General said the "For many months now in all the Jesuit Provinces and Regions round the world, we've been preparing to live out this year in different ways. But what links all the projects, publications, videos, and meetings is the theme of "Seeing all things new in Christ". It's an invitation to follow Ignatius in an experience of Conversion."

RANCHI PROVINCE

Inaugural Ceremony: Ignatian Year 2021-22

On May 20, 2021Ranchi Jesuit Province officially inaugurated the 'Ignatian Year 2021-22' to mark 500th Anniversary Year of St. Ignatius' conversion on virtual platform. The 'Ignatian Year' is also known as 'cannonball experience' because he was hit by a cannon ball while defending his Basque territory against the French army at Pamplona on May 20, 1521. This bombardment really shattered him physically and emotionally and while convalescing at Loyola he had enlightenment and began his new journey in life as a pilgrim allowing God to lead him. This is observed as the renewal year in the entire global Society of Jesus.

Firstly Fr. Sylverius Chermako SJ (Coordinator IY) welcomed the members of Ranchi Province to the historical inaugural ceremony of 'Ignatian Year 2021-22'. The ceremony began with a meaningful prayer service led by the Novices which was guided very well by Fr. Edwin Dang, SJ. The prayer service included a Bhajan, a Bible Passage, reflection and a few intentions praying for the Church, Society, deceased members of Ranchi Jesuit Society and God's interventions to heal the world from this present menacing pandemic.

Fr. Ignatius Tete, SJ, the resource person gave an impressive input base theme 'Cannonball Experience/ Conversion in Application to our life Today' through PPT. The presentation was informative, comprehensive and thought-provoking and the participants were able to visualize the cannonball moments of St. Ignatius at Pamplona and Loyola very well visualizing the sound, hit and impact of the bombardment. followed by spiritual conversations for oneself listening to the spirit based on valuable inputs. Then there was a coffee break in silence helping all to dive into the inner vibrations of oneself.

Again with a common pause after the break whole group entered into spiritual conversations with a short guidelines and preparation given by Fr. Medard Xalxo, SJ. It was the best moment of the entire inaugural ceremony. Moved by the spirit many were able to share the sound, hit and results of cannonball and thereby conversions took place in our lives. Sch. Valentine Sinduria, SJ, two Novices, Sch. Alok Ekka, SJ, Fr. Kennedy Soreng, SJ, Fr. Pradeep Robert Kujur, SJ, Br. Telesphore Horo, SJ, Fr. Ignatius Lakra, SJ, shared their cannonball experiences in common. This open sharing inspired the whole group for introspection and confirmation of conversions in the lives of others as well. Though only few were able to share their conversion experiences during the session but practically all were touched by the inner movements. 'A Jesuit is a sinner' but the one who is hit by the cannonballs and has undergone a conversion and so there is renewed conviction for purposeful life with greater openness and generosity. As a matter of fact all have been hit by cannonball in life journey and there have been turning points in our lives and so we have a beautiful vocation to the Society of Jesus 'seeing new in Christ'. The spiritual conversations will continue again in community and zonal levels. Later on behalf of Ranchi Jesuits, Fr. Francis Minj thanked Fr. Ignatius Tete profusely for his splendid presentation.

In the later half Fr. Ajit Kumar Xess SJ, Provincial Superior addressed the gathering. He mentioned that the Society is availing a process of renewal. The UAP and Province Apostolic Planning would bring the focus in the apostolates for greater service. He spoke the mind of Fr. Arturo Sosa that the 'Ignatian Year, would be an occasion of self-seeking and acknowledging the conversions in our personal life for better commitment. Let us ask the Lord for inner freedom to carry out life and mission with discerning minds and hearts. Let this Ignatian Year not as external celebration but as the year of renewal and revamping the spirit of St. Ignatius. Finally, he inspired and motivated the Province men to enter into the Ignatian Year with right disposition, sense of belongingness to the universal Society and consolations in our lives as we share the grace of our founder St. Ignatius.

Finally to note that an encouraging number of Ranchi Jesuits joined this virtual meeting from near and far including Assam, Andamans, Jordan, Rome, British

Guyana, USA, Cambodia, Japan and study houses with individual and common devices. Fr. Michael Kerketta offered a concluding prayer as the session ended. Sch. Alok Ekka proposed the vote of thanks for the innovative efforts behind the entire opening ceremony. Finally thanks to Fr. Medard Xalxo the convener who successfully conducted this inaugural ceremony so efficiently.

Province Days 2021

Like last year the Province Days 2021 looked unlikely due to the Pandemic. However, as our Founder says "Act as if everything depends on you and trust as if everything depends on God," his inspiration was obvious throughout the Province Days 2021 as the Committee along with its technical team with the leadership of Fr. Provincial, Fr. Ajit Kumar Xess congregated us together, virtually on 28 & 29 May 2021. More than 200 members of the province participated in it.

<u>State of the Province (by Fr. Provincial, Ranchi Jesuit</u> <u>Society)</u>

Fr. Provincial Ajit Kr Xess, SJ, succinctly presented the state of the province in the first session in the most lucid and precise manner on 28 May giving the overview of the Province to the members to get to know the vastness and variety of apostolate the province is engaged in. As per the spirit of the Society, he delved into both consolations and desolations of our ministries and our ways of proceedings as well as the opportunities lying ahead of us in the days to come.

He informed that Ranchi Jesuit Province is now one of the biggest provinces in terms of number of Jesuits in South Asia. As overseas Missionaries, our men are in Rome, Guyana, Zambia, Uganda, Cambodia, Jordan and Japan and the Scholastics for regency in Mumbai, Nepal, Delhi, Kohima, Japan and Africa.

He brought to light that while the various commissions of education, pastoral work, social work, communication, formation, spirituality centers, youth, finance and all other commissions have been working tirelessly even in the midst of mounting challenges of the pandemic, our men in remote places indifferent mission stations have withstood all adverse situations in the service of the poor.

He emphasized among the Province men a sense of "we feeling" and belongingness to the province and the larger

Society.

His presentation also foresees the training of young men as per the need of the province and that of the Universal Society in every field of the ministry. This is where it was reminded to the province that whether one is in formation or in active ministry we need to be cautious of the tendency of complacency that is likely to set in as impediment.

He also brought to light the various glaring issues of different institutions and that of the province and yet the house felt assured that all will be attended strategically and in the Spirit of the Society.

He also cautioned the province men of the areas of concerns either individually, commonly or apostolically that impede our missions and are unbecoming of the Jesuit way of life and that all of us need to attend to them to make our mission more effective and efficacious.

Finally, he filled in the province men a sense of contentment that we are serving the poor, marginalized and tribals in most of the places and in doing so many challenges lie ahead of us. a He specially challenged our men to develop a greater sense of Confidence in the Lord and oneself, intellectual depth, in leadership, governance and management and openness to learn 24X7 and everreadiness to where one is sent. These could certainly be achieved by spiritual conversations and transparency in what we do which can be reflected in professionalism and perfection in our works; taking recourse to networking and collaborating with religious men and women and people of goodwill.

Land and Registered Society

The speakers of the second session, Fr. Mahendra Peter Tigga, Fr. Xavier Soreng and Fr. Ignatius Minj educated the house as regards different kinds of lands in Jharkhand, the issues related them and other matters.

Fr. Mahendra Peter Tigga acknowledged the immeasurable contributions of the Jesuit Missionaries like Fr. Constant Lievens, Fr. Hoffmann and Fr. Stockmann on three fronts: *The Types of Land Holdings*, *CNT Act (Chotanagpur Tenancy Act, 1908) and Its Implications for us and The Types of Land Owned by Ranchi Jesuit Society were dealt with.*

Fr. Ignatius Minj elucidated on the existence and nature of the *Registered Societies*." He underlined the fact that the Registered Society is *our medium of existence and apostolic work* and that we need to fulfil the conditions of our MOAs.

Province Apostolic Preferences

May 29, 2021, (second day of the virtual Province Meet) the first session was devoted to "Province Apostolic Preferences" presented by Fr. Francis Minj. Fr. Francis categorized his talk in three parts, namely history, process and responses to UAP, PAP, ZAP and CAP. He highlighted that Fr. General promulgated the letter on discerning the UAP and after discernment and deliberations in 2017-2019, provinces and conferences submitted the Apostolic Preferences to Fr. General. While The JCSA outlined five Preferences, the Ranchi province has chalked out **six Apostolic Preferences**.

The Ranchi Province has proposed 6 preferences 24 objectives and 185 activities. The PAP draft will be sent to Fr. General for his approval which aftermath will be implemented in the Province.

<u>Sharing on Education, Social Apostolate, Pastoral</u> <u>Apostolate and the Ignatian Year</u>

The second session comprised sharing on the three important apostolates of the Province and the importance of the Ignatian Year.

While highlighting the importance of Education Apostolate in the Province, Fr. Erentius Minj (PCE) showed a grave concern as to how Covid-19 has disrupted our entire education system so severely. The institutions have been managing with the online classes or in other ways to connect with the students. He highlighted that in spite of emerging difficulties, individual institutions have been making some effort or the other. Problems of not having smart phones in rural areas, poor connectivity and lack of electricity have hazardously affected our age old system and we are bound to devise new methods and ways of teaching and learning. At the same time we need to attend to the emotional and psychological problems that are surfacing among children and parents. Some students have lost their parents; schools have lost some good teachers, including Jesuits. Financial crises are altogether the offshoot problems of the pandemic.

Speaking on "Social Apostolate" Fr. Xavier Soreng highlighted as to how the commission has been attending the issues like, human rights and dignity. The second phase of Covid-19 has created the feelings of fear, panic, uncertainty, depression, helplessness, vulnerability. People are instructed and educated how to deal with covid-19 and that the more needs to be done.

Fr. Samir Dungdung, as the third speaker brought to light as to how the Pastoral Apostolate responded to the Covid-19 situations aptly following the guidelines of the province and that of the government. Normal spiritual and pastoral activities were hampered but the parish priests have found their ways to cater to the needs of the faithful.

The fourth speaker was Fr. Sylverius Chermako speaking on "the Ignatian Year" focused on the theme: celebration and commemoration of the Ignatian Year.

As for the responses to this celebration, a committee has been formed and the activities chalked out for different levels, such as province, community, zonal, stages of formation, apostolate, and personal. Those activities will be communicated to the Province men as to when these activities take into shape.

The third and the last session of the Province Days 2021 was devoted to the "Renewal of FCRA & 12A presented and explained by the Auditor Mr. B.K. Banka. He said that Finance is the life and blood of any institution/ organization, hence it should be managed well.

12A is needed for charitable Societies. Till recently, registration under 12A was permanent, once the 12A registration was granted to the Society. The recent amendment requires a renewal of 12A every 5 years. He added that Every Registered Society exempted from income tax has to abide by all the laws that are necessary for the purpose of achieving its objectives. FCRA registration has to be renewed in every five years. There are number of documents required for its registration as the registration rules demand and so Secretaries, treasurers and DoWs need to be on their toes to fulfil the requirements.

In spite of the Province Days 2021 taking place virtually, a unique sense of bonhomie and togetherness and solidarity was felt altogether, making it a great success. The members were seen asking one another about, whereabouts, howabouts and so on.

The organizing committee, chair persons, secretaries and the technical man Fr. Francis David Kullu did an excellent job in running the Province Days smoothly.

Virtual Scholastics' Meet 2021

One of the most grace-filled moments in the life of Ranchi Scholastic is to be part of the annual Scholastics' Get-together. At the get-together, we not only celebrate our life together but also get to meet the new group of Scholastics, share our life, learn from one another and support one another. Last year was an unfortunate year

as we could not have the physical get-together. The year 2021 allowed us to be part of Scholastics' get-together, even if not physical, at least virtual. At the very outset our profound gratitude to Fr. Provincial and Fr. PCF for taking the initiative.

The Virtual Scholastics' Meet was held on 25th May 2021. It was one day Meet having two sessions with Fr. Provincial and Fr. PCF. Sch. Alok Ekka chaired the entire session while Deacons Johny Kujur and Libin Kerketta meticulously jotted down the minutes of the meeting. The opening prayer was led by Sch. John Osga, the vote of thanks was proposed by Sch. Patras Topno and the concluding prayer was led by Sch. Mathew Kawa. Fr. Prabhat Kennedy Soreng, SJ is back from Shembaganur on 10th May. Fr. Vinod Bilung, SJ, is improving gradually. Let us keep him in our prayers for his speedy recovery.

Before farewell from Kanke and reaching to new place of assignment at Jharain Fr. Clement Kullu, SJ does not want to leave the stone unturned and miss the chance to preach good news on demands. He conducted three day retreat for Seven St. Anne's Junior Sisters residing and pursuing their studies. They renewed their Vows. It may interest you that the "Suhana City" and "Birsa Nagar" are new upcoming Units of Kanke Parish. The Suhana City is in between Tangratoli and Churi tola, once it used to be "garha khet" low and cultivable land, and the Birsa Nagar is behind Tarunoday in the North. There is no cultivation today there and around ! Further, the Bukru is multiplying with leaps and bounds and reached up to 34 with Christian families.

Ritesh and the two kitchen girls. Fr. John was tested negative, however he suffered severe cough. Br. Modestus was also tested negative but his health started deteriorating. Fr. Walter was already out for his relative's marriage in Andamans after Easter and when returned, he was tested positive so he had quarantined himself in St. Mary's Community, Samtoli. The only soul who remained unaffected was Fr. Ravi as he had suffered previous year and by this time had developed antibodies.

It was not easy to take care of the community as both the kitchen girls were affected. An earnest thanks to our driver Mr. Jhulan Yadav who selflessly volunteered himself to provide two times meals a day for fifteen days. In the light of precaution Br. Modestus was shifted to ATC Namkum as his age was prone to viral transmission. The Province authorities tried their level best to admit him to any hospital but there was no bed available at that time. On 25th April, Br. Modestus suffered cardiac arrest and was declared dead when he was brought to St. Anne's Hospital, Ulahatu. This shocking news had a deep impact on the community. We experienced utter helplessness, moreover the daily death news of our near and dear ones had shattered us.

On 16th May there was a community birthday celebration of Fr. Benjamin. It was a jubilant occasion to gather together around the dining table after a long phase of isolation. We thanked and prayed for him to God. On 27th May, the community organized farewell to Sch. Ritesh Dadul who had joined the community on 19th October 2020. We are indebted to his contributions in High School and hostel. The next day Fr. Superior reached him to Manresa House.

With the passage of time, things have started improving as the affected members have recuperated now. We engage ourselves wherever needed. Fr. John had been

applying his cooking skills in preparing varieties of cuisines both nutritious and sumptuous. Fr. Benjamin was seen cleaning in and outside the house.

Overall, these two months have been the roughest and toughest route to journey upon, nevertheless we have learned a lesson for our life i.e., "survival of the fittest". We are now more health conscious and unpanicked for disaster management. The second wave of Covid-19 was undoubtedly a bane, however from my personal point of view it has enhanced the spirit of cura personalis in our diversified Jesuit communities all over the world.

He handed over his offices to two different Fathers, namely the Superior-ship to Fr. John B. Dungdung who has been appointed as the new Superior of Balipara Jesuit Community and treasurer-

In the third Phase of Examen/ Gratitude, the different groups spent a significant time in April and May, discussing on Apostolic Plan for the General Curia 2022-2026 and submitted their reports to the Core Committee. The aim of this meeting was to see where God was present in the life-mission of each member during these past years? The Curia Community members reflected and shared in different groups on the following questions: How did we experience the period of the last plan (2016-2020), especially with regard to the Covid-19 situation? What have been the more significant consolations and desolations in our work for R.P. General and for the General Curia? What has been life-giving? What has been life-draining? Where have we encountered encouraging factors or resistances in oneself and in others? How has each one's role been evolving in such difficult time? All the nine groups submitted their reports to the Core Committee for synthesis.

On 7 May, there was a common meeting for the entire General Curia Community where the Core Committee presented the outcome of the group's report. Some more inputs were given to enter into the next phase of the group discussions so as to re-connect with vision, to integrate with the UAP2, to initiate reflections on the upcoming events such as the Ignatian Year, and Magis and the Call to New Horizons. The aim of such meeting is to help the Curia members to get in touch with lifemission, the Preferences and re-kindle energy for the mission of the Society of Jesus. The groups discussed and shared on the following points: Which aspects of the UAP connect with my deepest self and my sense of deepest mission in the Society? What do I think are the current gaps in the Society and the Curia with regard to the mission, especially the UAP? What are the potential areas for development? Where have Curia structures helped or shown themselves not so helpful? Anselm strongly feels that such discussions have helped him to grow in the unity of collaboration and communication among the Community members and Jesuits, at large. He is becoming conscience of the challenging Missions the Society of Jesus in this new situations. Secondly, he is also becoming aware of self where to get the energy for one's commitment and service to the Society of Jesus.

PONTIFICAL GREGORIAN UNIVERSITY

ife in general seems to be gradually coming back to normalcy in Rome. People have started venturing out into the stony pavements, open spaces and tourist sites of the Eternal City. The vaccination drive seems to have assisted people to come out, slowly but surely, of the uncertainties and fear of the invisible enemy. A pleasant sign of hope for a better future to see the empty roads of Rome steadily being filled with people. Despite the emergence of encouraging improvements in the current situation, Gregorian University maintained the odd-even Roll Number Rotation System for the physical presence of the students in the class rooms. On 24 May, Gregorian University organized a Thanksgiving Holy Mass in St. Ignatius Church to thank the Lord for all the blessings received during the current Academic Year. The Holy Mass was presided over by His Eminence Cardinal Josè Tolentino de Mendonça, Archivist and Librarian of the Holy Roman Church. Apart from the Authorities of the University, a restricted number of students and teaching staff members was allowed to be present in the Church to abide by the Covid-19 Protocols. As part of the preparations for Ignatian Year, the Community celebrated a Holy Mass on 19 May, the eve of the Ignatian Year and prayed in a special manner for the renewal of Ignatian zeal. A full day Conference was organized by the Institute of Spirituality on 20 May to coincide with the inauguration of the Ignatian Year. Delegate encouraged Gregorian University to practice more closely community discernment and spiritual conversion. Apart from various Professors from the University, who presented reflections on diverse subtopics of the principal theme, His Eminence Cardinal Luis Ladaria, Prefect of the Congregation for the Doctrine of Faith, spoke on the Inner Struggle and Conversion of St. Ignatius of Loyola. His Eminence Cardinal Marcello Semeraro, Prefect of the Congregation for the Causes of Saints shared his reflections on the theme "Holiness:

Discerning the Presence of God and Finding Him in All Things". Indeed, the Symposium was a perfect launching of the Ignatian Year from Gregorian University.

Linus has just finished his courses online. For the Faculty of Missiology he is discovering the possibilities of proclaiming Christ through liturgy that is how the celebrating community can become an "Evangelizing Community" by means of sanctifying signs and symbols taken from the culture of a people. For example, the use of language, music, art and architecture, etc. in the Eucharist makes the way of life of the people holy and allows them proclaim the great deeds of Christ through their educated talents. He is also asked to explore religions that how they can make all "brothers and sisters" in truth. For example, Bhagavadgītā, the sacred book of the Sanātana Dharma (Hindus), teaches how to choose good and avoid evil in the search for inner liberation. The fight between two families, Pandavas and Kauravas, is in fact the metaphorical inner fight of a soul between good and evil tendencies that exits in each one of us. The victory leads to true peace and joy. Some have compared the holy book with the process of discernment. When time is available, he is determining the virtuous life of the Servant of God, Father Constant Lievens, and his contribution to the people based on historical documents like letters, homilies, discourses, important events, etc. This has to be in the context of Belgium and India of his time. Father Linus expects prayers from the readers of Ranchi Bulletin for the success of this project.

OBITUARY

BR. MODESTUS TIRKEY, SJ (1948-2021)

Br. Modestus Tirkey was born on 14 August 1948 of Mr. Lukas Tirkey and Juliana Toppo in the village Putrungi under Katkahi Parish. He was the 7th child among 3 brothers and 4 sisters. Though Br. Modestus was born in Putrungi village but his Primary to Matriculation



studies were done in Ratasili and Ambikapur, in the then Madhya Pradesh State. The reason being that the father of young Modestus, Mr. Lukas Tirkey, was studying in the Boarding School of St. John's, Ranchi, which was then surrounded by wild bushes all around, so the jackals used to haunt the school at night. Interestingly student Lukas and others used to chase them to the Ranchi Lake from where they used to pester the school. There were few houses between the Ranchi Lake and St. John's School in those days. St. John's students used to play hockey around the bushy ground of the present Sadar Hospital as well, Mr. Lukas used to narrate about his school days to young Modestus.

Mr. Lukas studied up to class IX at St. John's School, when the Missionary Fathers took him to Ratasili Parish as a catechist in 1955. Ever since he remained a catechist for his whole life and kept on moving from Ratasili, Manpur, Jhingo and Larangi Parishes. While young Modestus completed his schooling from Primary to Matriculation from the boarding schools of Ratasili and Ambikapur in 1956 to 67. On June 1967 he joined

the Minor Seminary, Ranchi and on October 1967 he was sent to St. Stanislaus' Sitagarha for six months of Postulancy. Thereafter, he joined the Novitiate on 21 April 1968 and took his first vows on 22 April 1970. One year of Juniorate being over, he enrolled himself for TTC courses at Sitagarha itself and wrote the final exams in 1973. Passing with good marks he was sent to the Primary School, Lohardaga, as a teacher and taught successfully for 3 years. On June 1976 he was brought to St. John's Middle School as Headmaster and gave his services in teaching as well as helping in various ways to the school till 1993, in all 18 years. And again on June 1993 he was transferred to Prabhat Tara Middle School, Dhurwa and served till 2012 for long 20 years. During this period he was elected President of Jharkhand All Religious Brothers' Association (JARBA) which he directed usefully for the good religious life of all the Brothers) in 2005-08. Back again to Lohardaga Middle School as a hostel superintendent for one year 2012 to 13 that saw him an active educationist. Then there came a change of service as a minister in Ashirvad-Jharna Novitiate from 2013 to '16. From 2016 onward he again shouldered the responsibility of a Headmaster of the Primary School, Bundu, till he could carry on no more till 2021. He fell ill with covid-19, brought to Agricultural Training Centre, Namkum for a few days. As it got aggravated he was taken to St. Anne's Hospital and Research Centre, Ulhatu, for treatment. Before the doctor could do anything, on the stretcher he breathed his last on 25 April 2021. On the next day, 26 April 2021, at 2.00 pm with all the religious ceremonies, he was laid to rest in the ATC, Namkum Cemetery, following all the guidelines of Covid-19.

Br. Modestus was a catechist's son. His father had been associated closely to the missionary Fathers life-long. So his religious and character formation went along inseparably. Naturally his father would have liked to see his son a religious. It was fitting that Br. Modestus joined the Society of Jesus.

Br. Modestus' motto in life was the 'Magnifiacat' of our Lady who in humble surrender always gave praises to God. Joining our Lady he also spent time in praising God which gave him the greatest joy. He used to say that though being unworthy, God chose him to be a religious. The other greater delight he experienced was his young students' untainted innocent love. Even after scolding or reprimand, the children would quickly forget all that and be close to him as if nothing have happened. He was fond of them and the children found him loving as they

used to run behind him to wish him good morning or good afternoon Brother!

During his school days the teachers, though being senior to him, would respect him and follow his instructions in fulfilling all that would be asked of them. You felt small before such returns. He felt grateful to the Society of Jesus for what opportunities it provided him. He recalled that the Society thought of him worthy of pursuing studies: he was offered to follow the Teachers' Training Course, made him finish his Intermediate to MA studies and placed the responsibilities of being Headmaster of major schools, though he was an ordinary Brother.

No work is small in the Society. If the worker is of small heart, even a big work would seem small to him and the vice versa. He always gladly fulfilled all the works entrusted to him like gardening or in the kitchen, considering that everything came from the Lord. As a Headmaster he did not himself bury in academic curriculum, but concentrated on sports and games as well. During his time the famous 'Football Moona Cup' existed which he engineered so thoroughly well that gained its name every year. The children learnt much from these activities.

As a religious he followed the path of simplicity, humility, friendliness and loving approach to people. His simplicity and outward appearance misguided people of what treasure of qualities were hidden in his person. Devotion and dedication to the given work were his character. His seventy-two years of life speaks a volume to us. Every morning the province men will miss him when they will check WhatsApp messages. Even during his ailing days, he continued faithfully wishing happy birthday to his province men. His immense love and interest for the Society of Jesus is noteworthy. He was fond of updating himself about his province men and therefore he not only knew the province men but also their designation and other details. He never missed morning Mass and evening prayer. Community life, community celebrations, community outings were his top preferences. He was punctual and regular to school in spite of his health issues. His public life was vibrant as he knew people by their names and place. He was connected to many of his old students on Facebook and WhatsApp. He was gifted with a sharp memory to recall and reproduce any person with his or her Biodata whom he had met before. He enjoyed any food and never complained about them. He had a great sense of gentleness in his approach and dressing sense. He was humble and obedient in asking

permission to superior for going out or if he needed anything. This religious gesture of belongingness to the Society is an epitome to us. During his last days he was deeply affected by the pandemic news of Corona. On 22 April he himself acknowledged - "lagta hai isbaar hum bhi nahi bachenge".I think this was an indication and acceptance from his part that he stood nowhere in front of the strike of nature.

Such a good religious completing his life journey he departed to his heavenly reward, without giving much trouble to his fellow Jesuits. May his soul rest in peace!

FR. ANIL K. TIRKEY, SJ (1953-2021)

Fr. Anil Kishore Tirkey, SJ, was born on 4 October 1953 in the village Chatti in Soso Parish, Gumla and joined the Society of Jesus on 20 November 1973. He was ordained priest on 20 May 1986 and took his final vows on 8 September 2000. Fr. Anil had been admitted to Constant Lievens Hospital and

Research Centre, Mandar a week before together with other Fathers of St. Ignatius' Community for Covid-19 treatment. They all got recovered and went back to their community. Fr. Anil was kept back for observation of Covid-19 related effects. On 26 March in the late noon quite many documents of AROUSE, Gumla were signed by him brought by Fr. George Soreng. The attending Doctor came hurriedly and communicated that the Father had to be taken to the ICU because his Oxygen level was going down. All precautions were taken care of, yet in the morning of 27 March 2021 Fr. Anil breathed his last.

Openness, kindness, willingness, readiness, generosity, cheerful bearing, pleasant countenance, dedication and commitment are some of the qualities which characterized the person of Fr. Anil Kishore Tirkey. The first sight of him would portray his happy disposition with his smiling face welcoming you and make you feel good. There would be no worry for the rest of your time with him. He would go round to provide you with the things you would need or have gone to him for. And in the end he would see you off pleasantly so that your journey back is safe and good.

Fr. Anil was a musician. He loved music, especially playing guitar and singing. His favourite song was, "Bless the Lord, O my Soul." He played other musical instruments also with ease and in perfect blend of notes harmoniously. However, the drum set was his favourite which he would hammer around in a good speed as the music would require. But above all he never boasted of his talents. He made his appearance invariably in any musical event with two drum sticks in hand. The audience liked his performance.

In his Jesuit life, most of the years he was a treasurer in various communities: at St. Xavier's, School, Doranda, British Guyana and St. Ignatius' High School, Gumla. During his stint at St. Xavier's School, Doranda, the unwelcome teachers' strike took place due to some flaws by his predecessor's pen. Fr. Anil put them all in their right place and the problem got settled before long. He knew that the treasurer's table was the pivot upon which an institution revolved. Therefore, accuracy and transparency mattered a lot which he justified strongly.

Fr. Anil Kishore Tirkey,SJ, was sent to Guyana arriving on 23rd December 2006 with Fr. Anugrah Amar Bage, SJ. When he was leaving for Guyana his elder brother was on his death bed. Yet the missionary spirit propelled him to go ahead surrendering his ailing brother into the hands of the Lord. He returned to Ranchi on 29th December 2019 and was assigned at St. Ignatius' High School, Gumla.

In Guyana, he was assigned as the house treasurer in Brickdam Presbytery, Georgetown and also was helping out in the cluster of parishes in Georgetown for four years. In 2009 all the Jesuits came to Arrupe House, Queenstown, Georgetown from Brickdam Presbytery leaving the house for the Diocesan Priests where he as minister and helped out in the parishes for three years. In 2012, he was assigned to be the Parish Priest in St. John the Baptist Church Plaisance, in the East Coast Demerara for seven years. He would prepare the homilies on time. After twelve years of service in Guyana he went to Manresa Spain for his Ignatian Immersion Programme in 2018 for a Sabbatical. After his sabbatical, he was in Arrupe House, Queenstown for a year helping out in celebrating the Holy Eucharist in Georgetown. He was parish priest of Muri Parish for some years which the people remember happily as visiting them regularly, particularly the sick and the old.

One never got tired of his company. He believed in companionship and had many close friends. And what a company in which if he didn't crack a joke or two! The first thing the companions would ask of him was a joke before beginning anything, though sometimes, the same joke would be replayed again. Humour reigned in any of his gathering. He held the view that in such an atmosphere the work would progress better. Never was he seen in tension or worried, though there were aplenty in his lap. He took them all in a stride and not let anyone know he underwent so many of them.

He had a magnanimous heart. He would accept everyone. He would listen to everyone. He was a good shepherd. He knew all his parishioners.

He was a creative person and would come up with his creative ideas in his preaching and teaching. He had a reading habit and would read many books and share them with others.

The Marian Devotion was another of his spiritual gift and had a special devotion to Mother Mary. He would spend time with his Rosary in Prayer. He would encourage people to recite the Rosary Prayer as well.

Youthful spirit dominated his appearance, dealings and actions and had special love for the young people, and loved to work with them.

He was Systematic or organized. Whatever appointments he received in the Society of Jesus, he put his whole heart and mind in it trying his best to be systematic and well organized with the files, document and records up to date.

Fr. Anil's companions remember him as a gentle, loving and kind person whom the cruel covid-19 took away. It is with great sorrow that his companions learned of his sad demise. A dedicated life has come to an end. He was a unique and special figure in missionary endeavours, and a guide and example, especially in the mission field. Among many of his colleagues he was a shining example showing keen interest in the work and had the ability to quickly grasp the reality.

FR. JOHN TIRKEY, SJ (1962 - 2021)

The last days of Fr. John Tirkey were a succession of visits to a number of hospitals with a hope of recovery from covid-19, but he could not be saved. On 18 April 2021 he left Noadih Parish for St. Stanislaus' High School, Lohardaga. While staying there he made a visit



to Constant Lievens Hospital, Mandar, for consultation with the doctor there. His condition did not improve in Lohardaga, so he was shifted to Singpur Nursing Home, Muri, on 22 April. It looked things would turn out to be better there. Facilities ran short for treatment there for such a deadly sickness. On 27 April he had to be shifted again from Singpur to Ulhatu St. Anne's Hospital. After two days of treatment at Ulhatu, his condition worsened. So he was finally shifted to Dev Kamal Hospital, Bajra, Itki Road, on 29 April afternoon. He had been just taken in to the hospital Fr. John breathed his last during the preliminary check up at 5.23 pm on 29 April 2021.

Fr. John Tirkey, SJ, was born in the village Akasi Pakritoli in Katkahi Parish on 16 March 1962. His parents Mr. Louis Tirkey and Libina Barwa were blessed with 7 children, 6 sons including John and a daughter.

Fr. John had his Primary and Middle School classes at Boys' Middle School, Katkahi till 1978. Thereafter, he proceeded to St. Ignatius' High School, Gumla, in 1979 for his Matriculation education and completed it in 1983. Intermediate studies were completed from St. Xavier's College, Ranchi, in 1983-85. On 11 July 1985 he entered the Novitiate at St. Stanislaus' College, Sitagarha and took his first vows on 11 July 1987. For his Juniorate he was sent to XTTI, Patna, from July 1987 to May 1988. Then he was sent to A. L. College, Vijayawada for his graduation studies June 1988 to May 1991. The Philosophical studies took place soon after at Satya Nilayam, Chennai June 1991 to March 1993. After completing his regency in Nagaland 1993-95, he was at first at Tarunoday, Arsande and then to Vidya Jyoti for Theology 1995-98. On 12 April 1999 he was ordained priest at Katkahi Parish. Soon after he was appointed

as an Assistant teacher cum hostel prefect at St. Mary's High School, Samtoli in 1999- 03.Tertianship followed soon after in Raia, Goa in 2003-4 and took his final vows on 12 April 2007.

After academic and religious studies were over, he was appointed as an Acting Headmaster 2005-10 at St. Peter's High School, Tongo which he took over on the approved post as a Headmaster in 2010-14. In 2014 he was transferred to St. Mary's High School as an Acting Rector cum Headmaster till 2019. His last status was at Janata High School, Noadih as Headmaster from 2019 till his death on 29 April 2021.

Fr. John Tirkey, SJ, was a loving and caretaking person and as a senior he always loved and took care of those who were junior to him either during formation or in the high schools wherever he was a Headmaster or a Prefect. He was considerate towards those under his charge of both either Scholastics or students. He played the role of a guide to all who approached him.

He loved sports and game and played all kinds of outdoor games, like hockey, football, basketball, volleyball and so on. Among these games, his favorites were hockey and football. As a Headmaster of St. Peter's High School, Tongo, he used to arrange "Inter School Hockey and Football Tournaments" for the boys often. He always wanted to see his team as a winner.

Annual Sports are parts of school activities so he never skipped them every year. He encouraged the students to take part in them and developed their sporting skills to enhance themselves with strength and confidence.

He was an extrovert who mingled with others and made friends easily. He liked Socializing with people and got his work done finally. Singing and dancing were not out of his interest. Tribal dance and Music were his favourites together with drumming the tribal drum (mandar) vigorously.

Fr. John, as a person, was simple, friendly, approachable, and honest. He was committed and dedicated to his work. He was psychologically mature and balanced, physically strong, and active. He was simple but bold to take decisions.
