MESSAGE OF FR. PROVINCIAL

On May 23, 2021, I complete one year in the office of the Provincial of Ranchi Jesuit Society. I am grateful to God for His abundant blessings upon me and the members of Ranchi Jesuit Province. I also thank Fr. Socius and all the members of Sadbhavna who have been guiding me thoroughly in making my stay here a comfortable one. I thank you dear brothers for your sincere prayers, best wishes and for your constant and concerned support so far.

It has been a year of learning various things of my office and it has made me aware of my duties and responsibilities. I have this continuous happy feeling that I belong to the Society of Jesus and that Ranchi Jesuit society is a part of a Grand Universal Society.

Ranchi Jesuit Society has not confined itself in Jharkhand but has also gone beyond the territory such as Assam and Andamans. Moreover, we have moved overseas and our men are missionaries in Africa, Cambodia, Guyana, Japan, Jordan and Rome. God has called our brothers to serve in these distant lands.

The year has been a very challenging one. We have had immense challenges to face and also had enough possibilities to prosper in. The Pandemic situation affected every sector of our life. The pandemic situation disrupted our usual life and works. But we were able to find some alternatives to make our life and works more meaningful. Though we were at various locations living our daily lives at different pockets of our provinces, we were ever united with one another in our minds and hearts. During the pandemic times, lots of good works were carried out by all our communities especially by reaching out to the poor, migrants and the vulnerable. I congratulate you all for your true sense of service and charity. I regret that due to the Pandemic situation, I could not make my timely official visitations to all the communities. In such scenario, though, I managed to visit many communities. We had wonderful moments of bonhomie then.

In my letters and addresses on different occasions in the province, I have always wanted to create a sense of “We feeling”. This is what makes us the “Companions of Jesus” and “Friends in the Lord”. I also stressed on ‘Jesuit ways of life’ which must be visible in our life. Let Ignatian discernment be part of our daily life.

Come what may, Christ should always be the center of our life and work. We have to be always united with Him in our daily spiritual activities. Like St. Ignatius, we have to find God in everything. Each thing we do must be for the Greater Glory of God.


The year ahead is the Ignatian Year for us. To this end, the Ignatian year will open on the 20th of May 2021 (anniversary of the injury at Pamplona). It will conclude on the 31st of July 2022. The 12th of March 2022 will be its centre, marking the IV centenary of the canonization of St Ignatius with St Francis Xavier, St Teresa of Jesus, St Isidore Labrador and St Philip Neri.

Let this time be a point of conversion for all of us - at the individual, community and institutional levels. The Ignatian Year Committee of the province has concretely framed the plan and programme for us all. I would expect every member of the Province to attend to these honestly and earnestly. Besides, we also have before us Universal Apostolic Preferences and have aligned Ranchi Province Apostolic Preferences with the UAP. We have to keep them in our mind consciously and work towards them.

Fr. Superior General has convoked 71st Congregation of Procurators which will start in Loyola (Spain) between the 16th and the 22nd of May 2022. "To see all things new in Christ", is the motto of the Congregation. As a part of preparation for the Procurators Congregation, we will have Province Congregation in the fourth week of September 2021.

I firmly believe that we are the precious instruments in the hands of God. We have to surrender and submit ourselves in the hands of God and allow Him to work through and with us. We are integral parts of God's plan in his creative and curative missions. Our ministries should have this guiding force throughout. At the same time, we need to network and collaborate with one another by entering into various cooperative measures by establishing inter-ministries and inter-Regionals rapport and also by creating trust among men and women of our world.

On 20th April, the community organized a Community Eucharistic Celebration to thank God and pray to him for the birthday babies of the months and the departed souls. It was an opportune moment to thank God for Sch. Sameer Ekka too, for being with us and for his generous service to the Community. The community bade him farewell and extended to him many good wishes for the next mission in Manipur.

Fr. Severius Ekka, SJ, a saintly person, a man of prayer and simplicity, passed away in Fr constant Lievens Hospital and Research centre, Mandar, on 22nd April. The following day his mortal body was taken to Samtoli,

KANKE, CHRIST THE KING CATHOLIC CHURCH

In view of the Pastoral care, “without the contribution from Tarunoday to Kanke Parish is not complete” is the experience of Fathers at Parish. Due to Corona the entire ‘Taruns and Professors’ were inside the gate. And whenever gate was opened either the vehicle headed to Ara Gate or to Mandar Hospital and not to the Parish Church for Easter Ministries.

The Palm Sunday was without Procession. The faithful flocked to the Church with mask on the face and sang ‘Hossana’ to the Lord aloud. The Passion week was a testing time. In the situation of aggressive Corona and imposition of Section 144 of Cr.P.C. in Ranchi, after deliberation we decided to arrange Passion Week Services at the Halls of Anita Intermediate College and Mont Fort Niwas Province Head Office respectively to curtail the crowd gatherings of the faithful. We conducted and maintained the larger group in the Parish Church for the service. We are very grateful to Sisters of St. Anne’s Convent and Brothers at Mont Fort Niwas at Kanke for their good service. All Sisters and Brothers came forward creatively to conduct the entire Holy Service. “Kudos” to all you generous hands, hearts and souls. The Parish - faithful were happy and are grateful for the moments of grace your service created.

At a time when no priests seemed to come to help us as planned, Fr. Justin Kandulna, S.J. from LTC offered himself to come and assist without hesitation in the emergency moment. I salute the spirited Fr. Justin with which he said, “I’ll come”. Fr. Justin with his ‘innocent smile and choice of words’ won the hearts of People of our Kanke Parish. Further he brought Fr. Mukul Lakra for Good Friday and Easter Vigil. Fr. Mukul with “buland awaz” and message of the occasion shook the faith of the people, gearing to the understanding towards the “faith that does justice” and emphasized that this begins from individual to family and it must spread to the society at large.

Fr Clement Kullu, SJ lost his elder sister late Christina Kullu on 10th April 2021. He had to rush for burial to Karangaguri, Simdega on the following day. That was the day 11-4-21 fixed for the First Communion for 45 children. There came Fr. Telesphore Lakra, SJ as an Angel to help out all the way from Assam. He celebrated the “First Communion- Holy Eucharist” with 45 Children and two members from the side of each child. Thank you Fr. Tele, it would have been heavy for one priest to celebrate three Mass on that day. The St. Anne’s

sisters and Parish Catechist took trouble to prepare the children in four groups for the First Communion with special class for a week from 3.00 pm to 6.00 pm. It was a great task and you performed well which a priest at confessional could experience that graciously.

The 18 April was the Confirmation Day. The 64 children had special Anointing of the Holy Spirit administered by His Grace Felix Toppo, SJ, D.D. . Fr. Clement Kullu, SJ, Parish Priest, with keen interest and care lovingly prepared all the candidates for five days from 3.00 pm to 6.00 pm . The candidates were divided in five groups. Sisters from St. Anne’s Convent and Parish Catechist Ashish Tirkey actively helped Fr. Clement to prepare the candidates for the sacrament of Confirmation. The audio visual can be followed in the YouTube published by the Archdiocese for one’s appraisal of the ceremony with the Holy Eucharist.

In the “Week of Swasthya Surakha” there is Holy Eucharist. People are advised to maintain the SOP. The participants are not compelled to attend it. The Grip of second wave - fear and awareness towards precautionary measures related to Covid have resulted the attendance of the faithful qualitative.

Again the School is closed. Some teachers were also found positive. Next, Fr. Manohar and Sch. Francis were tested positive. They are now recovering. One day Fr. John Lakra fell headlong on the way to Apostolic School as he was walking too fast and lost the balance. He got minor injuries.

Fr. Ashok Kandulna has joined the community to look after the office of bursar. He is also appointed as Minister of the house.

From 22nd again lockdown is imposed for a week. We hope that situation improves in our states. All the students are sent home.

As the Government has prohibited offline classes, we stopped conducting offline classes for the 8th and 9th standard students from 8th of April. But the school offices remain opened. Teaching and non teaching members continued to come to the school. Test exams for the new students are still continuing. Readmission for the old students and admission for the new students are going on. On 6th April, we received Mrs. Alma Minj a new cook, from

Noadih Parish, village Thootha in our community. As a cook, she is rendering her service to the community and in the kitchen. On 8th April, Fr. Philemon and Br. Nicholas Topno, SJ were vaccinated with the second dose at Messo Office in Lohardaga. Both of them are quiet well after taking their second vaccinations. On the same day all the community members had a community budget session 2021-2022 for the Community, School, Hostel and Arouse and discussed on other matters as well.

On 9th April, St. Stanislaus School conducted practical exams for the 10th Standard students. Practical exams were continued till 13th April. All the students appeared in the practical exams with great zeal and vigour. On 9th April, Fr. Ranjit submitted the Budgets of the community, School, and Hostel in Sadbhavana, Ranchi. On the same day we welcomed Sch. Nitish Ekka, SJ in our community. He is here to help out in the Arouse and in the community. On 10th April, Fr. Ranjit reached Miss Ursula (community cook) to her home, Binda, Khunti. On 10th April, Fr. Sushil and his team organized a meeting for the teaching guides in the school Hall. This meeting was held basically to inspire and encourage teaching guides who can focus and promote a value education to young children in the villages for they do not have classes in the schools due to lockdown. On 11th April, 28 children received their first Communion in St. Bernadette Church, Lohardaga. On this great day, Community members, hostel boys and inmates of our campus participated in the Holy Eucharistic Celebration. On 12th April, Br. Nicholas Topno, SJ the Minister of the House, celebrated his birthday with the community members and inmates of our campus. On his birthday, the community members remembered him and prayed for his good health of mind, body and spirit. On 15th April, Fr. Philemon, the headmaster of the school arranged a meeting for teachers from primary section, to give classes to the school children at village level but due to the rapid spread of corona virus the plan was cancelled.

On 18th April, Fr. John Tirkey, SJ the Headmaster of the Janta High School, Noadih came to our community to remain in self quarantine. He remained in self quarantine in the community itself for 4 days. We heartily welcomed Fr. Raphael Soy, SJ in our community on 19th April. He was there for two days for the work of Bank and returned to his community on 21st April. On 19th April, Fr. Patrick Xalxo, SJ the Parish Priest of Noadih, arrived to our community to remain in House Isolation. As per the Government order for "Health Safety Week" school and offices remained closed from 22nd April to 29th April. The school offices will be reopening on 30th April from 9

Travel News: Fr. Thomas Barla traveled to Ranchi on 25th March to attend the Province Consult Meeting which was to be held on 26th and 27th March. Just after the meeting he travelled back safely to Tezpur, on 28th March.

Holy Week Ministries: Fr. Cyril Guria was in Tezpur and did his Easter ministries in Don Bosco Cathedral Church, Tezpur. He also included Ursuline Provincialate, Gutlong for his Easter Sunday Ministry. Fr. Thomas Barla had gone to Bishwanath Charali Parish for the Holy Week Ministries. For Holy Thursday he was in Girija Line, Baghmaria Tea Estate where faithful from four different village Churches had gathered. After the whole day of work in the Tea Gardens, the faithful gathered slowly coming on foot, by hired vehicles, bicycles, etc. The ceremony started late and went on up to 11.30 night but it was very solemn. The Good Friday ceremony was in Garha line of Bhamaria Tea Estate. Again the faithful from the four village churches had gathered in a huge number. The Way of The Cross started at 9.30 a.m. and was completed in 3 hours. It was led by the different people of four churches. GENERAL CURIA

Amid the Coronavirus pandemic, both the General Curia and San Pietro Canisio Community celebrated together all the Holy Week Liturgical celebrations of the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Jesus Christ in St. Francis Borgia Chapel of General Curia. A united choir group, consisted of both the communities, was formed to make the Holy Week celebrations more solemn, ceremonious and devotional. For Anselm, the Holy Thursday was a precious moment to contemplate

on the model of salvific leadership of Jesus who offered His perfect love and empowering service to all. On Holy Friday, all contemplated on the mystery of the Passion and Death of Jesus Christ by following the Way of the Cross on the Mount of Spirito Santo. Further the Holy Friday ceremony was a moment of grace for Anselm, which reminded him of the Hour of Salvation, the Kairos and invited him to enter into the Mystery of Faith. The Holy Saturday was the day for the renewal of the Mystery of personal Redemption. On Easter Sunday, Anselm renewed the call of the Risen Lord to become the apostle of the Resurrection with full of faith, full of joy, full of hope and full of love with Mother Mary.

On Monday 12 April, Anselm's Economo Group members had the fourth phase of meeting on Apostolic Plan for the General Curia 2022-2026 where they successfully wrapped up the examination phase of last Apostolic Plan 2017-2020. In the meeting, they discussed on the issues which stand out for their Group, and the issues, which they did not wish to lose for the next Apostolic Plan. In the discussions, the following issues emerged which the Group would like to keep up for the next Apostolic Plan, i.e., the collaboration with R.P. General and with all the Provinces, UAPS, planning, communication/networking.

On Saturday 17 April, the community members of General Curia and San Pietro Canisio visited the Archivum Romanum Societatis Iesu (ARSI), which was renovated completely last year. The visit enlightened all with some basic ideas and knowledge about the hidden treasure of the Society of Jesus preserved and maintained by the Society. Fr. Robert Danieluk, one of the Archivists, explained in detail that ARSI is the archives of the central government of the Jesuit Order. They mainly contain materials sent from Jesuit Provinces and Regions to R.P. General regarding the general governance of the Society. The ARSI is divided into three main sections: The Archives of the Early Society (1540-1773); the Archives of the Restored Society (1814 and present), and the FondoGesuitico (The Italian National Central Library of Rome). Numerous manuscripts, typescripts and published inventories of the ARSI manuscript collections are available and listed in a general index. Some important reference books have been digitized and loaded on computer terminals for the readers. All those, who visited the Archives, were shown some major collections of the Archives on China and the original manuscripts of St. Ignatius of Loyola. For Anselm, the visit to the Archives was highly interesting and enlightening to be introduced to the treasure of the Society and its mission.

From January to March, the General Curia underwent the process of Budget Preparation for the Financial Year July 2021 – June 2022. All the independent Secretariats, Departments and the General Assistants participated in the exercise. They presented the Budget to the General Treasurer and discussed with him personally before the final approval by R.P. General. After completing all the procedures, the General Treasurer presented it to R.P. General and had a discussion on the entire Budget. In the end of April, the Curia Budget 2021-2022 was approved by R.P. General.

PONTIFICAL GREGORIAN UNIVERSITY

The partial Lockdown during the Holy Week provided the Gregorian Community with a good opportunity to stay together at home. All the Holy Week Liturgical Services were meticulously planned and celebrated with great solemnity and devotion ensured by the active participation of each member of the community. Although, the partial Lockdown was relaxed after Easter Monday, most of the community members preferred to stay back at home to continue their usual routine of study and research. My sincere gratitude to everyone for incessantly pouring on the prayers, words of comfort, and consolation. The gestures of sympathy mean so much, especially when we are away from the country, leaving

everything on God and in the care and thoughtfulness of the Province.

During the weekly Jesuit community Mass on April 19, the whole community gathered to pray for the repose of my father's soul. The community also prayed for those who joined the company of ancestors and angels in heaven in the recent past. I officiated the Holy Mass and thanked the Lord, and the community for their support and solidarity. During the homily, I shared the experiences of my father's "unwavering faith and ever steady attitude of gratitude to God".

Apart from praying every day for the deceased brethren and our relatives, Fr. Greg, the Rector and community members are deeply concerned and express their solidarity with the people facing terrible pandemic problems in India.

This was the last gathering with him. Mark has already been appointed as the director of a very popular Retreat House in Oshkosh 140 km from Milwaukee.

Thanks to Fr. Anderson for inviting me for a baseball game between Brewers, the local team, and Marlins from Miami at the American Family Field Stadium. It gave me

a moment of relaxation and a well-needed break with my studies on April 27. The indoor stadium accommodates some 42 thousand spectators. I assure you of my prayers and express my prayerful support to the province members, our relatives, friends and suffering people of our nation, grappling with deadly health care crisis.
