The UAPs are primarily calling us to BE rather than to perform certain tasks. It is a challenging ideal for us. An ideal is not an ideal if it is easily reached, says Gandiji whom we remember on 2nd of October.





 Certificate of these programs will be issued jointly carrying the emblems of both parties signed by the respective Directors, Course Coordinators and Principal Advisors, if any.


c. Faculty Exchange

- ii. Course materials will be prepared jointly and/or in consultation with both parties.
- 3. A three-month long Certificate program in Peace studies, the first collaborative project between LIPI and XLRI, starts on 26 October 2019. It is ensured that the course module and assignments are aligned with the UAP concerns.
