

Diaconate ordination of Sch. Eliash in Rome

Amidst fears and uncertainties of pandemic Covid-19, there was a great joy at Gesù, the Mother Church of Society of Jesus, on June 27, when **Cardinal Michael Czerny**, ordained 20 Jesuits-two as priests and 18 as deacons, belonging to 15 nationalities. Our own **Sch. Eliash Sarkar**, who recently completed his theological studies at the Pontifical Gregorian University, was one of the ordained deacons.

In accordance with the norms laid down by the Italian Bishops' Conference, the ceremony was kept 'private' although thousands around the globe had the opportunity to join the celebration through live streaming. The Superior General, **Fr. Arturo Sosa**, graced the celebration along with 150 faithful and the Jesuits. Cardinal Czerny, who presided over the ordination for the first time, since his elevation as Cardinal, began his homily by extending a warm welcome to the families, friends and relatives who were taking part virtually in the ceremony through social media on tablet or smartphone, etc. He exhorted the ordinandis "to be heralds of the Gospel, ministers of reconciliation and of liberation in the world of today and tomorrow where everything seems to be constantly and rapidly changing."



Our province was well represented by **Frs. Xavier Jeyaraj, Ripon** and two Bangladeshi priests who represented the Bangladeshi Catholic community in Rome. A sumptuous fellowship meal was served immediately after the ceremony.

Deacon Eliash and Fr Ripon have returned to Bangladesh to take up their new missions respectively, while Fr. Xavier Jeyaraj will continue his universal mission of the Society at the General Curia in Rome.

Pradeep recount his own spiritual journey and apostolic insertion in Bangladesh in his mother tongue, Bengali. Everybody was moved listening to Fr. Arularaj. He emotionally recalled the distinctive way in which Jesus touched and journeyed with him throughout his life in the Society.

The entire event made us all feel proud to be Jesuits of Calcutta Province.

Raghabpur

The Lockdown and the devastating Cyclone Amphan have had a seismic impact on the Raghabpur Mission, compelling us to face our essential frailty and help to alleviate the suffering of our people. Basic pastoral services have been restored (Baptisms, Funerals, Marriages, Home visits), keeping all preventive measures. Many of our people are yearning and praying for the day when they will again receive the Body and Blood of Christ.

The School and College campus housed a considerable

number of people during the Cyclone. It was also used both as a Shelter and Relief Centre. Parents of our school children come for the mid-day meal distribution. The online classes have been resumed after the disruption of Amphan.

Relief work by our College, Parish, and the SVP, organized and shepherded by the Jesuit community, was able to reach out to 2,500 people. We also helped 100 Amphan-stricken, shattered houses of our College students to do the repair work.

The Raghabpur community bid a fond farewell to **Fr. Joseph Toppo** has returned to the community after his enforced 'lockdown' at home and is already at work in the school.

Udayani

Udayani Social Action Forum has resumed normal office work from June 8. The second phase of Amphan super Cyclone relief work is being continued at Ballygunge place for pavement dwellers and migrant workers. More than 100 affected families were given dry food kits consisting of 5 kg rice, 2 kg cereal flour, 1 kg pulse and 1 kg edible oil. The similar help was extended to 200 families in Bishnupur, in Pandua for 350 families and in Jamalpur block for 200 families in the month of June. The field coordinators and activists carried out all these work with a meticulous planning. **Fr. Anbu** visited Pandua, Jamalpur and Kalna blocks on the day of distribution and **Fr. John** was present at Bishnupur block.



Our women in villages continued to have Self-Help Group meetings regularly. An online session was conducted regarding awareness of COVID – 19 for all the activists and coordinators from the head office. Self Help Group federation meetings and monthly group meetings were also used for COVID - 19 awareness program in villages. From the Right to Food and Work Network, our women observed a day of moaning on June 1 in solidarity with the migrant labourers who lost their lives due to the lockdown havoc. They stood at the public places and crossroads with placards and banners to make their voice heard. Udayani women led from front a campaign to demand for 200 days work for all who were affected by the unplanned lockdown.



Udayani distributed tarpaulins to the victims of Super Cyclone Amphan in Kakdwip on July 10. This relief work was organized in collaboration with the Kakdwip police led by Sudip Singh. 212 families of Gobindapur village were helped. **Fr. Probal Gomes** helped Udayani greatly. **Fr. John,** director of Udayani and **Fr. Anbu,** Assistant Director handed over the relief materials to the villagers. In the month of July, Udayani conducted 2nd and 3rd module training for SHGs in Bishnupur block and Anger Management training for the activists and coordinators of Jamalpur, Pandua, Kalna-I and Kalna-II blocks to strengthen their SHGs federation. In the right to food and work network, Udayani gave an online training on Public Distribution System (PDS) to the Azad Foundation organization staff on July 14.

St. Xavier's College, Kolkata

On May 20, 2020, we probably witnessed the worst affected Cyclone in our lifetime in the South Bengal districts. Severe cyclone Amphan literally devastated vast areas of West Bengal namely Kolkata, North 24 Parganas, South 24 Parganas, Purba Medinipur, Pashcim Medinipur, Howrah, Hooghly, Nadia and Murshidabad districts. St. Xavier's College Calcutta Alumni Association came forward with "Gift A Roof" concept to help the Amphan Cyclone Victims and provided a financial support of Rs. 5,000 to each of the students and their family members in distress.

In order to strengthen the efforts of our honorable Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee, St. Xavier's College and the Jesuit Community donated Rs.10 Lakhs to West Bengal State Emergency Relief Fund of Government of West Bengal. St. Xavier's College Teaching and Non-teaching staff donated their One-Day Salary of the Month of May 2020 towards the above said relief fund.

St. Xavier's College Calcutta Alumni Association has adopted a Village for development and distributed relief



materials to the Villages under Kakdwip Police Station on June 16 and Khorimutha, Mollarchowk, Pukurberia on June 24. Dry Rations, Ready-to-Eat Food Materials, Sanitation items and tarpaulins were distributed to more than 1000 hungry and homeless families at Sundarban belt.

Honorable Chief Minister of West Bengal Ms. Mamata Banerjee, in her Letter of Appreciation to **Fr. Dominic Savio,** Principal of St. Xavier's College, applauded for the contributions of St. Xavier's College Fathers, Staff Members and the Alumni.

Due to Covid-19, the College is getting ready to begin the new academic year with online classes for all the students till everything gets normal. The end semester students will have their partial online exams in the form of assignments to complete their degree courses for the year 2020. Online applications are available in our website for the new Post Graduate students who wish to study in St. Xavier's College, Kolkata.

Microbiology department and SXCAA prepared a good amount of hand sanitizer for free distribution to the people of Kakdwip region. St. Xavier's has adopted a village in the area of Kakdwip - Namkhana zone to do developmental activities there. On July 24, we celebrated the birthday of **Fr. Dominic Savio**. The Alumni Association made it a grand celebration.

St. Xavier's College, Kolkata, Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) and Academic Council organized a National Webinar on "Pandemics and Natural Disasters: Understanding and Coping" on July 11-12. Keynote speakers were Fr. Dominic Savio, the Principal, Mr. Snehasis Sur, Senior Journalist and Alumnus St. Xavier's College, Kolkata and Dr. Bhaskar Barayan Chaudhuri, Consultant Clinical Microbiologist. The Post Graduate Department of Commerce organized a two day International Webinar on "Managing Business in a Post Covid-19 World: Changes, Challenges and Strategies" on July 18 - 19. The Department of Commerce lost Prof. (Dr.) Samir Kumar Lowbo due to a massive heart attack. An online memorial service for him was organized which was coordinated by Fr. JRS Collaboration with CB (Caritas Bangladesh)

Protection to Rohingya Refugee

CB-JRS partnership Multi-purpose Child and Adolescent Centers (MCAC) Project had its humble beginning in May 2020. MCAC Project will benefit directly 2,952 Rohingya children and indirectly their family members. This project is a continuation and upgradation of earlier CFS (Child Friendly Space) project. Issue of COVID 19 Preparedness and Preventive awareness & measures is inbuilt with all activities and results.

Because of COVID 19 in Rohingya Camp, activities and movements are restricted. As of July 22, 2020 the number of



confirmed COVID-19 cases in Rohingya Camp is 59. It took away 6 lives so far.

CB-JRS partnership MCAC Project has paved the way for JRS's greater involvement (e.g. monitoring the project, staying near the camp area, and taking part in child safe guarding policy and recruitment of staff).

JRS is waiting to welcome **Sch. Xavier Roton Boidyo**, in place of **Fr. Francis Dores**. MCAC regular staff informed JRS members that children are missing the loving company of JRS Fathers. **Fr. Jeyaraj** is fondly remembered by CB, MCAC (and CFS) staff, and the Rohingya community, especially the children.

Bishop Linus N Gomes had a minor fall in the room which caused a fracture in the left hip ball. He was taken to Dil Kush nursing home for a replacement of the hip ball. The surgery was done on July 3. Bishop returned to SXC Kolkata on July 7. The Physiotherapist comes on alternative days to give him the necessary physiotherapy. Bishop is so positive in spirit and so grateful in his responses. Though the process is slow, he will be able to walk with the help of a walker within a few weeks' time.

Fr. P.C. Mathew, due to low sodium level, for three days, he was room bound and was given medicine to increase the sodium level. He is back now after spending 8 days in the Park Clinic for tests and treatment. His mind is clear and sharp. His liver is more or less fine. He is not able to stand by himself and walk. He needs the help of the nurses and ayahs to stand up or take a few steps. He is currently lying in bed for most of the time.

Fr. Joeph D'Souza was brought to St Xavier's infirmary, following complaint of giddiness and lack of sleep. The tests seem to show 4 blockages in the arteries. He was in nursing home for a few days and was in the infirmary. Now he has returned to St. Lawrence and he will follow some medication, diet and exercises.

Fr. Korko after a month long rest and regular physiotherapy, his doctor has agreed to his going to Alternative Health Centre, Kalidanga for a month long advanced physiotherapy. He takes meals in the refectory. He is also busy giving online spiritual discourses or meditations to his disciples. He is ever ready to sing good Bhajans at the evening prayers to give a devotional flavour to our evening prayers.

Fr. Aloysius Carvalho's, 92nd Birthday was celebrated, together with **Fr. Peter Durairaj's** on June 19. He surprised the community with his amazing memory of events, places and names of Jesuits, scholastics, candidates, even students.

Fr. Augustine D'Souza reached St. Xavier's Kolkata

infirmary on July 24 for some medical checkups. It was found that he needs treatments for hernia and hydrocele.


