
Fr. GENERAL HAS APPOINTED

They also got their annual results. We completed the extension of the stage and the much needed repair of the Middle school building. With the unlock One hostel's work has resumed. Fr. P.O. Chacko came for an inspection. Provincial Fr. Santosh made a short visit to us. Br. Francis Mathias was another guest of the month. JAI president Mr. Devender Singh along with two of his friends visited us and had a short sharing with Saju about his ecological initiatives. Fr. Saju organised a week long seminar for the staff on "21st Century Jesuit Schools, 10 Identifiers of Jesuit Schools". These days Francis and

Kishore are giving English course to staff. On alternative weeks Middle and High School staff are attending it. We are expecting an inspection of the school by the DEO to go ahead with the recognition. **Fr**. **Saju** visited St. Xavier's, Hazaribag thrice for the school managing committee meetings. **Francis Lopez** lost his elder sister Catharine on 7th July.

We are saddened by the news of Sr. Michel H.C. who passed away on 9th July. She was associated with the parish for many years by teaching catechism to the students and in faith formation.

We are very happy with the Matric result. Among the 137 registered 135 wrote the exams. 109 first division, 22 second division and 4 were marginal.

BOKARO, ST. XAVIER'S

On 10th July the School was delighted to know the brilliant result of our students in ICSE and ISC board examination. We got 100% results for class X whereas in class XII there were 2 unfortunate failures. Puja Kejriwal became the district topper securing 98.4% in class X and Vanshika Sinha with 96.5% in class XII. Online classes are in full swing with the daily review meetings of the Staff. We have got the brand new ramp ready to be used in the high school section. Fr. James with the help of Mr. Abhishek is working to set up the communication system in the school and is trying to bring an order in the school office. On 18th of July the school celebrated the School's birthday. Students' council prepared a short presentation and was presented online. Fr. Arun made a quick visit to his elder brother who is suffering from cirrhosis of liver and is admitted in the Holy Family Hospital Mandar. **Fr. Xavier** was very fortunate to bless his nephew's marriage in the Cathedral of Ranchi observing the government's prescribed order. **Fr. Tintus** has started his visit to the close by villages and has been trying to identify the needs of the poor.

JAINAMORE: Good old Fr. Lou Lachal of happy memory bequeathed to us numerous land properties all over the province. These in later years in Bokaro developed into Balidih Parish, Missionaries of Charity Brothers' works of leprosy and tuberculosis centres. Still, in Jainamore-Bokaro we have three pockets of scattered land comprising 3.44 acres practically unused. Our eyebrows have been raised time and again from Fr. Raska's time over there as 98 decimals of our land has been sold clandestinely and illegally by a group of four women to two men of Chandrapura. These two men have been claiming their rights and obstructing our works and building their own wall. Fr. Arun Minj in March this year witnessed such activity and intervened. Since this is the matter of land disputes, all gaps of land incongruities have to be capped. Through the efforts of Frs. Xavier and Tintus who are in a difficult and critical period of Covid-19 managed to get two vital land documents from the circle office (virtually closed due to Covid-19) and are waiting for two more to finally clinch the undisputed possession and ownership of the land.

PATKI, MASI MANDER

The arrival of **Fr. Anil Bhushan** and **Dn. Simon** doubled the joy of the Patki community. The Community thanked **Sch. Arockia Sasi** for his valuable service to the people of Patki and wished him all the best for his theological studies. **Fr. Anil Bhushan** accompanied him to Tarunoday, Ranchi. The Lockdown in various phases made the community to engage itself in indoor activities. The campus has increased the number of medicinal plants and has enlarged the garden with rare plants under the guidance of **Fr. Gyan**. We as a community also contributed dry ration and vegetables in four villages. The school campus looks beautiful as we are levelling the ground and repairing the broken windows. We got 100% result in the JAC Matric examination.

Birendra and Nicholas took **Gregory** for treatment to Ramgarh as he was suffering from unbearable shoulder pain. Doctor prescribed some medicines and physiotherapy for next 6 days and so he had to go for physiotherapy daily. School staff kept busy themselves in preparing apps for online teaching. It was an interesting event because for a few staff members it was first opportunity to use touch screen mobile phone and learn. On July 9th Frs. Binod **Toppo** and his companion visited us as they were on their way back from Ranchi. On July 12th Fr. Francis Marian came with a scholastic to inspect the boundary wall and high school toilet construction. Fr. Emile was accompanied by Sch. Prakash Baskey to Bhurkunda for recollection. A local neighbour named Md. Rahmat put objection of releasing campus rain water in his field and after negotiation problem was resolved to certain extent. On 20th July community decided a few things due to spread of Corona-19 and they were as follows we shall: not offer holy mass in villages and convents, novena to St Ignatius, and celebration of founder's feast. On July 28th Birendra with Mr Anup went to Ranchi office to forward school papers for recognition. Sch. Prakash joined his other companions for recollection held in Ankur. Feast day of our founder, St Ignatius, was celebrated with our neighbouring sisters in a simple way. The Main celebrant of the mass was Fr. Birendra.

HAZARIBAG, ARRUPE NIWAS

In the context of the coronavirus pandemic, the province has applied for and received generous funding to help migrant labourers and unemployed persons in our Dumar, Jamuniatanr, Patra, Tarwa, Chatra, Chiro, Pakripath and Tundtoli centres. As a result, our Sisters, Jesuits and staff members are very busy giving food packets to many households. At the same time, many food (cash) for work projects have been taken up so that large number can earn and at the same time valuable work too can be done to benefit villages. Hence, ponds are, being dug, wells repaired, fields prepared for

cultivation, new wells being dug, village schools repaired, and small shops are being set up. About 1073 households and so; at least 6500 people are being helped.

Our Juniorate programme in St. Stanislaus College for the juniors of the central province has begun as usual. To help the juniors study well and also be more effective teachers, **Bob** was asked to give a 3 day programme which hopefully will make them persons of experience, reflection and action. The juniors took part enthusiastically in the seminar.

The corona virus pandemic has come very close to Arrupe. Apparently, four persons living next door have been diagnosed positive. Hence, barricades have been set up by the municipality on our Holy Cross Road, making our lockdown more visible. Of course this has not disturbed **Shyam Kishore Tudu**, and **Marcus Murmu** who are very busy with their online courses.

The community took part in a very well prepared novena to prepare for the feast of St. Ignatius with a different member of the community taking turns to lead the prayers. The standard was very high with the three schols starting by presenting power point presentations with commentaries. Not deterred, the elder members of the community kept up the standard in different ways, ending on the last day with thanksgiving for the various apostolates the province is involved in.

Except for **Fr. Santosh** involved in visitations, **Fr. Tony Herbert** busy is trying to arrange admissions to our institutions, and of course our Minister **Fr. Francis Marian**, very busy arranging supplies to keep our community healthy, most of the Arrupe community are in lockdown. But now **Sch. Patrick Tirkey** has gone to Kolkata with **Fr. Manoj** to be of service to him in hospital and **Sch. Prashant** has been captured by SSC as he is a very active person ready to help in whatever way.

JDV, PUNE ONLINE: This is M.Th Spirituality! Google Meet! We are fourteen students, the biggest batch so far for this course at JDV, Pune. Every day we have 10.30 a.m. to 12.15 p.m. Google Meet classes. It's an amazing experience! One of our companions is in Madrid (Spain), another one in Malaysia and the rest of us are in different parts of India. Our First course' professor conducted the classes from US!

We are given two types of reading materials besides bibliography for the course. First type of reading materials helps us to attend the classes and the second type of materials is meant for us to read and present to the class as part of the partial fulfilment of assignments. Besides this assignment we have to write Integration paper of 2-3 pages every week and a final thesis of 15-20 pages on a topic of our choice with the approval of the concerned professor.

The classes are not very different from the actual classrooms except that everybody is seen on the computer screen. One can intervene in the class; ask clarifications, present opinions when needed and interact. Of course, for this entire activity good internet connectivity is needed! The students from North-East and Western Ghats often experience problem with internet and we help each other through WhatsApp group. It's a new experience of learning and I'm enjoying it thoroughly!! *Shyamkishor Tudu, sj.*

LOCKDOWN EXPERIENCE:

People from all walks of life have been affected by the outbreak of covid-19. Ironically, the so called developed countries, who took pride in being a nuclear power, are helpless and struggling to develop the vaccine. Fear and uncertainty loomed large during the lockdown. In the beginning, we didn't bother much about the corona virus but as we started taking precautionary measures, such as maintaining social distance and sanitizing, things started getting creepy and frightening. During the life threatening situation, what sustained our positive mood was the good vibes of the community. Ahmedabad had the highest number of covid-19 cases in Gujarat but we stood together at the face of the adversary. With a sense of foreboding, all of us made our maiden flight journey. At Delhi airport, we were too afraid to eat anything at the airport so we ate reluctantly two bars of chocolates for lunch. We landed in Ranchi around 8 o'clock in the evening and were picked up by drivers Christopher and Dashrath of Prerana, who dropped us at St. Joseph School, Tarwa around 11 o'clock.

During the home Quarantine, we were strongly advised to abide by the governments rules and regulations for Quarantine. We were even exempted from Mass. We had plenty of free time so we kept ourselves busy by reading, playing video games and cards, chatting and sometimes taking a long siesta. Because we were given particular area to move around, just like animals do in their territory, I felt I am in the world but not of the world. But in our case stepping beyond our assigned area meant imposing a threat to others' lives, since we did not know whether we had contracted the corona virus or not. There has been a small innovation in that a variety of different instruments are being used each night, according to the various talents of our members. We had special mass in the main Church. Sisters and candidates of Holy Cross and FCC joined us for the celebration. There was a solemn mass with entrance dance and appropriate songs by Holy Cross community, followed by breakfast for all. The community had organized a basketball match between candidates of Holy Cross and FCC. SJ fathers and Holy Cross sister had mixed double Badminton match. Our new minister Fr.

Kamal provided delicious and sumptuous meal for all Jesuits in the evening.

One of the benefits that we had during this lockdown was fishing by hooks, yes! fresh fish from our ponds by our own fishermen Fr. Francis Indwar and Fr. Vincent mainly. During the month, Fr. Santosh Minj, the Provincial, visited and encouraged us by evaluating the lockdown, how it has affected us, how have we been coping with it positively and what have we done for the people affected by it, etc. The feast of our founder St. Ignatius was very simple and among the community, along with Fr. Sebastian and Fr. Arun Kujur who joined us for supper.

Mr. Abhishek and his family came and stayed with us for three days to introduce G-Suite (Google Meet) Online class especially to PTEC and Loyola faculty members and now they are directing them from Bokaro. PTEC started their online classes for the second-year students since Even, the new admission 1st July. counselling was conducted on Google Meet from 24th July onwards and the admission is going on. This year in the absence of students the local village women helped in paddy transplantation on time.

St. Xavier's School: The result of St. Xavier's School, Sitagarha for secondary and higher secondary was very satisfactory. The matric result was overall 99.02% (Only one marginal) but on the other hand, the first batch of higher secondary students came out in flying colours with 100% result. The Principal and the faculty deserve a good pat on their back for their hard work and commitment. The online class is being conducted from their respective homes with class-wise groups. There are 90 in class 9, 93 in class 10, and 21 students in class 11. The science and arts streams are being added

from this year. The school office remained open and functional during lockdown.

Loyola School kept on their online classes. very fast and at present weeding is going on. Crop looks so far very promising.

TARWA, ST. JOSEPH SCHOOL COMMUNITY

The new team for Tarwa Mission is already here. We all are learning the tricks of the trade in the specific context of Tarwa. It took rather a long time to learn and understand the specificities of the various aspects of the concrete Mission and ministries here and now. At this moment of covid-19, the presence of the **Schs. Naveen**, **Raja, Raymond, Samuel, Sujit,** and **Sumit** is a great blessing. In the beginning, they were quarantined in the hostel but now they are in the community building.

Greetings from Nairobi, Kenya. We had a celebration for **Bro.
