FROM THE PROVINCIAL'S DESK

WOUNDS TO SCARS

Tuesday 20 May 2021 was made memorable for us in the Province by the formal inauguration of the Iganatian Year. The three speakers - all ecclesiastical dignitaries, the Mayor of Kochi and the Provincial of the Ursulines made us reflect on the significance of the Ignatian legacy. The wounded and consequently shortened leg of Ignatius became a catalyst for his conversion. Eyes to see everything in new light was the outcome, and he saw himself and his mission afresh. The long pilgrimage began, and still continues - through us.

Being wounded is part and parcel of being human. Rarely do we suffer from physical wounds unless some accidents or tragedies occur. But emotional wounds leave many people high and dry. There is no escape from pressures of work, strained relationships, unpleasant community life, and feelings of meaninglessness in religious life. These leave many people wounded and some continue to nurse the wounds. Physical wounds once healed become scars though plastic surgery is a way out. Scars would remind us of our wounds. The Risen Lord showed the disciples his scars as a sign of the wounds he had received. But these were healed wounds. When a would is healed, the scar becomes a sign of life-giving memory. That is what Ignatius shows us too.

IGNATIAN YEAR

The Ignatian Year inauguration in the Kerala Province was held online at 6.30 pm on 20th of May. Fr Salvin Augustine extended an affectionate welcome to the guests and Fr Roy Alex effectively compered the programme. Fr E. P. Mathew, Provincial, delivered the presidential address by reminding and reiterating the words of Henri Nouwen: "our hearts are stronger than our wounds." Cardinal Mar Baselios Cleemis, Major Archbishop of the Syro-Malankara Church, officially inaugurated the Ignatian Year. In his inaugural speech, Cardinal Cleemis invited the Jesuits to serve the Kingdom of God beyond the borders of Catholic Church without overlooking the needs of the Church. Bishop Varghese Chakkalackal highlighted the significant contributions of the Iesuit missionaries to the Calicut diocese and pointed out that Bishop Patroni's period in office as its golden age. Mar Jose Porunnedam, bishop of Manathavady, indicated that the Jesuits should defend the Catholic faith by bringing to their ministries an intellectual character as in the former times. Adv. M. Anil Kumar, Mayor of Kochi, spoke of the significant role of Christian educational institutions in India in shaping the citizens. Fr Stanislaus D'Souza, SJ, POSA, pointed out that though at Pamplona Ignatius' "earthly dreams were shattered by a canon-ball, it made him more fit for a deeper reality, the reality of the Spirit to see things differently."
