Beatification Process of the Servant of God Louis Marie Léveil Approval by Vatican for the Documents of the Diocesan Inquiry

The Diocesan Inquiry of the Beatification Process of the Servant of God Louis Marie Léveil was concluded with the closing session held on 30 June 2019 at Sarugani. The documents of the diocesan inquiry, submitted to the Apostolic Nuncio, New Delhi, on 09 July 2019 in two trunks, were shipped to the Congregation for the Causes of Saints, Rome. The two trunks were opened at the Vatican Office on 11 November 2019, all the documents were checked, classified and sent for verification in January 2020.

Having verified all the submitted documents of the diocesan inquiry, the Congregation for the Causes of Saints issued the Validity Certificate (*Validitas*) to the Cause of Léveil on 30 October 2020. The Congregation declared, “The Diocesan Inquiry, which was conducted in the Ecclesiastical Curia of Sivagangai as the principal place and in the Ecclesiastical Curia of Rennes – France as Rogatory place on the life and virtues and also of the fame of sanctity and signs of the Servant of God Louis Marie Léveil, a professed priest of the Society of Jesus, is valid. And the witnesses were rightly and correctly examined and legitimately and properly recorded with regard to the matter concerned.”

The Congregation for the Causes of Saints has also given the direction to proceed with the preparation of the Positio – ‘a comprehensive and scientific report’ on the documents of the diocesan inquiry which were submitted to it.

On this occasion, I extend my sincere gratitude to all who have rendered their valuable cooperation and collaboration in preparing the documents successfully. In particular, I thank our Bishop Emeritus J. Susaimanickam, the College of Consultors, the members of the Historical Commission, Board of Inquiry and Theological Commission. I thank Rev. Fr. Danis Ponniah, Provincial – Jesuit Madurai Province, Rev. Fr. Jebamalai Raja, Provincial – Jesuit Chennai Province and all the Jesuit priests and brothers who have contributed to the process. I gratefully remember all the religious sisters and brothers and the lay faithful who were involved in the process of preparing the documents of the diocesan inquiry.

I request you all to continue to pray for the success of the Beatification Process of the Servant of God Louis Marie Léveil.

Health Update

SXC, Palayamkottai

Sch. Ragu Antony and **Fr. S. Mariadoss** tested positive for COVID-19 and got admitted in Apollo Hospital, Madurai, on 12.11.20 and 13.11.20, respectively. Since their admission to COVID ward, their oxygen saturation level was normal and their condition was also very stable. Sch. Ragu Antony was given antiviral injection consecutively for five days and Fr. S. Mariadoss for seven days. They were discharged on November 21st. Both returned to SXC, Palayamkottai and resumed their normal activities after a 14-day quarantine.

Fr. Henry Jerome, Fr. Elias, Fr. Loyola Savari and **Br. Irudayam** were discharged from Apollo Hospital, Madurai, on November 13th and returned to Palayamkottai for a fortnight’s quarantine. All of them were keeping well and regularly taking medicines prescribed by the doctor. They reported back to Apollo Hospital for a post-quarantine check-up on November 28th and returned to Palayamkottai to resume their normal activities.

Fr. K. Amal tested positive for COVID-19 and got admitted in Apollo Hospital, Madurai, on 12.11.20.

He was given antiviral injection consecutively for eight days till November 22nd. Since he was experiencing difficulty in breathing, he was given 4 litres of oxygen support. His blood pressure and his fluctuating sodium level were brought under control with medication. His oxygen support was gradually reduced and from November 21st onwards his oxygen saturation level was normal. He underwent a walk test on 23rd and was discharged on November 24th. He went to Muhil, Thirumangalam, for a fortnight’s quarantine under the medical care of Dr. Rani.

Fr. M. Arulanandam was not feeling well and so he was taken to the hospital for a check-up on November 13th. As swab test and CT scan confirmed that he was COVID-19 positive, he was taken on the following day to Apollo Hospital, Madurai. He was given an antiviral injection to contain the virus as well as oxygen support to maintain his oxygen saturation level. His blood sugar level was fluctuating. From 22nd onwards his oxygen level was normal and he did not experience any breathing difficulty. Finally, on 24th afternoon he underwent walk test and was discharged on the same day and returned to SXC, Palayamkottai, for a fortnight’s quarantine at SXC itself till December 9th.

Fr. Alphonse William, after being discharged from Rhock Hospital, Palayamkottai, was back at SXC but was found to need nursing care. On November 17th, he was brought in an ambulance to Dindigul where a CT scan revealed that he was COVID positive. So he was taken to and admitted in the ICU of Apollo, Madurai. On 19th, he was shifted to the general ward but continued to receive 2 litres of oxygen support. His blood sugar was brought under control. He was also treated for his Parkinson and hematuria. As he tested negative for COVID-19, he was discharged on 25th afternoon and taken to St. Joseph Hospital, Dindigul, where he was till 28th before he moved to Beschi Infirmary. With him **Prince Wilfred (CEN)**, a second-year novice, also returned to Beschi. Prince who had been mildly COVID Positive was combining his own treatment with his hospital experiment of assisting since November 13th Br. Aloysius Arulraj and Fr. Alphonse William.

Fr. G. Pushparaj was diagnosed CO-RADS 5 as per a CT scan taken on November 19th. He was rushed to Annai Velanganni Hospital in Tirunelveli where, at the time of his admission, his oxygen saturation level was found to be 88%. So, he was immediately given high flow oxygen. The doctors also said that Fr. Pushparaj had got a very severe lung infection of 90%. With the support of 60% oxygen, he was able to maintain his oxygen saturation level 97%. On 23rd, he was shifted to the general ward and he was able to maintain his SpO2 without oxygen support. On November 30th, he was taken to Apollo Hospital, Madurai. After a thorough checkup and 4-day hospitalization, he returned on December 4th evening to SXC and is having his 14-day home quarantine.

Beschi, Dindigul

Br. A. Santiago, Minister, and **Fr. Michael Doss**, Superior of Beschi Illam, Dindigul were quarantined in the CIS Building, Beschi. After their quarantine, they returned to the community on 17th November and have resumed their normal works observing the necessary protective measures.

Br. S. Rayappan, after being discharged from St. Joseph Hospital, was in quarantine in the CIS Building, Beschi. He joined the community and resumed his work on November 24th.

Fr. Ignatius Puthiadam was admitted in the COVID Ward of St. Joseph's Hospital, Dindigul, on November 9th with a 20% lung infection. He got discharged from hospital on 17.11.2020 and was back at Beschi for his home quarantine.

Fr. Xavier Mampra was admitted to St. Joseph's Hospital on November 13th due to elevated blood D-dimer level. After assessment and a few investigations, he was diagnosed with pulmonary hypertension. He got discharged on November 30th and has been asked to restrict his activities and take rest.

Br. Aloysius was diagnosed with COVID-19 with 40% lung involvement and was admitted in St. Joseph Hospital on 13 November 2020 and was discharged on November 27th.

Fr. A. Soosai Raj (CEN), who was in Maduralaya, Dindigul and getting treated as an outpatient since 6 November 2020, is now back in Manalur to resume his mission.

Online General Body Meetings

GBM: YOUTH COMMISSION

Youth Commission GBM of the Jesuit Madurai Province was organized using the online Zoom platform on November 25th though many cities in Tamil Nadu were on red alert due to NIVAR cyclone. AICUF Unit advisers, Ex- AICUFers and AICUF students, youth from Mullaikudi and Lourdes Parish along with commission members participated in the Online GBM.



Fr. Paulraj, the Coordinator, welcomed the participants and briefed them about the dynamics of the GBM. Mr. Aloor Sha Navas, Secretary General of *Viduthalai Chiruthaigal party*, talked on “இன்றைய தமிழகச் சூழலில் இளையோர்”. He highlighted the disasters being created by the religious fundamentalist groups in Tamil Nadu State, which is known for its religious tolerance and self-respect. Youth are being targeted by these fascist groups through social media and cinema. He invited the GBM to impart historical consciousness and leadership to unorganized youth through workshops. He emphasized that to empower the youth, political awareness has to be instilled in young minds.

We had a panel session led by Mrs. Annie Rose and Mr. C. J. Rajan, Ex- AICUFers and social activists,

Prof. Alan and Prof. Aswini from the American College, Madurai, on “பதிலிறுப்பும் பங்களிப்பும்” from the feminist, social activist and educationalist points of view. All these panelists have been accompanying youth for many years. Their sharing invited us to renew our commitment to youth ministry and to deepen the PAP action plans.

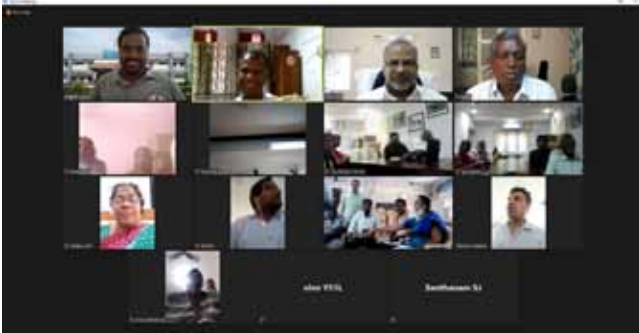
In the afternoon session, Fr. Thayriam, the new PDD, shared with the participants on the evolution of PAP and invited all of us to carry out the PAP Action plans with our fullest commitment. The action taken report was presented by Fr. Parthasarathi. Salesian Frs. Felix and Vincent shared their experiences of youth ministry and gave their suggestions to strengthen the ministry.

Fr. Provincial, in his final remarks, insisted on the need for networking and collaboration with other religious orders and lay collaborators. He suggested that the commission consolidates the action plans and to prepare the youngsters to the forthcoming State elections. The GBM came to an end with a YouTube hymn ASALAMALAIKKUM PRAISE THE LORD KOVINDA by Gana Vinoth, which summarized the GBM deliberations.

GBM: PASTORAL COMMISSION

The Online GBM of the Pastoral Commission was held on 26 and 27 November 2020. A total of 36 participants attended the GBM. The agenda of the meet on the first day included the Parish Activities, the Pastoral Implications of and our Response to NEP and EIA and the Protocol to Protect Minors and Vulnerable Adults. The agenda for the second day included the Challenges of COVID-19 in the Parishes, Action Plans and Implementation of PAP, Unemployment, Financial Difficulties, BCC and our Parishioners’ Faith and Understanding of the Liturgy. Fr. S. Amalraj, the Coordinator, welcomed the Jesuits, stakeholders and resource persons. Fr. Paul Mike addressed the participants on the NEP and presented



its pastoral implications. Fr. S.M. John Kennedy addressed the attendees on EIA 2020 notification and the draft’s alarming ill effects that are foreseen. It weakens the already fragile ecosystem. It dilutes the already existing laws and curtails public consultation and freedom of speech. It negates the Right to Life. It caters to the needs of the capitalists and corporates. Both of them urged the Pastors to conscientize our parishioners about the dangers lurking in NEP and EIA. Fr. Philomin Raj was the resource person for the session on the implementation of Protocol to Protect Minors and Vulnerable Adults. He explained in detail our Province’s policy to protect children and vulnerable adults and motivated the participants to reflect on the need for implementing the same by appointing Designated Lead Person, Internal Committee and Domestic Enquiry Committee in our institutions. All ours who are in the pastoral field greatly appreciated that food materials were supplied to poor families of our parishes during the Lockdown (Phase I and Phase II). At the same time, regret was expressed that during complete COVID-19 lockdown, we could not go out of the residence to administer the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick and conduct the funeral services. Mr. Rajendra Sekar from St. Mary’s Cathedral Parish, Madurai, shared about the importance of offering periodical training to nuns, sacristans, altar servers and the laity in Liturgy. Fr. Provincial appreciated Fr. S. Amal, the Coordinator, and all the Jesuits for their commendable work and motivated the Pastors to have a year plan of the parish events. Alarmed by the number of widows in the Parishes, he urged the Pastors to network with *Kalangarai*, Nagapattinam and replicate the work done there in all our parishes.

GBM: TVET

The first-ever online GBM of TVET (Technical Vocational Education and Training) Commission was held on 24 November 2020. Mr. S. Ratnasabapathy, General Manager, REGA Auto Distributors shared his views on “The expectation of industrialists from our industrial institutions and students of ITIs”. In his sharing, he highlighted that ITIs offer livelihoods to youth. The syllabus narrows down the broad skill learning in the industrial schools. The students need to be given counselling before they choose a particular trade as their future profession. While sharing on smart work and hard work he emphasized the need



for students first to be smart workers and then hard workers. He underlined that smart work comes from the fundamental knowledge of the chosen trade.

In the second session, Mr. John Bosco, RJD, Tiruchi shared on “தொழிற் பயிற்சி நிலையங்களில் இன்றைய வளர்ச்சி”. He expressed his view that ITI training is not the end of learning, but it gives an opening to Polytechnic and Engineering courses. For a student from a rural and economically weak background, ITI training is very handy for family welfare. He further mentioned 643 Skill training programmes offered by the Tamil Nadu Skill Development Corporation (TNSDC). They are all fully subsidized and job oriented certificate programmes given on an hourly basis. He invited us to reflect on how well we can make such opportunities available to our students. In the third session, before lunch, the heads of the institutions shared the impact of COVID-19 and our institutional response to it. In the afternoon, the institutions shared on the implementation of PAPs and the challenges faced during the process. Fr. Provincial and the members suggested that we study the possibilities of implementing skill development programmes in our Province, for which TVET should strengthen the nodal centre at LTI, Madurai.

Madurai: DACA

DACA tried SRI (System of Rice Intensification) in its Kuthirakuthi Farm, in which 4 kg of paddy seedlings were planted singly spaced in 2 acres of land. The growth looks remarkable. 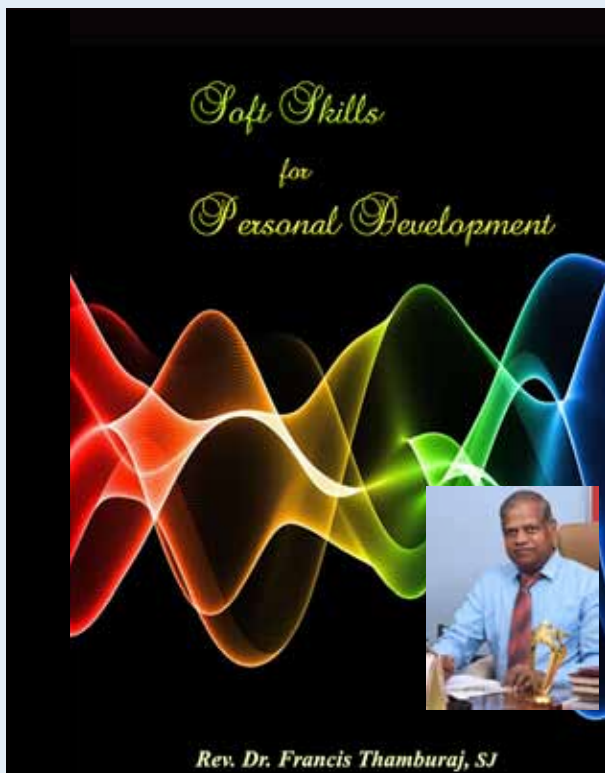

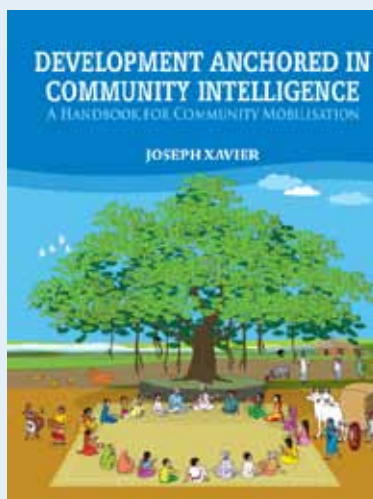

The final chapter shows the superiority of inspiration over motivation, stresses its importance and offers the secrets to stay inspired.

Release of Two Books on Community Mobilization

When people lead the process of their own development, it only plays a perfect catalyst in the process of development, and this has been affirmed yet again in as many as three urban and two rural locations across five different States of India. Two very important publications in this

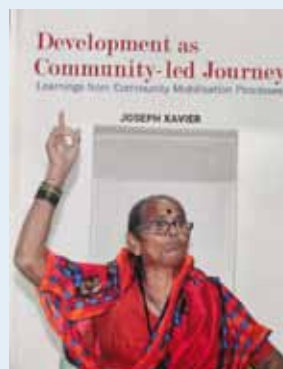


regard are, 'Development as a Community-led journey: Learnings from Community Mobilization Processes' and 'Development anchored in Community Intelligence: A Handbook for Community Mobilization' authored by Dr. Joseph Xavier S.J., which were released virtually by Archbishop Sebastian on 3 December 2020, in the presence of eminent panelists from across the country.

Mr. Peter Seidel, in-charge of Asia Desk of Caritas Germany, said that Caritas is committed not only to provide project support but also to engage in critical reflection processes based on experiences of the communities. He also said, "It is time that such efforts are linked to the academia in India and other parts of the world, as the handbook is developed in the Indian context".

The reflection shared by all the panelists was that due to a paucity of Indian publications on the subject of Community Mobilization, these books are going to play the role of a 'best friend' for all the people involved in any capacity, in any part of the country, with community mobilization process, given the easy and lucid language, content and colourful illustrations provided abundantly in both the books. All of them committed themselves to use the handbook in their colleges.

Also, academicians from across the country



expressed their satisfaction with the publications, by labelling them as "mandatory readings" and "highly relevant for Social Work students and practitioners."

Since the books cover their material from practical experiences of the communities and are excellently backed up with the needed theoretical background, these books can be used to re-ignite community mobilization from a 'rights-based approach', in both theory and practice.

The handbook, which brings to the fore 12-step processes, which are non-prescriptive in nature, yet covers almost every inch of the same, is going to be translated into nine different languages. This fact was highly appreciated by all the panelists, as this enables regional-language literates to be engaged in the same capacity as the ones who use English version of the same.

These books are jointly published by Indian Social Institute, Bengaluru, and Caritas India.

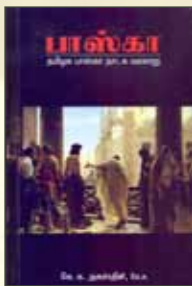

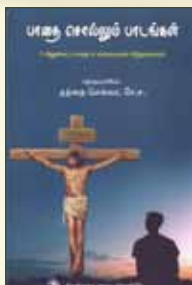

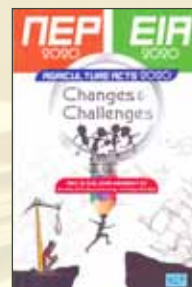

FR. A. ANTONY PAPPURAJ, S.J. (1946 – 2020)

In the sad demise of Fr. Antony Pappuraj we have lost a dynamic Jesuit, an excellent academician and a friend of the poor. He was born as the sixth and last child of Mr. A. Arockiam and Mrs. Mathalai Mary of Velampatti, a hamlet in Dindigul District on 6 September 1946. He joined the Society of Jesus on 10 June 1963 and was ordained a Priest on 16 April 1978. He pronounced his Final Vows on 15 August 1984.

After his Ordination, Fr. Pappuraj was appointed the first Director of *Maitri* (a Sanskrit word usually translated as “friendship,” “friendliness” or “benevolence”) in Shembaganur. As an acronym, MAITRI stood for Madras Association for Information, Training, Rehabilitation and Improvement, an organization which was functioning under the Commission for Justice and Labour of CBCI to provide relief and rehabilitation to Sri Lankan repatriates who were bonded labourers in Kodaikanal. Fr. Pappuraj worked hard and travelled through slopes and valleys in Kodai Hills with dogged determination and accompanied the repatriates in their struggle for liberation. Then, for four decades since 1980, he guided thousands of students especially first-generation learners as a teacher and mentor and rendered remarkable service in the field of Higher Education in four of our colleges (St. Xavier’s, Palayamkottai, Loyola, Chennai, St. Joseph’s, Tiruchi and Arul Anandar, Karumathur) in various capacities (as Hostel Director, Vice Principal, Controller of Examinations, Management Institute Director, Principal, Secretary, Correspondent, and Rector).

As Principal of St. Xavier’s, he used to visit the villages of STAND outreach programme on a motorbike as pillion rider to encourage the students and to support the people. He also had a long-time involvement with AICUF and he has been a founder member of the Rural Uplift Centre based in Nanguneri, Tirunelveli Dt., formed in the year 1981. He served as the treasurer (from 1981 to 2012) and executive committee member (from 2012 to 2020) of this NGO that has been

providing training and legal aid to thousands of poor unorganized women *beedi* rollers, innocent victims of domestic violence, dowry victims and poor dalits so that they would be emboldened to assert their rights, demand justice and get due compensation.

After serving the LTI Jesuit community in Madurai as House Minister for one year, Fr. Pappuraj lived his last few months back at St. Xavier’s, Palayamkottai, teaching in Xavier Institute of Business Administration. On November 3rd, as he complained of severe chest cold and cough, he was taken to a nearby hospital and after a few tests, it was found that he was COVID Positive, his blood sugar level was alarmingly high and his kidneys were partly affected. The next morning, he was taken to Apollo Hospital, Madurai, by ambulance and was admitted there. On 7th November, his condition became unstable. He was shifted to the High Dependency Unit and given Oxygen support. On 9th November he was given Non-Invasive Ventilation (NIV) and his oxygen



saturation level was fluctuating. As he was experiencing breathlessness and his condition was deteriorating, he was shifted to the ICU on 10th November. There, as his condition was becoming critical, the doctors put him on Ventilator on 12th night. On 13th November his health condition became very critical. On the same day at 11.10 a.m., he was declared dead.

Fr. Marianathan, Rector, St. Mary’s, Madurai, and Fr. Stephen Lourdu Pragasam coordinated the funeral arrangements following the guidelines of government health officials. Frs. Thomas Alex and Dominic Royce brought the body of Fr. Pappuraj from the hospital to the cemetery at 5.40 p.m. in an ambulance with the help of two hospital workers dressed in PPEs. At 6.15 p.m., Fr. John Bosco said the prayers and blessed the body; Fr. Marianathan paid homage and blessed the grave and Fr. Pappuraj was laid to rest surrounded by his Jesuit companions and a few of his relatives. RIP.
