On August 3, Month's Mind Mass of Stan was held in Jamshedpur Novitiate presided over by Archbishop Felix Toppo, followed by the burying of his ashes, in the Jesuit cemetery. In the evening, there was a meaningful public event at XISS, Ranchi, in which scholarship for two girls, daughters of Adivasi prisoners who worked for Adivasi communities, was given, as desired by Stan. The award money of Rs 25,000, given to Stan by NCHRO (National Confederation of Human Rights Organisations), was shared between the two girl students. There was also the release of Stan's memoirs – I Am Not A Silent Spectator, which was well received by many. Indian Social Institute, Bangalore, published Stan's memoirs. The book is not priced. CEN and MDU Provinces: A Pilgrimage for Justice

As a result of their discussions with the Consultors, Superiors and Team Leaders of both CEN-MDU Provinces, Fr. Jebamalai Irudayaraj and Fr. Danis Ponniah decided to make use of this occasion as a God-given opportunity to celebrate the prophetic life and mission of Fr. Stan by taking his cremains reverently to our communities in Tamil Nadu and pay our loving homage to this martyr of the modern times, in collaboration with the dioceses, religious congregations, laity and all people of goodwill.

Chennai

On July 17th evening, the urn containing the cremains of Fr. Stan reached Loyola College, Chennai, from ISI Bangalore. We started the Pilgrimage for Justice on July 18 with a solemn Eucharistic celebration in Christ the King church with Fr. Jebamalai Irudayaraj, Fr. Danis Ponniah and Fr. Francis P. Xavier as the principal celebrants. After the Mass, Mr. M. K. Stalin, the Honourable Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu, Ms. Kanimozhi MP, Mr. Dayanidhi Maran MP, Mr. Thol Thirumavazhavan MP, Mr. Inigo Irudayaraj MLA, Mr. Peter Alphonse, Chairman, Tamil Nadu Minorities Commission, followed by religious communities in groups came and paid homage to the urn of Fr. Stan. The urn was kept in the church till 3.30 p.m. for the public to pay homage



and then the civic function started in Betram Hall. Mr. Hariparandhaman, Retired Judge, Madras High Court, Most Rev. George Antonysamy, Archbishop of Madras-Mylapore and Rev. Dr.V. Devasagayam, Bishop of CSI-Madras Diocese, offered homage to Fr. Stan. The Jesuit communities in Chennai organized this event under the leadership of Fr. Francis P. Xavier, Rector, Loyola College.

Nagercoil

While one urn was taken to the dioceses in Chennai Province, the other which was in Kerala Jesuit Province was received reverently in the border between Kerala and Tamil Nadu by the Jesuits of Carmel community, Nagercoil, on July 21 and was kept in the Jesuit community for the homage and civic function on the following day jointly organized by the Jesuits of Thozhamai Illam and Carmel communities. On July 22, in the morning, a concelebrated Eucharist was organized to pray for Fr. Stan. We invited our staff, alumni and CRI representatives to take part in the Mass. Most Rev. Dr. Nazarene Soosai, Bishop of Kottar, our illustrious alumnus, also joined us during this graceful occasion. Throughout the day, a large number of priests, religious and laity from Kottar, Kuzhithurai and Marthandam dioceses came into our campus to pay their homage to Fr. Stan. Most Rev. Vincent Mar Paulose, Syro-Malankara Bishop of Marthandam, a few officials from the neighbouring dioceses, political leaders, representatives from many peoples' movements and NGOs paid their homage to Fr. Stan. We organized a civic function in the evening with a restricted number of people. Most Rev. Dr. Nazarene Soosai presided over it. The special speakers



included Dr. James R. Daniel, former Principal of Scott Christian College, *Ayyavazhi* Bala Prajaapathi, Mr Bellarmine ex-MP, Mr. Suresh Rajan, ex-Minister, and Mr. Hamim Musthafa, writer and professor. They all condemned the custodial killing of Fr. Stan and demanded the release of human rights defenders languishing in jails. The event was a clarion call to the participants to follow the footsteps of Fr. Stan in order to walk and work together for justice, peace and reconciliation in Kanyakumari District.

Thoothukudi

From Carmel, the urn was taken to Xaveriana, Thoothukudi on July 23. Fr. S. Arockiasamy, Superior of Xaveriana, carried the urn in procession from Xaveriana to St. Francis Xavier's School.

Fr. K. A. Augustine, Correspondent of the School,



arranged a prayer service for Fr. Stan in Arrupe Hall. Most Rev. Yvon Ambroise, D.D., Bishop Emeritus of Thoothukudi, blessed the urn and addressed the gathering in the morning. The urn was solemnly placed in Arrupe Hall for the public to pay their homage. At 5:00 p.m., the urn was taken by Fr. Victor Desoza to Snow Hall adjacent to the Basilica of Our Lady of Snows. In the civic function organized there, representatives from political parties, civil movements and our collaborators paid homage to Fr. Stan. Most Rev. Stephen Antony Pillai, D.D., our Bishop, spoke elaborately on the life and mission of Fr. Stan and inspired everyone to imbibe the courageous commitment of Fr. Stan. After the civic function, the urn was reverently handed over to St. Xavier's Community, Palayamkottai.

Palayamkottai

The mega public event on July 24 was meticulously planned by the Jesuits in collaboration with the local political, religious and civil movement leaders. Since permission was denied by the police to take the cremated remains in a procession to Vannarapettai, all

the leaders came to St. Xavier's to pay their respects to Fr. Stan and all went to the venue of the public meeting in a car procession of about 70 vehicles, with the portrait of Fr. Stan in front. Among the dignitaries were Most Rev. Antonysamy Savarimuthu, our Bishop, Mr. P. Abdul Samadu, MLA and General Secretary of Manitha Neya Makkal Katchi and Mr. Nellai Mubarak, State President, SDPI. All the local political leaders, religious heads and other activists participated in the protest meeting. The participants included priests, religious, party cadres, teachers from various institutions, and other like-minded men and women, all numbering about 1,000. The main demands made during the public event were, an international inquiry into the custodial death of Fr. Stan, proper legal action on those who were instrumental in his arrest and death, release of the other 15 human rights activists and repeal of the draconian laws. There was an overwhelming support and solidarity expressed by leaders of all groups to stand united in fighting for justice.



On July 25, in the evening, the cremated remains of Fr. Stan were taken to St. Xavier's Cathedral for the Holy Mass, presided over by Most Rev. Antonysamy Savarimuthu, Bishop of Palayamkottai. All parishioners paid homage to Fr. Stan. The next day the urn was taken to Shanthinagar Parish. An ecumenical meeting was organized by the members of SC and ST commission of Palayamkottai Diocese and a meaningful Mass was celebrated by Fr. Henry Jerome, Rector and Fr. Arul Ravi preached. On July 27, in the morning, a group of priests and members of SC/ST and Youth Commission of Tuticorin Diocese had a prayer service and Mass. In the evening, the cremated remains were taken to Kovilpatti for a prayer service. Then the urn was handed over to LAAS community in Madurai.

Dindigul

While the urn received from Kerala reached LAAS, the

other urn taken around the dioceses of CEN Province was brought from Mettupalayam to Beschi Illam on July 27. The Novices along with Jesuits from Beschi campus, gathered at the gate to welcome the brave Crusader for Justice back to where he had done his novitiate in the late 1950's. Fr. Michael Doss, Superior of Beschi Illam, and Fr. Antony Inigo, the Novice Master, carried the urn with reverence and respect for a short memorial service to the domestic chapel where Fr. Stan pronounced his First Vows in 1959. On July 28, at 8:00 a.m., all the Jesuits in Dindigul and Kodai Hills gathered for the Eucharistic celebration which was presided over by Fr. M. Devadoss. Fr. Stephen Martin emphatically elucidated in his short homily that our judicial system could be unjust to the extent of imprisoning the just and the innocent and be guilty of murder.

After the memorial Mass at Beschi on 28th morning, the urn was taken in procession to St. Joseph's Cathedral, where Fr. Danis Ponniah, our Provincial, handed it over to Most Rev. Thomas Paulsamy, Bishop of Dindigul. The urn was placed in the Cathedral on a beautifully decorated floral platform for people to pay their respects. Throughout the day, diocesan clergy, religious, groups of faithful from all the parishes of the diocese, teachers from many schools, and members of civil society came in large numbers to express their solidarity and be part of the Pilgrimage for Justice. The civic function was presided over by the Bishop and Fr. Provincial gave the inaugural address. There were many eminent political and religious leaders who strongly condemned the custodial killing of Fr. Stan



and also the unjust arrest of 15 other Human Rights activists. They condemned the atrocious, unjust activities of the union government and the NIA. They demanded the repeal of all unjust laws and expressed the importance of fighting for justice just like Fr. Stan. Following the letter of the POSA urging us to observe July 28 as a National Justice Day, the Provincial had written to all communities in the Province to mark July 28 as a National Justice Day to pay homage to Fr. Stan and to recommit ourselves to the mission of Truth and Justice. The press release by the Jesuit Provincial of India was translated into Tamil and was made available to all in advance. As the civic function in Dindigul coincided with the National Justice Day, the Tamil translation of the POSA's press release was read out by Fr. Stephen Martin before the press conference that concluded the civic function.

After the civic function, at 7:00 p.m., the urn was taken in a candlelight procession to St. Mary's Jesuit Residence. More than a thousand people took part in the procession. The participants carried candles in silence. There were also many banners with creative designs and concrete demands to ensure justice for Fr. Stan and other human rights defenders. On reaching St. Mary's, the Bishop handed over the urn to Fr. Stephen Martin. The final activity was the slogan raising as a group to raise our voices for the voiceless who face injustice in this country.

National Justice Day

The Jesuit community in Karumathur marked the National Justice Day with a public event in which prominent members of TN-CRI, religious communities in the neighbourhood, some members of the local parish and a few from other faiths participated. The front-yard of the Parish Church where the event took place was filled with an air of



deep sentiments of love and admiration for Fr. Stan and other crusaders of human rights languishing in jail. The event lasted for about 100 minutes and it described the life and works of Fr. Stan and the rich tributes that he had received from some notable members of the civil society. After listening to the Tamil version of the POSA's press release, those present listened to a set of resolutions that condemned State terrorism and voiced concerns about blatant suppression of human rights in the country. Finally, all read a statement/oath expressing their resolve to follow the footsteps of Fr. Stan and to stand in solidarity with the poor in their struggle for justice. The Jesuits in Madurai numbering about 60 along with their collaborators gathered at 6:00 p.m. on July 28 in front of the main gate of St. Mary's Cathedral to observe the National Justice Day. Some Sisters from the neighboring convents and the CRI President of the Madurai City also took part. All had lit candles and placards demanding justice for Fr. Stan and other human rights defenders languishing in jail. Frs. Xavier Antony, Albert William and Santhanam spoke on the importance of the day. Fr. Marianathan spoke about the POSA's press release the Tamil translation of which was read out by Fr. Stalin. Fr. Vijin led the participants to take a pledge and then all dispersed in silence.

In **Oriyur**, around 150 parishioners gathered in front of the Church of Our Lady of Good Health where St. John de Britto was martyred, to observe the National Justice Day. The event started with a short sharing on the life of Fr. Stan, a messenger of Justice, by Fr. Francis Sales. It was followed by the candlelight procession, adoration and Eucharistic celebration, which highlighted the need for us to become the ambassadors of justice in our day-to-day life.

In **Palayamkottai**, St. Xavier's community observed the National Justice Day with a candlelight procession on July 28. As a culmination of a four-day packed schedule of meetings, Masses and demonstrations with the cremated remains of Fr. Stan in and around the city with the support of political, civil and ecclesiastical groups, the National Justice Day was observed in a simple way recalling the sacrificial life of Fr. Stan and reflecting on the life of St. Ignatius.

Pilgrimage for Justice continued after the National Justice Day

Madurai

After the observance of the National Justice Day in Dindigul, the urn was taken to DACA, Madurai where Fr. M. Vargheesh Antony, Team Leader of DACA, received it and DACA community, the Madavaram Sisters of St. Anne and a few students paid prayerful tribute to Fr. Stan. On July 29, the urn was taken to St. Mary's, Madurai, where it was respectfully received by Most Rev. Antony Pappusamy, Archbishop of

Madurai, at 6:50 a.m. and placed in the Cathedral for homage. The religious sisters in the parish and the parish council members paid their homage by the placing of wreaths. The Archbishop celebrated Solemn Mass for the repose of the soul of Fr. Stan and concelebrating with him were the VG, VFs, Diocesan Curia Priests, Vicariate Priests, Religious Priests and the Jesuits in Madurai. At the end of the Mass, the Archbishop, the priests and the religious heads paid their floral tribute to Fr. Stan. The choir led by Sch. J. Alex Melvin Xavier of AAC, Karumathur, helped the participants experience the solemnity of the occasion. Fr. Maria Michael and his dedicated team and Madha TV videographed the Solemn Mass and the entire event of the Pilgrimage for Justice to telecast on August 1 on Madha TV.

After the Mass, the urn of Fr. Stan was kept for public homage from 9:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. At 4:45 p.m., it was carried to St. Mary's Higher Secondary School campus by Fr. S. Marianathan, Rector, and Advocate C.J. Rajan. As the urn moved forward step by step, the mood of the participants numbering around 500 got elevated along with the beating of *parai* and the

shouting of slogans seeking justice. After the urn was gently placed on a decorated podium, representatives of 17 political parties and 24 social movements paid floral tributes. The civic function was presided over by the Archbishop and 14 leaders representing different political parties and movements delivered speeches demanding posthumous justice to Fr. Stan and the repeal of oppressive laws. The entire event was organized by Advocate C.J. Rajan in collaboration with Fr. Marianathan, Fr. Stephen Lourdu Pragasam and Fr. Paul Mike.

Oriyur

On June 30, the cremated remains of Fr. Stan reached Oriyur. The parish council and the school staff organized a floral tribute followed by a silent rally which began at 10:30 a.m. from the New School entrance to St. Arulanandar Shrine. It was followed



by a meaningful Eucharistic celebration in which we prayed for Fr. Stan and invited all the faithful to join together in our struggle for establishing justice, peace and reconciliation.

Devakottai

A public function was organized on July 30th at 10:00 a.m., in Ananda College, presided over by Most Rev. Stephen Antony Pillai, Bishop of Tuticorin, and Mr. S. Mangudi, MLA, Karaikudi Constituency, Mr. Naga Krishnan (Thiruvalluvar Tamil Mandram), Mr. Janab Abdul Ajies Ajikari (Imam) and Mr. Shankar Subramanian (Tamil Nadu Writers Association) addressed the gathering and spoke against the injustice done to Fr. Stan. After the event at Oriyur,



the urn was brought to Devakottai in the afternoon and placed in the De Britto Hostel premises for the public to pay their homage. We had a Eucharistic celebration 6:00 p.m. in the Sahaya Matha Parish Church, Devakottai. Fr. Vincent Amalraj, Superior of De Britto, successfully organized the entire event in collaboration with the Jesuits, clergy, religious, political parties and civil movements.

Nagapattinam

On July 31, the urn containing the cremains of Fr. Stan reached *Kalangarai* in the evening. It was placed in the house chapel with due reverence. On August 1 morning, it was taken to the Church of Our Lady of Lourdes in Nagapattinam for the Holy Eucharist and for paying homage. The Mass started at 8:00 a.m., after which the urn was taken to the hall where arrangements for a public homage had been made. The event not only attracted the people of the parish but also people from other faiths. Numerous groups of people came in large numbers to pay their respects to the cremated remains of



Fr. Stan. The priests and religious in and around Nagapattinam and Tharangampadi towns paid their homage. Representatives of various political parties and people's movements flocked to pay homage to Fr. Stan and express their solidarity. The number of people who visited the place created a deep sense of solidarity and hope that humanity is still very much alive in the hearts of the people. As planned, the civic function started at 4:00 p.m. Religious leaders representing different faiths, social activists, and political leaders spoke about Fr. Stan and expressed their desire to take forward his life's mission.

Vilangudi and Viragalur

On August 1, in the evening, the urn was received at the entrance of VMI, Vilangudi. The pre-novices took it in a solemn candlelight procession to the residence. A soul-stirring prayer service was conducted for Fr. Stan and for the speedy release of



the other fifteen human rights defenders languishing in jail. On August 2, the urn was handed over to Most Rev. Antonysamy, Bishop of Kumbakonam, at Viragalur, Fr. Stan's birthplace. Our pre-novices were privileged to take part in the Pilgrimage for Justice at Viragalur. Prior to the event at Viragalur, Fr. Provincial had appointed a committee with Fr. Arul Oli as the convener to plan the event at Viragalur in coordination with the Diocese and the Parish Priest. The committee met with the Parish Priest and the members of the parish council and planned the event meticulously. It was truly a moment of grace for the people of Viragalur to have the cremated remains of Fr. Stan, the brave son of the soil who was martyred for justice. The procession took place at 4:00 p.m. with the urn being carried by Mr. Hirudayasamy, Fr. Stan's elder brother in a beautifully decorated car. As the procession reached the house where Fr. Stan had been born and brought up, the members of the bereaved family received the urn and spent with it a few precious moments they would love and cherish. The Holy Eucharist began at 5:00 p.m. with the Bishop as the main celebrant. Fr. Danis Ponniah, our Provincial, preached a very powerful and moving homily which consoled Fr. Stan's family members and villagers, and encouraged everyone to take the road less travelled just like Fr. Stan in order to establish justice, peace and reconciliation. After the Holy Eucharist, a civic function was organized, in which many eminent speakers spoke against injustice done to Fr. Stan and expressed their solidarity and commitment to fight together for justice.

Tiruchi

On August 3, the final day of the Pilgrimage for Justice, the urn was taken to St. Joseph's College, Fr. Stan's alma mater, where he had his early education. A large number of priests, religious and laity, from various parishes joined the procession organized to carry the urn containing the cremated remains of Fr. Stan. The procession started from the SJC



Museum at 8:00 a.m., with Fr. Rector carrying the urn in a decorated car. The church bells tolled and the Camboulives College Band played its mourning beats as the procession moved to Our Lady of Lourdes Church.

Fr. Danis Ponniah, our Provincial, presided over the concelebrated memorial Mass. Fr. Jebamalai Raja, CEN Provincial, preached a homily highlighting Fr. Stan's quest for justice with no room for compromise. After the Mass, following the two Provincials and the diocesan authorities, more than 2,000 people offered their floral homage to Stan's mortal remains till 1:00 p.m. strictly adhering to the COVID protocols. The memorial service ended with a concluding prayer led by Fr. Marivalan, the Parish Priest.

The urn was taken to St. Mary's Cathedral, Melapudur at 6:00 p.m. and laid near the altar for malar anjali. Fr. S. Arockiaraj, Bishop-Elect of Tiruchi Diocese, led a short memorial prayer and paid floral tributes, and the entire gathering followed him in paying their respects. Then, a civic function demanding justice for Fr. Stan and other human rights activists was held at the Parish Hall in the Cathedral campus. Fr. Leonard, Rector, welcomed the gathering. Bishop-Elect Fr. S. Arockiaraj, Fr. Provincial, Mr. Thirunavukarasar, Member of Parliament, Tiruchi, Ms. Balabharathi, Ex-MLA, Dindigul, Rt. Rev. Daniel Jeyaraj, TELC-Bishop, Mr. Henri Tiphagne, Director, People's Watch, Madurai, Mr. Nellai Mubarak, President, SDPI, Sr. Reginal, Superior General of St. Anne's, Tiruchi, and many other leaders spoke of the need to imbibe the prophetic and fighting spirit of Fr. Stan. Fr. Jebamalai Raja released Fr. Stan's book *I am not a Silent Spectator* and Mr. Hirudayasamy, the elder brother of Fr. Stan, received the first copy. The civic meeting ended with a vote of thanks proposed by Fr. T. Eugine, contact person for Tiruchi Diocese. The Pilgrimage for Justice, on its final day, was truly a memorable occasion to cherish and celebrate the life, mission and martyrdom of Fr. Stan. The Pilgrimage for Justice has not ended but has just begun and it is only by carrying forward the legacy of Fr. Stan, can we truly and meaningfully pay our homage to this Martyr of the Marginalized.

On July 31, our Founder's Feast was celebrated with grandeur while adhering to COVID-19 protocols. Fr. Superior was the main celebrant and Fr. Thayriam preached an inspiring festive homily. Novices artistically arranged cannonball-moment exhibits from the life of St. Ignatius which gained the applause of one and all.

JRS

The COVID lockdown blighted the life and the livelihood of Sri Lankan refugees who live in cramped camps across Tamil Nadu. Deeply aware of their vulnerability, JRS sprang into action and provided relief supplies to them. In order to ensure better protection, 925 refugees – mostly children, pregnant women, and elders – were provided with vaporizer, health-mix and hygiene kits; 230 thermometers were distributed to JRS Complementary Education Centers in 84 camps; dry rations were provided to 1,553 refugee families, with the help of philanthropic NGOs and some religious congregations. On June 7, the JRS-TN office in Beschi reopened as there was relaxation of lockdown measures.

Between June 1 and 11, JRS-TN facilitated four online interactive sessions between the staff of the Commissionerate of Rehabilitation and the representatives of Sri Lankan refugees. These online meetings enabled the COVID-afflicted refugees to seek due and quick redress from the government officials.

On June 20, a virtual observance of the World Refugee Day was organized to drive home the message: "Together we heal, learn and shine." Speaking on the occasion, Mrs. Jesintha Lazarus, IAS, Director of Rehabilitation Commissionerate, appreciated the JRS mission in Tamil Nadu and pledged her team's support for the wellbeing of the refugees.

On June 22, a webinar was hosted by JRS in view of spreading awareness on the rights of refugees and the prospect of their local integration as citizens of India. Advocate Romeo Roy Alfred enlightened an audience of 70 refugee youths on that occasion.

The Complementary Education Teachers of JRS-TN took part in the online teacher training programme from July 5 to 10. An advanced level programme of Intensive English Training has started in seven camps on July 15 for the refugee students. As we are warned of a possible COVID Third Wave, sessions on COVID prevention and hygiene practices were organized for the camp inmates in the second week of July. From

June 18 to 23, a six-day online workshop was arranged by the JMAADD team from Arrupe Sukalayam, Mullaikudi. This enabled 21 JRS staff members to conduct awareness sessions for the camp inmates in 94 camps, identify the drug dependents in the camps and assist in their rehabilitation.

Having concern for the livelihood of the refugees, JRS-TN organizes lots of livelihood training programmes such as tailoring, sanitary pad production and an income generating programme for the refugee women. About 160 women participated in this month's programmes and started small scale businesses after the training. On July 28 and 29, a monthly review meeting for the staff was held in the JRS-TN office. Dr. A. Siluvairaja, Assistant Professor, LIBA, Chennai conducted career guidance for the staff and explained the possibilities to pursue higher studies for the refugee students who completed their schooling.
