Ignatian Year 2021-22 Update

On 16 March 2021, Fr. Vincent Sekhar convened the IGY 21-22 team of MDU Province to give an update on the preparations for the Ignatian Year celebrations at the JCSA and Global levels. After initial clarifications on joint publications, Fr. Sekhar outlined the Inaugural Day celebrations at three different times and in two different (online and offline) modes. The morning programme on 20 May 2021 will comprise of an introduction, prayer, and the Provincial's talk, all online; at mid-day, we will have the Holy Mass, online; and evening will be left to the communities to have their celebrations. The institutions can spend time together in the offline mode during the day. By the end of April, an initial reminder, placing of boards and placards, etc. will have to be done in all our institutions giving awareness of the Ignatian Year to all. A Novena to Saint Ignatius will precede the Inaugural Day.

On March 20, Fr. Vincent Sekhar was invited by Fr. Provincial to address the Superiors/Team Leaders/Commission Coordinators' meeting on the Province IGY plans, online. Joint printing and publications, joint gatherings of the Ignatian Family (IGFA), former Jesuits, and student communities, Province pilgrimage, a rough outline of the Inaugural Day celebration etc. were the highlights of Fr. Sekhar's presentation. The participants welcomed the plans. He was also glad to listen to the efforts made by the communities and institutions in presenting their Ignatian plans for the year. Further details on the Inaugural Day celebrations will be discussed by the team and communicated to all the communities in due course.

Superiors, Team Leaders & Coordinators meeting: March 20 & 21

The meeting of the Superiors, Team Leaders and Coordinators, which was planned to be held in Maduralaya, had to be held online because of the unexpected surge in COVID cases. Although the meeting was held online, everything went on smoothly as planned. The first session, with Fr. Thomas Alexander as the moderator and Fr. John Peter Arulanandam as the secretary, began with a prayer service conducted by Fr. Vincent Amalraj imploring the grace of God to see all things new in Christ.

Immediately after the prayer, Fr. Provincial explained the dynamics of the day highlighting the salient features of Fr. General's call to see all things new in Christ in our mission for the poorest of the

poor by promoting a culture of closeness with the Lord and His people. The Superiors, Team Leaders and Coordinators shared elaborately their creative and concrete action plans for celebrating the Ignatian Year in a meaningful way. Fr. Provincial appreciated the participants and invited them to document all the Jubilee Year activities. Encouraging the Commissions to come up with creative ways of collaboration for the celebration, he sought the insights of the members present for enriching the celebration. Indeed, there were many insightful ideas and suggestions such as keeping the poor at the centre of our celebration, using it to promote more vocations to the Society and revive IGFA (Ignatian Family) and CLC (Christian Life Communities) and making it an inclusive celebration in the Province. The forenoon session ended with Examen in common led by Br. P. Arockiasamy. In the afternoon, Fr. Vincent Sekhar, the Convener of the IGY, appreciated and thanked the Superiors, Team Leaders and Coordinators for the many creative ideas and suggestions that emerged in the communities and commissions and he presented the plan of IGY Committee for the celebration at the Province level.

In the evening, we had an important session on Salary Revision moderated by Fr. L. R. Michaelraj with Fr. Francis Xavier Arockiadass as the secretary. This session was made more informative, relevant and useful by the clear and concise presentations by Br. Edward Brunoraj, Frs. Jeyaseelan T. Barnabas, and Mariadoss Siluvaimuthu. There were clarifications and suggestions from the floor. The first day came to a close with a very moving prayer service by Fr. S. Aruldoss.

The second day was only for the Superiors and Team Leaders and it started with a beautiful prayer service by Fr. Arul Oli, seeking the grace of God to interiorly rejoice with Ignatius. With Fr. Henry Jerome moderating the session and Fr. Xavier Raj as the secretary, the first session was on Grievance Cell Document vis-à-vis Province Protocol on Protection and other statutory committees in our institutions. Frs. Thomas Alexander and Joseph P. Xavier made the presentations with Fr. Philomin Raj as the observer. In the final session, Fr. Provincial spoke elaborately on issues, challenges and future directions in South Asia based on the talk of Fr. General. He invited the entire Province to make use of the IGY as an opportune moment for conversion both individually and as a Province. The meeting came to a close with a detailed Examen conducted by Fr. Xavier Antony.

UPDATE ON FR. STAN SWAMY'S CASE

Though normally the NIA courts are not lenient in granting bail, the incomparable legal fight put up by our lawyers, intensive national and international level campaigns and incessant prayers raised our optimism to unprecedented heights. The rejection of bail confirms that the government still feels threatened by human rights defenders and dissenting intellectuals of our country.



After the refusal of bail, there was a meeting of our lawyers in Mumbai – Adv. Sharif, Adv. Kritiga (trial court/NIA court lawyers) and Adv. Mihir Desai with the participation of Fr. A. Joseph Xavier. Mr. Mihir Desai, our High Court advocate stated that he would be preparing the bail petition, appeal against the order of the Sessions

Court, in which he would also include the medical bail matter. He might also file a writ challenging Section 43D(5) of UAPA (norms to be followed while granting bail in UAPA cases) and also questioning the legality of frontal organizations but the problem is that the High Court has many holidays in April and it will be on vacation in May. Adv. Mihir Desai will try his best to file the bail petition soon so that the petition is heard before the vacation.

On March 20 and 23, one of our lawyers spoke with Fr. Stan on legal counsel call. Stan was briefed about steps being taken before the bail order as well as after the bail was rejected.

There was a meeting of Nodal Jesuits and Core Team members of Stan Campaign on April 7. It was decided to have varied celebrations on Fr. Stan Swamy's 84th birthday on April 26. Some of the suggestions made are: Sending birthday greeting cards to Fr. Stan, online community prayer, webinar, book with a collection of articles published on Stan, Happy Birthday sung in different languages, programmes with the children of prisoners, organizing blood donation, standing outside the institutions with birthday posters, birthday Twitter eruption etc.

Dindigul: Beschi Illam

Despite the surge in the number of COVID positive cases in Tamil Nadu, with restricted entry and exit, we are keeping Beschi campus and its senior Jesuits safe. As a sole exception, Fr. Joseph Srinivasan, ended up in the COVID ward of St. Joseph Hospital, Dindigul, on April 8. On the same day, Fr. Paul Dominic of AND Province, who was directing a retreat in Tiruchi, was first brought to Dindigul and owing to the severity of infection was referred to Vadamalayan Hospital, Madurai, where he has been put on Intravenous (IV) drips and Oxygen support.

Fr. Dhanaraj directed a month-long Ignatian retreat from 1 to 28 February in Coimbatore for the seminarians hailing from eight northern dioceses of Tamil Nadu. He preached a similar retreat of a shorter duration (4 to 26 March) at Vadipatti for 30 seminarians of eight southern dioceses. Fr. Bastian is directing the Spiritual Exercises for three sisters of the Congregation of the Sacred Heart, Tuticorin. They are preparing themselves for their final vows. Frs. Antony Inigo and Dhanaraj are preaching the Spiritual

Exercises to three sisters of the same Congregation who are preparing themselves for their silver jubilee celebrations. They all go to Fr. I. M. Joseph for their personal chat.

Fr. Michael Panimaya Raj conducted a three-day workshop (*Introduction to the Spiritual Exercises and Discernment - A Way of Life*) from 1 to 3 March for the seminarians of Christ Hall, Karumathur.

Our five second-year novices have completed their month-long Socio-Pastoral Experiment from 5 March to 5 April at Harur and Oriyur. From February 22 to March 23, our nine first-year novices had their work experiment at Palamalai to have a deeper understanding of the Lord, as Creator and Labourer, and of the life and struggles of the farm labourers. Since the novices are not yet permitted to go out for weekend ministries, the nine first years had their Holy Week services/ministry within the Beschi campus itself.

Léveil Day Celebration – Sarugani

The 48th death anniversary of the Servant of God Louis Marie Léveil was celebrated in a colourful way at Sarugani on 21 March 2021. The memory of the heavenly birth of the Servant of God is observed every year at the place where his mortal remains are preserved.

Very Rev. A. Packianathan, the Administrator of Sivagangai Diocese, presided over the solemn Eucharist at 6 p.m. Almost 50 priests concelebrated the Mass. Among them, there were diocesan priests of Sivagangai, religious priests from various Congregations and also many priests from other dioceses of Tamil Nadu. Nearly 100 religious brothers and nuns participated in the Eucharistic celebration.





The devotees of the Servant of God who participated in the celebration were more than 5,000 from all over Tamil Nadu.

After the Eucharistic celebration, a recorded speech of Fr. Léveil in French was played in the public address system. In 1970, Sr. Mary of Jesus, his niece, had visited Sarugani to attend the celebration of his Sacerdotal Golden Jubilee. At that time, she recorded this speech of Fr. Léveil to his family members in an audio recorder. The audio file was obtained from Fr. Léveil's relatives in France during the diocesan process. The Tamil translation of the speech was read out by the Vice Postulator.

Fr. S. James Anthuvan Dass explained the ongoing Roman phase of the beatification process of the Servant of God. He announced the appointments of 'Relator' and 'External Collaborator" by the Congregation for the Causes of Saints, Rome. A poetry book on *Léveil Léveil Vaagai Pookkal* written by Mr. Kalaiaruvi Rasi Xavier was released by the Administrator. The Mizo and Italian translations of the book *Merkathiya Suriyan* by Fr. Yagoo Y. Sandanam were presented by the Administrator. A new song on Léveil, with lyrics by Fr. Yagoo and music by Fr. R. Wenishraj was also released in YouTube.

Following the Eucharistic celebration, the portrait of the Servant of God, was taken in a procession through the streets of Sarugani where the Servant of God went around for 17 years. The people of Sarugani prepared a common meal which they served as *Annathanam* to more than 6,000 people of all religions.

The celebration of Léveil Day was organised well by Fr. C. A. James, Parish Priest of Sarugani, with the collaboration of the parishioners and various committees.

Talk of Civil War? Ominous Chatter in Myanmar

As our readers may be updated in the media about the conditions of Myanmar, let me give some news and views.

There is a big talk about a civil war between a 'federal army' and the military here. The federal army is supposed to be comprised of youth and ethnic armed groups. There are nearly 10 of them that seem to be supporting this idea. Of course, any such move would result in enormous suffering to the ordinary people, whose life is devastatingly impacted by both COVID and the army coup. Food insecurity looms large as jobs are increasingly hard to come by. Prices have gone up by 30 percent. This man-made disaster has aggravated the suffering inflicted on people by COVID. The economy has taken a visceral wound, with banks not functioning normally and rationing/reducing the amount one could withdraw in a day. Long queues are the norm, people waiting from early morning to withdraw an amount under the fixed ceiling. Midnight knocks, arbitrary arrests and torture and detention continue as the army enforces its will in the streets. Protestors continue their efforts to organize but there has been a decline in protests because of the ruthless violence let loose in the streets. Catholic Church continues to support the peaceful ways of protesting. Cardinal Bo in his strong Easter message, urged the army to respect people's wish for democracy and appealed to the protestors to seek only peaceful solutions. Pope Francis has made his fourth appeal expressing his support for peace and dialogue in Myanmar and deeply appreciating the youth protestors for continuing to protest peacefully. As things fall apart, we all pray that better sense prevails and a little thought is given to millions of poor whose every meal is becoming a big challenge. The talk of civil war is preposterous since the army is known to love conflict and managed to hold its fort despite 70 years of conflict. But the youth, many of whose companions have been tortured and killed in the streets, see that there are not many non-violent options left. The uncertainty continues to impact our work. Food distribution is a possibility while other works have to be put on hold. The army has revived the old surveillance system by which every ward will have its own agents who keep everything under control. In the past, we did negotiate those spaces once things settled down but things are still unclear. Please continue to pray for this country.

Strong Institutional Support for the Jesuits in Myanmar

On 19 March 2021, Father General's decree announced the new "status" for what was until now the "Myanmar Mission". This "unit" was under the responsibility of JCAP (Jesuit Conference of Asia-Pacific). Myanmar (MYN) is now considered a Dependent Region of the Philippine Province (PHI). The new Region has 38 Jesuits, 28 of whom are scholastics. A youthful wind is undoubtedly blowing there!

At first glance, one might think that this is just an administrative change. But for the Jesuits working in this Asian country, which is under extreme political tension, it is a sign of confidence given to them by Father General and by their companions in the Philippines. After a serious process of discernment, the major superiors of Myanmar, the Philippines and JCAP suggested this change of status to the General,

who recognized the authenticity of the steps taken in both Myanmar and the Philippines.

In the letter he wrote to his fellow Jesuit confreres on the eve of the change, Fr. Mark Raper, the Superior of the Mission, wrote: "Let us pray together that this initiative of accompaniment and collaboration will, as Fr. General suggests, bring new energy to mission in both the Province and the Region. Fr. General is aware of the tensions faced by the people of Myanmar in our dual crises of the global pandemic and the coup d'état, and he follows closely the current events, joining his prayer in solidarity with ours."

As for the Provincial of the Philippines, Fr. Primitivo Viray, he also published a letter for the occasion. He wrote: "Against the backdrop of escalating tensions and calls for authentic peace and justice in Myanmar, the (Philippine) Province lends its voice and helping hand to sisters and brothers there in their aspirations for a hope-filled future founded on the dignity of each human being and respect for human rights."

Let us continue to accompany in prayer the people of Myanmar and the Jesuits of that Region.



FR. ARUL JEEVAN, S.J. 1947 - 2021



Fr. Arul Jeevan was born the seventh of nine children to Mr. Jeevanandam and Mrs. Masilla Mary on 19 November 1947 at Rajakembiram in the Diocese of Sivagangai. He finished his undergraduate studies in Mathematics at Sivagangai before joining the Novitiate

at Beschi, Dindigul, in 1970. I was his novitiate companion and we were one of the largest batches with 19 Novices in the first year. Although he was the senior-most in our batch, he accepted himself as he was with all his strengths and limitations. After his theological studies in Jnana Deepa, Pune, he was ordained a Priest on 26 April 1981.

Soon after his Ordination, he served as Pastor for a year at Sindalacherry (1981) and another year at Oriyur (1982). Then, for more than two decades, he served as Teacher/ Asst. Head Master in our schools [St. Xavier's, Thoothukudi (1984–1989), St. Mary's, Madurai (1989–1992), St. Xavier's, Palayamkottai (1994–1999) and St. Joseph's, Tiruchi (1999–2006)]. As Acting Head Master of St. Mary's, Dindigul (1992–1994), he came up with SUPAM (Student Uplift Animation Movement), an innovative income generation project to help poor students.

On the occasion of Fr. Arul Jeevan completing 50 years of devoted service in the Society of Jesus, Rev. Fr. Arturo Sosa, our Superior General, expressed his appreciation in the following words: "During those years you involved yourself not merely in teaching but also in character formation of students with your added interest in counselling. Your alumni carry good memories of your accompaniment. Your insistence on discipline among staff and students and your promotion of the Ignatian pedagogical paradigm with its focus on accompanying the learners in their growth and development have left indelible footprints in the Secondary Education sector of Madurai Province."

After he retired from service in Secondary Education, Fr. Arul Jeevan served as Librarian of Jnana Deepa, Pune, from 2006 to 2011. During those years, he also got involved in weekend pastoral and youth ministries in the neighbouring parishes.

Fr. Arul Jeevan's much-appreciated work in Pune came to an abrupt halt when illness struck and he was brought to St. Mary's, Madurai. He had to undergo craniotomy twice and in 2016, because of adrenal cancer, he underwent also right nephrectomy. In 2018, he moved to Beschi Illam, Dindigul, where despite the care given by the infirmary team of PDDM Sisters, attendants and co-workers, serious health problems continued but as Fr. General mentions in his Golden Jubilee letter he "not only accepted medical options but also dared to accept God's invitation to live a life of pain and suffering."

In 2019—'20, he experienced chronic back pain. Scans and other investigations were done and he was diagnosed with colon cancer and he willingly underwent colectomy at Vadamalayan Hospital, Madurai, in October 2020 followed by chemotherapy. He responded well to the treatment but became so weak that he was not able to carry on with the physical exercises prescribed by the surgeons; he was bedridden and, in March 2021, he gradually developed imbalance and respiratory problems. He was admitted in St. Joseph Hospital, Dindigul, on 18 March 2021 and breathed his last at 5.30 a.m. on 20 March 2021. It was a peaceful death.

Fr. Danis Ponniah, Provincial, presided over the funeral Mass on March 23 with restricted attendance of Jesuits and family members. In my homily, as Beschi Superior and Fr. Arul Jeevan's Novitiate companion, I spoke comparing his suffering to the patient suffering of Job in the Bible and how the Risen Lord Jesus relieved him from all pain, suffering and illness and called him to Himself and has given him a share in His glory. All the family members returned home praising God and thanking the Society of Jesus and Beschi community for the care given to Fr. Arul Jeevan over the years, and his meaningful and solemn obsequies despite COVID-related restrictions.

May God grant unto Fr. Arul Jeevan eternal rest and let perpetual light shine upon him, and may he rest in peace.
