**Fr. James Savarimuthu**, the newly appointed PCF presided over the Inaugural Eucharist; later the scholastics had a ceremonial welcome for the new PCF and the two new members, the juniors, namely **Schs. Piyush Gamit** and **Saurabh Parmar** to the group.

On the following day, **Fr. Alpesh Macwan** (the former PCF and currently the Socius) presided over the Eucharistic Celebration. The scholastics then shared with one another their graces and experiences of the past year. Fr. James addressed the scholastics that evening. He spoke about different aspects of Jesuit Formation. He also introduced the scholastics to the new 'Graded Ignatian Spirituality Syllabus for Formees', highlighting the objectives and the importance of this curriculum as per the directives from the Assistancy. All the scholastics, according to their stage of formation, are expected to complete this curriculum.

At the cultural program, the Scholastics bade farewell to the fourth year theologians, Schs. Pratik Christi and Melwin D'Sa; they also thanked Fr. Alpesh for accompanying them as their PCF for last six years. Fr. Provincial Durai Fernand, addressed the scholastics on the final day on the vision, mission and expectations of the Province and of the Universal Society; he also presided over the concluding Eucharist.

#### • Personality Webinar

#### Dangs Diary

Amidst COVID-19 pandemic and the lockdown the three Centres of Pimpri, Shamgahan and Subir in the Dangs have reached out in several different ways to the affected

**Pimpri:** Led by **Fr. Ishwan Gamit**, provided some guidance to the students from the surrounding villages who have passed SSC board exams and helped them make a proper choice of schools for their higher secondary education in the vicinity like Ahwa, Subir, Bardipada or

Unai. They have also motivated and guided around ten students to get admission at the Vidhyadeep Community College Bharuch and in Modasa for the English Course. Forty-one college students, who are studying in different colleges of Gujarat, were called in different small groups for some motivational instruction and guidance. Some resource persons were invited to teach and instruct the school children and parents and to help them study from home. (Fr. Ishwan Gamit SJ)

**Shamgahan:** The new textbooks for the new academic have already been distributed to the students; this hopefully will help the students, to have some idea about their studies even during this period of crisis. According to the envisaged plan and with the required permission from the Education Department of the Dangs District, under the guidance of Fr. Kirit Patelia, the coaching classes for our students of Stds I -VIII in their respective villages has picked up well. Some students who go to other government schools also take part in these classes, which are held in the morning hours. As per the current guidelines for the school staff, fifty percent of our school teachers in turn are engaged in different villages to instruct and regulate the coaching classes on a regular basis. The required safety measures like keeping physical distance and distribution of masks and sanitizers to the teachers and students have been taken care of. The students are also being given snacks at the end of the daily session. Sr. Mayuri, the Principal of the school and Fr. Sanjay Aind have been doing the periodic supervision of the coaching classes in these villages. Besides, our school has also been producing YouTube classes based on the initial chapters of Std VIII Science and Maths. These YouTube videos would hopefully further motivate the students; being a rural setup, the availability of a proper network and connectivity is always a major issue. Tests based on the coaching classes and e-lessons will be conducted for the students once the school reopens. (Fr. Sanjay Aind SJ)


#### GJYM Meet

this year, the day had to be sadly forgone until the idea of meeting virtually occurred to its designer Mr. Rajubhai Parmar who is the creative head of Divyabhaskar. #### **BIODIVERSITY IN NATURE**
