

CONGRATULATIONS

Bihar School Examination Board (BSEB) published the results of Intermediate Course (+2) on 26 March 2021 and of Matric on 5 April 2021. Our Schools affiliated to BSEB and Social Action Centres conducting coaching classes for students of Dalit caste communities through long duration Residential Programmes for Classes IX to XII have come out with flying colours, including a student of CH School, Ara securing Vth rank in the State

Congratulations to our Principals / Headmasters, school / social centre administrative teams, teaching and support staff, parents / guardians of our students, and above all our lovely students, for the outstanding performance.

Of the 1,089 Matric students (Boys–736 and Girls–353), 971 (Boys-666 and Girls-305) have secured I Division and 106 (Boys-65 and Girls-41) have secured II Division. Of the 340 Intermediate (+2) students (174 Boys and 166 Girls), 274 (130 Boys and 144 Girls) have secured I Division and 54 (37 Boys and 17 Girls) have secured II Division. LOCAL REPORTS

Kaiserganj: Blessing and Inauguration of Jesuit Residence. March 13, 2021, was an important day of our mission at Kaiserganj in Uttar Pradesh. It was three days prior to the centenary (16 March 1921 – 16 March 2021) of the arrival of the American Jesuits in Patna. The blessing and inauguration of the Jesuit Residence (Centenary Building!) at Kaiserganj took place in the presence of a good number of Fathers, Sisters and well-

wishers on Saturday, March 13, 2021 at 11.30 a.m. Rt. Rev. Gerald John Mathias, Bishop of Lucknow, blessed the Residence and Fr. Donald Miranda, SJ, Provincial of Patna, inaugurated it. At the beginning of the programme, Fr. Joseph Sebastian, SJ, Rector of St. Xavier's, Patna, welcomed everyone present for the blessing and inauguration. After the inauguration, the Bishop and the Provincial blessed all the rooms and surroundings.



A felicitation Programme was organised after the blessing and inauguration. The Bishop in his message thanked the Jesuits for beginning the mission at Kaiserganj and exhorted them to develop the mission as early as possible. He further asked the Jesuit Community to extend their mission to neighbouring Catholic communities and others through various spiritual and social ministries. He expressed his hope that our presence here will not only bring new dimensions to various ministries here, but also in the diocese. Fr. Provincial thanked the Bishop of Lucknow, the clergy, religious and others for the support and encouragement that we have received here and assured that the mission will continue and we will do everything within our capacity to develop the mission. He explained the historical background and evolution of our mission at Kaiserganj. He informed all present that the Jesuits have prepared a detailed plan for developing this mission and it will be done in a phased manner in the coming years.

We felicitated the dignitaries and others who helped us in our mission. The presence of Fr. Edward Mendonca, SJ, the explorer of this mission, along with members of our community from Patna and other Jesuits from Patna, Lucknow and Allahabad added to our joy. We specially thanked Fr. Ronald D'Souza, former VG and current estate manager of the diocese, Fr. Simon Fernandez for their continued support and help. Engineer Mr. S.K. Gupta, Contractor, Mr. S.K. Verma and all others who helped and contributed to the construction of the building and to the mission here, were also felicitated. The Jesuits acknowledged the warm and cordial welcome they received from the bishop and the diocese and specially from the clergy and religious of Ghaghara zone. The diocesan clergy and religious of Ghaghara zone were present with many other well-wishers. We further remembered and thanked all the Patna Jesuits who have helped the mission at Kaiserganj to make it a reality and made this day possible. Fr. Sudeep Chacko, SJ proposed the vote of thanks and everyone joined the fellowship meal thereafter. We are grateful to Fr. Christopher Kandulna, SJ, Novice Master, Fr. Nicholas Kulandai, SJ, Socius to the Novice Master, and all the novices for their support and help from June 2020 and specially the help rendered during the programme.

Fr. Rajesh Kant Prasad, SJ, joined the community on the same day and was warmly welcomed as we moved into the new residence in the evening. Fr. Rector presided over the thanksgiving Eucharist during which he recalled the blessings that we have received in our mission at Kiaserganj and surrendered to the Lord all the plans of our apostolate here. We were happy that Fr. Rector, along with other members of our community and Fr. Joe Pulickal, SJ, stayed with us for our first two days in the new residence.

Dungdung guided our parishioners through a day of prayer, confession and preparation for celebrating the Pascal mysteries of the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Our Lord. In spite of the apprehensions due to the second wave of Corona pandemic, since we are a small parish located in the midst of a thinly populated Railway Colony on the outskirt of Patna, our Holy Week celebrations took place with traditional fervor and good gathering of the faithful, but adhering to the pandemic protocols such as wearing of masks. SOCIETY AROUND THE GLOBE

Myanmar (MYN) is a Dependent Region of the Philippine Province (PHI): On 19 March, Father General's decree announced the new "status" for what was until now the "Myanmar Mission". This "unit" was under the responsibility of JCAP (Jesuit Conference of Asia-Pacific). Myanmar (MYN) is now considered a Dependent Region of the Philippine Province (PHI). The new Region has 38 Jesuits, 28 of whom are scholastics. A youthful wind is undoubtedly blowing there!

At first glance, one might think that this is just an administrative change. But for the Jesuits working



in this Asian country, which is under extreme political tension, it is a sign of confidence given to them by Father General and by their companions in the Philippines. After a serious process of discernment, the major superiors of Myanmar, the Philippines and JCAP suggested this change of status to the General, who recognized the authenticity of the steps taken in both Myanmar and the Philippines.

In the letter he wrote to his fellow Jesuit confreres on the eve of the change, Fr Mark Raper, the superior of the Mission, wrote: "Let us pray together that this initiative of accompaniment and collaboration will, as Fr General suggests, bring new energy to mission in both the Province and the Region. Fr General is aware of the tensions faced by the people of Myanmar in our dual crises of the global pandemic and the coup d'état, and he follows closely the current events, joining his prayer in solidarity with ours."

As for the Provincial of the Philippines, Fr Primitivo Viray, he also published a letter for the occasion. He wrote: "Against the backdrop of escalating tensions and calls for authentic peace and justice in Myanmar, the (Philippine) Province lends its voice and helping hand to sisters and brothers there in their aspirations for a hope-filled future

founded on the dignity of each human being and respect for human rights."

Let us continue to accompany in prayer the people of Myanmar and the Jesuits of that Region.

Celebrating the new Southern Africa Province

(SAP): On 25 March 2021, a decree of Fr. Arturo Sosa, Superior General, came into effect, which said: "I unite the present Dependent Region of South Africa, the Province of Zimbabwe-Mozambique and the Zambia-Malawi Province. The new Province will be comprised of the territories of the Republic of South Africa, Namibia, Lesotho, Botswana, Swaziland, Zambia, Malawi, Mozambique and Zimbabwe." On this day, through a videos message, Fr. General addressed the Major Superiors: David Rowan, Chiedza Chimhanda and Leonard Chiti and their current 277 companions in Southern Africa.

It took nearly ten years of transition to erect this new Province and it took two generations of Generals and several major superiors, let alone the different commissions, task forces and committees; assemblies, conferences, consults, dialogues, meetings; colloquies and prayers at different levels and times, to come peacefully to this day of consolation.

The difficulties towards unification were faced prayerfully, proactively and creatively. The languages, especially Portuguese and English, were to be taught and learnt from the novitiate, common catalog be printed to enhance knowledge of one another and of their respective apostolates. All this helped to have transcended to good extent cultural, ethnic and historical differences. A bond of mutual knowledge dispelled fear of one another and of the unknown.

Asia Pacific – Jesuit Education Today: Discerning for a hope-filled future. The international gathering of Jesuit schools dubbed, II COLLOQUIUM JESEDU-Global2021, will be held as a purely online event from 28 June to 2 July. It replaces the II COLLOQUIUM JESEDU-Jogjakarta2020, originally intended last year. Centred on the theme, "The Global Jesuit Network of Schools: Discerning for a Hope-Filled Future", the virtual colloquium is expected to draw in some 500 participants from the six Jesuit conferences, the Secretariat for Education, and the International Commission on the Apostolate of Jesuit Education. They will take part in a mix of synchronous and asynchronous sessions.

The colloquium has been designed in the context of the ongoing discernment called for by the document, Jesuit Schools: A Living Tradition in the 21st Century. This year's event holds special significance as it is taking place during the Ignatian Year, particularly on the occasion of the 500th Anniversary of the Conversion of St Ignatius of Loyola. The organisers hope that the global education forum will serve as an invitation "to conversion — a change in our usual way of proceeding, and to join Ignatius in a pilgrimage that will hopefully continue transforming Jesuit education".

II COLLOQUIUM JESEDU-Global2021 will be hosted by the International Commission on the Apostolate of Jesuit Education (ICAJE). It is organised by the Jesuit Conference of Asia Pacific with the Steering Committee based in the Philippines, and with the support of the Secretariat for Education of the Society of Jesus and Educate Magis.
