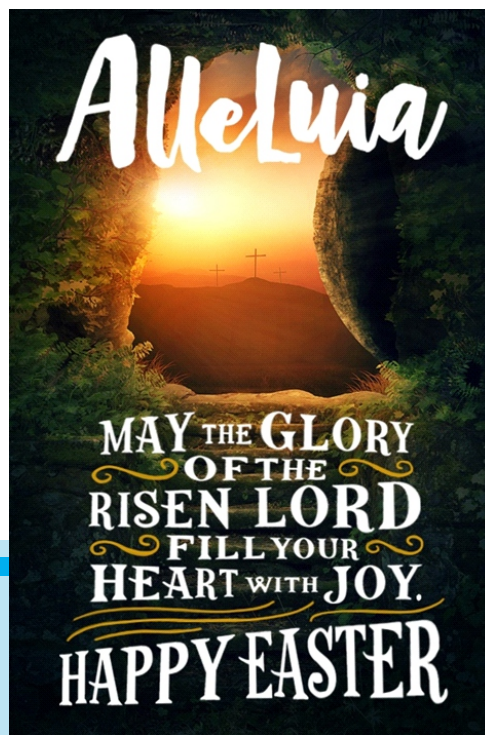
Living our Song of Joy!

JCSA ONLINE – FEB 22 TO 26

As the Jesuit Conference of South Asia, how do we understand the present situation in South Asia, and how do we respond to the needs of our people? Questions such as these were deliberated upon when the Jesuit major superiors of South Asia met online from Feb. 22 to 26. The meeting was well planned by the President of JCSA, Fr Stany D'Souza and his Socius, Fr Shajumon.

In his address to the JCSA members on Day 1, Fr General raised a number of pertinent points: the Covid-19 pandemic as an opportunity for compassion (Fr General recounted with sorrow that around 150 Jesuits have already died of Covid-19); authoritarianism of a particular ideology, shrinking space for the marginalized in South Asia in general and FCRA norms, the New Education Policy, the incarceration of Fr Stan and Fr Alphonse Aind; the need for discussion and discernment before starting new colleges and universities; the universality of our vocation and the oneness of the Society of Jesus, i.e., persons and finances all belong to one body as ours is not a federation; Ignatian year as an opportunity to see all things in Christ; the renewal of the statutes of poverty—a long process is required because an intense interior movement is needed with regard



to the vow of poverty; nurturing a culture of vocation promotion; the role of the Conference President; and intellectual formation—Ours should be able to deeply reflect on the world and the Church.

During these five days, the provincials and regional superiors reflected and discussed about our way of proceeding; the state of South Asia (with inputs from Dr Brinelle D'Souza on the shrinking space for pluralism, dissent and justice in South Asia), Jesuit conference structures (Solidarity in Formation, Vocation Promotion, Solidarity Fund, etc.); new ways (MAIN, Ignatian Year preparations and leadership program), and reorientation respectively. While the discussions were fruitful and engaging, many felt that meeting face-to-face brought about greater bonding and personal sharing among provincials.

VATICAN RADIO

A RADIO THAT HAS NOURISHED PEOPLE'S HEARTS FOR 90 YEARS

On 12 February, Vatican Radio celebrates its 90th anniversary. This work, set up by Guglielmo Marconi at the request of Pope Pius XI, had been entrusted to the Jesuits. Since 2015, with the creation of the Dicastery for Communications, Vatican Radio has been integrated into all of the Vatican's communication media.

Despite what might have been thought, the radio continues to play an important role all over the world. It is synonymous with proximity and reaches large audiences who do not always have access to other media. In this context, Vatican Radio pursues its fundamental objective of a

public service that seeks to nourish hope and to make available the voice of the Pope while offering an interpretation of current events in the light of the Gospel. It has done so again, and despite the obstacles, throughout this long worldwide ordeal of the Covid-19 pandemic.

RV offers programmes in 41 languages and broadcasts on various platforms, including the internet. In Rome, some 20 Jesuits collaborate daily in the radio production of RV.

MYANMAR

STRONG INSTITUTIONAL SUPPORT FOR THE JESUITS IN MYANMAR

On 19 March, Father General's decree announced the new “status” for what was until now the “Myanmar Mission”. This “unit” was under the responsibility of JCAP (Jesuit Conference of Asia-Pacific). Myanmar (MYN) is now considered a



Dependent Region of the Philippine Province (PHI). The new Region has 38 Jesuits, 28 of whom are scholastics. A youthful wind is undoubtedly blowing there!

At first glance, one might think that this is just an administrative change. But for the Jesuits working in this Asian country, which is under extreme political tension, it is a sign of confidence given to them by Father General and by their companions in the Philippines. After a serious process of discernment, the major superiors of Myanmar, the Philippines and JCAP suggested this change of status to the General, who recognised the authenticity of the steps taken in both Myanmar and the Philippines.

In the letter he wrote to his fellow Jesuit confreres on the eve of the change, Fr Mark Raper, the superior of the Mission, wrote: “Let us pray together that this initiative of accompaniment and collaboration will, as Fr General suggests, bring new energy to mission in both the Province and the Region. Fr General is aware of the tensions faced by the people of Myanmar in our dual crises of the global pandemic and the coup d'état, and he follows closely the current events, joining his prayer in solidarity with ours.”

As for the Provincial of the Philippines, Fr Primitivo Viray, he also published a letter for the occasion. He wrote: “Against the backdrop of escalating tensions and calls for authentic peace and justice in Myanmar, the (Philippine) Province lends its voice and helping hand to sisters and brothers there in their aspirations for a hope-filled future founded on the dignity of each human being and respect for human rights.”

Let us continue to accompany in prayer the people of Myanmar and the Jesuits of that Region.

BR. VICTOR CAMPOS: SERVICE WITH LOVE AND HUMILITY (1933 to 2021)

Bro Victor Campos was reunited with his Master and Lord on 10 March 2021. He had lived his life to serve Christ and His people, and he was ready to go home to God. On 11 March, his Jesuit brothers, relatives, and friends bid him farewell during the Requiem Mass at Pedro Arrupe Institute Chapel, Raia, and thereafter, he was buried at Our Lady of Snows Cemetery in Raia, surrounded by his Jesuit confreres, his relatives, and his friends.

Born in Bombay on 08 May 1933, Victor growing up. His mother often fell ill and to a healthier climate. This affected place to place, until he was admitted as a he completed his SSC. He heard this and so he wrote to Fr Peter Mendonca, Margao, asking him permission to join Br Campos joined the Society in the year complete his Novitiate; he joined the vineyard as a Brother. He returned to training, and then began school and under Fr Meyrelles, the Principal at that



had many challenges as he was asked to move away from Bombay Victor's schooling as they moved from boarder at St Britto's, Mapusa, where inner voice calling him to serve God who was at Loyola High School, the Society of Jesus.

1956 and was sent to Portugal to Jesuits desiring to serve in the Lord's Goa in 1960, was sent to Bombay for office work at St Britto HS, Mapusa, time.

Due to personal challenges, Br Campos left the Jesuit Order after 18 years. Frs Braz Faleiro and Ubaldo D'Sa helped him to begin a new life and he started a small business of cold drinks and snacks on the ground floor of Jesuit House, Panjim. In 1999, he heard that a priest, Fr Condillac, had rejoined the Society, and it struck him that he really wanted to be a religious again. After due process by Fr Patrick de Mello, then Provincial of the Goa Jesuits, Br. Campos took his First Vows on 2 February 2002.

He was a simple man, open to corrections, polite in his ways and very obliging and ready to serve. He was ready to go wherever needed. He did work assigned to him with diligence and faithful regularity. He had wonderful talents as a tailor, and continued to work at his old sewing machine at Pedro Arrupe Institute (PAI) Raia, even though his legs hurt. His willingness to extend himself in service to the community brought about good will and a spirit of cooperation in the community.

He was a man of prayer, deeply rooted in Christ; he demonstrated spiritual depth and familiarity with God. His standard of living was simple and exemplary; he showed no desire for worldly things. He showed great availability to whatever was asked of him. A man ready to serve, he rendered his loving services at Xavier Training College, Desur, St Paul's High School, Belagavi, and Pedro Arrupe Institute, Raia. He is fondly remembered by all who benefitted from his presence. He contributed his talents in whatever way he could to the well-being of the community.

Towards the latter part of his life, he spent most of his time in prayer and helped out in doing odd jobs to make his small contribution to the community. Those who came to PAI-Raia for the daily Eucharistic celebration remember Br Campos for his gentleness and dedication to keeping everything ready much in advance. For Br Campos, it was his way of showing his great love for the Society and the Church.
