After the success in potato cultivation, Fr Siby and his team have ventured into rice cultivation. Fr Fredrick Baraik goes to different parishes to rejuvenate himself after being confined to his room for three months. He is also the coordinator for the Covid Relief

Like last year, this year too our children have performed well in the ICSE examinations. Out of 38 students appeared 11 got 90% and above; 16 between 89 &80 % and 11 between 79&70%. On 30th June, we had the burial of **Br Francis Basumatary** at the parish cemetery with a limited number of people attending the funeral due to Covid protocol. In the High/Higher secondary school, mid-day meal was distributed (Phase XVI) for the lower classes and 225 bicycles were distributed for class ten students under *Shabooj Sathi* scheme by the government. Marksheets and certificates are handed over to the successful Madhyamik and Higher Secondary students; admission is going on for class- XI. A large number of tree saplings were donated to the School by the Border Security Forces, Ranidanga.

Fr Peter Pappu has returned after his treatment in Chennai



for about four few weeks and he feels better now. In his absence **Fr Oshish Tirkey** took care of the Parish. The latter left for Sitong mission to take up his new assignment there. After much persuasion and correspondence by the school, the West Bengal Minority Welfare Department has agreed to construct a two-storey hostel building for boys. It's coming up in the old "dera-line" area, close to the existing hostel. **Fr Simon Kerketta** preached a triduum to the sisters of St Anne of Faudijote. **Br Dennis Rodrigues** managed to return to the community after a prolonged home visit; he was stuck there due to lockdown for almost three months.

A Seminar was conducted on 20th July for the school staff. The resource person was **Fr John Kennedy**, Province Vocation Promoter and Youth Director. He inspired our staff with the life-story of St Ignatius of Loyola. This was organized as a part of Ignatian year programs. We have decided to spend a day every month to delve on Ignatian themes. The community also attended the Zonal meet on Ignatian spirituality. Our Community had the novena to St Ignatius in preparation to celebrate the feast.



A Free vaccination camp was conducted for 550 people in collaboration with Medica North Bengal Clinic. We're indebted to CJI and Xavier Network partners for making this possible. We also thank Shri. S. Ponnombalam, the DM of Darjeeling and DY CMOH, BDO, Officer in charge, Naxalbari police station, the staff of St Vincent's and village catechists and the leaders for ensuring it's success.

Fr Kennedy had a meeting with our parish youth to plan further activities. The CCTV installation is complete with 76 cameras. Now the school and the campus have a better surveillance. The lab set-up is well on the way. **Fr Alvin Minj** continues to beautify the campus with the help of parish youth and catechist. The Christeen group also loves to help out in the garden.

HAYDEN HALL, DARJEELING

Hayden Hall has 14 sub-centres spread across the two districts. Each centre has an in-charge, generally a nurse, under whom several community development workers (CDW) operate. These on field CDWs organize all our programs at the village level. When the second wave of COVID -19 struck, our centres came into play. The CDWs were instrumental in forming volunteer groups from the cross sections of village communities, civic bodies, SHGs, ASHA and others willing to be of service. From April 2021 Team Hayden Hall has trained over 250 such volunteers on disseminating right information on the coronavirus, precautions and protocols to be maintained, COVID appropriate behaviour, isolation and COVID care, acquiring a healthy and happy lifestyle and physical and emotional wellbeing.

As a lot of our villagers in the hills live in remote places, easy access to basic medical care remains a persistent problem. Facing this challenge, we equipped all our subcentres and whoever requested us with basic medicine for COVID symptoms and other emergencies, COVID kits to all our CDWs and Centre-In-Charges. In all, we were able to reach out to around 110 villages through our centres for the benefit of the needy and the distressed. Our centres and CDWs are always available on-call.



During the past three months there have been 2489 plus primary level counselling calls to our community development workers. Earlier on we started an online wellbeing campaign 'We Build Each Other', partnering with our centres, Darjeeling Prerna, Radio Salesian, Gandhi Ashram School, St Joseph's College, Art Mile, Vacay Workers and Himalayan Institute of Goodwill and Living Ethics. In this campaign we have been trying to pay attention to the mental and emotional well-being, relooking at education, physical well-being and various other social issues. Through this campaign, we were able to reach more than 40,000 people virtually. Spreading awareness among the villages was of utmost importance as with the media availability and accessibility, a lot of fake news has been spreading. Free counselling sessions were also provided by professionals to people who reached out via the online campaign.

HUMAN LIFE DEVELOPMENT & RESEARCH CENTRE (HLDRC), MATIGARA

In July we focused on Children's Education & Nutrition program in 18 study centres for 650 children in Terai and Dooars tea gardens. The special supplementary program (Milk packets, Eggs, Bread/Bun Roti, Grams, iaggery and peas) for the poor and malnourished children was carried out by HLDRC. We have completed one month program and planning for the second month with different food items. These children are living in extreme, remote and backward geographical locations like Tulsipara, Lankapara and Ramjhora tea gardens which are closer to Bhutan -India Border. Bamandanga tea garden and Tandoo tea garden are located between Jaldhaka river and Gorumara forest range as an island and are not easily accessible. Any food program for children or even for villagers is like "Manna from heaven experience". Thanks to SOS-INDIA and JESUIT MISSIONS UK for their generous support for this important program.

We are also happy to share that nine **Nursing students** who were supported through HLDRC and were trained in

Navajeevan Hospital, Gayaganga, got placement in Bangalore city and they are earning around Rs.10,000/- per month. Most of them are from Dooars closed tea gardens.

Mrs. Nirmala Karjee does the counseling and mentoring work giving them good support to build their fine career. We send our Special Thanks to JESUIT MISSIONS UK for supporting this program. HLDRC has also opened up Employment Training & Job Placement unit in Matigara temporarily. There is a huge demand for skills training among the youth of tea gardens and villages. Fr Pascal invites youth to join social work network of HLDRC and gradually those who like to find jobs are trained freely under



the care of HLDRC social development projects for the youth.
