ADILABAD - ASIFABAD MISSION:

Thirty minutes, adoration prior to morning Mass was introduced in our Utnoor parish church from the 1 Jul and it has become our practice to sit in the presence of the Eucharistic Lord together with our parishioners and begin the new day. Manos Unidas, Spain came forward to assist the families of tribals, migrants and daily wage earners



during Covid-19 pandemic. We are grateful to the Province for getting this help from Manos Unidas and for procurement of food and non food items. Our fathers from Loyola Academy were with us on 29 Jun. They visited our area of operation from Hatti to Jodeghat. They paid homage to Kumaram Bheem the martyr of Adivasis. They also saw the museum and interacted with the teachers. We also had the visit of Fr. Santiago SDB, the Vice



Provincial and Fr. B. Sudhakar SDB, the Director of Bosco Seva Kendra, Hyderabad (BSK) to our area

on 16 Jun. They saw all our 13 villages from Hatti to Jodeghat and paid their homage to Sri Kumram Bheem at his samadhi. They also participated at the distribution of 150 dry food kits supplied by them to our people and interacted with the people. They assured that they would provide free skill training for any tribal youth of our area and also find job for them after the training. In response,



some of our youth have given their names to Fr. Pratap for skill training at Bosco Seva Kendra in Hyderabad.

We have distributed a total of 1385 dry food kits in 82 villages of 8 mandals in Adilabad and Asifabad districts in the months of Jun and Jul. Our hills and forests are green offering the most beautiful sight; the streams and rivulets are flowing in rhythmic movements; and our fields are flourishing with crops of cotton and pulses.

The implementation of our action plan for Jesuit Education in Kumram Bheem and Adilabad districts for the academic year 2021-'22 is very much delayed due to Covid-19 pandemic. We are awaiting the government's decision for reopening the schools. We have motivated our tribal children to go to schools as soon as the schools are reopened. We have chosen 4 best students from 9 selected secondary schools to pursue intermediate course at Carmel Junior College in Mandamarri. Their college and hostel fees will be met by sponsors. We are accompanying these children as well as those who have given their names for Skill training



at Hyderabad. We took the four students along with their guardians on 22 Jul to Carmel Junior College to show them the college and hostel and for admission in the college.

As the result of canvassing and visiting different schools by Fr. Rex and his team, the number of admissions for first year inter in Carmel College is slowly increasing. He started online classes for senior and junior inter and the EMCET and NEET coaching from 1 Jul. Fr. Shinto who was his companion as

administrator of Carmel institutions at Mandamarri left for his higher studies on 16 Jul and Fr. Renoj has replaced him as administrator and parish priest. Fr. Pratap is very much appreciated for his Telugu sermons and singing. Fr. PS. Amal attended the memorial service in honor of Fr. Stan Swamy at St. Mary's Basilica, Hyderabad on 18 Jul and placed a wreath from the "Adivasis of Ummadi Adilabad District" before the Urn containing the holy ashes of Fr. Stan Swamy, the Apostle and Prophet of the Adivasis. As precautionary measure, he received the second dose of Covishield on 23 Jul. We the Jesuits of Adilabad and Asifabad wish you all a very happy feast of St. Ignatius.

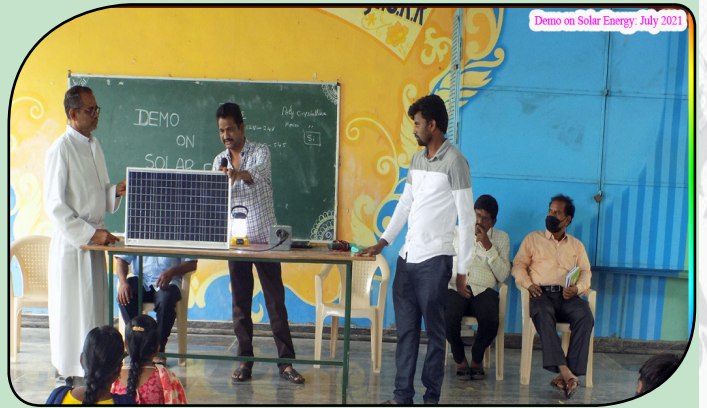

HEALTH BULLETIN OF FR. WILSON CLEMENT :

When Fr. Wilson reached Vidyanyketan, Trivandrum, on 15 Jun, he had a wound on his right foot due to a piece of glass being taken out. Here he was suffering from intense cough and cold. He was first taken to CSI Hospital, Kazhakootam, where it was found that the wound was very deep and there was no sensation at all in and around it. His sugar level was extremely high (nearly 800). He was admitted then and there and, after three days, was shifted to Kottiyam Holy Cross Hospital, Kollam. There, after Doppler test and other investigations, the second toe of his right leg was removed. Subsequently, the big toe was also removed. Even that did not help as blood flow below the knee was only 20% and, that too, was gradually getting reduced. The only treatment possible at Kottiyam was another level of amputation to save the rest of the leg. So we got him discharged on 17 Jul, arranged to send him with Fr. T.V. Antony up to Hyderabad airport. From there he was flown to Chandigarh and got admitted in Post Graduate Medical and Research Institute, Chandigarh for further treatment, where his nephew is a doctor.

Fr. Wilson experienced cardiac arrest on 28 Jul. Doctors found blocks in many parts of the body, not just in legs. One by one the effects of prolonged diabetes were observed. Currently he is in the ICU. He had undergone cardiac-angiography to see where the blocks are. On 29 July, an angiogram was done and the cardiologists were able to insert just one stent. He has been having problems also with urination. He was put on dialysis on 31 July 2021. He looks better after dialysis. On 1 Aug, Fr Wilson will be taken to an Eye specialist as his vision needs immediate attention. Let's pray for his good health and right treatment. Let's support his younger sister and nephew who are attending to him. His elder sister from Hyderabad reached Chandigarh on 31 July. God bless them to be safe and healthy too. May God guide the team of doctors to take care of all ailments related to diabetes that are surfacing one by one. The uncontrolled diabetes seems to be at the root cause of all his problems.
