We have almost completed the first floor. We are hoping to start regular lessons during the coming academic year.

Maria Sadan: Our candidates attend classes regularly. The arrival of Sch. Maneesh is a great help. He is helping the candidates in their studies. Fr Antony spends much time preparing for his BEd examination. The candidates fill their time with various activities like exercise, gardening, cleaning and indoor games. Due to the increase

of Covid-19 cases all over the country, two of our first-year candidates are asked to attend online classes from their homes. They will be joining us once the situation becomes normal.

Parish: Due to Covid-19 restrictions, we had the Easter Mass in the late evening. After Easter, the parish priest and the other priests went for house blessing. We were assigned to different areas. These days, the church activities are suspended because of the pandemic restrictions.

ST. XAVIER'S, JAIPUR

Parish: The disregard of the general public for the guidelines issued by the State resulted in a tsunami of Covid infection leading to many deaths during March. Doubts were raised whether it is prudent to celebrate the Holy Week falling in the closing days of March and the beginning of April. On 11 April, St. Xavier's Parish welcomed **Fr Nelson D'Silva**, the newly-nominated superior of C-Scheme Jesuit Community, and **Sr. Sonia Moras, SCJM**, the new vice principal of the Junior School.

Mrs. Mary Thomas of the parish won the 1st prize (a cell phone) in the JCWS lottery and the President of JCWS, Mrs. Dipali Paul presented it to her. As Rajasthan slipped into the curfew mode due to the spiraling Covid-19 cases, on Sunday, 18 April, public Mass was suspended and once again the online streaming of the Sunday morning Mass started. It was heartening to see that many families were getting connected and participating in the Eucharistic celebration.

The farewell of fathers Augustine, Varkey, Rex, Sherry, Raymond, Sobin and Jose, who are on transfer after having served the faithful in Jaipur, was scheduled on April 25. But due to the restrictions imposed by the government on the places of worship, the program was stalled.

As the Delhi Mail is being typed on 1 May, **Fr K. P. George** has arrived in Jaipur. Plans are afoot to install him after the mandatory quarantine period on 9 May by the Local Ordinary **Most Rev. Oswald Lewis**, Bishop of Jaipur.

During April, three parishioners left for their eternal reward – two due to Covid infection and one because of cardiac arrest. May they experience the fullness of life with the Risen Lord.

School: From Easter Monday the new academic session was kick-started through online mode without much fanfare. The practicals of class 12 for various subjects started on the same day. Sr. Sonia Moras, SCJM, the new vice principal of the Junior School was introduced to the Junior School teachers via virtual mode. The outgoing and incoming managers of the school, Frs Augustine and Nelson respectively, started interacting with the entire staff on a one-to-one basis following the spiritual conversation method through video conference eliciting concerns and vision(s) for the betterment of the school. Community: It was our privilege to have Provincial **Fr Soosai Mani** during the Holy Week in the campus. On Maundy Thursday he celebrated the Eucharist. On that day we all were invited by the sisters for a festive meal. A meaningful Farewell-cum-Welcome programme was organized in the college to express our gratitude to the outgoing veterans (Frs Varkey, Augustine and Ravi) and welcome the new team at Nevta. As everyone is feeling helpless due to the Covid-19 pandemic and the havoc it caused all around, the community spends more time in prayer asking God's mercy on humanity.

XVI: We started the vocational programs and village animation programs with full enthusiasm. **Fr Arok** visited some villages to form self-help groups to empower the rural women. However, due to the lockdown we had to close everything until we are permitted to restart again.

School: Our hope of starting the new academic year from April 12, 2021 with offline classes was dashed by the second wave of the pandemic. Several staff members in our school were tested Covid-19 positive and a few of them had to be hospitalized in ICUs due to respiratory problems. Some of them are still in hospitals. In spite of all these, we are continuing with the online classes till we break for summer vacation from the third week of May. Since the CBSE has cancelled the Board Exams for class 10 students, we are in the process of making the provisional list of students for various streams based on the marks of classes 9 and 10 and on their performance in the first and second Pre-board Exams. We hope to begin the new academic session with online lessons for class 11 from Thursday, May 6, 2021.

The fee issues continue to bother us as a significant number of the parents have not yet deposited the school fees for the academic year 2020-21. We hope to recover the dues by August 2021. Consequently, the salary issues for the staff during 2021-22 will continue to remain a concern for the school management.

College: The merger of both St Xavier's Colleges of Hathroi Fort Road and Nevta, was formalised during a grand function held at the Nevta premises on 6 April with the blessings of Fr Soosai Mani, our provincial who presided over the ceremony. The merged college will function with **Fr A Rex Angelo** as the principal, who took charge on the same day. A farewell and a merger program with the title 'In Gratitude, Let Us Journey Ahead' was organised at the college auditorium in which Fr Augustine Perumalil (outgoing principal, St. Xavier's College, Nevta), Fr John Ravi (outgoing principal, St. Xavier's School, Nevta) and Fr Varkey Perekkatt (former manager, St. Xavier's College, Hathroi Fort Road, Jaipur) were given a fond farewell by the new administrators and staff of the college. Due to the spiralling of Covid-19 cases, the second internal examinations were conducted online from 7 April to 16 April. On 12 April, the first staff meeting of the combined college was conducted at Nevta campus during which Fr Rex gave practical guidelines. In addition to the teaching staff, the meeting was attended by Fr Arokya Swamy (manager) and Frs Raymond and **Sherry** (vice-principals). As per the instructions from the state government, the college was closed from 15 April to 2 May. The staff worked from home. On 23 April, the Media Committee officially launched the YouTube Jaipur for promotion and Life@Xavier's, advertisement under the mentorship of the college management. The shifting of furniture and equipment from HFR college to Nevta campus is still going on, though the major portion has already been shifted. Under the care of Fr Jeba, the campus administrator, and Fr Raymond, the college administrator, the maintenance staff attend to their duties to spruce up the campus. Under the guidance of the Institutional Social Responsibility Cell, the college donated 5 computers and a printer to Ropar Mission.

ST. XAVIER'S, SHAHBAD

School: The new Academic session for classes 6 to 9 started on April 7, 2021 through digital modes. We had an offline staff meeting on April

discuss academics, activities discipline-related matters for the new academic session 2021-22. Webinars were organized for parents of classes 10 and 12 by the respective class teachers. Parents were very appreciative of the efforts taken by the school management and staff in educating and forming their children during the pandemic. An interclass competition was conducted for engaging and enlightening the students. On April 22, a special assembly was organized to celebrate the Earth Day. The Tarumitra Club presented a beautiful and meaningful virtual assembly on the occasion. On 21 April, the Education Department directed the Delhi schools to suspend all the online classes and reschedule the summer vacation. In the Junior School, the Prep admission concluded on March 31, with 120 new entrants joining St. Xavier's family. The online classes for the Junior School started on April 6. On April 10, a virtual staff meeting was organized in which various academic and activity-related matters were discussed. To mark the Earth Day, the Jr. School science teachers prepared a PowerPoint presentation which was shared with all the classes.

LVI: On 1 April, we inaugurated a branch of LVI at Narela, in the outskirts of Delhi, starting two courses in Cutting & Tailoring and Beauty Culture. It is a new area requiring much publicity; but it is picking up well. LVI at Rohini with 150 students and the tailoring centre at Sector-27, were doing well; but we had to close them down on 15 April because of the lockdown. The Lokmanch project has been functioning for five years in Sect-26 & Sect-27, creating awareness among 3000 women of their rights and duties. Misereor, the nodal funding agency, appointed an external expert to evaluate the impact of Lokmanch. The team carried out a detailed inspection on 5 April, after which they were taken to Sect-27, Rohini, in order to interact with the 40 leaders of Lokmanch, and to have an on-the-spot inspection. The team was very much impressed by the leadership and self-confidence of the leaders, and by their contribution to facilitate the process of providing drinking water, sewage line and health facilities. Our 45 SHGs are functioning

well in spite of the corona, with regular meetings and monthly contribution. We had a meeting of the 20 remedial coaching teachers, and we had an evaluation of our tuition program and its impact during past 2-3 yrs. We had decided to reopen our centres from 1 April but due to the worsening pandemic, we have postponed it to May. Our helper, **Mr Ramu**, has been under home quarantine since two weeks. Because of the spread of corona and the uncertainty of the future, we are thinking of anticipating the summer vacation to May and starting classes in June (God willing).
