ST. XAVIER'S DORANDA

After using Extramarks (Learning & Teaching Module) for six months the school shifted to Cutebrains (School Management App) ensuring an integrated platform for entire school activities. Initially the teachers had sufficient orientations and learning sessions to plunge on the new platform effectively. The first ever SAT (Self Assessment Test) was conducted very efficiently for all the classes from 5th to 17th October, 2020. The questions were uploaded for a stipulated time on the school website and even on the computers/mobiles of the parents at home. The students

wrote their examinations under the supervision of parents. Even Fr. Principal, Vice Principals and many other teachers visited the families of students during the test hours which remained as a great surprise for many. The Test meant for self evaluation of knowledge, honesty and integrity. The marking schemes were uploaded on the website again. The Papers were corrected by the parents only with the help of their sons. Finally answer scripts were submitted to the school for further evaluation by the teachers. With gratitude a meaningful birthday was celebrated of Fr. Ignatius in the community. On 18th Oct. Fr. Britius' health went down and was immediately admitted to Orchid Hospital in ICU. Later as his health was better he was shifted to St. Anne's Hospital Ulhatu for further close monitoring and nursing care. Presently he is regaining his health at Manresa Infirmary. The admission mania began in PREP 2021-22 through online and Parents submitted the printed Application Forms with required documents. After Interactive Sessions the selected candidates were admitted on Nov. 18 – 24, 2020.

We were very much saddened with some death news in November. On 1st Nov. Fr. Ravi H Kujur lost his aunty who died of cancer after the diagnosis of hardly two weeks. She was buried at Aragate. SARWADA COMMUNITY

The partial unlocking of lockdown brought happy news for the parishioners. The government allowed the worship place to be opened with terms and conditions. The Church of Sarwada was opened for the public from mid-October onwards. The thirst and longing for the Eucharist was indeed genuine and real among the faithful. A good number of faithful attend the Sunday mass. Meanwhile the sacraments of baptism, funeral service, bachandatt etc. are going on in the parish. The parish priest is making sure that the deacon knows to perform all these services. The guidelines for the deacons provided by the province are very well followed by the parish priest. The Covid-19 lockdown has adversely affected the schools. Due to long break from the school the children seem to have forgotten Hindi speaking. The students have not been able to have benefit from online classes for basically two main reasons; first is that there is very poor mobile network service in this area and second, that most of them do not have smartphones. The lockdown has kept the students away from the schools but not the teachers. Besides coming to school every day the teachers have to appear for the online exam and get the certificate. Fr. Xavier is seen busy with his Smart phone appearing for online exam and downloading certificates thereafter. The poor network is of course a real challenge in all these exercises. To have better network one needs to come to Murhu which is about 7 km from Sarwada. In the high school the lockdown challenge is that the students are not even coming to enroll themselves in the school. The administrator and the teachers feel helpless

as how to encourage them to come to school. Nevertheless, the administration of the school is looking for the alternative to deal with this issue.

PARIS, FRANCE

Bonjour à tous!

After lot of difficulties, a prolonged uncertain period and adverse situation, we two, Sch. Peter Paul Horo and Sch. Sudhir Lakra arrived in Paris on Sunday 8 November. We left Ranchi on 7 November in the afternoon and reached Delhi in the evening and on 8 November, left early in the morning from Delhi for Paris. We were indeed lucky to reach Paris in such a situation of uncertainties and difficulties. Sch. Subodh Lakra and two other fathers Fr. Romain Subtiland, Fr. Bruno Saintot were at the Airport to receive us. Immediately after arrival in the community Peter had to attend the Welcome Holy Eucharistic Celebration in the afternoon. The same day he was welcomed by the community members. Myself after one-day rest, I had the speed Covid Test next day and found negative. I was also welcomed by the community members same day having the Eucharistic Celebration and grand Lunch. We are not in-home quarantine. We are actively participating in all the community activities. Both of us are placed in different communities, Peter is in Communauté Saint Louis de Gonzague 9 Rue Raynouard 75016 PARIS and myself in Saint -Jean Brébeuf 14 rue d'Assas, 75006. Since French Government has declared the 2nd Phase of Confinement (Lock-down) with certain guidance, so we cannot move around freely. Only in case of emergency and necessary we can go to 1 Km distance with the attestation paper. The 2nd phase of Confinement will end on 30th of November. We gradually began to adapt ourselves to the new culture, new situation, and new life style. Certainly, we find new context, new atmosphere and new situation but we could adjust ourselves quite easily.

Fr. Jyoti Baxla as our Master and Guide of our French classes in Jharna Namkum taught us French language. He did a commendable job by teaching us the fundamentals of French grammar. We had gained confidence in expressing ourselves

in French. We are grateful to Fr. Jyoti Baxla for his patience and paternal guidance in teaching the basic French grammar. We feel indebted to our Province men, very specially to Former Provincial Fr. Marianus Kujur, Present Provincial Fr. Ajit Xess, Fr. Socius, Fr. PCF, Sadbhavana Community, and Jharana Community for their constant effort, love, concerns and prayers to make our journey to France a successful one. In the process of our Journey we had unforgettable and enriching experiences.

Since we reached late in France, now we have begun our French language classes in different places online. I joined the Alliance Française Paris for my French classes online on 23rd of November and Peter will begin his French classes on 30th November in one of the language schools. As we begin our life and journey in France, we have many new experiences and insights. The moment we meet someone no matter what time of the day, the greeting is "Bonjour" (Good Morning). Another thing commonly said is "Bien Dormi" (Slept well) and last, they will say "C'est bon" (It is good), Merci (Thanks). We took part in the community meeting in the week-end that is on Saturday, Sunday or somewhere it is on Monday. On 15th Novembre Sch. Tousseliat Mareus (CAN) shared with us about the mission of his Province. We experienced that Christ is the Centre of everything and hence with such zeal and enthusiasm they are working for the service of mankind. On 22nd November Sch. Niyigena Charles (RWB) shared about the Pre-diaconate experience. It was a really enriching experience. We hope to do well in our studies and the work or responsibilities given to us.

ROME, ITALY

International College of Gesù, the community of Nirmal, Sandeep and Kuldeep had one of the hectic months in November due to various community activities and some serious academic commitments during past 30 days. The most important activity of the month was the personal encounter of all 46 Scholastics with Fr. Luis Orlando, Rector of the College. The Italian test for the new Gregorian students as the part of the academic requirement was held in the month which brought lots of exam pressure to the 20 First Year Scholastics. Sandeep and Kuldeep appeared for the test on 9 and 12 November respectively. Both were quite satisfied with whatever they could do in the stipulated time, and now, are hoping for the better result which will be declared during the second week of December. The second wave of Covid-19 forced the Italian Government to issue a new Decree which directed all educational institutions to conduct 100% online classes. The maternal schools were kept open with strict guidelines to take care of the children. Following the Government Decree, Gregorian University too started to conduct 100% online classes from 6 November using the Moodle Platform. As per the preparations for the Diaconate Ordination and eventual priestly ministry, the ongoing Ad Audiendas classes for the Third Year Scholastics under the guidance of Fr. Robert Geisinger, were concluded successfully on 27 November.

The South Asian Scholastics came together on Saturday 14 November to celebrate a special Holy Mass in the Rooms of St. Ignatius with some particular intentions, viz., to invoke God's blessing on all the students during the new Academic Year 2020-2021, to thank the Lord for the gift of life of Fr. Cecil Azzopardi for completing 60 years in the Society of Jesus, and to pray in a special manner for Fr. Stan Swamy for his better health of mind and body, and for his immediate release from the prison. Fr. Vernon D'Cunha, ASM Regional Assistant, was a special guest for the occasion. Cecil, the man of simple living with deep spirituality, inspired and enriched the Scholastics immensely by sharing of his life experiences as a Jesuit in India during a long span of 42 years. At the end of the Eucharistic celebration, the Scholastics felicitated him with bouquet and songs, and honored him with a sumptuous dinner prepared

His reflections were based on his article which appeared in *Jivan* (November 2020). His sharing was highly informative and enriching. Linus Kujur has finished his courses of the First Semester, and now is busy learning more about the Servant of God, Father Constant Livens. It

is interesting to know what Lievens observed in his journeyed from London to Calcutta in 1880, and especially about the British. He writes to his family members, "Our ship is about 100 meters long, 300 feet, and 30 to 40 ft. broad. We are about 400 passengers; some 30 sheep, chickens etc. in abundance, cows and calves etc." [25 Nov.]. "It is unbelievably big and there are all kinds of people: black and white, old men, women, children, and youths. All speak English, but so quick that we do not understand anything." [27 Oct.]. About the British, he had this impression, "English people are polite: they speak gently, but as quickly as the wind." [28 Oct.]. Yet he looked at them with compassion, for according to him they thought they were in the true faith [25 Oct.]. Father Lievens was very sharp in observing and understanding the situation that made him successful.

After the holiday month of August, there was a notable upward surge in the cases of Covid-19 in Europe; and the Italian Government issued new precautionary directives, and imposed restrictions on the movements from 6 November. Although all the classes are being held online, unlike the other Roman Pontifical Universities, the doors of Gregorian University are kept open for a limited number of students to use the Library with compulsory prior online booking. The non-teaching staff members take turn to come to be physically present in various offices. Since closure of Restaurants and Bars from 6.00 p.m. and the start of the night curfew from 10.00 p.m. the streets of Rome, always buzzing with life and various activities in normal times, are completely deserted. The Advent season was given a somber start with a hope of better future; and the reason of hope was none other than the Saviour Jesus Christ himself, the fount of all joy and hope!

Amidst uncertainty and claustrophobia caused by Covid-19, Anselm has maintained perfectly his health and continued his mission in the *Economato Generale* with zeal and fervor. There were various community activities and events during the month of November. On 14 November 2020, the Jesuit Refugee Service completed its 40 years of serving, walking and accompanying the Refugees in different countries. JRS was founded by the Servant of God Fr. Pedro Arrupe in 14 November 1980. Now it is working in 50 countries having 10 Regional Offices in the Middle East, Africa, Asia, the Americas and Europe.

It accompanies, renders essential services, and advocates for the rights of refugees and forcibly displaced people. On such an auspicious occasion, Pope Francis sent his cordial best wishes to Fr. Thomas H. Smolich, JRS Director, JRS Staff members, and the volunteers saying, "Pope remains close to men, women and children who seek refuge and assistance from JRS and praying for them. I pray that all of you will continue to draw encouragement and wisdom from the vision and example of your funder." A solemn online Eucharist was celebrated in the Congregation Aula to thank and praise God for 40 successful years. All the Regional Offices of JRS participated in the Holy Mass and offered their petitionary prayers in their own mother tongue. Rt. Rev. Arturo Sosa presided over the Holy Mass. In his homily, he invited all to keep awake just like Fr. Pedro Arrupe, who always remained awake and listened to the urgent call of the refugees and displaced people. He added further that the Universal Body of the Society of Jesus was awake and alert to the call of GC 32 for the service of faith and promotion of justice as the integral dimensions of its identity and mission. Indeed, a creative response to the situation of displaced people and refugees in different parts of the world have become a universal apostolic commitment.

On 25 November, the Curia Community spent time in prayer, reflection and personal faith sharing on the theme VOCATION. Fr. Federico Lombardi shared his own vocation story to help us in our personal prayer and reflection. Some of the salient points that surfaced in the personal faith sharing were as follows: the fundamental aspect of personal vocation is to journey with Jesus Christ towards God; love for Jesus with self-denial and self-sacrifice makes life journey more meaningful; all are called to follow Jesus by taking up one's cross with generosity and humility; readiness to confront the crises of all kinds; living one's life in the presence of God guides the way to a deeper understanding of the essential and living dimension of every religious vocation. He had to make efforts for the entry to Jordan via Egypt as Lebanon still falls under red zone of covid-19. He had to follow the full eight days of home quarantine. It turned out to be the best moment for him to be able to meet all Jesuits and the collaborators inside the

house. Earlier he was one of Country Directors of Jesuit Refugee Service. He knew well about the works and the old staff members. But the time was not sufficient to pay a visit to the Latin Bishop. He had to limit himself only with the Greek Catholic Bishop who hails from Lebanon.

The month of November was the harvest season of collecting olives all over Jordan. We have seven growing trees. The harvest was better this year. I could collect with my Gardener a total amount of 165 kilograms. It was given in the oil presses and 22 liters of pure olive oil was brought home. It will be sufficient for the community for a year. Jordan olive oil is known as one of the best in the region and worldwide.

On 21st we had a community outing to the Baptism site of Jordan where Jesus was baptized. The other side is occupied by Israel. We came back driving through the long stretch of Dead Sea.

Embassy of India in Amman had observed a "Communal harmony week" in the last week of November. It had organized a seminar on the topic, "Importance of communal harmony in our multicultural society. The session was chaired by Ambassador H.E. Anwar Haleem. There were three speakers; I was privileged to be one of the first speakers. Dr. FaridKawar, a Greek Orthodox (Jordan - India Friendship Society) had his studies in late 70's in the then Bombay. He has already visited India twenty times. Mr. Deepak Joshi-Chairman, Al-Qamer for Energy & Infrastructure Ltd. Originally from Chandigarh, he is here for more than ten years. It was an enriching experience.

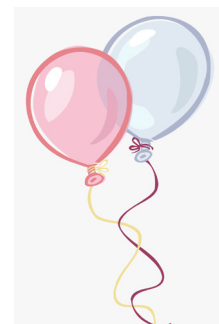
