Moris and Tom. On 19 the Oct. Fr. Provincial made a quick visit to Sahodaya to discuss more about the prevailing situation on school and community. On 20th Oct. all the members of Vivek Sadan community gathered at Sahodaya for a special meeting, prior to the meeting the scholastics conducted a very meaning full prayer service which was appreciated by all. Our scholastics are very punctual to attend the monthly recollections held at Hazaribag. Fr. Tom accompanied Frs. Sibrus and Jugal went to Jamshedpur to meet Bro. NAIROBI

Greetings from Nairobi! Our Jesuit Centre here in Nairobi, Mwangaza Jesuit Spirituality Centre, where the Procurators' Congregation was held in 2012 in which our **Provincial Fr. Santosh** was one of the delegates, gradually opened for programmes after many months of lockdown. I too am kept busy at the centre with retreats and other programmes. Bookings are going on for the next batch of tertianship which is supposed to start at the beginning of January 2021, all depending on the COVID-19 situation.

The New Provincial of East Africa Province, **Fr. Kizzito**, takes charge on 3rd December. The outgoing Provincial **Fr. Afulo** is appointed New Vice-Chancellor of Arrupe Jesuit University, Harare in Zimbabwe. That is where the Africa-Madagascar Assistancy has the English Philosophate like our Satya Nilayam at Chennai.

Regarding the COVID-19 situation, by the middle of October the daily number of infections had come down. Schools were reopened; road transport, markets and other institutions of normal activities slowly picked up. But now, warnings are loud and clear on the media about another surge as the numbers of infections began to be on the rise again. Like some of the European countries, Kenya too is showing signs of a second wave of the pandemic. We keep our fingers crossed and hope that downward trend continues.

India has announced again that the suspension of normal international flights would continue for another month except for special Vandebharat flights and "bubble" flights to some countries. There is no direct flight yet between Kenya and India. People who have to travel on emergency do so by round-about routes connecting up with flights from other countries.

Our neighbouring Tanzania, just four hours' drive from here, which is part of this Province and where most of our Jesuits come from, is one country among the African Nations least affected by the Pandemic. They do not wear masks nor do they have any restrictions on gatherings. Schools social and churches continued to function normally while the neighbouring nations were reeling under the onslaught of spreading infections. The president of the country, John Magufuli, a staunch (evangelical) catholic, who has been re-elected in last week's general elections, has declared the country "Corona virus-free" thanks to the prayers by the citizens!!! I say this because last month at the funeral of a Jesuit there, the whole

parish gathered in big number and the usual burial ceremony followed lasting the whole day. *Fr. R.C.*

PARIS, FRANCE

The month of October brought to us a mixed emotion, and we have all journeyed through it courageously. Since last few weeks, France has witnessed a series of three terror attacks on her civilians. These brutal attacks starting from its capital Paris followed by attack in the cathedral of Nice and then Lyon, swept the fear of terror across. The uncertainty of "the next" had prevailed throughout France, but fortunately, the situation of fear is dving down now. During the Eucharistic celebration in St. Ignatius church, Paris on 1st November, the police had to intervene and stay on guard due to suspect activity of one person. Kudos to the team of national security for constantly instilling the confidence in the citizens. On the other hand, the COVID-19 has again taken the strong grip in most cities of France. This has forced the government to impose the second indefinite confinement throughout the country. There has been reports of COVID-19 cases in different Jesuit communities in Paris. Some recover fast and others take more time. 25 Oct. was marked by the death of two Jesuits in the province. The superior of Amit's community, Fr. Bernard Poulet sj (63) passed away of cardiac-arrest on Sunday, 25 Oct. After having symptoms of Covid-19, he was isolated in his room for three days. On Sunday morning, he was found lying on the floor in his room. The emergency medical team was called upon for the immediate aid but by then it was too late. We presumed that the internal bleeding could have led to his cardiac-arrest. Since he was also COVID-19 positive, the special team had to intervene for the preparation of his coffin. His remains in the coffin were kept in the community until 29 Oct. The requiem mass was held at St. Ignatius church on Thursday which was exclusively attended by the family, friends and the Jesuits. His body was finally laid in the graveyard of Jesuits in Montmartre. After the loss of their superior, the community was also isolated. Out of 23 Jesuits, three were tested covid-19 positive. Many others had to remain in

self-quarantined. Therefore, the older Jesuits had to be given special attention and the younger ones served them. Being healthy and untouched by the COVID-19, Amit actively served those who were confined to their rooms. After few weeks of isolation, fortunately all have recovered well. During last few weeks, the community had to live with the pain, uncertainty and worries. The able guidance of the vicesuperior and the prayerful supports of the Jesuits and friends have been the consoling factors. The brotherhood and fraternity have been strengthened in the community through this difficult time. The community is grateful for your prayerful support.

We had one week of vacation "Toussaint" in the last week of October, and

since then we are confined at home. During this vacation, the European time has been changed by adding one more extra hour to it. Now we are exactly 4 hours late from Indian timeline. After the vacation, we resumed our classes all in hybrid-visual modes. All the sessions and classes have followed again different online portals and video-conferencing. We both are keeping a good health for the moment and are fully engaged in our studies and other assignments. We have been waiting for Raymond who is supposed to come to Paris.

Other Indian scholastics have already arrived and have begun their language classes. The rest is fine here. Kindly keep us in your prayers and be assured of ours too.
