General Curia

In a letter sent to all Major Superiors, Fr. Arturo Sosa announced the 71st Congregation of Procurators to start on 16 May 2022. It will be held in Loyola and will be preceded by a week of Spiritual Exercises to allow the delegates "to attend more deeply to the Holy Spirit who is active in our Society." An announcement 16 months in advance, isn't it a bit early?

No, it isn't! A Congregation of Procurators brings together delegates from each of the administrative units of the Society - Provinces and Regions. They must be elected in a Provincial Congregation and they have the duty to visit Jesuits and Jesuit works in order to prepare a picture of the situation of the Society in their Provinces and to answer questions that the General suggests to them for further discussion during the meeting. Such an assembly therefore requires a long preparation.

The first role of the Congregation of Procurators is to decide whether a General Congregation should be convoked, after having informed Father General of the "state of the Society." From the 31st GC, another purpose was added: to deal with important matters at the level of the universal Society. This greatly expanded its role. This meeting allows a representation of the 'grass roots' of the Society, since the Procurators are not Provincials.

In his letter of convocation, Father Sosa situates the next Congregation of Procurators within the framework of the Ignatian Year, with the same theme: Seeing all things new in Christ. More specifically, he writes: "the Congregation can be a time when we examine together the lights and shadows of the Society, the particular challenges that face us, and action of the Holy

Spirit, who calls us to ever greater generosity in the service of Church and our world."

With regard to the issues that the Superior General asks the Provincial Congregations to deal with, the first is the follow-up given to the broad project of the *Universal Apostolic Preferences*, paying particular attention, according to the wishes of Pope Francis, to the first one, that of "showing the way to God with the help of the Spiritual Exercises and discernment." And secondly, the Ignatian youth ministry and the link with the promotion of Jesuit vocations.


Ignatian Year

Tertianship at Hazaribag

I am writing this as we are just a few weeks away of our departure from the "School of the heart". Yes, it's been six months already since we began our Tertianship at St. Stanislaus College, Sitagarha, a heavenly place indeed. Our house is at the centre of a hundred-acre land surrounded by 10 religious formation houses.

It is in this place that I began my journey into the depth of my heart with two main aims in mind - to have a deep and personal encounter with the Lord and to know the person of St. Ignatius more closely. The initial days were marked with uncertainties due to prevailing pandemic and travel restrictions. Eventually everything fell in place we reached Sitagarha where we went into home quarantine.

Our first few days were of coming to know each other. We had to share our life beginning from our childhood up to this stage focusing on how God has been journeying along with us. Each one's sharing at depth made these moments precious and holy. These experiences made me feel proud to belong to the Jesuits – men who are ready and willing to dedicate their lives at the service of God and His mission.

Classes on the Autobiography, Letters and Spiritual Diary of Ignatius geared us towards entering into the long retreat. During this time one Spanish word that kept repeating itself in our hearts was "Acatamiento", literally translated as Compliance but understood in our context as "loving surrender to God".

Then came the Long Retreat, the heart of Tertianship itself. It was truly a moment of grace and an experience of the living God. Three Divine hugs that I received during the retreat was a deep personal confirmation of God's unconditional acceptance and Love. God was generously pouring out Himself onto me and I was like a sponge getting soaked in God.

After the retreat, we were unable to go out and give a retreat due to the Covid situation. Similarly, our other experiment involving any task of humble service was also cancelled. The spirit of the experiment was carried out by

undertaking tasks of humble service in our campus itself. The underlying theme for this year was taken from the second UAP i.e. "Walking with the excluded". During this time, we were led into a better understanding of the four UAPs by way of different sessions, presentations and prayer services which helped us to make the UAPs our own and eventually flow into our mission. We also got a chance to offer a Holy Eucharist at the Punya Bhumi of Fr. A. T. Thomas on his martyrdom day. Listening to the thrilling experiences of those who worked with him filled me with a great sense of dedication and courage.



The last phase of our Tertianship is devoted to the study of our Constitutions. This study is aimed at imbibing the Spirit of the Society of Jesus. Soon our Tertianship will be over and we will find ourselves back in the active ministries which will extend till the end of our lives. As the days of our third probation coming to an end, I ponder over this question, "What kind of Jesuit will I eventually become?" The exact answer will be known only in time, but I do not need to wait till then. I know what type of Jesuit I ought to become. I have a clear path before me, the path of discreet charity, and all that I have to do is just keep walking on it....



Manmad Khabar

The new year has begun with many good tidings and new beginnings. The Covid Care Center for Manmad which had been located in our school has been shifted to some other government institution. As per the statistics we had nearly 5000 people who took shelter at St. Xavier Manmad out of which 912 came positive and were healed. As a token of this service done by the Jesuit community, Saby Correia received a certificate of appreciation from the DY. SP officer Mr. Samir Singh.



Once the center had been shifted, we began a thorough cleaning and sanitization of the whole school. The Jesuit community has once shifted to its original community residence. We began the classes for the 9th and 10th Std students with a formal blessing of the students, teachers and each classroom. Keeping in mind the needs of the youth, we have initiated a *reference library* for the youth studying for various competitive exams like UPSC, MPSC, NEET etc. The Library is used by the youth throughout the day.

After a gap of ten months, we had our school ground buzzing with the presence of children on the occasion of the Republic day programme. The chief guest was Mr. Gurudeep Singh Nirala

who along with his Sikh brothers had provided free food services to the Manmad people during the corona lockdown. It was our token of appreciation as well as interfaith sharing to build positive relationships with others. The *Tanda* class units have now increased to seven with more demands coming from the people.

Talasari Trainings


