From the Provincial's Desk

What does Ignatius have to say to us in the midst of a pandemic that leaves us worried and anxious? History tells us that Ignatius and his companions had encountered the plague during their life time. In his autobiography, Ignatius refers to the plague that spread in Paris during his student days. He visited a plague-stricken man, comforted him, caressing his arms which had the sores of the plague. When he returned, the hand which had caressed the patient began to hurt. Inigo panicked and thought that he had caught the disease. Then on an impulse, he forcefully thrust that hand into his mouth saying to himself: 'If the hand has it, let the mouth also have it'. He testifies that the panic disappeared. He directly confronted panic and fear. Today we are better informed about the disease and its prevention. Yet, a growing sense of fear and anxiety is visible all around. Fight the fear and anxiety within, Ignatius may be telling us.

We had announced a meeting of the Superiors and Coordinators of the commissions in August, but we shall postpone it till the situation improves. The commissions have completed their work on the Apostolic Planning process and the team is giving it final shape. The Province Protocol on the protection of minors and vulnerable adults has gone to the press and copies will soon reach your hands.

I wish you the blessings of Ignatius as we prepare for the Feast!

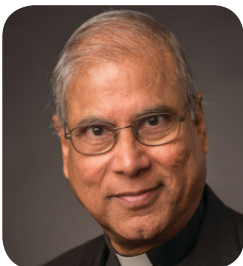

Admission to the high school is almost complete with 207 admitted in the High School section. Last year we had only 100 new admissions and the strength of the school was 966. This year the admissions got doubled and the strength of the High School section rose to 1060. Of course Covid 19 had its own share. The marginalized families preferred Sarvodaya School to any other aided school in the locality. After handing over charge as HM, Fr Wilson went to Ernakulum to take care of his ailing father who had to undergo a major surgery.

The Community organized a send off party in honour of **Fr Bastin Vattanky** on 20th June. During the function the community extended a warm welcome to **Fr Wilson Mulakkal** and **Sch Anjo Alappat**. On 26 June, **Frs E J Thomas** and **Wilson Puthussery** received their new appointment orders. The same evening, the community organized a beautiful prayer session followed by a farewell dinner in honour of Fr. Covid-19 has thrown in many challenges and opportunities to the communities in and around Anchuthengu. Our community leaders, staff and volunteers have generously responded through awareness building in all the Lok Manch pockets. Fr Benny has been attending all the important meetings of the 'Jagratha Samiti'. Meanwhile, under Jesuit Worldwide Learning (JWL), Sneharam has been running three courses, namely, Global English Learning (GEL), Peace Leader (PL) and Learning Facilitator (LF) as part of our commitment to



higher education at the margins. After making up for the lost classes through a crash course, 10 GEL students appeared for the end of level exam, and eight of them will start their new level along with new recruits in July. Seventeen students joined PL and LF courses, and sixteen of them completed the first two months.

Another golden opportunity has come our way; Xavier University Bhubaneswar (XUB) and JWL jointly offer a Bachelor of Arts in Sustainable Development (BA SD) to communities at the margins. Now Sneharam has been offered 10 seats for eligible applicants for this online BA SD Course. Among 30 courses in this programme, 5 courses are accredited by the Swedish Newman Institute (NI), contributing 3.75 credits each, 3 courses are accredited by Hekima College, Kenya and the earned credits are transferred to XUB. Covid-19 restrictions have affected our recruitment process.

We suspect the beginning of 'community-spread' of Covid-19 in the neighbouring villages. More expatriates from Kerala are returning home and are looking for safe places. We have been requested to provide two rooms and a hall for quarantine purpose, ensuring other spaces free for our classes and training programmes. It is also providential that in Anchuthengu, Sneharam could offer Holy Mass right from the beginning of the Covid-19 restrictions following the government guidelines. We are grateful to Loyola College Community for its generous support to our community leaders through

a relief programme giving out grocery kits worth Rs.1000/- and cash of Rs.500/- each to 215 deserving families. Special thanks to Fr Dominic and Midhun for their visit and enquires regarding our higher education programmes.

A team comprising Jesuits, Sisters and

teachers visits village after village, gather the children and conduct 3 hours of lockdown- special outreach sessions which are well appreciated by everyone. Such days turn out to be festive days for the whole village.

LOYOLA JESUIT COMMUNITY, SAN FRANCISCO

As the Covid-19 pandemic has been rising at an exponential rate in the United States, our community now remains not spared from being infected. One of our community members is tested positive for the virus. Fr George Williams, who has been working for years as chaplain for the men on death row at San Quentin State Prison of California, became infected last week. Above 700 inmates are reported positive (still the numbers are rising) in the prison which accommodates as many as 3,776 condemned persons, more than 700 being on the death row. Fr George had been going for his ministry from a residence away from the community foreseeing a possibility of being contacted with the virus, and he has only mild symptoms and is now isolated following the USF protocol. One of our theology professors and a lover of India, who was instrumental in getting Tony de Mello's works published by the Double Day, Dan Kendall (83), passed away last month. His mortal remains were cremated and we had a very moving funeral ceremony in our community which was globally attended by a large number of his students and admirers. The murder of George Floyd has made huge waves of protest and responses across the US and the Jesuit University and the community also responded by issuing statements assuring their official solidarity with the protesting groups. Since the pandemic defines even our religious life differently, our community members found new ways of doing their personal retreats. Along with three others I went to a large house in a ranch owned by the family of a community member located about 140 miles from San Francisco. Due to the continued uncertainty, our classes for the coming fall semester have been declared mostly in the online mode.
