I was happily received by **Sch. Amit** and my new Superior **Fr. Xavier Nucci** at the airport. Thanks to our two companions for not letting me get lost at the huge airport. Thus, I was warmly welcomed by the community. We are 36 members in the community from 9 different Jesuit provinces.

For the first time, I am having a strong experience of universal Society of Jesus. The things are fine with me although there are cultural and language difficulties. At the moment, I have not yet enrolled myself to the language courses.

Overall, I am doing well and am trying to get used to the things here. **Schols. Amit** and **George** are busy with their studies, tri-semester assignments and dissertation works. The situation of Covid-19 is not bad here. According to the government, the mass vaccination in France will start from January in priority. The rest is fine with us. Kindly keep us into your prayers. We too assure you of ours.

OBITUARY OF Br. LAWRENCE RICHARD SALDANHA SJ [7 Jul 1937 - 17 Nov.2020]

Laurie (as Br. Lawrence liked to be called) was one of the two vocations to Hazaribag Jesuits from Mangalore. The other is Bro. Francis Mathias still happily with us. Both are from the parish of Immaculate Conception, Kinnigoly. They joined the Society together on 01 February 1962. Both worked for some time before joining. Both came to know the Hazaribag Jesuits through Fr. Ian Travers-Ball, later to become Bro. Andrew, the founder of the Missionaries of Charity, Brothers.



After his primary schooling Laurie moved to Bombay to live with his brother and do High School studies. Later he worked with Firestone Tyre Company; then he spent some time with the Shanghai Bank, and worked in a hotel. It was a foretaste of his life in the Society, where he had many appointments. Brothers are always in great demand, especially as Ministers. He was Minister in Mahuadanr, in Manresa House, Ranchi, at St. Stanislaus College Sitagarha, Loyola Centre (then the Provincial's Residence), and in his old age at St. Louis School, Balidih, Bokaro.

Laurie's novitiate was in the Brothers' Novitiate in Sitagarha, under Fr. Martin Topno. In his life in the Society he had a number of periods of technical training. After the novitiate he did a course at St. Joseph's Technical Institute in Pune, and a computer course at XLRI, Jamshedpur. In Australia, where he had Tertianship, he worked with an experienced motor mechanic for some time and he did a special course in spoken English at the University of New South Wales.

Shortly after his final vows we find him NBCLC, Bangalore for a Church renewal Theology Course. Laurie was probably happiest in his years in Mahuadanr. There he was, as well as Minister of the community, general 'mister-fix-it' of the compound. While in Mahuadanr he worked with a number of Australian volunteers on different projects sponsored by the Indian Aid organization.

In 2012 some health problems and failing eyesight made it necessary to move from an active life to retirement in St. Xavier's, Hazaribag. There he lived quietly. He is remembered as first in the chapel in the morning, putting on lights, setting up the altar for Mass and waiting in prayer for Mass to start. He took books from the library, enjoying especially books in large print for those with sight problems.

The last years of his life were spent in the infirmary wing of St. Stanislaus' College. This year his health deteriorated and his mental faculties faded. After some time in the Holy Cross hospital, Tarwa, he returned to his room in the infirmary where he died quietly on 17 November 2020. We pray that he will use his influence with the many Coadjutor Brothers in the communion of Jesuit Saints in glory to send more vocations to our Province. **Fr. William Dwyer sj.**
