

#### JMAADD comes to Tiruchi

JMAADD (Jesuit Ministry for Alcohol And Drug Dependents) will soon begin to serve people in Tiruchi and the neighbouring districts. We offer 21 days of residential treatment for people who are addicted to alcohol and other substances. Doctors, nurses, and trained counsellors will give their best to help the patients recover from their addiction, as JMAADD sees addiction as a disease of the mind, body, soul and family.

The unique treatment, developed by JMAADD, has proved to be effective because it employs community-based strategies, based on Alcoholics Anonymous' famous 12 steps. It incorporates findings of extensive scientific research into the physiological, psychological, and spiritual aspects of addiction. The different phases of the treatment offered by JMAADD are awareness-intervention, treatment, detox, psychiatric assessment, meditation, 12 steps work and recovery support for a year.

The new Centre, AHEAD (Arrupe Health Enclave for Alcohol/Drug Dependents), coming up in Mullaikudi, expects to start functioning from 1 December 2020.

JMAADD, a ministry of the Madurai Jesuit Province, launched in 2006, has conducted 152 camps so far, treating more than 4,500 addicts and their families. Total Cost: Rs.15,000. #### **Health Undate**

**Fr. Sahaya Philomin Raj** had symptoms of mild viral infection in his lungs according to a CT scan report on 07.09.2020. With Mr. James Rajan, his elder brother, he was quarantined at Muhil Health Centre, Alampatti, Thirumangalam from September 8 to 13, at St. Philomena's, Bangalore, from 13 to 17 and back again at Muhil from 17th from where he was discharged and returned to IDEAS on September 28th.

**Fr. James Thamburaj** was admitted in the ICU of Star KIMS hospital, Tiruchi, on September 7th evening having developed a kidney infection due to high creatinine levels along with some symptoms of arthritis causing severe pain in the hands, the knees and the waist. Discharged from the hospital on September 19th, he was back at Clive Illam, Tiruchi, but pretty much bedridden. On September 26th, he was brought to Beschi Infirmary, Dindigul, and has been there since. His pain is much reduced. With some assistance he is able to get up from his bed or

chair and even walk in infirmary corridor with the support of a walker.

**Fr. Britto Bonaventure**, too, was brought on the same day in the evening to Beschi after being hospitalized for a few days at St. Joseph Hospital, Dindigul. He has been unsteady on his feet and finding it difficult to walk. He has been accommodated in the room adjacent to the dispensary and as at now, physically, clinically and medically there is no issue and he is able to move around without assistance.

Fr. A. Wilson: Health workers of Nagercoil Corporation came to our Carmel Hr. Sec. School, on 1 October 2020 and tested about 25 persons including our staff and domestic workers. Unfortunately, Fr. A. Wilson, our Headmaster, was found to be mildly COVID positive. He was admitted on October 3rd at Holy Cross Hospital, Nagercoil, run by the Sisters of the Holy Cross Menzingen (Kottiyam Sisters). From October 3rd, Carmel community members self-quarantined immediately and have been following all the protocols/precautions including suspension of all the common activities, separate meal timings including using separate crockery and cutlery. We also continue to take regularly different types of kashayams, homoeopathic preventive medicines and proper diet with fruits. No visitors are allowed in the campus and our staff entering the campus are asked to wash their hands, use sanitizer and wear masks compulsorily and are asked to take all other preventive measures for their safety and security.

Fr. Gerlin Amaladoss (CEN) has been fitted with an Implantable Cardioverter-Defibrillator (ICD) at CMC, Vellore, a device that detects any life-threatening, rapid heartbeat. After the implantation he feels much better and is able to do things for himself. He has to walk 200 to 300 meters, three times a day and gradually increase it to 3 kilometers in three months, do a lot of breathing exercises and follow the diet as per the prescription. He has been shifted to the Jesuit Residence at Ranipet.

**Fr. Maria Packiam (CEN)** tested positive for COVID-19 on 23 September 2020 after his home visit. He is now quarantined in Loyola Hostel with medications prescribed by the doctor.

**Fr. Vino Selukas (CEN)** who was supposed to fly to Rome on September 25th had taken a

COVID test as a prerequisite for his air travel. Unfortunately, he tested positive for COVID-19 on September 25th. Cancelling his flight, he is also quarantined in Loyola Hostel and is under medication although he is asymptomatic.

Fr. Xavier Rajan (CEN), having intermittent fever, prolonged tiredness and swollen feet, was readmitted in St. Thomas Hospital on 27 September. He had developed urinary infection that caused intermittent fever and other weaknesses. He is supposed to stay there for some more time for rest and recuperation.

Fr. Freddie (CEN) tested positive for COVID-19 on 2 October 2020 and has been admitted in Sathyam Hospital, Coimbatore, while his community members Fr. Xavier Gnanasekaran and Sch. Sundar are quarantined at Arrupe Illam, Mettupalayam.

Fr. J.P. Bellarmine (CEN) has been brought from Porulur and admitted in JCB Hospital, Dindigul, on 11.10.2020 with 70% lung infection.

#### **Ecology Commission Meeting**

The first meeting of the Ecology Commission was held online on 4 August 2020. Fr. Joe Arun, the resource person, presented PAP2 Action Plans and emphasized the importance of aligning with Jesuits globally in protecting and preserving the environment and safeguarding the rights of the poor and the marginalized in our Province. He highlighted the important action plans proposed by various Commissions and communities which served as a backdrop to the discussion that followed during which it was stressed that we should evolve a Vision and Mission for the Province keeping in mind the call of Pope Francis to listen to the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor. It is true that we have taken some eco-friendly initiatives such as making our campuses plastic-free zones and trying to use Solar power to produce electricity



and so on. However, we need to do more to preserve and protect our common home. It was agreed that we have to collaborate and network with like-minded people and organizations to promote integrated energy, water management and eco-friendly agriculture in order to preserve our common home. During our discussion on EIA 2020, it was very much stressed that we need to collaborate with all like-minded groups such as political parties, unorganized labourers and all the common people under the banner All India People's Federation for Environmental Protection – Tamil Nadu ('அகில இந்திய சுற்றுச்சூழல் பாதுகாப்பு மக்கள் கூட்டமைப்பு'-தமிழ்நாடு) and oppose this unwanted EIA 2020 draft. The online Commission meeting ended with the concluding remarks of Fr. L. John Peter Arulanandam, Coordinator of Ecology Commission, who thanked everyone for actively participating in the first meeting of the Commission.

### **NEWS DIGEST**

#### **Dindigul: Beschi Illam**

Novitiate In line with PAP 2, our novices celebrated the International Day of Care for creation on 31 August. They chose the theme "இயற்கையின் நிழலில், இறைவனின் மடியில்" (To be with Nature is to be in the bosom of God) and each did a tree-adoption after planting saplings. Fr. Dhanaraj Raphael gave a one-week course on தமிழர் ஆன்மீகம் (The Spirituality of Tamils) for our novices from 14 to 18 September. It was an eye-opener for them to discover how replete our Tamil Bhakti literature is with rich resources.

Eleven first year novices had their pilgrimage experiment from 20 to 26 September and this was organized differently this year. All through this experiment, the grace they asked through the intercession of our Lady was "to be placed with Her Son". They walked, in and around Beschi Campus, about a distance of 270 kilometres, equivalent to the distance from Beschi Illam to the Shrine Basilica of Our Lady of Health, Vailankanni. They went on a pilgrimage to Vadipatti on the last day where they concluded their pilgrimage with a Solemn Mass concelebrated by Frs. Novice Master, Socius and Harry Martis.

During the pilgrimage experiment of the first year novices, their five second year companions had their



house maintenance experiment instilling in them the value of manual labour.

On 26 September, the eve of the 480th anniversary of the Society's approval in 1540, Fr. Michael Doss gave a recollection talk to the community on the theme: 'Following in the footsteps of St. Ignatius today'.

JRS: Even during this global pandemic, the refugee students never remain idle in camps; rather, they grab the opportunities to exhibit their talents at various levels. For example, two of our Complementary Education (CE) students –R. Karunakaran (Class X) and S. Ajith (Class V) – from Thumbalhalli camp participated in the drawing competition conducted by Kalvi Tholaikaatchi, a Tamil Educational TV Channel and won third and fourth prizes, respectively, at the district level.

Fr. Viji Bose, Director, Pre-Novitiate, JPLI, Kasthambadi, handles Spoken English classes for X to XII students in Kasthambadi camp. On 5 September, Teachers' Day was celebrated in most of our CE Centres and the teachers were gratefully honoured by their students.

JRS-TN conducted an online Quarterly Teacher Training Programme for 156 CE teachers of Nellai, Kovai, Tiruvannamalai and Tiruchi zones on 12,13, 19 and 20 September, respectively. It was the first of its kind for the JRS teachers in Tamil Nadu. Sch. Edward Lenin, the Education Officer of JRS-TN, handled sessions on Effective Leadership while Mr. Antony, Peace Coordinator, handled sessions on Peace Education. On 27 and 28 September, Fr. Louie Albert, Regional Director, JRS South Asia, visited the JRS-TN team and took part in the monthly review meeting conducted at Alverna Centre, Nochiodaipatti, Dindigul. The team had long discussions on how to take up the programme activities innovatively during the unlocking of the COVID lockdown and came up with an action plan to implement the program activities.

#### Dindigul: St. Mary's

On 28 August, St. Mary's organized a webinar on NEP 2020 and the Future of School Education, in which our teaching and non-teaching staff and staff from our neighbouring schools actively participated. Fr. S. M. John Kennedy, Director, JCERT, the resource person, was exuberantly fiery in explaining the hidden agenda behind this deadly NEP 2020 with its historical background. On 5 September, we celebrated Teachers' Day together with our primary and secondary school staff. #### Kanyakumari: Thozhamai Illam

Thozhamai Illam has been given a facelift with three new projects:

1) Fixing of a galvanised sheet rooftop over the community building: The purpose of this addition was to block rain water hitting our corridors. The rooftop now looks grand and gives a finished look to the whole building from every angle. More than anything else, it serves its intended purpose and now when it rains, we can safely step outside our rooms. Additionally, the rooftop has also made the space below look like a compact and beautiful hall for prayer, meetings and gatherings. This hall has been named Fr. Louis Lèveil Hall to honour his memory. From the first week of July, the community members, together with the co-workers, gather in the hall every morning at 9:00 a.m., except on Sundays, for prayer followed by the co-workers signing the attendance register. The hall has been used for community gathering, Novena prayers to St. Ignatius and the feast day Eucharist. The house chapel wall from behind has a beautiful picture of St. Francis Xavier giving the residence a prayerful atmosphere.



2) Chapel renovation work: The purpose was to fix the cracks and add additional support to the chapel as a lot of cracks on the walls had created a sense of danger to the people who visit the chapel regularly. This has been done with concrete, chemicals and iron mesh to make the building quite strong extending its life for many more years. The La Storta vision of St. Ignatius and symbols like Sacred Heart, AMDG and IHS together make the altarpiece in the space behind and above the altar. On 13 August, we had the Mass celebrated for the birthday babies of the month, Frs. Sahayaraj, Arul Sivan and Br. Peter, in the newly renovated Main Chapel. With some modifications and the fixing of a new tabernacle, the house chapel, too, looks good giving an atmosphere of prayer and serenity.

3) Creation of a new garden behind the community's residence: A large space behind the community's residence, lying unused for a long time has been converted into a new garden now. This space that already had a few coconut trees was prepared to plant more coconut saplings and cultivate banana as a middle crop. We have now planted 70 coconut saplings grown in our garden and 100 banana suckers

freely provided to us by the Rosarian Fathers at Vadakkankulam monastery. The already connected drip irrigation facility takes care of watering these trees. They are growing well and the garden is a beautiful sight to see.

#### **Karumathur: AAC**

There were several stocktaking meetings, particularly on continuing the online classes, webinars, and conduct of examinations online in the context of COVID-19. It was a new experience for all to conduct online exams, manoeuvring through challenges but finally coming to a smooth completion. Having become experts, some of our staff members helped the five neighbourhood schoolteachers, equipping them with soft skills to handle online classes and webinars. Serious preparation for NAAC has been going on for two weeks with the first round of academic audit in every department with experts accompanied by Fr. Rufus, the Principal. The second round will start at the beginning of October. Initiated by Fr. John, our Superior, the Principal constituted three committees inclusive of Jesuits to have an overall study and monitoring of the three vital areas, academic, health, and finance. These teams are already at work. AAC played a noteworthy role in the Higher Education GBM held on 2-3 October with Fr. Gilburt heading the team of Jesuits in deliberating on NEP. Fr. Vincent Sekhar, as Head of the Department of Human Excellence organized a separate Orientation Programme for I and II year teachers handling Personality Development and Environmental Studies on 3 and 11 September, respectively. While he was the resource person for the I year teachers, Fr. Jayaseelan presented a model sketch of one Unit, its content and method of teaching and evaluation to the II year teachers. We could notice visible changes in the method of teaching of our staff. Fr. Vincent Sekhar gave an online class to the Theology students of Georgetown University, Washington DC, on "Christian theology in Asia, engaging differences" on 10 September. He also organized a Google Meet on 30 September on behalf of the Dept. of Human Excellence and the JCSA Secretariat for Faith - Commission for Interreligious Dialogue on the theme "Religions vis-à-vis COVID-19" with well-known speakers, Fr. Sebastian Painadath, Director of Sameeksha at Kaladi, and Fr. Felix Wilfred, Founder Director of Asian Cross-Cultural Studies, Chennai. The webinar was attended by 70-80 participants. Fr. A. Antonysamy after his "long"



sabbatical in Marquette University, Milwaukee, joined the Arrupe Illam Jesuit community, hale and hearty. Everyone on campus including the Jesuits is safe and life runs smooth, thank God! Fr. Amalraj has gone back to Kadamalaikundu Parish on 25 September after completely recovering from COVID-19. His memorable quarantine/stay in Arrupe Illam Jesuit community was one of joy with deep gratitude to the community members. Fr. Provincial's contact visit on 24 September was informal and he expressed during the homily his happiness of visiting various Jesuit communities at this time of the year.


#### **Madurai: IDEAS and LAAS**

As a follow-up to 'Corona Unlocks: The Vulnerabilities of the Advocates – a Study on the Lockdown Impacts', formally released in July 2020 by LAAS and ISI-B, an awareness zoom meeting presided over by Fr. Santhanam for advocates of Tamil Nadu and Puducherry was organized on 5 September. Speaking on the occasion, Mr. P. Ashok, the Co-Chairman and Mr. M. R. R. Subramaniam, member of the Bar Council of TN & P demanded that the government should address the financial vulnerabilities of the advocates and reservation for women advocates in the Bar Council. The study report



has been submitted to the Secretary-General of the Supreme Court of India for placing it before the CJI and other judges. Fr. Santhanam has elucidated the significance of Preamble of the Indian Constitution in the present context to the animators and cadres of TN unit of ISI-B as a part of the cadre formation

program online on 16 September. Sch. Joseph, as a member of the Law Students Forum for Social Justice (LSFSJ), has organized a webinar on 30 September 2020, titled "நீட் தடை போடவா? தரம் உயர்த்தவா?" The webinar started with a homage to



students like Anita to Modhilal who lost their lives owing to NEET. Dr. Ezhilan Naganathan delivered an emotional, informative and thought-provoking speech to the advocates and the students of law. He strongly condemned NEET and the education system that destroy the dreams and lives of Dalits and marginalized students of the first generation in the name of quality improvements. He extolled the thoughts of social justice of Periyar and the constitutional values of Dr. Ambedkar.

#### **Madurai: DACA**

With the objective of empowering the local farmers to face a drought-prone situation with minimum available water and become self-sufficient in food production, DACA has initiated organic farming called Agroforestry or Five Layer Farm. The farm was set up on 30 November 2019 initially with 28 different crops including fruit trees, vegetables, creepers, flowers and oil-plants in a half-acre of land. Now after nine months, the entire land looks like a



thick green forest. Today several farmers are visiting the farm and studying the various techniques used in it. As 'Online Education' has become the order of the day, SJC's ERP team, co-ordinated by Fr. Santiago, rose to the occasion by setting up Google classes, students' e-enrolment and ensuring availability of e-learning materials. Many training programmes on Online Teaching Tools were organized by the college to orient the staff to teach and conduct exams - both theory and practical - in the online mode. As a result, Final Semester exams for the academic year 2019-2020 due in April 2020 for both UG and PG

courses were conducted online professionally. And the Controller of Examinations Cell left no stone unturned to facilitate the exams taken by all the final year students, including those who live in very remote places. The Department of Mathematics was the first one in the whole of our university to conduct Ph.D. viva voce online and more than 25 Ph.D. scholars defended their theses during this lockdown period.

SJC was selected for the perennial fund under the 'Unnath Bharath Abhiyan (UBA)' Scheme by IIT, Delhi, the National Coordinating Institute. Thanks to the good work done by the SHEPHERD Department co-ordinated by Fr. Berchmans, St. Joseph's was selected for the fund.

Under the supervision of Fr. K. Arockiam, three Ph.D. scholars have successfully defended their theses on different aspects of Human Resource Management. The external examiners from Karunya Deemed to be University, Coimbatore, and Alagappa University, Karaikudi, for the viva voce examinations were very much appreciative of the quality research work.

Fr. K. Arockiam conducted a two-day national Online Workshop on Research Project Proposal Writing for Lecturers on 1-2 September. Nearly 57 participants from all over India participated in it. It was a registered event, with a pre-condition that the participants should have submitted a research proposal in advance. Fr. Principal appointed him the convener of the Task Group for UGC Quality Mandate on Human Values and Professional Ethics in April 2020 and he organised online meetings for the Task Group members and submitted the Final Report to him in May.

From 13 to 18 September, Fr. M. A. Joe Antony preached an online retreat for the priests of the Madurai archdiocese. For him as well as for the priests of the archdiocese this was the first online retreat. Fr. Joe is grateful to Fr. Santiago and Schs. Susaipragasam and Sebastian Jerald for the technical help that made this possible and problem-free. Fr. V. Joseph Xavier served as a resource person at three national level webinars on New Education Policy (NEP) 2020. He has also been invited to conduct NEP reviews by other organizations as well. UNLOCK 4.0 guidelines issued by the Government of India have paved the way for resuming daily Mass Services (6.30 a.m. & 6.30 p.m.) at Our Lady of Lourdes Church from

1 September with adequate precautionary measures. In the same way, the regular 8.00 a.m. Mass on Sundays also has been resumed.


#### Fr. Frederick Xavier Joseph

The very thought of Sacerdotal Ordination evokes in us memories of a huge gathering and a celebration with all splendour and grandeur. Ordination 2020 was different. What we had on 7 October 2000 was a simple but very solemn and meaningful celebration, resonating with our theme, நலிந்தோரின் நற்செய்தியாக (to be the Good News for the marginalized).
