JESU ASHRAM

All of us at Jesu Ashram, the staff, nursing students, FC Sisters and Jesuits were aware of the spread of covid-19 pandemic in the world. Dr Louis Tirkey, the associate Professor of North Bengal Medical College and hospital and Dr Pankaj Chowdhary, an Oncologist have been giving us inputs on covid-19. We succeeded in protecting one hundred and fifty

two Jesuit novices who had come for their hospital experiment and two



nursing staff, ten nursing students and three patients. An isolation ward was set up and all the infected were shifted there. Dr Louis Tirkey began a treatment plan for all. Providentially Sr Gita FC, one of the core members of the administration, was not infected. She assumed the charge of running Jesu Ashram. Fr Anthony T Kollakkompil, the director of Loyola Pastoral Centre, Matigara, came to our rescue in buying food provisions and medicines. The Provincial, Fr John Wilfred Lobo kept a close watch on the situation at Jesu Ashram, visiting the campus practically every day. At present there are seventeen of us out of isolation but recuperating, four continue to be in isolation. I would like to thank Fr John Wilfred Lobo, my Provincial, Dr Louis Tirkey, Fr Anthony T Kollakkompil, Sr Antonia FC, who guided all the nursing students how to take care of covid-19 patients, Sr Gita FC, and our staff for supporting all the covid-19 infected people.

It is unfortunate that even in the 21st century leprosy patients are rejected and despised by their near and dear ones. Many leprosy patients are forced to stay on railway platforms, footpaths and in inhuman conditions.



Their livelihood most of the time is begging in the streets. In Jesu Ashram, leprosy patients find that there are people who love and care. Through the help of **SOS India**, Jesu Ashram completed constructing two houses for rehabilitating twelve leprosy patients at Lenin colony adjacent to Jesu Ashram campus. **Novara Centre**, Italy, whose president is **Angela Beani** sponsored construction of a bore-well and water tanks. Beside the twelve mentioned above, other leprosy patients living in the village and school going students will be able to get safe drinking water from the project. **Novara** Centre also sponsored training for gardening for the leprosy patients currently under treatment at Jesu Ashram. Eighteen leprosy patients were taught to grow flowers. This gives them an opportunity to learn floriculture and the possibility of a livelihood. On behalf of the leprosy affected people, I would like to thank Novara Centre and SOS India.

The department of health, Govt. of West Bengal, provided fifty rapid antigen test kits and they have promised more if need be. Jesu Ashram is authorized to test all the tuberculosis patients for covid-19. Till date we have tested fifteen people.

I would like to thank each and every one of you, for your generous help in carrying forward the healing mission of Jesu Ashram.

training.

The mushroom training program of Hayden Hall has taken off well. At the end of training mushroom seed beds (aka, cylinders) were given as certificates by the trainer. The painstaking efforts of **Mr Agnel Prem**

Tshering Lepcha, Mr Mark Mukhia, Mr Dawa Lepcha and Mr Dechen Lepcha in nurturing the seeds and making sure that nothing of the training went amiss, have really proven that with hard work and determination



everything is possible.

Bamboo is grown ubiquitously in North Eastern India. In recent years there's been a lot of research in bamboo products. It can be an extremely good alternative construction material because it is easy to grow, it is fibrous and tensile. Considering the above a ten-day bamboo training workshop is being organized at Hayden Hall from 23 November to 2 December. We began with a short orientation for the trainees conducted by **Ms Babita Biswakarma** and **Mr Cassian Dukpa**, two of our staff. There are 8 young trainees mostly from the tea gardens of Darjeeling. During these ten days, the trainer **Mr Titus Rai** from Liza Hill, Darjeeling,



will be trying to equip our youth with livelihood skills in indigenous craft with easily available material.

Hayden Hall is moving towards 'Earth Care and People Care'. In doing so, we have started making compost with the food waste. We have installed composters and our sustainable warriors have started their journey in this waste management.
