This centre comprises of treatment cum rehabilitation complex for leprosy and HIV infected individuals, besides different departments for care of senior couples, destitutes, home for the aged and the novitiate of the sisters. Celebrating three masses daily for the spiritual nourishment of the inmates was in turn nourishment for me as well. Apart from this, there were occasions wherein I officiated at funeral services, administered sacrament of reconciliation, anointing of the sick and conducted various prayer services. During the pandemic situation when celebration Eucharist and gatherings were prohibited, this opportunity to welcome the Eucharistic Lord was well received. Each one amply benefited from availability of sacraments and prayer services. Giving inputs to the novices on various topics one hour a day was another regular involvement here. As a Jesuit I benefitted by making myself available for priestly services. Moreover, I could understand the deep-seated human brokenness and struggles of many an inmate especially during their old age and as persons sent out as outcastes from their very own home by their own near and dear ones. Helping out in the registration process of the OPD section of the complex twice a week and witnessing various persons with skin diseases widened my horizon of understanding human conditions. This was also an opportunity to come closer to the rural folks and culture of Maharashtra. For the first three weeks of Feb, I had the joy and company of four novices from Belgaum Jesuit Novitiate. They too had come over for their novitiate experiment. Simplicity of these four younger brothers and their openness in mixing with the inmates as companions touched and moulded me as well. Other Jesuit tertians from Jamshedpur, Pune and Bombay provinces have been to this ashram during previous years for their experiment. I would term this experiment at the ashram as a human-divine encounter at the level of human brokenness and vulnerability. I place on record my bountiful gratitude to the Society of Jesus as a body of companions of Jesus, to the Congregation of Helpers of Mary, each inmate here and the Divine Master for bringing me to this encounter and experience.
