ST JOSEPH'S SCHOOL & COLLEGE, DARJEELING

Responding to the Covid-19 affected people in the hills, the Jesuits of St. Joseph's School and College came together to open an isolation centre in Campion Hall of St. Joseph's College. This is a part of the Emergency Response of Darjeeling Province, supported by several donors.

The 50-bed *Sursum Corda Covid Care Centre* was inaugurated on 20th May by **Dr Santosh Nimbalkar**, Superintendent of Police, Darjeeling, in a simple ceremony attended by dignitaries, press and volunteers, observing the Covid protocols. The Chief Guest lauded the noble efforts and stressed on the aspect of service one needs to render to one's own society and offered all the support from the Darjeeling Police. His Lordship Very **Rev. Bishop Stephen Lepcha** blessed the Centre and congratulated the Jesuits

and collaborators for taking up the much needed cause and offered his solidarity and prayers. Fr Donatus Kujur, Principal of St. Joseph's college and Fr Stanley Varghese, Rector of St. Joseph's School, thanked everyone who contributed so much already to the running of the Centre and hoped that with everyone's continual support much more can be achieved.



This safe house has all the basic facilities for asymptomatic and non-serious Covid positive male patients. Ten nurses are staying in the campus to give the patients round the clock support. Doctors visit the patients regularly and ambulances are kept ready for any emergency. Hot, hygienic and healthy food cooked in the Xavier Hostel mess is made available to them three times a day. Oxygen concentrators are also available in case of need.

All these services are offered FREE OF COST with generous help from political parties, alumni of both School and College, NGOs, students, parents, teachers and well-wishers. Especially we thank SOS India and Xavier Network partners coordinated by Canadian Jesuits International for mobilizing the needed resources. The Co-workers of both the institutions and energetic volunteers have offered their service towards this cause. The Centre will be functional for at least two months with the hope of continual help and support.

ST PETER'S, GAYAGANGA

Although the school is closed, dry rations of midday meals were distributed to Classes V-VIII for 4 days from 10-13 May. Meanwhile online classes are on for the high school and homework is given to children every 15 days in the primary section.

The parish has suspended all its pastoral programs scheduled for this month. Our new priest, Fr Oshish Tirkey joined the community on 3rd May. He is under the guidance of the parish priest, Fr Peter Pappu for his pastoral ministry. The community has put up stricter guidelines for the visitors and guests who visit the community now. We had our community triduum from 4th to 7th May preached and guided by Fr Xavier Alangaram. Br Denis Rodrigues is yet to arrive from his home visit. He is actually stuck in the lockdown! Regent Sujit Minj is attending the scholastics' annual program at Premanjali, Matigara. We had the inaugural Mass of the Ignatian Jubilee year at 11.00 A.M. on 20th May, with representatives of our collaborators, followed by an agape meal. Fr Peter Pappu was admitted to Navjeevan Hospital on 6th May when he had some health issues. He had an extensive check-up for 8 days. He returned to the community on 17th May. However, he was feeling weak and loss of appetite. On 21st May evening he went through a rapid test for Covid-19 and tested positive. Immediately he was readmitted to Navjeevan Hospital. Consequently, all the other community members and co-workers went for covid-19 test but all of us tested negative! After a week in the hospital, Fr Peter Pappu's health improved very much and he was discharged on 29th May. Fr Cherian Maliekal gave retreat to the scholastics in Premanjali, Matigara, from 21st to 30th May.

NORTH BENGAL ST XAVIER'S COLLEGE, RAJGANJ

On 13th May, in a simple ceremony, **Fr Gabriel Tirkey**, the Jesuit superior, inaugurated the newly constructed *connecting bridge* (linking old and new buildings) by cutting the ribbon and blessing it, followed by blessing the just completed 2nd and 3rd Floors of the new building named Loyola Block. Due to the surge in Covid cases, only about 20 staff were present including seven Heads of Departments, apart from the five Jesuits. After the final prayer, there was tea and snacks for everyone present which was followed by a quick meeting to discuss our action plans to reach out to people afflicted by the new wave of Covid-19.



It was felt that while exploring the possibility to set up a safe house in Jalpaiguri, we also do something for the neighbouring villages and tea gardens. To that end, Fr Lalit Tirkey and Fr Bijay

Kindo purchased essential materials required for Covid-prevention that will be distributed in selected tea gardens and villages while some residential areas will be sanitised using fogging machines. Posters, handbills and flexes are getting printed for awareness creation in the most affected areas under Rajganj Block. Moreover, in order to address the mental health of our own students and even extending the help to students from the other colleges, teams of faculty members have been formed to provide online counselling in different local languages. On 20th May, five Jesuits of the community celebrated the Eucharist and held a special evening prayer to commemorate St Ignatius' Cannonball Moment by keeping the portrait of St Ignatius in the chapel. **Sch. Anup Minj**, the lone scholastic left in the house after having lived under the shadow of other senior scholastics, took upon himself to lead the choir and evening prayers.

HUMAN LIFE DEVELOPMENT & RESEARCH CENTRE (HLDRC), MATIGARA

We decided to move to tea gardens through **Lok Manch** network for Covid awareness campaign using print and digital media and work with the local administration to improve the health facilities. We undertook a health survey in 55 tea gardens across Darjeeling, Jalpaiguri and Alipurduar districts. The results of the survey shocked us: in these 55 tea gardens, there is not a single doctor in any of the tea garden hospitals; only 6 tea gardens had Covid quarantine centres; not a single tea garden has a Covid positive isolation centre; only 12 tea gardens have Covid vaccination units. The total number of Covid positive cases reported was 61; no death was reported so far in these 55 tea gardens.

HLDRC has so far reached out to about 80 tea gardens in Terai and Dooars with health awareness drive. We have established digital link with about 800 android mobiles phone users already. There are three layers of communication: with Covid response Core Group, tea garden key leaders Group and labour line volunteers' group (with micro group of 5 members at labour line). More than 15 organizations have come together to address this pandemic. Our staff **Mr. Cornelius Hasda, Mr. Basil Ekka** and **Mr. Pawan Baxla** are leading the campaign.

Quite many youth have shifted from using the mobile for entertainment to social cause which can save many lives. Special Thanks to Canadian Jesuits International (CJI), Jesuit Mission UK, Lok Manch, Mrs Patrizia, SOS-India and Mr Hanspeter, who have been our strong supporters during this most difficult time. We dream to end this pandemic and restore peace, love and life in the world.

MANRESA JESUIT NOVITIATE, KALIMPONG

The 'joy' of inactive life, in the isolation, away from the Novitiate for almost a month, is yet another level of magnificent and memorable life-experience for all of us. It is, of course, once-in-a-lifetime-experience for the novices and administrators. Although we wish to enjoy the active life of the Novitiate, we are forced to relish it in our dreams while in isolation due to Covid-19.

After several members of the novitiate community showed serious symptoms of Covid-19, keeping in mind the safety measures, availability of the hospitals and medications, on 9th May, the entire novitiate was closed down and all the members (12 novices, **Fr Shaji Joseph**, the Director of Novices, **Br Gabriel Gurung**, the Minister and **Fr Roshan Kiro**, the Socius) were brought down to Matigara for isolation. **Jay Ghale**, the first year novice, was

hospitalized in Dr Chhang's Superspeciality hospital, Matigara, on 2ndMay.**Fr Shaji** was hospitalized in Navjeevan Hospital on 10th May. All through our *exile* in the Senior Home, Matigara, we have been experiencing the true hospitality and selfless service of so many fathers and brothers. We are deeply indebted to all of them for offering their helping hand to us in our needs.

Some of the novices sum up their experience of the Covid-19 quarantine period: Pilat Narzari says, "I experienced that I was like a caged bird gripped by frustration desperately wanting to fly in to the sky." Anurag Toppo narrates, "I felt separation and isolation for a month, with abhorrence, but it was God's intervention that aided me with the 'Life of Saints' and helped me to be positive in all I was going through." Sanchilit Dungdungopines, "The quarantine period of three weeks gave me a beautiful chance to be with the Saints and journey with them who have experienced loneliness in their lives, like St Therese of Lisieux, St Teresa of Kolkata and many others. I drew encouragement and guidance from them." Markush Narzary expresses, "The word 'positive' (attached to corona) brought me a great fear, but through God's love and care, it disappeared from my heart; for God is the best medicine and in him I am safe." Sushant Xalxo says, "I grew in self knowledge and came to realize God as the ultimate source of hope amidst all helplessness and altruism." Ashish Basumatary sums up, "Covid-19 filled me with admiration towards nature, to contemplate upon the rustling leaves, chirping of the birds, hovering moon and the twinkling stars..." Praful Lakra summarises his ordeal, "I experienced great care and love from the community members and others in Matigara, even when I was experiencing hopelessness and fear of death."

Undoubtedly, May 2021 has been quite challenging for all of us. It was a month of self-introspection and self-surrender into the saving hands of God. We have come to realize deeply our vulnerability and sense of belonging to a larger human relationship in the Society of Jesus and in the suffering humanity in the world.
