PROVINCE CONGREGATION 2021

The Coetus Praevius (Preparatory Committee / Election Commission) of Patna Province Congregation 2021 met on 10-11 June 2021 for scrutiny of the preliminary election. The **list of Delegates of Patna Province Congregation**2021 has been sent to the Province members by email and also hard copy to the Delegates.

After taking into account the declining numbers of Corona affected persons and pandemic related deaths in Bihar and eastern Uttar Pradesh, the Preparatory Committee opined in favour of holding the Patna Province Congregation 2021 as scheduled, i.e., beginning from 6.00 pm on 13th October 2021 at Atmadarshan.

As mentioned by Fr. Provincial in the letter of convocation of the Province Congregation 2021, dated 19 March 2021, the **last date for sending postulates** to the Province Congregation **is 15 August 2021** (Feast of the Assumption of Our Lady). This date remains unchanged.

In his letter (2021/01) of <u>Convocation of the 71st Congregation of Procurators – To See All Things New in Christ</u>, dated 15 January 2021, Fr. General had given a directive that all the Province / Regional Congregations discuss the themes of: i). Universal Apostolic Preferences and ii). Ignatian Youth Ministry and the link to Jesuit Vocations Promotion.

In the light of the directive of Fr. General, it would be appropriate that all our communities discuss these topics afresh, focusing on the questions proposed by Fr. General. Though these topics have been discussed many times, the focus that Fr. General provides in his letter, enables us to visit them afresh; such a re-visit or discussion / sharing would enable the delegates of the Province Congregation to form an informed opinion / assessment to build their reflections, which they would be expected to share during the Province Congregation. There is no need for a report of the discussion.

SECOND WAVE OF CORONA PANDEMIC

After the 'Deadly April', though the second wave of the Corona pandemic is less in its severity, loss of lives and number of daily fresh cases of infection do continue. The intense campaign for vaccination gives hope that even if there is to be a third wave of the pandemic, as is being forecast, a good percentage of the people would have better immune system.

Besides the economic challenge that the poor daily wage earners face, education of our children and training of our young adults, is another worst affected sector. Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) and Indian Certificate of Secondary Education (ICSE) could not conduct the Matric and Intermediate exams, and they are preparing to publish results of students based on internal assessment. According to the Bihar Govt. – Unlock–5 Order, issued on 05 July 2021 (w.e.f. 07.07.2021 to 06.08.2021), educational institutions (schools and colleges) and training centres are allowed to re-open in a graded manner, functioning with 50% attendance.

Places of worship, which were closed to the public in the second week of April 2021 in accordance with the state government's directive, will continue to remain closed at least till 06 August 2021.

Because of the deadly nature of the second wave, many families, organizations and religious groups suffered loss of members and/or had to spend much in taking care of their infected members. Hence, the level of voluntary service for the needy (by individuals and organizations), which was witnessed last year during the first wave, has been minimal during this

second wave, except perhaps by the Sikhs in the form of 'oxygen langar', besides their usual food langar (community kitchen).

IGNATIAN YEAR

By his letter (2019/23) dated 27 September 2019 (Anniversary of the Bulle *Regimini militantis Ecclesiae*) on <u>Ignatian Year 2021-2022</u>, Father General had declared that "the Ignatian year will open on the **20th of May 2021** (anniversary of the injury at Pamplona). It will conclude on the **31st of July 2022**. The 12th of March 2022 will be its centre, marking the IV centenary of the canonization of St Ignatius with St Francis Xavier, St Teresa of Jesus, St Isidore Labrador and St Philip Neri. ... the motto of our celebration is, '<u>To</u> see all things new in Christ."

- As one of the programmes of the Ignatian Year, the Ignatian Spirituality Commission of our Province has proposed that all our communities have monthly recollections (prayer, reflection and sharing) during the Ignatian Year. Since the Ignatian Year began on 20 May 2021 (anniversary of the injury at Pamplona), it was felt that we could hold such recollections or reflections on 20th of each month. In case, in certain months, it is not possible to hold it on the 20th then communities could arrange it on another convenient date instead. However, all the communities praying, reflecting and sharing on the same day of the month, on a particular ministry, could be a way of expressing and experiencing 'union of minds and hearts' (GC 32, d.11). For the month of June, the Education Commission had proposed the points, which was sent to all our communities.
- ➤ Ignatian Retreats have been planned every month at Atmadarshan so that during this Ignatian Year all the members of the Province have an opportunity to return to the sources of our Congregation and charism. All the members of the Province are highly encouraged to join one of these retreats according to the month of your convenience. (See Atmadarshan brochure)

Manthan, Khagaul: As Corona hit the peak in terms of infection and death rate in the country in the months of May and June the community members were by God's grace fit and healthy. By the end of May, Manthan office was functioning with limited number of staff. The community unanimously decided to initiate some Covid relief work among the most affected people. Fr. Juno contacted a few benefactors and donor agencies for the same. In the beginning of June a few donors and benefactors responded positively and we started the relief work. All Manthan staff members are fully involved in various Covid related activities like, awareness campaign, distribution of

medicines, dry ration kits etc. Mathan distributed 650 ration kits to deserving families in Danapur, Bihta and Phulwari blocks.



Fr. Juno was busy with recruiting staff for the new project in collaboration with Caritas India. Due to the lock down the interviews were conducted online. The project aims at poverty reduction and food security, promoting social inclusion of marginalised groups as well as increasing the resilience to disasters in highrisk areas. The staff conducted baseline survey in the last week of May and the first week of June.

In the month of June we reopened all the SECs, CRCs and tailoring centres in the villages. This brought a lot of joy and smiles on the face of children and parents. Because of the lock down the education of children was badly affected. We hope that in the coming days we will be able to create more awareness among the people to take vaccination to prevent corona spread in the villages. At present people are frightened and have apprehensions to take the vaccination.

Because of the lockdown the church remained closed for the faithful and parish activities halted during the month of May and June. But Sunday Masses were conducted in the church with only the fathers and sisters participating, besides one or two devotees.

Fr. Juno kept himself isolated for a few days due to some symptoms of covid-19, but he tested negative and he was back to action soon. Frs. Joseph Velam, Junas Kujur and Srs. Gracy and Pushpika have taken both the doses of the vaccination, while Frs. Juno and Susai Raj have got their first dose. The community went on a mission tour to Gobadda on 20th June. The trip was very relaxing and brought a lot of joy. Meeting with the SRA Sisters and knowing their mission there was a source of mutual enrichment. Fr. Joseph Velam voluntarily stayed back to take care of the house.

SOCIETY AROUND THE GLOBE

VIETNAM-**JESUIT** SOCIAL **APOSTOLATE** OFFICE'S EMERGENCY FOOD PROGRAM HELPS THE POOR IN SAIGON: Hochiminh City, one of Vietnam's biggest cities, was hit by a fourth wave of COVID-19 infections in the late April. The city recorded 166 local transmitted cases, the highest daily total since on Monday 21 June 2021, the highest daily total since the start of the outbreak. Recently, the city's officials have extended social distancing measures for a further 15 days in an effort to curb the spread of COVID-19 in the community. Fr. Peter Truong Van Phuc, SJ, and His Social Apostolate Office coordinated with Caritas groups of 32 parishes, Caritas offices of 23 congregations and societies of apostolic life in Saigon Archdiocese, to initiate the COVID-19 Emergency Food Program to provide material aid for low-income households, especially migrants and unemployed people, affected by the epidemic. From the beginning of June, the program has received much support and donation (around 36,200 USD) from individuals to help the needy during the pandemic. 62,1 tons of rice and 20 tons of sweet potatoes were offered to thousands of people in Go Vap, Tan Binh, Hoc Mon, and Thu Duc.

In a letter posted on his Facebook, Fr. Phuc expressed his sincere gratitude to benefactors for their support as well as to scholastics of St. Joseph Jesuit Scholasticate, who usually helped him to upload rice and sweet potatoes bags from cargo trucks and relocate them in the storage of the Province Curia at midnights. The director of the Vietnamese Jesuit

Social Apostolate Office also acknowledged and thanked truck drivers and delivery tricycle drivers for their generous support and collaboration. "Many low-income families are consoled and supported during this hard time by many benefactors through various ways. They have experienced the joy of sharing and solidarity. May God bless our friends, benefactors, volunteers and collaborators who have helped us," Fr. Phuc said.

On 11 June 2021 the plaster was removed from his ankle and was replaced with a bandage. Fr. Mathew is staying with his elder brother and is scheduled to meet the doctor on 12 July 2021.
- Fr. Selvin Xavier, SJ, underwent a procedure called Radio-Frequency Ablation (RFA) with Electrophysiology Study (EPS) to treat Supraventricular Tachycardia (SVT), an abnormally fast or erratic heartbeat that affects the heart's upper chambers. It was done at CMC, Vellore on 28 June 2021 and on 02 July 2021 Fr. Selvin moved to the Jesuit community at Ranipet (CEN), where he is recuperating well.

After participating in the 'Roots and Wings' programme (on Ignatian Spirituality, 6 April to 8 May 2021) in Shembaganur, Fr. Selvin, who was staying in Beschi Illam, Dindigul, due to Corona lockdown restrictions and for treatment, experienced discomfort due to high BP and recurrence of allergy. He was recommended by his doctor in Dindigul to proceed to CMC Vellore for further tests and treatment.

- Though he has been a diabetic patient since January 2020, the health condition of Mr. Vincent Paul Somepalli, **father of Fr. Rajesh Somepalli, SJ**, began to deteriorate considerably from 25 May 2021. It started with a big wound on his left leg, which caused some pus formation and led to the amputation of his toes. As the wounds were not healing well after all the regular dressing and medication, more treatment and ballooning followed in the last week of June. He is recuperating well, but needs our continued prayers.
- ➤ Fr. Anthony Pendanath, SJ had a black-out and fell in the dining room of Xavier Bhawan on 01 July 2021 during breakfast. He had a cut on his left eyebrow and inside his mouth, which were attended to in KHFH. Though blood, ECG and brain scan test reports suggest that everything is normal, further

medical consultations are on to ascertain the cause of black-out.

▶ Fr. George Karuvelil, SJ, who had tested positive for Covid-19 in the second week of March 2021 when he reached home to be with his ailing mother, and has struggled with serious lung infection for the past several weeks and months, seems to have got the functioning of his lungs to normalcy. But the Gastroenterologist has prescribed medicines for a month to treat his liver and the Cardiologist has asked Fr. George to continue with the tablet he was taking for blood clot for another three months.

On 8 October 2020 Fr. Stan Swamy was arrested and chargesheeted by the National Investigation agency (NIA) for his alledged role in the 2018 Bhima Koregaon violence and links with Maoists. He died in judicial custody, Taloja Central Jail / Holy Family Hospital, Bandra.

A Tribute to Fr. Stanislaus Lourduswamy SJ

With deep anguish and sorrow, we mourn the death of the martyr of the marginalized people, Fr. Stan Swamy SJ. His last month in custody on a hospital bed till the last moments is the most



heart wrenching tragedy of an innocent man persecuted for doing good. The custodial hospitalization restrained his movements, but in his death, his legacy is set free now, inspiring thousands in every part of India and the globe. His mission will continue and will never succumb to evil.

India has a glorious history, as the cradle of many world religions, but she also nurses a wounded history. Even the great Mahatma Gandhi, the saint who lived for the poor, was arrested and incarcerated under sedition laws by British officials. The same Gandhi is the pivot of Indian history today. We take solace in the thought that Fr. Stan Swamy, too, followed Gandhi's nonviolent path, with a great love for those in the margins. He is the latest saint of the modern India's poor.

Fr. Stan Swamy redefined his priesthood, extending his altar to the streets and hills of those obnoxious corners of injustice, breaking the bread of good news of human dignity and justice especially among the indigenous (tribal-Adivasi) people. For too long, the innocent tribals trudged a merciless Way of the Cross, inflicted on them by corporate greed and unjust laws. His tireless struggle to liberate these marginalized communities brought him to the peak of Calvary, of incarceration, deprivation and ultimate death. He died as a true disciple of Christ.

In his death, he has shone a damning light on the injustice that is becoming a norm in the world: Tribals and indigenous people are expendable to corporate interests and their political enablers. Even in Asia, starting from the South China Seas to the central parts of India, a vast stretch of land of millions of acres was inhabited by the indigenous tribes. For thousands of years, they have protected the "lungs of Asia". Now an ecological COVID of greed has waged a war against these lands and the people. Fr. Stan Swamy died while accompanying the powerless tribals in their struggle and dream.

In mourning him, we also commit ourselves to his dream of a new world of justice and peace. Rest in peace, Great Warrior, you have run a great race and finished it with all glory.
