From The Provincial's Desk

My dear friends in the Lord,

Fr. General has appointed Fr. Durai Fernand the next Provincial Superior of the Gujarat Jesuit Province. He will assume office on Tuesday 12 November, during our Province Sammelan and the Felicitation for the Jubilarians of the year.

The Colloquium of Superiors' Forum was held on 29September. As befits a colloquium, the group shared their joys and sorrows of their ministry of leadership to build a caring and compassionate community. They also shared some of their best practices of governance to learn from each other. They reflected on the current socio-political scenario and came up with possible ways to counteract the onslaught of negativity towards us and our mission. There was a certain feeling of helplessness against this situation.

On the second day, there was a common session for the members of the Superiors' Forum and the PCM. Fr. M. I. Raj guided the group to become familiar with Communitarian Discernment through Spiritual Conversations.

I am glad that the Superiors come together to learn from one another and provide a structure for mutual support. I hope and pray that like the early Fathers, we too may make Spiritual Conversation a part of our way of proceeding in all matters related to our life as Jesuits and our ministries.

The Province Commission for Ministries (PCM), a quasi-governing body of the Province, met from the evening of 30September to 2October. The preparatory committee did a very good job with presenting an Action Plan on the proposed Vision-Mission Statement, derived for the various districts. The Spiritual Conversation

method was used for the deliberations. Since these deliberations were held in small groups (of 6-7 persons), everyone had a chance to express his views. All were highly impressed by the positive results due to this method of Spiritual Conversations. The group expressed the desire to use this method in all our deliberations. The results will now be submitted to the Provincial for him to arrive at a decision after due consultation.

The **biannual JCSA meeting** will take place in Ranchi from 21to 28October. I invite all to keep praying all these days for the guidance of the Spirit and for courage to follow the dictates of the Spirit in our Assistancy.

- **06:** Synod of Bishopsfor the Pan-Amazon Region begins in Rome. Let us pray very specially for the Pope, for the Church and particularly the Amazon Region
- **07: Our Lady of the Rosary**: Let's offer daily Rosary for our country.
- **08: Dashera**: May this celebration of triumph of good over evil be a beacon of light for our beleaguered nation.

We offer our prayerful good wishes to **Abp. Stanislaus Fernandes** as he celebrates his birthday today.

- 10: World Mental Health Day: Keeping in mind this year's Focus on Suicide Prevention we pledge to create structures of trust among desperate persons to confide in us.
- 11: St. John XXIII: May Good Pope John who opened the doors of the Church through Vatican II intercede for us from above

International Day of the Girl Child: May we practice and promote gender justice.

12: Bl. John Beyzym: May this "rayamendreny", Father and Mother of the lepers in Madagascar, the first priest in the mission to work among the lepers, inspire us to undertake humble, loving service of the least of this world.

- **16:** World Food Day: May we work to ensure that all get their daily bread.
- 17: International Day for the Eradication of Poverty: Theme of this year, "Acting together to empower children, their families and communities to end poverty". Poverty is not solely an economic issue, but rather a multidimensional phenomenon that encompasses a lack of both income and the basic capabilities to live in dignity. May we work to eradicate causes of poverty.
- **18: St. Luke**: May this Evangelist inspire us to be Good News to all who come in contact with us.

- 19: Sts. John de Brebeuf, Isaac Jogues, Anthony Daniel, Charles Garnier, Noel Chabanel, Gabriel Lalemant (all priests), Bro. Rene Goupil and lay volunteer John de La Lande: May these martyrs of North America inspire us to work for harmony among various tribes and castes.

▶ Spiritual Journey

Three books were launched on 9 September 2019, at CCD. Bishop Rethna Swamy was the Chief Guest with Dr. R.S. Sipai and **Fr. Francis Parmar** as the Guests of Honour. CCD was encouraged by the felicitous words from Bishop Rethnaswamy and Dr. Sipai. The third book in Gujarati, "Gujaratna Shalakiya Shikshanano





Xray" attracted the attention of the Ministry of education and has requested CCD to furnish a 90 minute Power Point Presentation for discussion among bureaucrats in Education; having seen this presentation, CCD has been informed, that the Ministry has appointed a committee to scrutinize the recommendations for implementation. On 9 September, Dr. Raheel Dhattiwala, a Ph.D. from Oxford delivered a lecture on her new book on 2002 Gujarat riots, 'Keeping the Peace'exploring the spatial dimension of riots.

Fr Lancy Lobo gave a talk on Human Ecology on 11 September to students of Tarumitra from Patna at CCD.

▶ Juniorate Jottings

Our Juniorate journey in Vinayalaya, began with working on our inner selves aided by a course on Self Awareness through Creative Art by Dr. Evelet Sequeira. We also participated in football tournaments held at XIE, Mahim and at Holy Family Church, Andheri. There were plenty of assignments to improve our academic skills, such as story writing, homily deliveries and presentations on the history of the Jesuits, story analysis, and article analysis. These have helped us to give our best wherever and in whatever we do, especially in ministry. Other courses included 'Art Appreciation' by Fr. We also went on a pilgrimage (and a meaningful Eucharistic Celebration) to Mount Mary in Bandra. We have also begun our course in Swimming in the Holy Family School pool. >> Programs focused on Ignatian Spirituality: Pune

1. Ignatian Principles for Priestly Ministry: (5th Dec to 20 Dec. 2019) The two week program aims at offering young Jesuit priests an in-depth understanding of specific Ignatian Principles that are relevant to their identity as Jesuit priests and which will aid them in their priestly ministry.

Modules: Introduction to the priestly character of a Jesuit vocation; Priestly ministry of St. Ignatius – Constitutions, Spiritual Diary & Letters; Priesthood in the documents of the GCs/Generals; Discernment in one's priestly life & ministry.

2. Ignatian Sources: (5th Jan, 2020 to 15th March, 2020) The 10 week program on Ignatian Sources will primarily focus on the fundamental texts that constitute Ignatian Spirituality. The modules will familiarize the participant with the texts, help one to analyze and interpret them in accordance with the changing times and contexts. The program ends with an 8 day retreat.

Modules: Introduction to Ignatian Sources, the Autobiography, Discernment, Spiritual Exercises, Constitutions, Spiritual Diary, Letters, Writings of the Early Companions, Ignatian Prayer, History of the SJ in India, Vatican II and Mission Today.





ECO SPIRITUALITY

Pope Francis' "Laudato Si" encyclical explains the Tripodal foundation of Christian Faith – Love of God, Human Beings and Nature. This is the core of Eco Spirituality. GJEM from its inception has been spreading this in Gujarat and beyond – through eco-spirituality retreats, sessions, Eucharists, youth workshops and eco education

Nearly two hundred Jesuits, Priests, Religious women/ men and lay faithful have attended 6/8-day retreats organized by GJEM and directed by Frs. Robert Athickal, Lancy D'Cruz and Rappai Poothokaren in different parts of Gujarat and India.

The increasing acceptance by the Church in India of Pope Francis' call to eco reflection, spirituality and involvement, has inspired some Religious Congregations to include Ecology as one of the areas of their spirituality and action ahead. Lancy directed an Eco retreat to the Daughters of the Cross congregation, Rappai directed a Retreat-cum-Seminar for all the Superiors of India of the St. Anne's of Bangalore (SAB) Congregation at NBCLC, Bangalore.

All the eco education camps for students and teachers organized by GJEM in Gujarat include a session on eco spirituality. It is time that the Church in Gujarat, India and the world integrate, and live, a loving relationship with Mother Earth as part of our Christian Faith.
