

On 31 July, Father Arturo Sosa, Superior General, began the celebration of the feast of Saint Ignatius of Loyola by retracing the path that the founder of the Society of Jesus had walked on 500 years ago. Accompanied by a small group of young people, the Superior General walked a few kilometers of the "Camino Ignaciano" ("Ignatian Way"), ending up in Manresa, an important stage in the conversion experience of Saint Ignatius. The Camino Ignaciano is a 665-kilometre pilgrimage route that begins in Loyola and ends in Manresa. It is the same route that Ignatius followed at the beginning of his "new life". Recently added to the Camino is the leg to Barcelona, which was where the pilgrim headed after his stay in Manresa, hoping to board a ship to the Holy Land.



The Eucharistic celebration at Manresa by the Superior General on the feast of St. Ignatius of Loyola holds a very significant place for this jubilee year since it was here that the founder of the Society of Jesus had what is called an "illumination," an inner understanding of his relationship with God and the plans the Lord had for him.

Having walked the 655 kms, Ignatius was already a "pilgrim" when he arrived in Manresa from his fiefdom in Loyola. He was aware of his spiritual poverty: he was looking for the way to true richness on this level. He was also experiencing the material poverty of the pilgrim who has left material conveniences to place himself in the hands of the Lord and to rely on the help of those who would welcome him.

VOCATION PROMOTION

'Come and See' Programme: 28 boys for Patna Province and 3 for Delhi Province (thus a total of 31 boys) had participated in the 'Come and See' Programme held at Sewa Kendra, Patna on 4-11 July 2021. Of them, 24 boys for Patna and all 3 for Delhi were selected. 14 were sent to Xavier Nilaya, Bangalore, 6 each to the Candidates' House of Jamshedpur and Dumka-Raiganj Provinces, and 1 was admitted to Pre-Novitiate, Sanjivan Niwas, Patna.

CANDIDATES AND PRE-NOVICES

Candidates' House - Xavier Nilaya, Bangalore: There are 22 Candidates in XN Bangalore – 13 for Patna Province and 9 for Delhi Province.

KR Candidates' House, Bettiah: There are 15 Candidates in KR Candidates' House, Bettiah – 9 First years and 6 Second years. All of them are for Patna Province.

Pre-Novitiate – Sanjivan Niwas, Patna: There are 20 Pre-Novices in Sanjivan Niwas, Patna – 12 for Patna Province, 3 each for Delhi and Jamshedpur Provinces, and 2 for Dumka Province. Jesuits from all communities and ministries are most welcome to drop in to visit and encourage our young men.

Manish was admitted to Holy Family hospital for Covid. After spending 15 days in the hospital, he spent a month at Xavier Bhawan for recuperation. Br. Abe went to Patna to get a pacemaker implant since his heart beat was below normal. It was successfully done at Ruben Hospital, Patna on 12th July. After spending a few days at Xavier Bhawan, he is back home with the same vigor and enthusiasm. Fr. Joe Thadavanal too had gone to Patna for a medical checkup. Fr. Vimal accompanied both of them and made sure that they are back in the community safe and sound. Fr. Saji is busy with the school work and updating himself with the CBSE regulations. We are having our monthly recollections on the topics given to us by the Province. On 25th July, as directed by the Holy Father, we honoured our seniors (Br. Abe, Frs. Joe and Albert). Their sharing lifted up our spirits to look forward to our future with joy and enthusiasm. On 28th July, four of us joined Fr. Gabriel Michael at Chenari for his Golden Jubilee celebrations. School and Non Formal Teachers was organized on 29 July. The seminar was conducted by Fr. Periyanayagam, who is an expert in Ignatian Spirituality. The seminar was very inspiring and touching. All the students and parents were connected for the video show online. On 30 July, on the eve of the feast of St. Ignatius of Loyola, we had a short prayer service organized by the teachers. On the same day the school bade farewell to Mr. Prabhat Seraphim of Primary Section of K.R. School. On this special occasion Fr. Rector, Joe Maripuram, who was the chief guest, gave the message. All the students and the parents were connected online for this special program. St. Xavier's School had seminar on Ignatian themes conducted by Fr. Periyanyagam on same day.



CBSE results of Class XII were published on 30 July and one of our candidates Anand Jaimon of St. Xavier's School, scored 98.4 percent marks. He is the topper in St. Xavier's School, Bettiah. On 31 July, the feast of St. Ignatius, we had solemn Eucharistic celebration in the morning. Fr. Rector was the main

celebrant. In the afternoon our attached communities, Ratanpurwa, Gaunaha and READ, and candidates were invited for the lunch to share brotherly love and joy. At 3.30 pm we had tea with our co-workers.

Bodhgaya - Jeevan Sangham: As the Corona pandemic lockdown restrictions were being relaxed gradually, our village education program and residential education program were resumed in June and picked up vibrancy in July. The workshops organized for village teachers, student leaders, and community leaders on ecology and forest are a starting point for a deeper engagement in future to care for the terrain and forests in Barachatti-Sherghatti belt. The students have been introduced to Tarumitra; student leaders have been given the responsibility to form Tarumitra groups in their own villages. As an incentive, prizes have been announced for those leaders with maximum membership of children. The students along with their parents have so far planted over 500 plants. Another 500 plants are expected to be planted soon.

Enhancing the academic competency of our children is a major challenge before us. Analysis of performance of students through a Baseline Competency Test, setting up syllabus based on the findings of the Baseline Test, training of teachers, making available a large set of questions for practice are some initiatives taken by **Fr. John Ravi** with the hope of making a breakthrough in the academic competency of our students.

Hardships and deprivations are visible in the life of village people, especially the Dalits and other economically weaker sections. With help

from generous donors, God enabled us to reach out to more 400 than households with dry ration; and 800 people with face masks, washing soap, etc.; and, 40 children with nutrition kit. We grateful are to Loyola School, Pune, **Fatima** Mata Susamachaar Kendra, Digha, BDVS, Patna, and Nazareth

More recently, we received help from *Missio* for providing dry ration to 1000 households in response to a request by **Fr. Lawrence Eucharist** through the PDD.

We organized health campaigns in five panchayats. During these campaigns, we heard stories from the field on selfless medical care provided to people by the Registered Medical Practitioners (RMPs or village doctors). In many cases, these village doctors have saved lives of those who were rejected admission by hospitals and doctors. These stories propelled us to network with them. We provided them with non-prescriptive medicines for making them available to the needy on their visits to interior villages. We organized a public function to recognize as well as to honor them for their dedicated service at the peak of the second wave of the pandemic that swept the villages. The function, which honored about 70 country doctors with certificates of appreciation, was an opt response to the genuine demand of these hitherto unnoticed heroes or the frontline health workers.

The civil society network at Jeevan Sangham organized a silent march and public function on 7 July to protest the custodial death of Fr. Stan Samy. A memorial Mass was offered for him by us, together with the SRA sisters. Fr. Cyriac was given a very touching farewell as he moved to Xavier Bhawan. His farewell taught us a few lessons on love - he, being a teacher all through his life as a Jesuit Priest, had come to love our children in the campus. The Dialogue ministry under the leadership of Fr. Lawrence Eucharist is exploring networking with diocesan initiatives in interreligious dialogue and peace mission in Rajgir and Vaishali. The month ended with a solemn celebration of the Feast of St. Ignatius. - Anto Joseph

On the opening day of the college, there was an icebreaking session for the students as well the teachers. There was also an awareness session regarding the social distance that has to be maintained. The students had the chance to share what they have realized and how God has touched them during the prolonged lockdown. It was indeed a good experience for all, including the teachers. All the teachers were involved in the curriculum redesigning for the academic year 2021 onwards for B.Ed. as well as M.Ed. students. MOSAICS IN MANRESA

A space of encounter in 500 square meters of mosaics in Manresa: The Slovenian artist and Jesuit Marko Rupnik and his team, made up of some twenty people from different countries around the world, have worked intensely at the Shrine of the Cave of Saint Ignatius, in Manresa, installing the set of mosaics they have created for the side naves of the Slovenian artist and Jesuit Marko Rupnik and his team, made up of some twenty people from different countries around the world, have worked intensely at the Shrine of the Cave of Saint Ignatius, in Manresa, installing the set of mosaics they have created for the side naves of the Shrine.

The work captivates all who contemplate it, for the strength of its message, its beauty and the fascinating process involved in its creation. There are more than 550 square metres of mosaics, showing the Christian pilgrimage through the Spiritual Exercises. "An itinerary of prayer," the artist himself explained, "in which one moves from a professed Catholicism to a lived faith."

In 2015, Marko Ivan Rupnik came to *La Cova de Sant Ignasi* and was offered the opportunity to present, through his art and from the experience of the Spiritual Exercises, the story of Salvation. From then on he worked with his team at the *Centro Aletti* in

Rome to design each of the eight rooms that form the side naves of the church. When Rupnik and his team arrived in Manresa in March 2021, they unpacked several containers: marble from the five continents, crystals glazed with pigments selected from all over the world, gold and silver ceramic pieces, and more. But what was really important was the team of 22 artisans, of more than ten different nationalities, who worked day and night to complete the mosaics in two weeks. With Rupnik they had studied Eastern and Western Christian traditions, mastered different forms of art, ancient icons, classical mosaics, the Bible, history. They also made their work a time of prayer. In the experience of living the faith lies the energy to transmit the sacred story in this contemporary work of art that we contemplate today.
