Manmad Khabar

Saby Correa has recovered fully and has resumed his responsibility with new zeal and vigor. Under the direction of Br. Wenscel, supplementary classes have been launched at Tanda Vasti (for the Labhan Banjara Tribe). Initially we began with a formal survey and based on its result we have framed a pilot project to help the children of the migrant workers. We also had meetings with the village heads and parents to create awareness among them about the importance of education. Subjects like Maths, Science and Language are stressed upon. Women teachers were chosen from among the locals and provided with training which was given by our experienced teachers from St. Xavier High School. These training sessions will be continued every month.



The movement for the release of Fr. Stan Swamy saw an overwhelming response in Manmad city. Teachers from St. Xavier School were called in two groups and made aware of the issue. Posters were displayed in some parts of Manmad town to make people aware about the unjust arrest of Fr. Stan. Looking at our zeal and enthusiasm the local political party RPI on their own took the lead in formulating letters and presented it to the District collector of Nashik. The Christian community of Manmad also wrote an appeal letter and presented it to Tahsildar. The Manmad community along with the religious sisters actively participated in the protest organized by the Nashik District Jesuits.

Our school premises continue to be used as a Covid care center with a few patients undergoing treatment here. The new Chief Officer has been highly appreciative of the different services given to the people by the Jesuit community.

'God grant me the Serenity to accept the things I cannot change, Courage to change the things I can, and Wisdom to know the difference.'

The Serenity Prayer by Reinhold Niebhur (composed in 1932-33) is so apt in the present situation. It has been difficult to come to terms with the scenario. Amidst the turmoil, and disturbing atmosphere we've been searching for serenity. For most people, accepting corona as the new normal has been difficult. But we cannot change the situation and have to learn to adapt.

As teachers we have recognized this fact and have equipped ourselves with the skills to make online teaching more effective. We at St. Xavier's are constantly trying to improve. Every day of teaching is a new learning experience. After our unit tests we had several training sessions to improve the process of conducting the First Terminal Examinations.

The present crisis has taken its toll on all of us and especially our students. It has not only impacted their learning gain, but also increased anxiety and induced feelings of desperation and hopelessness. To help us deal with this predicament, the Education Department organized a Vipasana Training program on the 25th of September. It equipped us with the knowledge of mediation, deep breathing and other breathing techniques to deal with stress and overcome negative emotions.

We bid farewell to our Principal Mrs. Sharmila Sunny who retired on 30th September after 35 years of dedicated service. In an informal meeting that evening, the Manager Fr. Dr. Francis Swamy thanked her for her service to the institution. Her positive energy and congeniality will definitely be missed at Xavier's. Sr. Thresia Sini has taken over as the new Principal. Mr. Gaspar Britto has been assigned the role of Coordinator and Mrs. Elaine Fernandes will continue as Supervisor. So it's a new team and a new beginning at St. Xavier's. We welcome Sr. Sini and assure her of our support and cooperation. Being part of the new team, I look forward to contributing towards the functioning of the school and the wellbeing of the students.

Virtual Lessons @ VJ and Contextual Learning @ MPSM

In response to the coronavirus pandemic, the Vidya Jyoti College of Theology has adapted virtual learning environment and stepped up to deliver program to its students. "Pilgrimaging Theologically in Corona Times" is the theme for this academic year which began on 10 August. We have a total of 155 students. The classes go live on Google Classroom and will continue for the entire semester till December 2020.

This year we have a total of 6 scholastics from the Bombay Province for theology. The second and the third year theologians are housed at MPSM campus and the two first year theologians are at St. Xavier's high school. The third years have finished the major courses in Medical ethics, Liturgy, Marriage law and Ecumenism. The second years have completed the Gospel of Matthew and John, and at present are busy with the Pauline corpus. The first years are through with the course on "Introduction to Theology" and "Faith and Revelation" and now into "Pentateuch".

The situation calls for a pedagogy which is contextual for a deeper theological reflection. Fr. Joel Noronha is the mentor for the second and the third year theologians. He oriented us, as to how we need to contextualise our textual studies to the interventions and works of the Province. The efficient internet setup and the newly renovated chapel, create an atmosphere conducive to learning and prayer. Some of us even got an opportunity to be part of the MPSM's monthly staff meetings, NCEE (Nodal Centre for Educational Excellence)-planning meeting and Legal aid workshop at Nandurbar. To recollect and to deepen our faith experience we had Bishop Lourdes Daniel giving us a talk on Priesthood and Pastoral Life in the context of the present time and its relevance. In the wake of the arrest of Fr. Stan Swamy, we were involved in the online campaign demanding his release. Sch. Wesley was prompt in composing a song which was widely circulated and well appreciated. On 16 October adhering to social distancing norms, we all joined the silent protest organised by the Jesuits of Nashik and their collaborators along with the National Alliance of People's Movement (NAPM) against the prosecution and pre-trial detention of Fr. Stan and other human rights defenders.

The Higher Education Committee Meet

On Gandhi *Jayanti*, the Higher Education Committee members along with Frazer and Swamy, met to face, like Gandhi-ji, contentious issues and, like him, they did so with clear minds and a strong resolve. They could do this without violence because the Zoom call ensured sufficient physical distancing. Overriding other concerns, the Committee spent most of the meeting time discussing with Frazer the New Educational Policy (NEP) of the Central Government.



Frazer heightened our awareness about many objectionable aspects of the Policy.

There Christian (Minority) is no representative in the State or Central Government Committees. Furthermore, all educational Institutions would be controlled not by their trustees but by the appointed Board of Governors. Even though some outstanding colleges are allowed to be autonomous, the content of what is taught will be according to the ideology of this Board of Governors. There is also a high level of centralization regarding admissions, content, and testing. The present 3-year degree College courses are found to be more than adequate but the NEP is reverting to the old 4-year degree system which is helpful only to the few who wish to pursue higher education abroad.

Two other important items were also discussed. One is that SXIE with its two year B.Ed. course, wants to merge with SXC. An application was made some time ago, but the Registrar could find no provision for this possibility in the University statutes. However, SXIE is planning to apply again. The committee also discussed about a B.Ed. four-year selffinanced course at SXC.

The other item discussed was the letter of Fr General on "Companion Schools." It was clarified that such schools do not pertain to higher education. They refer mainly to former Jesuit schools that are now managed by others but would like to continue with their links to the Jesuit ethos and ideals.
