Seventy two patients already UNDER treatment for Diabetes were specially tested. Several tests were done. Nutrition counseling was given to counteract and control the disease. The camp was organized by the Church, Parish Council and SVP. The presence of our Bishop Shyamal at the inauguration was deeply appreciated. It was a memorable day for all of us.

Udayani News

A one-day human rights training was organized on November 13 for the Udayani Staff. The Calcutta High Court lawyer and social activist, Mr. Zameer Khan conducted the training. This sharpened their legal knowledge and enabled them to conduct the same training for SHG women in villages.



Udayani continues to campaign for the extension of free ration to all people under the Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Anna Yojna (PMGKAY) during the entire COVID period. In collaboration with the Right to Food and Work Network West Bengal (RTFWN), a national day of action was called on November 22 across the State to demand for the extension of free ration distribution under the PMGKAY, restoration of free ration to Rajya Khadya SurkshaYojna (RKSY-2) ration card holders, universalization of Public Distribution System (PDS) and 14 kilos of food grains, 1.5 kilos pulse and 800 ml of edible oil per head every month as per the ICMR guidelines. In each block, SHG women actively participated in the campaign, organized at public places with placards, posters and leaflets. SHG women submitted a deputation to the Food and Consumer Affairs Minister through the local government officials in different blocks.

The first ever online children's day celebration was organized by St. Xavier's University students for rural children on November 22. Children from all the five centers of Udayani participated in the live programs. They performed cultural dances and watched each other's program online. It was

a unique celebration during the pandemic period which children enjoyed together on this occasion.

St. Xavier's College, Kolkata

The International Webinar on "The COVID-19 Pandemic - Lives, Livelihood and Challenges", presented by the Department of Economics and Yunus Centre - supported by the College Alumni Association became a grand event on October 8. The Webinar, featuring Nobel Laureate Prof. Muhammad Yunus and the Keynote Address by Fr. Dr. Dominic Savio, the Principal of the College, had received extensive coverage by the media.

A unique effort to bring smiles to the helpless victims of COVID-19 and Amphan was initiated by the College by the name of "FESTIVAL OF GIVING" with the support of the Alumni, where a fresh consignment of gift items including dress materials like Sarees, Lungis, Dhotis, Vests and essential items like face masks, mosquito nets for 800 poor rural families of the Sundarbans was formally flagged off by Fr. Dominic on October 19.



On October 20, the 15th Edition of Knowledge and Ideas X-change Series organized a webinar on the topic "DOs & DON'Ts in the upcoming Festive season amidst COVID pandemic". The inaugural address was given by Fr. Dominic and Dr. Shiv Kumar Sarin, the Padma Bhushan Awardee was the resource person.

The Ph.D. Pre-Submission Seminar paper was well presented by **Fr. Milton Costa** on October 29. The title of his thesis is "the Socio-economic Conditions of Women Workers in the Garment Industry of Bangladesh."

After the University of Calcutta granted its permission to St. Xavier's College in 2015 to independently initiate a Ph.D. program, the first Ph.D. Open Viva-Voce Examination took place on November 10. Mrs. Ritun C. Chaudhuri, a registered Ph.D. scholar under the supervision of Dr. Kasturi Sarkar in the Dept. of Microbiology, had appeared for the examination in online mode. The College has currently 43 Ph.D. Supervisors and 69 research scholars in all, enrolled across the departments of Physics, Microbiology, Biotechnology and Commerce.

On November 14, the Xaverians had chosen to spread the happiness of Kalipuja and Diwali, which coincided with Children's day celebration, by sharing gifts with some differently abled children and children with cognitive challenges. Around 800 children from three NGOs got new clothes, chocolates and other gifts. Fr. Dominic, the Principal, along with **Fr. Joseph Kulandai**, the VP (Morning) and **Fr. Peter Arockiam**, the VP (Evening), distributed the gifts. The distribution drive was the first leg of a special initiative called

JRS Bd Celebrates 40th Anniversary of Jesuit Refugee Service (JRS) & 3 years of JRS-CB collaboration in Bangladesh

JRS Bangladesh was full of activities in November. The event worth remembering is the celebration of JRS 40 and 3 years of JRS-CB collaboration in Bangladesh on November 14 in eleven MCACs in Rohingya Camps and Ukhiya CB Office, Cox's Bazar, Bangladesh. Two JRS Bd team members, **Fr. Jerry** and **Fr. Francis** took part in the event.

Banners and flex boards were prepared to celebrate the event. Fr. Jerry composed a message on JRS 40 and 3 years of JRS-CB collaboration in English version, and got it translated into Burmese by Rosalyn Kayah, Country Director of JRS Myanmar. With the English and Burmese versions of the message, flex boards were prepared. They were hung in the centers to celebrate the event. The recently renovated centers with decorations threw a different look on that day.

Two documentaries were prepared to celebrate the event. One was prepared by **Fr. Jeyaraj** (with the help of JRS team) and the other one by MCAC team. 'A Tribute of Gratitude to JRS by the Rohingya Refugee Children' (which is available on YouTube) is the name of the documentary prepared by Fr. Jeyaraj in honor of JRS Founder, Fr. Pedro Arrupe. It was shown in eleven MCACs in Rohingya Camps dividing the participants in small groups. It was followed by a sharing session. Snacks were provided to the participants (nearly eight hundred from the Rohingya community) in eleven MCACs in Rohingya Camps. The volunteers went with snacks to the homes where 60 Rohingya children with special needs live. Beside the invitees, whoever came to the centers were greeted with sweets. In this way, half the day was spent in the celebrative mood in the camps.

The celebration at Ukhiya CB Office began on November 14 with a good lunch. Nearly 85 participants took part in that event. The two above-mentioned documentaries were shown to the participants followed by their sharing. CB-JRS members expressed gratitude to each other. Ukhiya program ended in the evening with snacks.

The event was celebrated throughout November. Something beautiful happened in Center one called 'Hope' in the camp. The management team members of 'Hope' made arrangements by themselves and invited CB-JRS members to celebrate the event on November 14. Everybody appreciated them for the initiative. Fr. Jerry went there again on November 18. On that day, the two above-mentioned documentaries were shown to 35 Rohingya participants followed by their sharing and snacks.

Obituary of Fr. Robert Wirth

On November 4, 2020 the Lord called him to Eternal Life. He died at Mater Dei Hospital, Imsida, Malta at 86 years of age after 69 years in the Society. The Funeral was held on

November 5, 2020 at 10.15 a.m. at the Parish Church of Naxxar

Fr. Robbie, as he was affectionately called, was born in Valletta (Malta) on February 12, 1934. He joined the Society on October 2, 1951 at Loyola House, Naxxar and pronounced his Final vows on August 15, 1969 at Sahibganj, India. The first year of his Juniorate



was done at Loyola House. But in 1954 he went to India as a missionary and worked there till 1990. He continued his Juniorate at Vinalaya, Bombay. Then in 1956, he went to De Nobili College in Pune for Philosophy. He started his regency in 1959 at St. Joseph's College, Darjeeling. The following year, he again went to Pune for theology. He was ordained a priest at Guhiajori in the Santal Mission on March 24, 1963. After theology, he went to La Providence, Kodaikanal for Tertianship. In 1965, he was sent to Bangalore, as the Spiritual Father of the College boys. The following year, he was appointed as an Assistant Pastor at Dudhani and Vice Principal at St. Xavier's College, Sahibganj. He was in charge of the boarders and taught some classes. In 1971, he went to St. Joseph's College, Guhiajori, as Minister and Treasurer. In 1972, The Provincial of Calcutta Province asked the Regional Superior of the Santal Region to send Robbie to Calcutta and be appointed as the National Promoter of the Leadership Training Service (LTS). During the 18 years that he held this office, he travelled to many parts of India to promote and establish the Movement in many Christian Colleges and conducted training courses. He prepared and printed Manuals and other literature for the members of the holistic formation of youth.

In 1991, Robbie returned to Malta and was posted as Pastoral Co-ordinator at the Sixth Form of St. Aloysius' College. The following year, he was appointed as the Chaplain of the University of Malta. After three years, he was sent to St. Aloysius' College and was in charge of organizing the meetings of Parents and teachers in Ignatian Spirituality.

In 1999, he was appointed Superior at Xavier House, Valletta and continued his work at St. Aloysius'. His next posting was in 2002 as Superior at Loyola House, Naxxar, and Administrator of the Province infirmary. In 2008, he joined the Community at Sarria House, Floriana and for some years was in charge of the pastoral care of our benefactors.

Fr. Robbie is known to make phone calls to his Jesuit companions on their birthday and also many family and friends. As prefect of discipline in St.Aloysius College, he was also known for his personal care to students. In fact, he was known as 'Fr. I love you all', because every day the first thing he used to say to his students was 'I love you all!'. Fr. Robbie was also known for his spirituality and depth in accompanying people. Many used to go to him for spiritual insight, for confession and for good counsel. Fr. Robbie aged gracefully and continued to remain up to date with technology. This enabled him to remain occupied all the time and also keep in touch with so many people from all over the world whose lives he touched.

Due to ill health, in 2018, he went to Loyola House, Naxxar. On Sunday, November 1, 2019, he was diagnosed with Covid 19 and was admitted at Mater Dei Hospital. The Lord called him in the morning of November 4, 2019. Let us remember him with the fraternal affection in prayer.
