OBITUARY

FR. ISAAC TETE, S.J. (1955 - 2021)

Fr. Isaac Tete was born on 23 February 1955 in Bhelwadih village of Khanjaloya parish in a devout Christian family of late Mr. Mathias Tete and late Mrs. Salomi Dungdung. He grew up in the family of his elder sister, Mrs Felicita Dungdung in Dwarsini. He received his early education in the parish



school. After passing seventh standard he joined Apostolic school Gumla and did his matriculation from St. Ignatius High School, Gumla. He joined St. Aloysius Minor Seminary Ranchi and completed Intermediate Science from St. Xavier's College Ranchi. He joined the Novitiate at St. Stanislaus' College, Sitagraha on 20 November 1974 and after two years, he took his First Vows in the Society of Jesus (21 November 1976). It was a great event for him and the family members as well as the villagers. It is evident from the fact that in remembrance of his receiving cassock for first time in the Novitiate, the villagers had Curus Gari programme on 3rd December 1974. Still the villagers celebrate the Curus Gari Feast in the village each year. Fr. Isaac's becoming a priest was a great blessing for the family as well as the village. He was the only priest in the village. His father was a happiest man when Fr. Isaac was ordained a priest on 29 April 1987. He told us that his father's long awaited dream was fulfilled and he wanted nothing in life.

Fr. Isaac did his regency in St. Albert's College Ranchi and Socius to the Novice Master in the Novitiate in ATC, Namkum. So he had deep understanding of religious life and of the youth. Occasionally he shared about great Jesuits history of Society of Jesus. It was interesting to

know about the past history of the Church from him. He reminded us of great feast of the church and the Society of Jesus. He respected individual's ideas and encouraged initiatives. He had great hope from young Jesuits. He said that these young scholastics will be the future Superiors and Rectors. He respected every human person - young and old. He did not want to become any obstacle on the way of Jesuits, staff and guardians.

Fr. Isaac was a good planner and organizer. He had sense of good administration and discipline. At times he did not get support but he was firm in his decision. The staff and students liked his way of dealing. In his tenure as Principal of St. John's High School, Dorea, the School produced 100% result in the Matriculation Examination in 2019 - 2020. For this great achievement, the whole of Tamar Block appreciated the Principal and Staff of the School.

He had good Knowledge of Computer. All the office works were done by him working for hours in his office. At times he forgot his meals. He knew the urgency of the tasks and often there was no assistant to finish the official works. He spent hours in preparing the recognition papers for St. John's High School Dorea.

Fr. Isaac Tete was calm and serene man. He looked young even at the age of 65. The students said he looked very young, the age of about 40 - 50. But he would smile and say I am now 65 years old. He was respected and listened to by the Staff and the students. It was painful that due to lockdown most of them were away in their houses and unaware of his death on 6 May 2021 in St. Anne's Hospital, Ulhatu. They will miss him much when the school reopens at any time. May God reward His faithful servant eternal peace in heaven.

FR. SEVERIUS EKKA, SJ (1938 - 2021)

Pr. Severius Ekka, SJ was born on 7th September 1938 in Chichwani village, in Katkahi parish. He was the second son among three brothers. He did his middle school in St. Joseph Middle school Katkahi. After his high school in St. Johns' Ranchi and Inter College in St. Xavier's college Ranchi. He was interested in Maths and Physics as a science student.

With much prayer and fervent desire to become a Jesuit he entered Society of Jesus on 15th July 1961 in St.



Stanislaus College Sitagaha. In two years he made himself man of prayer and to fight gallantly for faith and justice he committed with his first vows in the Society of Jesus. After Novitiate he was sent to St. Joseph's Bangalore for his juniarate on 16th July 1963. After one year of hard work in literature

and spirituality he came back to Ranchi for his B.Sc. in St. Xavier's College from 1964 to 1966. He was clever and hard working in his studies. He did well in his studies. Thereafter he was sent to Sacred Heart College Shembaganur for his Philosophical studies from 1966 to 1968. After completing his philosophy he was sent to St. Mayr's Samtoli for his regency. Here he proved himself with his talents and qualities as Science teacher in a year.

He was sent to St. Mary's Kurseong for his theological studies from 1968 to 1970. This was the transition period when Theological institute was shifted from Kurseong to Vidya Jyoti Delhi so his final year of theological studies was done from 1970 to 1971 in Vidya Jyoti Delhi. After his Diaconate ministry he was ordained on 25th April 1973 in his home parish, Katkahi. Soon after his ordination he had few months of pastoral ministry.

Those days very few studied science among the tribals and it was dire need of a science teacher in St. Mary's High School Samtoli, Simdega. Therefore, Fr.Severius Ekka was appointed as science teacher in Samtoli. Usually Religious are transferred from one place to another according to the need and place but Fr. Severius worked hard as science teacher from 1974 to 2001 as full duration of his service period for 27 years in St. Mary's Samtoli. Fr. Severius was well known for his teaching among the parents, students and teachers. In the course of his stay in Samtoli he made his final commitment in the society of Jesus with his final Vows on 15th August 1977 at St.May's High School, Samtoli. Fr. Severius was a man of discipline for which students liked him much and his teaching. Beside his teaching ministry he was a man of mission. He used to go to Simdega jail for his prison ministry. As long as he was in Samtoli he did his prison ministry very faithfully. The inmates of the jail liked his service to them. As he was faithful in his educational

ministry so also he was faithful for the prison ministry.

He visited Christians as well as non-Christians equally whenever it was holiday or he found his own way of recreation. He rarely went for home visit. But whenever he went for home visit, he used to visit many families and spend enough time in talking about the genealogy of the family relationships and others. Villagers liked him for visiting the families. Fr. Severius retired in 2001 after his tiresome 27 years of service in St. Mary's High School Samtoli, Simdega.

After completing his educational ministry he had a great desire to become a pastor hence he was sent to Catholic Ashram Soso for few years to work as assistant parish priest and even there he continued his educational ministry. At this age he had great dream and desire of becoming a missionary in Assam so he was sent to Chidimit, Garo hill in Assam as assistant parish priest. He wished to become a great missionary so after few years he moved to Balipara in Assam as assistant parish priest and to teach in the school. He loved teaching but at this age how much students followed him it was a big question. Because of his age and physical weakness his physic did not cooperate with him so finally he had to come back to Ranchi, Manresa house somewhere in 2016-2017 to pray for the church and for the Society of Jesus.

During his stay in Manesa house he kept up his holiness and spiritual ministry. He made sure to join all the spiritual and other activities of the community. When his ill-health did not co-operate with him he has to visit doctors in Ranchi as well as in Mandar. In spite of ill health he was always cheerful, man of prayer and visiting his neighbors next to his room in infirmary to talk and spend some time with other inmates. Last days of his time was mainly spent in Constant Lievance Hospital and Research Centre. Often he expressed that his mortal remaining to be taken to Samtoli after his death as he spent longest period of his life there. He breathed his last on 22nd April 2021 at Lievance Hospital and Research Centre Mandar. His long intended desire to be buried in Samtoli was fulfilled as Curia decided to bury his moral remaining in Samtoli.

Such a dedicated and good religious person completed his earthly life journey and departed his heavenly kingdom cheerfully. May his soul rest in peace!

hen we see the life of Fr. Gyan Prakash Minj, his life was filled with struggles and trials. He hardly enjoyed the filial love as his father was in military service. of his father, which he expressed quite many time. That's why he was not understood by his colleagues. Fr. Gyan was a responsible person. Whatever work was assigned to him we was doing it with his utmost ability. Whether in the school, parish or it may be in the field of gardening, which he liked, I think, he made it sure that things should proceed ahead smoothly. He was seen going out in the scorching sun or pouring rain only to complete the pending work. In the school too he would avail himself so that students should not suffer because of him. He was quite optimistic for the future of the students who were under his care. For the hostellers he had already stocked rice and firewood for the near future. He had a plan of leveling another play-ground for the kids and tots as they could not be accommodated when senior ones were playing. As a good teacher he tried his best to groom the students with his capacity. With this

intention, I believe, he had enrolled himself for T.T.C., so that he could be a better teacher and administrator for the school, in fact that was his dream.

This caused him acute breathing difficulty. He was rushed to Samford Hospital, Ranchi and got admitted in the Covid wing where he was under treatment in the Intensive Care Unit. Despite all efforts of the Medical Team in the Hospital, he succumbed to the disease.

Born on 1st June 1945 at Barwadih Pahantoli village to late Mr. Ignace Kerketta and late Mrs. Julia Tete as his father and mother, Br. Stephen was brought up in a strong Catholic family atmosphere. He had his schooling up to class X in the parish school Barwadih. Later he did his Intermediate privately. Deep down in his heart he had a desire to be a Jesuit Brother. So he went to St. Ignatius' School Gumla for pre-postulancy programme. He was happy to be one of the five selected candidates for postulancy. His postulancy in Sitagarha exposed him to quite a few tasks that he would undertake later in the Society. His Novitiate formation blended appropriately prayer and works which Stephen engaged happily. On 2nd February 1966 he took his First Vows together with five of his companions as Jesuit Brothers in the Society and stayed there for another year for Juniorate. Then his years of ministries started in different communities of the Province which he accomplished them with much dedication and availability.

The significant contributions he has made speak of volumes of the quality of his Vision accompanied by

earnest Commitment as a true son of St. Ignatius. He is one of the Jesuits who lived and served in majors Communities as well as in some parishes of Ranchi Province: St. Ignatius' High School, Gumla (1968-1969), St. Xavier's College, Ranchi (1969-1975), Catholic Church, Soso (1975-1976), Catholic Church, Tumdegi (1976-1977), St. Xavier's School, Ambikapur (1977-1978), St. Xavier's School, Doranda (1979-1986), St. Stanislaus' College, Sitagarha (1989-1993), St. Xavier's College, Ranchi (1993-2008), Catholic Church, Noadih (2008-2009), St. John's Middle School, Ranchi (2009-2019) and St. Xavier's College, Ranchi (20019-2021).

His first appointment was in St. Ignatius High School, Gumla (1968-1969) - quite a big community. As an incharge of fields and garden, Br. Stephen convinced his Rector to ensure the safety with strong brick walls around the campus. For irrigation purpose water was pumped from the Pugu river. As the electricity supply was constant at night, he would pump in the water into the Community tanks till mid night and during the day he would irrigate the fields and the garden. He confessed that his one year time passed happily and very soon. Then he was assigned to work in the main office of St. Xavier's College, Ranchi (1969-1975) - from fields and garden to busy office tasks, a difficult transition. But gradually he learnt the tricks of the trade and gave his valuable service to one of the prime educational institutions in the Ranchi city for five long years.

Then his service was needed in Catholic Church Soso (1975-1976), one of the old Jesuit parishes. Br. Stephen had to look after the farm and garden - full of vegetables and fruit trees. Campus was wide open and security was a big concern. Here also Br. Stephen became an instrumental to raise stone boundary walls around the campus. His service was needed in Tumdegi parish, then a Jesuit-manned mission centre, late Fr David Kerketta, SJ being the parish priest. As Garden and Farm Incharge, his spirit of service and commitment reflected there as well though he went through some initial difficult moments in the community.

After his tertianship in Sacred Heart, Shembaganur (1978), he was assigned as Minister and Treasurer in St. Xavier's School, Doranda under the guidance of Fr George Karakunnel, SJ and Br. Tarcitius Toppo, SJ. It was a challenging task for him, especially to maintain the account of the School. But slowly he learnt things and successfully accomplished his duty for seven years (1979-1986). His joy was doubled when took his Final Vows here in 1980.

Gradually his health issues became a concern for him.

He found difficult to give himself fully to active ministry. He represented his case to the Provincial who considered it and gave him SXC Community, Ranchi, where he engaged himself as a Sacristan and assistant Minister until his last days.

A few human and Jesuit characteristics of Br. Stephen could be worth noted: he was a happy, simple, soft spoken and friendly and very accommodative. His presence radiated pleasant feeling amidst his Jesuit brothers and the people he came across. He was accessible to all those who were in need.

As a Jesuit Brother, he loved his vocation. At times he expressed his genuine concern towards the dwindling vocation of Brothers in the Society of Jesus in general. He was convinced that a Jesuit Brother has a significant role to play in the Society. He had special love for the sick and the elderly members. Often he was seen visiting some of the inmates in the Manresa House Infirmary.

In these Institutions and mission centres (in some twice even) he had put in a yeoman's work with marvelous achievements and that too in a record time. He has accomplished his share of the Mission. Well done! He has gone for his reward from the Lord who had called him a 'companion in His Mission'.
