When Pope Francis addressed GC 36 on October 24, 2016 he exhorted the members to ask intensely for consolation. Those who participated remember how his address itself and the interaction that followed were deeply consoling moments. Seeking consolation, the Pope says, is an important element of the Spiritual Exercises. It is meant to animate us Jesuits 24x7 to become truly contemplatives in action. How could we seek consolation in the midst of a pandemic? Even our very ordinary conversation is about the virus, the lockdown and the mounting number of victims. But that must not be the last word. It is time we look at "Ignatian tools", as James Matin puts it, more seriously. Ignatius began to recognize consolation in the sick bed. The Ignatian journey that we just celebrated was a reminder to seek consolation amidst adversities.

We are on a cancellation mode. Life online appears to be the new normal, perhaps for a while. With all its limitations, we had successful online meetings of superiors, schoolmen and scholastics. I add a word of appreciation to all who made the Ignatian Novena a moving experience reaching beyond boundaries. The digital medium offers us new possibilities to move beyond in a truly Ignatian way. Stay safe, stay healthy!

PIUS X JESUIT HOUSE, EDATHUA

Our community has become vibrant with the arrival of **Br** George Vattukulam Fr Rubil Martin. Fr K P Mathew was given a warm send off by the community and the Parish community. The lockdown due to the pandemic was a blessing in disguise for Pius X ITI because we could complete the restructuring work without interruption and disturbance. Developments at Pius X are taking place at three levels. In the farm sector we planted seventy four coconut saplings in the water logged areas over sand heaps using JCB. Most of the saplings were home grown. Plantains were chosen for the rest of the vacant area. A duck farm also is yielding good results. The second sector of development is related to the infrastructure of the ITI. We have constructed a new front gate with a wide road up to the ITI office. All the seven labs were restructured as per the NCVT (National Council for Vocational Training) directives. We have



installed CCTV in vital areas and introduced digital signature system using face recognition technology for teachers and students. With the help of Fr Sunil Padannamakkel, we have acquired new instruments from Delhi to replace those damaged in the floods of 2018. The third area was the ongoing formation of our teachers. During the lockdown, our teachers were given sessions on the characteristics of Jesuit education aimed at proper motivation and attitudinal change. Online classes for students have begun and most teachers have become familiar with the online platform. Fr Rubil is coordinating the online classes. SNEHARAM, ANJENGO

Frequent and sudden lockdown announcements have already inflicted a heavy toll on the lives and livelihood opportunities of fishing-dependent communities in Anjengo. But compulsions of daily sustenance force them to fend for themselves, and hence they are unable to adhere to the safety measures prescribed by the government. They await the dawn of August 5 2020 to resume fishing operations, but the Jagratha Samithi is worried about keeping the COVID-19 protocol. It is inevitable to limit the number of fishing boats and regulate the auctioning of fish. Limited road transport and internet connectivity has affected higher education opportunities of the coastal students. So we are trying to improve higher education opportunities through the Jesuit World-wide Learning (JWL) programmes. Sneharam was hopeful of starting a graduation programme, namely 'BA in Sustainable Development', but it was hampered when the area was declared a containment zone on the very day we had an online 'Cambridge Linguaskill Test' for the aspiring students.

While we were in containment zone, the health workers who made Sneharam their home for a week had to leave on the third day since one team member was tested positive. Our cook's sister was isolated and some neighbours are hospitalised or isolated. The situation has been exacerbated since another line of houses along



the coastal belt has been eaten up by the sea. People are looking forward to getting outside support from willing and generous partners.

JEA (Jesuit Educational Association - Kerala Province)


The Corona virus pandemic has proven challenging for schools and parents in educating children. It is a chance for our schools to confront those challenges with courage.

We are called to respond to the most immediate exigencies to ensure a regular conclusion to the academic year and organize for the future to be able to discern opportunities which this crisis could offer us. In order to reflect on the challenging situation and assess our responses and share our good practices, JEA organised an online core committee meeting. One of the decisions was to orient our teachers, particularly the newly appointed ones, of our schools on Jesuit Education and Legacy.

The first webinar for the newly appointed teachers on Jesuit Education and Legacy was conducted on 1 July 2020. Fr. Norbert Menezes SJ, former JEASA Secretary and the current PCE of Patna Province, led the session. The session was appreciated by the participants. In order to help the teachers understand the depth of Jesuit Education and Legacy, follow up questions were given for reflection and assimilation. JEA will also

be organising a number of online training programmes for our collaborators in the coming months.

Mathew**, Provincial, gave a short key note address. 26 Jesuits who are involved in school ministry attended the meeting. Principals/DOW of the schools presented their reports, and it was followed by sharing and discussion. It was a great opportunity to listen to the achievements, challenges



and concerns of each school and support one another. One of the decisions was to share our resources and good practises with each other. This year, our schools have achieved great results in SSLC, Plus2, CBSE, ICSE, and ISC. However, in order to instil the spirit of MAGIS and academic excellence in our schools, JEA conducted a short evaluation on the academic results of each school.

IGNATIAN TOOLS FOR TODAY

To kick off Ignatian Month celebrations in early July, the Ateneo de Manila's Office for Ministry and Identity invited the American Jesuit Fr James Martin SJ to give a talkon"IgnatianToolsforToday".FrJim, ashe is popularly known, is probably one of the most recognisable Jesuits in mass media—the bestselling author is the editor at large of the Jesuit publication America Magazine and was appointed by Pope Francis as consultor to the Vatican's Secretariat for Communications.

The Philippine audience was excited for the talk, with nearly 700 people on Zoom to hear Fr Martin.

Fr Martin began his talk by contextualising Ignatian Spirituality in light of the pandemic, which "both separates and unites us". We are all "alone together". Many negative emotions run wild these days, including fear, confusion, anger, loneliness, and sadness. How can Ignatian Spirituality help? Fr Martin pointed out three classic Ignatian tools that can ease the burden: Discernment, the Examen, and Contemplation.

For clarity, he started with the life of St Ignatius of Loyola, who was born in Spain's Basque country, became soldier and knight, was wounded in battle, and during his recovery had a conversion that set him down a spiritual path. It was during the recovery period that Ignatius started reading about the life of Christ, and the lives of saints. This is when his discernment of the spirits began: the good spirit bringing hope, and the evil spirit bringing despair. "The voice of God in this pandemic is the voice of calm, of reason, of hope," said Fr Martin. This is the chance to tune in to God, because "the more you pay attention to God in your life, the more you will understand...listening and paying attention will bring recognition".

Then he discussed the Examen, essentially an examination of conscience, or in very accessible terms, "a review of your day... that helps [you] see the whole picture". For those who are not used to the Examen, it can sound confusing or even intimidating, but in 10 to 15 minutes and in five steps, Fr Martin delineates the Examen. Step 1: Put yourself in the presence of God. "Be with me now," is the phrase Fr Martin likes to use. He

also recommends looking at the place where you are going to pray, which makes it easier to slide into the mind-set of prayer. Step 2: Ground yourself in gratitude. Remember all of the things you are grateful for, big and small, and savour them. Thank God for these things. Step 3: Review the day, and try to see where God was and is. Step 4: Express your sorrow for your sins. Step 5: Ask for Grace. If you struggle, Fr Martin recommends spending time on gratitude, by thinking of something that will remind you of God's presence in your life. Most of all, Fr Martin reminds us: "Are you being honest in your prayer?"

The third tool, Ignatian Contemplation-imaginative prayer-asks you to imagine yourself in a scripture scene. "Compose the scene... give yourself time, close your eyes, and envision." Using your senses and feelings, let it play out and notice what comes up within you-insights, memories, feelings. "Can you be honest with Jesus?" asked Fr Martin. "Speak bluntly. Listen to his response," he said. "God wants our honesty," is how Fr Martin succinctly put it.

And even during a painful period of loss, Ignatian Spirituality can help. "Suffering is never the last word," shared Fr Martin. "We are people of Hope," he said, "not just the Cross, but the Resurrection, too." He said: "The Spirit is not rationed", true words of consolation—in the Ignatian sense—ever more resonant in this most difficult time.
