2. Pursuing studies in Private/Regular (B. Ed, T.T.C. M. Ed, Post-Graduation, Doctoral Studies etc.)



Ashirvad/Jharna, Namkum

The month of March started with the excitement for all the novices as a month-full village experiment awaited them. On 3rd March onwards Fr. Superior K. C. Philip, SJ guided a group of nuns (tertiaries) through their long retreat. The novices spent a quality time to give the final touch to their preparation, before setting out for their mission. On 5th March, early morning a group of eight novices left for Assam and the rest dispersed on 7th March to different Jesuit parishes in Jharkhand.

In the absence of novices, Fr. Sylverius Chermako, the Master, gave an eight-day retreat to DSA Sisters, Fr. Edwin guided a group of OSU Sisters and Fr. Deepak

went to preach a retreat in St. Paul's Community Dibodya Lalkhatnga.

Unfortunately, on account of COVID-19, we the novices could not have a whole month of Lenten ministry. We began getting back to the novitiate just after ten days with a little but rich experiences. At this situation, the greater importance was our safety than our experiment. The Vijaygiri group came back on 19th, the Rumtukel group on 22nd and the Gumla and Bingoan group on 23rd March.

Soon Fr. Master gave us documents on CAA, NRC, and NPR together with UAP's (Universal Apostolic Preferences) to read at our leisure hours. We were completely forbidden to go out of the campus and to play games. In order to keep us busy Fr. Master taught us a few hymns. Later Fr. Socius continued since on 3rd April Fr. Master along with Fr. Deepak went to Doreya to run the "Shelter Home" over there for the migrant workers. The following morning, all the novices, Fr. Socius and Fr. Edwin also went to Doreya to give them a helping hand in cleaning and arranging the place. They came back to the community by evening.

We had solemn Palm Sunday celebration in the community. The Holy Eucharist was presided over by Fr. Henry and con-celebrated by Fr. Jyoti Paul, our socius and Fr. Edwin. The main theme of the homily was "To stay with the Lord at His Passion and console Him." With this, we entered into the Holy Week. On the Holy Thursday Fr. Edwin was the main celebrant and we had every liturgical ceremony except the washing of the feet. We ended the liturgy with an hour of adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. On Good Friday we had special solemn stations of the cross on theme COVID-19 followed by liturgy of the day. Fr. Henry presided over the liturgy. We omitted the veneration of the cross due to COVID-19. The first half, on the Holy Saturday we decorated our chapel in an attractive way which the staff members appreciated very much. All the novices attended the Easter Vigil Mass and Easter Sunday's Mass in their dress. Fr. socius presided over the vigil mass accompanied by Fr. Henry. Here also we omitted a few liturgical parts. On Easter Sunday, we had Holy Mass late morning at 10:30 a.m. offered by Fr. Edwin and accompanied by Fr. Henry. Fr. James Barla, SJ, our Minister provided us with variety of items for our physical need at lunch and supper.

On 14th April five of the novices donated their blood in Manresa House to NACO, a blood donation camp arranged by Doranda Xaverian Alumini. On 15th April the ministry group of Rengarih (Ns. Ashwini Tigga

II, Ns. Pawan Kandulna I) and Jharain (Ns. Benojit Narzari II, Ns. Ajit Minj I) got back to the novitiate early in the morning. They were quarantined for two weeks. Meanwhile we resumed our usual routine. Fr. Master was back from Shelter Home Doreya, Fr. Socius donated his blood in Gurunank Hospital for one of the St. Anne nuns and quarantined novices joined the community on 22nd April 2020. On 25th April Fr. Henry showed us the video of UAP. The last day of the month was a villa day for the novices.

1st May, on the feast of St. Joseph, the patron saint of all the workers, we started the Marian month with solemn Rosary. On the same day, our football ground and volleyball court were ploughed in order to prevent the outsiders to make crowd for games and for an evening walk. On 3rd May we celebrated the birthday anniversary of NS Hemant Soreng and Fr. Edwin came back from Shelter Home Muri. On 5th May onwards we got into the normal schedule of the Novitiate. The 9th May was a special day for the second year novices as they had the canonical meeting with Fr. Provincial Joseph Maranus Kujur. They were both excited and happy to talk to him. On 11th May the fresh Juniors from Patna juniorate of Ranchi, Jamshedpur, and Dumka Province, joined Jharna community but were in quarantine. On 14th May we observed the universal day of Prayer, Fasting, and Charity called by His holiness Pope Francis. We concluded it with an hour of Adoration before supper. On 18th to 31st May, we had quinzine. On 28th May Fr. Master's birthday was celebrated in the community in a solemn way. On 30th May evening we had the thanksgiving Holy Eucharist presided over by Fr. Superior for Fr. Henry, Fr. Deepak and Fr. Edwin for their selfless service to the community. The month of May ended with the birthday of NS Amit Barla.

We entered into the month of June with the Cultural Evening and the birthday of NS Thomas Purty and NS Suman Shishir Oreya. On 2nd June two schs. Peter Horo and Sudhir Lakra joined Jharna community to learn French for their theological studies in Paris, France. On 3rd June three novices namely Amit Tete, Ashwin Baa' and Gulshan Tirkey discontinued. On 4th June evening the first year novices began their Annual Retreat and the second year novices their Vows Retreat in Jharna, which ended on 13th June morning. The very next day, on 14th June we said goodbye to Fr. Henry. Fr. Superior, Fr. Master, Fr. Socius and Br. Minister went to reach him to Doranda, his new mission station. From 15th June onwards we began a special English class by fresh juniors Schs. Pingal Bilung and Matthew Kawa. On 16th June second year novices submitted their hand written

vows formula. On 18th June we had birthday of NS Ashwin Kindo. On the same day onwards we accelerated our preparations for the first vows day and completed it by 20th June.

21st June 2020, The First Vows Day:- Due to the pandemic, the first vows ceremony was in the morning. The Holy Eucharist began sharp at 9:30 A.M. The newly appointed Provincial Fr. Ajit Kr. Xess, SJ, was the main celebrant and Fr. Superior, K. C. Philip, SJ, Fr. Master, Sylvester Chermako, SJ, Fr. Socius, Raymond Kerketta, SJ and the former provincial Fr. Joseph Marianus Kujur, SJ accompanied him to the altar. Around 70 Jesuits from different communities, two OSU nuns and a couple witnessed the first vows of NS. Barla Amit, NS. Kindo Ashwin, NS. Narzari Benojit, NS. Purty Thomas and NS. Xess Rasal Prabhat. Fr. Jyoti Paul, our socius was the anchor of the day. Fr. Provincial gave a powerful and meaningful homily challenging the participants to be spiritually locked up with God. One of the fresh vowed Jesuits extended the words of gratitude on their behalf. After the final blessing, we had a very short wishing programme by the first year novices and the fresh juniors. Then, all marched for lunch and by 2:00 P.M. the whole programme got over. The choir led the congregation to pray devotionally. All congratulated the choir for their good and melodious singing and appreciated the beautiful decoration of the hall.

On 22nd June we bade farewell to the fresh vowed brothers who went for their juniorate to Hazaribag and at the same time 9 fresh novices joined the Novitiate for Ranchi Province. On 23rd June onwards the fresh novices began their first probation and on 24th and 25th June the basketball court was concretized. Last Sunday of the month we went for a walk in the ATC fields.

In the Ignatian month of July, there was novena to St. Ignatius from 22nd to 30th July. On Monday 27th July, the whole community participated in the online prayer service organised by the Ignatian family, Jesuit Conference of South Asia both for the Jesuits and their collaborators. The theme of this virtual prayer "AMDG, Conversations of the Heart" helped us to better prepare ourselves for the feast of St. Ignatius. On the feast day of our founder, we had the community Mass at 6:15 am and after the festive breakfast, the badminton match till 11:30 am added an extra flavour to our celebration. The community was happy to join in the virtual recreation on zoom on 1st August arranged by the media team of Jesuit Conference of South Asia for all the Jesuits of the Assisi.

Satya Nilayam, Chennai Goes Online: Virtual Inauguration of the Academic Year 2020-21 & the Schola

Brevis

Much awaited virtual inauguration of the academic year 2020-21 for M.A. Philosophy, delayed due to the relentless pandemic, Covid-19 and suffering it inflicted on the humanity across the world, finally took place here at Satya Nilayam, Chennai (also known to many as Department of Philosophy, Loyola College) on August 03, 2020. Fr. Boniface Panna, SJ, the Rector of this national centre for formation, presided over the Eucharist and invoked the Holy Spirit and its guidance on each one of us, throughout the academic year. The small congregation gathered on this occasion prayed in unison for the outpouring and overshadowing of the Holy Spirit on the entire creation, for the healing it needs, for renewal and for its reinvigoration of life, as the entire cosmos is reeling under the threat of Covid-19. Fr. Lawrence Fernandes, SJ, the Head of the Department, broke the word of God and re-emphasized the importance of God's intervention into the lives of suffering humanity, through the spirit of risen Christ. As seekers of truth and lovers of wisdom, we are always in need of God's spirit because it is God's spirit that helps us to realize wisdom and to seek knowledge with much greater depth; rather than treating the academia as a mere collection of information and reading resources leading one to passing the exams and securing marks, which can in fact, be achieved in any platform including the virtual ones. Our take and our usage of knowledge and wisdom is service-oriented, the other-oriented and meaning-oriented. To achieve and realize the knowledge of highest degree and class, based on truth and wisdom, we need the wisdom of God, which only the spirit of Risen Christ can give. The sacred liturgy and singing was very well anchored by our international students, who have been with us in the community ever since different phases of lockdowns dealing with the pandemic were announced.

Schola Brevis: "Our Philosophical Response to Subaltern Empowerment in today's Context"

Schola Brevis, which is generally a very short talk highlighting the theme of the academic year and a framework within which an institution of higher learning could focus its attention on, was delivered by none other than Rev. Dr. Fr. Jebamalai Irudayaraj, SJ, the Jesuit provincial of Chennai Jesuit Society, who is a renowned scholar, a philosopher, a social activist and a very progressive thinker. His talk was powerful, inspiring, thought-provoking and highly philosophical. He divided his talk in two sections. In the first section, he underlined the context in which we live today; the context of a divided and distorted world, the domination of the darker

side, the recent happenings in the context of Covid-19 including the recent happenings in political circle; and the killing of George Floyd in the US and Jayraj and Bennicks in India. He situated and defined who the subaltern sections of people are, and also included Covid-19 patients under the subaltern because of the stigma and discriminations that are being attached to them. Making a very clear distinction between Equality and Equity, he said that equality is based on basic human needs, whereas equity is based on human rights, fairness and justice. He gave examples of stalwarts like Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar, Jyotiba Phule, Gautam Buddha, Guru Nanak and Periyar, who championed the cause of the subalterns and worked for their uplift.

In the second section, which was more engaging and highly philosophical, he gave us his insight into the philosophical discourse on subaltern empowerment. In this section he spelled out our philosophical responses and responsibilities to the issues that affect the subaltern society. Speaking on the subaltern empowerment, he said that it is the power of the oppressed people moving towards equal status, participation and power of decision making, having access to literacy skills and government jobs and positions; freedom to travel and have voice of their own, awareness of their identity as groups, and increased socio-political and economic awareness. Responding to the question as to why should a Jesuit philosopher choose to respond to subaltern issues and why we should have subaltern perspective, he said that our basic orientation to life and mission is subaltern, our history is subaltern and our origin is subaltern. Beside this, we must learn to choose a perspective that will help us to attain the mission and vision of Jesus Christ, whose company we belong to. It is a must to have subaltern perspective in order to understand the world, philosophize the issues that affect human existence of our time and move forward towards making a just human society. Decoding the dominant theory is mandatory, for reconstructing a renewed society that has been distorted and divided based on religion, culture, language, ethnicity, caste, class, and nationality. As far as the subaltern world is concerned, it has been constructed by the rich, powerful and the elite; it needs to be deconstructed. Fr. Jebamalai signed off in style saying that the Jesuit philosophers should not stop with interpreting the world, but they should labour towards re-making the world, and deconstructing the socio-political and economic constructs that are oppressive and alienating.

The virtual platform which relayed live, both the mass of the Holy Spirit and the Schola Brevis, was created, anchored and championed by Fr. Valerian Mendonca, SJ,

the associate professor, the department of Philosophy, Loyola College, Chennai. Fr. Vinod Sushil Soreng, SJ moderated the session and proposed the vote of thanks.

Foreign Mission Rome

Having completed the Academic Year 2019-2020 in June, Nirmal's community of International College of Gesù, began the summer holidays until September. The online registration for the new Academic Year will start already from 24 August 2020. Normally, the Scholastics and the Staff members of Gesù community have well organized and pre-planned summer program; however, COVID-19 has put every plan upside down. Nirmal was supposed to go to Jerusalem in July along with his Jesuit companions of Second Year for the religious studies of three religions, namely, Christianity, Judaism and Islam. Their annual program was cancelled because of the uncertain and unstable situation. Just like his non-European companions, he finally decided to stay back at home and continue to devote his time in reading theological books to prepare himself for the next Academic Year.

The community members from European countries managed to leave for their respective Provinces. Some of the newly-ordained Deacons, especially from Asia and Latin America were held up in Rome because of the suspended Flight services. Even among 19 new arrivals, only 6 have reached Rome. Among the new arrivals, Kuldeep Linda and Sandeep Bage are expected to join the community before the start of the new Academic Year in October. In such an uncertain situation, R.P. Rector and R.P. Minister meticulously planned the online language courses to the would-be community members according to the feasible time of each country. In normal circumstances, Italian Scholastics organize one-month course in August for the newcomers in one of the northern cities of Italy. Thanks to their generosity, 5 new Gregorian students – Deepak, Kuldeep and Sandeep along with two Ursuline Sisters – Shanti and Prabha – have been assigned to 30 minutes of online tutorial class every day. Although Edwin Dang has done a commendable job in teaching them the fundamental of Italian Grammar, they will benefit a lot from online tutorial class, during which they will have the chance to interact face-to-face in Italian with one singular Scholastic.

On 26 July, Nirmal took initiative to invite the other Ranchi men to Gesù community to celebrate his own birthday

along with the feast of St. Anne and St. Joachim. After four days, the community celebrated with great joy the feast of St. Ignatius of Loyola. Because of the prevailing situation, most of the community members were at home, and hence, probably for the first time in many years, the joy of celebrating the Founder's feast day was more than evident in the Eucharistic celebration as well as in the festive meal. In the evening, R.P. Arturo Sosa, Superior General, presided over the solemn Holy Mass in the beautiful Gesù Church, in which, despite the restriction on the number of participants to maintain the social distancing, a good number of Jesuits from different communities and other friends and well-wishers of Jesuits participated with great joy.

Kulwant rightly decided to stay back at home in Collegio Roberto Bellarmino during the summer vacation to prepare himself for the final comprehensive exam to complete his Licentiate in Canon Law, which will be held in September. Amidst scorching heat, he frequents the House Library, which is the only air-conditioned space in the community. The pandemic has forced many inmates of Collegio Bellarmino to cancel their summer program. And therefore, unlike previous years, the community is functioning in a normal way. Those from the central European countries were fortunate to go back to their Provinces; however, those from Asia, Africa and Americas rescheduled their summer plan opting either to stay at home or to go for some pastoral ministries outside Rome. R.P. Rector has made it crystal clear that those coming back to the community after the summer vacation have to be in self home quarantine for a week so as to secure the protection of the community from any danger of virus infection.

Most of the community members of Gregorian University have left either for their respective Provinces or for summer ministry. The suspension of the International flights has forced almost all community members to reschedule their summer plan. Some of the Europeans too opted to stay in Italy instead of going back to their Provinces.
