JRS Ruby Jubilee (40 Years)

A celebration of the 40th anniversary of the Jesuit Refugee Service was organized by JRS Tamil Nadu at Alverna Retreat Centre near Dindigul, on 9 December 2020. A Eucharistic celebration and a public function marked the event. Speaking on the occasion, Fr. Jebamalai Raja, Provincial of CEN, said: "Transformation of the refugees'



brokenness into wholeness is the hallmark of JRS accompaniment." He added: "The 40 years of JRS accompaniment remind me of the 40-year Exodus of the Israelites from Egypt to Canaan--an exodus that had liberation as its destination." Fr. Danis Ponniah, Provincial of MDU, stated: "The occasion arouses in me a sense of wonder at the enormous amount of hard work done by the JRS team and at their enduring and enabling accompaniment of thousands of Sri Lankan refugees in India since 1983." He also expressed his deep sense of gratitude to all the Jesuits and religious and lay collaborators who contributed to this admirable humanitarian work.

Two books were released on the occasion: அமைதி வழியில் அகிலம் வெல்ல, a Peace Education Manual in Tamil, and *Local Integration as a Durable Solution for Sri Lankan Tamil Refugees*, a report of the consultation held at Loyola College, Chennai, on 14 February 2020. A video highlighting JRS services over the years was presented by Fr. Leo Pereira, Director of JRS Tamil Nadu and a portrait he painted of Fr. Arrupe was unveiled by Fr. Louie Albert. Some Sri Lankan refugees and former as well as the current team members of JRS Tamil Nadu took part in the celebration. Besides, sharing of experiences, folk dances and songs, too, marked the occasion.

Ignatian Year 2021-22

On 4 December 2020, Fr. Vincent Sekhar, Province Convener for the Ignatian Year 2021-22 (IGY 21-22), took part in a webinar with Fr. General. Fr. General's talk was simple, direct, and inspiring, inviting the whole Society and its provinces to make use of the Ignatian year as an opportune time for personal and community transformation. Following this, the JCSA Coordinator for IGY 21-22 called for a meeting of all the conveners, in which Fr. Sekhar participated and presented the proposals the province committee had prepared. JCSA was very much pleased with the Chennai Province and AAC annual calendars incorporating the Ignatian life-events. On 19 December 2020, Fr. Sekhar presented during the Superiors/Team Leaders, Coordinators and Consultors meeting the proposals of the committee for the communities/institutions, province, and MDU-CEN joint celebrations. Superiors and Team Leaders unanimously welcomed the ideas and they would take them up in their community meetings in the months of January/February 2021. On December 24, Fr. Francis Pudhicherry, JCSA Coordinator for IGY 21-22, asked all the province coordinators for the updates in their respective provinces and I sent him the aforementioned information. On December 26, I wrote to all the commission coordinators to provide me by the end of January 2021 with two or three affordable and realizable proposals for the Ignatian Year celebrations from each of their commissions.

Human Rights Day

There was a good response to the call given by MDU and CEN Provincials to celebrate the Human Rights Day on December 10 in a meaningful way in both the provinces. The following events were planned and executed by our communities and networking teams.

1. Two public events were organized in collaboration with many civil society groups and religious and priests at Madurai and Chennai to commemorate the Human Rights Day demanding the release of Fr. Stan Swamy and other human rights defenders and expressing solidarity with the protesting farmers in Delhi. In Madurai, the public protest was arranged under the banner of 'Nattai Kappom-Tamil Nadu'. Mr. Nanmaran, Ex.MLA, Mr. Ellalan, Organizing Secretary of VCK, Mr. Mahaboop John of MDMK and Mr. M. Shanmugavelu MP of DMK addressed the gathering. After the protest, all assembled at Krishna Iyer Mahal and participated in an online meeting organized by the Federation against the draconian laws. The whole event was ably coordinated by Fr. Paul Mike and Advocate C.J. Rajan on behalf of Madurai City Jesuits.

2. Two online meetings on the theme of human rights with a special reference to Stan Swamy were conducted by St. Joseph's for Tiruchi CRI and by St. Mary's, Dindigul, for teachers which became

awareness-building events. Fr. Santhanam was the resource person for both the meetings and Frs. Xavier Arockiasamy, Arul Oli, George Vedamuthu and Gnanaraj gave the lead.

3. On behalf of the social media networking team, LENS (LTI) released on December 10 a video titled as 'வேளாண் சட்ட ஆப்புகள்' which was scripted and starred by Fr. Xavier Antony describing strikingly the dangers of the new farm laws.

4. The social media networking teams came out with Poster and Just A Minute (JAM) video talk contests on the human rights theme on December 14. Actor, Director and Producer Mr. R. Parthiban as the special guest gave a touching message and announced the 10 prize winners among the 220 contestants. Frs. Vasanth, Thayriam, Sarathi, Gladwin, Irudayaraj and Xavier Antony played important roles in organizing it. Fr. Sahaya Philomin Raj as the special speaker highlighted the significance of human rights. A team of media-friendly and digital-savvy scholastics, Schs. Zenith, Frankly and Praveen infused a professional touch to the entire event.


GBM: Dalit Commission

The online GBM of Dalit Commission on 13 December 2020 attracted 105 participants for the inaugural address delivered by Dr. Lella Karunyakara, Director, Babasaheb Bhim Rao Ambedkar Centre for Dalit and Tribal Studies and Dean, School of Culture, MGAHV, Wardha, Maharashtra. The main theme of his address as well as of the GBM was 'Education envisaged by Dr. Ambedkar for the Empowerment of the Dalits'. Being a history professor of a Central University, Dr. Lella Karunyakara presented a historical sketch of the education status of the Dalits. He pointed out clearly how the traditional education system in India reserved education only to a particular group of people who kept themselves supreme in the caste hierarchy of the Indian society. Education was denied not only to Dalits but also to all sections of people other than particular dominant caste groups. The professor himself being a Dalit activist thanked and appreciated the Christian missionaries as well as the British, who secularized and made education accessible to everyone. The panelists, Frs. Santhanam and Arul Ravi with his students, presented the reality of Dalit education and challenged the participants to move forward revolutionizing Dalit education. The deliberations, discussions and the action plans that were finalized made every participant to state that the GBM was fruitful, meaningful and satisfying.

GBM: Finance Commission

The online GBM of the Province Finance Commission was held on 14 December 2020. The meeting began with a prayer service conducted by Fr. Mathew Cyril. In the first session, auditor C. K. Avvanar enlightened us all on the topic Finance Related New Compliances. He shared about the recent amendments in Taxation of Charitable and Religious Trusts. He urged us to fulfil the compliances before 30.06.2021 with the help of the auditors. In the second session, Fr. G. Alex (JAM), talked on the Effective Role and Responsibilities of Treasurers. He highlighted the different features of the Instruction on Administration of Goods and Financial Management and invited the Jesuit treasurers to keep in mind the Society's spirit in handling money. Prior to the session, Fr. Provincial released the book, Registered Charitable and Religious Trusts in India by Fr. G Alex. In the afternoon session, Fr. Thayriam, the PDD, shared his thoughts on how to mobilize funds with the help of our Alumni and generate more local income. Then, the treasurers of different communties were invited to share their current financial situation and they expressed their strategy of financial management and difficulties faced during the pandemic.



In the business session, Fr. Maria Joseph requested the treasurers to act diligently to fulfil the finance-related compliances in 2021 with the help of their auditors. He emphasized that the present pandemic has taught us to create a reserve fund in the province and unit levels in order to meet the unexpected expenses. Province Land and Building Committee and Province Finance Commission will meet on 17 January at Maduralaya and discuss the utilization of the existing resources and another wider level consultation will be held on 3 February. He also presented the treasurers' role in implementing the PAPs as proposed in the GBM held in 2018. Fr. Provincial in his final sharing stressed the imperative need for financial accountability and transparency of the treasurers. He invited the treasurers to adopt a kind and humane approach towards the domestic staff members. The meeting came to an end with the vote of thanks proposed by Fr. Berchmans Maria Joseph, followed by the concluding prayer by Fr. Sahaya Raj Thangasamy.

GBM: Formation

The GBM of the Province Formation Commission was held on 15 and 16 December 2020 on the theme Jesuit Formation in the Forthcoming Decade. The online meeting began with the lighting of the lamp by Fr. Provincial and prayer service by the novitiate community; 42 Jesuits and lay collaborators participated in the GBM from all over the world. On the first day, the guest speakers from various social movements addressed the gathering.

Ms. Brinda Adige, a women's rights activist, gave us a clarion call to find a "feminism" within all of us while challenging us to think beyond patriarchy. Mr. Ravi Nair, Executive Director of South Asia Human Rights Documentation Centre, reminded us that the Church and the faithful have an obligation to raise their voices against oppression. Mr. Harsh Mandar, Columnist, Author and Researcher, hit the bull's-eye with his statement that the Church has been weak in speaking out against the massive project of spreading hatred against the Muslim Community.

All the speakers gave us the wake-up call to speak louder than we have been speaking, to see beyond what we have been used to seeing and to walk beyond what we have been used to walking.

The highlight of the day was the address of Fr. Mark Ravizza, General Counsellor for Formation, from Rome; 250 scholastics and priests from the southern provinces (Andhra, Chennai, Karnataka, Kerala and Madurai) attended this meeting. He shared that our formation in the forthcoming decade must prepare us to answer the call of God's dream for the Society which is part of a larger dream of renewal for the Church. We had group discussion and business session on the second day. Fr. Provincial in his address to the participants shared the salient points of Fr. General's recent address on vocation promotion: "To rekindle the culture of vocation promotion." He thanked various people who rendered their selfless service for the smooth running of formation during this lockdown. The GBM ended with a vote of thanks and the *Angelus*.

The virtual meeting of the Local Superiors, Team Leaders, Coordinators and Consultors of our Province was held on December 18 to 20, 2020. Fr. Santhanam, a member of EIA Committee, shared the major challenges and recommendations on Central Government's Draft **Environmental Impact Assessment Notification** 2020. Fr. Arulanandam briefly shared about the possibility of producing an E-Book on 'Healing Earth'.

The afternoon session on the MoU between

Madurai and Chennai Provinces was attended by the Superiors, Team leaders and Consult members of both provinces and was moderated by Fr. Leo Fernando. Fr. Provincial presented the MoU and sought suggestions and recommendations from the floor. This session ended with a lot of appreciation for the committee that drafted the MoU.

In the evening, Fr. Aruldoss, the moderator of the day welcomed Fr. Sekhar B. Vincent, the convener of the Province Ignatian Year Committee, to present proposals for consideration. Fr. 
