Two Programs on Ignatian Spirituality offered at the Centre for Ignatian Spirituality and Research (CISR), DNC, Pune:

- 1. Ignatian Principles for Priestly Ministry (5th Dec to 20th Dec 2019): The two-week program is only for young Jesuit priests who have not yet done their tertianship. It aims at aiding them in their priestly ministry by offering them an in-depth understanding of specific Ignatian principles that are relevant to their identity as Jesuit priests.
- 2. Ignatian Sources (5th Jan to 15th March 2020): The 10-week program on Ignatian Sources is for Jesuits as well as the wider Ignatian family. It will primarily focus on the fundamental texts that constitute Ignatian Spirituality. The modules will help the participants to analyze and interpret them in accordance with the changing times and contexts. The program ends with an 8-day retreat.

HEALTH UPDATE

Fr. A. Arulanandam underwent surgery on October 1st at Apollo, Chennai, to drain off the hemorrhage on the right side of his brain. He is now recuperating at Loyola, Chennai. After a week, on further checkup, a decision would be taken whether a similar procedure would be needed on the left side of the brain.

The General Body Meeting of the Pastoral **Commission** took place at Beschi Illam, Dindigul, on 29-30 August 2019. There were altogether 49 participants of whom 12 were Jesuits and one diocesan priest; of the remaining 36 lay people eight were ladies. It began with the Holy Eucharist by Fr. Guna, Commission Coordinator. Fr. Provincial shared with the members that the intent of the GBM was to evaluate the progress each Commission had made in implementing the Province Apostolic Plan (PAP). Then the Coordinator explained the agenda and the dynamics of the meeting. In the first part of the GBM, Parish Priests presented reports of the progress they had made in implementing PAP goals and action plans. Interventions of Fr. Provincial and Fr. Joe Arun, PDD, were helpful to have a focused sharing. In the second part, we had Spiritual Conversation in small groups to plan for the coming months. In the plenary session, the secretaries shared the report of the Spiritual Conversation. After spending some time in reflection, the members decided to implement common action plans of PAP by grouping themselves into three zones: Madurai, Tiruchi and Harur, and Frs. S. Marianathan, James and C. Marianathan accepted to be the zonal coordinators.

In his talk Fr. Jerry Rosario focused on how Servant of God Fr. Arrupe was an inspiring personality in implementing apostolic plans. In his concluding remarks, Fr. Provincial motivated and encouraged the parish priests and the participants to focus on the plans and reminded them to realize the impact of the implementation of PAP in their respective parishes. The GBM came to a close with the Holy Eucharist by Fr. Provincial.

SJC Marathon: On September 22nd, the 175th year Torch was brought by a group of 65 athletes from Nagapattinam, where the college functioned before being shifted to Tiruchi in 1844. 

When I was asked by Fr. Jerry to write these reflections, the immediate response which arose within me was: "Why not?"

The best Arrupean quality that I wish to take into my Jesuit life is his deep, personal, intimate and loving attachment to Jesus Christ. This quality of his has made him who he was. It pervaded his whole being which was evident in all his words and, more importantly, deeds. Once he was asked by a journalist after becoming the 28th Superior General of the Society of Jesus: "Who is Jesus for you?" and pat came the reply: "Jesus is my everything".



God and made him take everything as the will of God. In his case "everything" really meant "everything."

It made him a man of "Ignatian indifference" by which he accepted both joys and sorrows, health and sickness with equanimity. He gave himself completely to his mission of doing His will for His greater glory because "In His will is our peace." (Dante Alighieri, The Divine Comedy)

He was a man who was truly ahead of his time. The major decisions he took, the way he lived, his relationships inside and outside the Society and his overall attitude towards life was centered on that quality.

It had kept him at peace even after undergoing a lot of trials and tribulations and made him stand strong against the storms of life, finally leading him to reorient the mission of the Society of Jesus in the light of the Second Vatican Council. It inspired him to be a visionary leader, efficient administrator, model Jesuit, faithful son of St. Ignatius, mystic and truly a very saintly man.

Though we, too, have been initiated into this Ignatian indifference, I pray that it grows more and more in each one of us. It is the first quality required in "Our Way of Proceeding," too. When it takes complete control of us, with St. John the Baptist, we could also say: "He must increase, but I must decrease." (John 3:30)


Abide with the Lord

FR. EDWARD JEGANATHAN, S.J. 1936 - 2019

Fr. Edward Jeganathan was born in a traditional Catholic family in Kodaikanal. Two of his sisters opted for religious life, Sr. Leoni Mary becoming a Servite and Sr. Saveria joining the ICM congregation. His younger brother Fr. Amalraj entered the Society of Jesus in Gujarat Province. After his Intermediate studies at St. Joseph's College, Tiruchi, Fr. Edward joined the Society on 29.09.1956 at Beschi, Dindigul. In 1958, he went and did his Juniorate at Shembaganur and continued his philosophical studies there from 1960 to '63. Shembaganur has always remained very close to his heart and he would return there to spend the last 10 years of his life working in the archives of Madurai Province.

He completed his theological studies at De Nobili College, Pune, and was ordained a Priest on 23.03.1969. In 1970, at the request of Fr. Adaikalam, Jesuit Superior of Mauritius, Edward was missioned by Fr. Douglas Gordon, Provincial of Madurai, to work in that island nation which had a mixed population of about 10 lakhs, 62% of whom were Hindus, the rest being Creoles, Chinese, Muslims and Europeans.

From 1971 to 1985, Edward did his work of evangelization among all these people seeking God in a variety of ways. His approach which was cultural, human and pastoral did yield fruits. He also took Bible classes in educational institutions. From 1986 to 1993, he was engaged in pastoral ministry as the pastor of a parish.

Off and on, when his assistance was needed in the neighbouring island of La Réunion, he was ready to help out in traditional spiritual ministries.

About 1,000 kms to the north of Mauritius and La Réunion, lies Seychelles, a country which is an archipelago or a cluster of islands. Edward was sent there and was engaged in pastoral ministry from 1993 to 2006. He was ever ready to help out, especially the Indian emigrants. It was the humanity of Edward that attracted these groups to him. These emigrants from India, mostly Tamil Hindus sought Edward merely for his human qualities. Noting that they were not receptive to the Good News of Jesus

Christ and seeing that life in Seychelles was too comfortable materially, without adequate returns in spiritual fruits, Edward decided to return to his Mother Province.

Whenever he spoke of his missionary endeavors, he always spoke of Mauritius and little did he share of his Seychelles experience. About Mauritius itself he would repeat the oft-quoted saying: "Mauritius was made first and then heaven; and heaven was copied after Mauritius."

He was a committed missionary and for 34 years he worked tirelessly among the people of Indian origin and other Catholics. He cherished the many moments of bringing people together in their differences as well as bringing them closer

to God.

Fr. Xavier Raj during the homily in the funeral Mass recalled how he was a man of spiritual ministry, joyfully accepting all the spiritual assignments like celebrating the Eucharist, hearing confessions, giving recollections and Ignatian retreats and giving importance to family counseling.

The homilist also highlighted Edward's solidarity with the poor. After he returned to Shembag in 1997, he helped many poor people financially with the help he got from his friends abroad. He had a soft corner for the works of PEAK and Grihini Community College, Shembaganur. Thanks to his conviction and support PEAK was able to put up an additional building for the school children at Sacred Heart College itself when many community members were not enthusiastic about our option for the poor, dalits and tribals. He stood his ground and supported the PEAK team in all its endeavours.

Working in the Province archives at Shembag was a labour of love for him. He helped numerous people, Jesuits as well as non-Jesuits, with their research work as well as writing and publishing articles and books.

His was a life so well lived that the joy that emanated from him radiated all around.
