From the Provincial's Desk

A MIRROR AND A WAKE UP CALL

Dear Friends in the Lord,

The webinar we organized for the KCBC and the KCMS on November 27 is still fresh in my mind. The update on the case of Fr Stan Swamy and the search for the way ahead brought clarity to many. Fr Stan's commitment to the Adivasi people was perceived as keeping in line with his religious vocation, the Jesuit tradition of faith that does justice, and the Constitution of India. It has serious implications for the Church's mission too, especially amidst fake news, counter propaganda and 'safe' judicial silence. The seriousness of the situation is very evident.

Fr Stan comes to us as a mirror reflecting the hard reality underneath the shiny surface of the country - the deplorable state of the tribal people, the subhuman condition of our jails, the snail's pace of our judicial system, and the increasing grip of draconian laws. Yet, "humanity is bubbling in Taloja jail", as Fr Stan writes with candour.

Fr Stan's arrest is a wakeup call. It wakes us to the social teaching of the Church that is still a "best kept secret" in the Indian Church. It invites us to take political activity and political processes more seriously. It asks us to see the vital link between the Christian principles and the values that the Indian Constitution embodies. Let us continue to stand with Stan – and what he stood for.




SANTHINILAYAM, KOTTAYAM

JESUIT REFUGEE SERVICE (JRS), BAMYAN

November offered despondent moments to the Jesuit Refugee Service (JRS), Bamyan. Since the fall of Taliban in 2001, Bamyan was the safest place in Afghanistan. But a double bomb explosion occurred on Nov 24, 2020 claiming 19 lives and leaving 59 injured. Though the motive was unclear, the miscreants have created havoc and panic in the minds of the people. Common spaces still loom the wounded memories of the lost ones. JRS has temporarily suspended all its activities in Bamyan for two weeks. Currently there are five Jesuits available in Afghanistan who are spread around Kabul, Herat, Bamyan and Daikundi. Fr Robert Rodrigues (KAR) and Br Sandesh Gonsalves (BOM) are available in Kabul. Fr Jesuraja (MDU), Sch Ronald Antony (CEN) and Fr Linto Kanichai (KER) operate from Bamyan. The new Country Director (CD) designate for JRS mission Afghanistan is Fr Jerome Sequiera (JAM). Gratitude to Fr Stan Fernandes (PUN) who served in the capacity of CD for the past 13 years.

MEETING WITH THE KCBC AND THE MAJOR SUPERIORS OF KERALA

Fr Provincial took initiative to organize a webinar on behalf of the Kerala Province and the JCSA in connection with the arrest of **Fr Stan Swamy**. The participants were exclusively the Cardinals, Archbishops and bishops of Kerala Church, and major superiors of religious congregations in Kerala cutting across rites. The meeting started with a prayer led by **Fr Prince Clarence**. Fr Provincial welcomed the gathering and explained the objectives of the meeting: to take stock of the developments after the arrest of Fr Stan Swamy, to look at its implications for the Church's mission and to elicit suggestions for further action. **Fr Stanislaus D'Souza**, POSA, logged in and gave a brief opening message. In his address, the clarified that the Society owns up the mission of Fr Stan Swamy and said that his ministry among the Tribals is in line with the Jesuit apostolic priorities.

Fr Siji Chacko (Director, Development and Communications, JCSA) presented the current status of the case. **Fr Joe Xavier** (Director, ISI-Bangalore) provided an excellent update of the legal proceedings. He recommended organizing symbolic protests like collecting sippers and blankets and sending them in bulk to Taloja jail as part of the campaign. The organizers were keen that the focus should not be merely on the person of Fr Stan but rather on larger issues of human rights and justice.

The following are a few suggestions that emerged in the webinar:

- The issues related to the case of Fr Stan are yet to reach the public sphere and Church circles in Kerala. To achieve this, relevant details related to his ministry and the developments after his arrest must be made available to people.
- A delegation of the Church officials could meet either the Prime Minister or other Ministers with key portfolios and present our concerns.
- Adequate measures must be taken to counter the negative propaganda in the social media against Fr Stan labelling him as a Maoist and a terrorist.
- The youth in the Catholic parishes must be mobilised to organize non-violent protests against the silencing of Fr Stan and other human right defenders.
- The issue must be adequately addressed both legally and diplomatically.
- It is important to join the secular groups and persons who have come out in open support of Fr Stan Swamy and others in similar conditions.

The webinar helped to create a deeper awareness of the issue accompanied by a collective owning up of the cause Fr Stan Swamy stood for. The suggestions for concrete action at the ecclesial level must be followed up. The participants appreciated the Jesuit way of approaching crucial issues of this kind and asked for related materials for future use.

Fr Binoy moderated the sessions and **Fr PT Mathew** proposed the vote of thanks.
