Gorakh and Fr Nicolas Christuraj were warmly welcomed with Nepali khadas in Jhapa Jesuit Mission in Nepal.

The Arrupe Niwas community continues to reach out to our Catholic faithful at this time of pandemic. Masses for them are being celebrated in small numbers at different places. Both Fr Arul and Fr Boniface gave a day of recollection on different days to Carmel Missionary Sisters of Sadakbari and Faber House, Maheshpur respectively.

'Walking with the poor'- one of the Universal Apostolic Preferences -has been constantly implemented by distributing dried ration to downtrodden and neglected people in the society of our pastoral area and neighbouring places with the assistance of the people belonging to the respective localities.

It was a newly laid stone road which Fr Daniel and Ravindra took and in the process of saving a chicken, a stone piece entered the front wheel. Thus, the running bike fell, dragged Fr Daniel for some distant; leaving his shoulder bone cracked and dislocated. Sch. Ravindra was thrown off from bike and had a minor injury.

Now Sch. Ravindra Bara, our beloved theologian, is preparing himself for his upcoming semester examination from October 12, 2020.

News and Views from Rome

After a prolonged uncertain period and adverse situation, 3 Ranchi Jesuits – Deepak Toppo, Kuldeep Linda and Sandeep Bage; and 2 Ursuline Sisters – Shanti S. Samad and Prabha Topno – arrived in Rome on Saturday 3 October. Immediately after their arrival, all of them had Covid Test in the Airport itself. Kulwant, Nirmal and Prem were at the Airport to receive the new Roman friends. After one-day rest, they started their online classes from Monday 5 October. Deepak joined the Institute of Spirituality to pursue in Ignatian spirituality; while Kuldeep, Sandeep, Shanti and Prabha have joined the Faculty of Theology as the First Year Theology students. In normal situation, they would have arrived in Rome already in May. However, the cancellation of flights and suspension of Visa process forced them to wait and see for the appropriate moment. Fr. Joseph Marianus Kujur, the outgoing Provincial and Fr. Ajit Kumar Xess, the new Provincial along with Sr. Suchita Shalini Xalxo (Ranchi OSU Provincial) and Sr. Maria Swarnlata Kujur (Gumla OSU Provincial) came together to search for some feasible means to provide the future Roman students with the Italian language course and assigned Fr. Edwin Dang as their Master and Guide in Ashirvad. Fr. Edwin did a commendable job by teaching them the fundamentals of Italian grammar. The daily Eucharistic celebrations in Italian helped them to learn some important liturgical as well as theological words and phrases. From August, all five of them joined the Online language course conducted directly from Rome. With the conclusion of online language course on 18 September, they had already gained confidence in expressing themselves in Italian.

Sch. Kuldeep Linda wrote a few lines to share his hopes and aspirations with Ranchi Jesuits, "First of all, I would like to thank the Almighty God for making all things possible during the pandemic situation. I feel indebted to my Province men, very specially to Fr. Ajit Xess, Provincial, Fr. Socius, Fr. PCF, Sodbhwana Community, St. Xavier's Doranda Community, and my guide and professor Fr. Prem Xalxo for their constant effort, love, concerns and prayers to make my journey to Rome a successful one. I am grateful to Fr. Edwin Dang for his patience and paternal guidance in teaching the basic Italian grammar. I left Ranchi on 2 October with my 4 other companions; and on 3 October, left early in the morning from Delhi for Rome via Paris. In the process of my Journey I had unforgettable and enriching experiences. With great hope and enthusiasm, I landed in Rome, and without delay I went through the Covid Test with the other companions. With Negative Reports in our hands, all of us came out and were received very warmly by Kulwant, Nirmal and Prem. Both Sandeep and myself were accorded a very cordial welcome by Fr. Rector and the Community of International College of Gesù. On the next day itself, Fr. Prem had arranged one-hour class conducted by his colleague to teach us the new system of distant teaching and learning using Moodle Platform,

which helped me to attend the online class from the very next day itself with great joy, hope and enthusiasm”.

Towards the end of August, the community members of International College of Gesù started coming back to Rome to renew the registration in Gregorian University. Nirmal was already back in the Community on 25 August. From 2 September, 11 Second Year Scholastics and 2 Biblical students began their Arrupe Month commonly known as Pre-Ordination Program in the Convent of Bethany Sisters. Newly arrived First Year Scholastics had already started their Italian language course in August, which continued until 18 September. The Course was made accessible by conducting online classes for those who could not arrive in Rome. Deepak, Kuldeep, Sandeep, Shanti and Prabha too joined the Online Course from Ranchi itself.

On 31 August, Nirmal went to a small town on the outskirts of Rome for his Annual Retreat under the loving care and guidance of Prem Xalxo. The House is constructed on the rocky beach of Mediterranean Sea. The picturesque natural beauty and relaxing sea waves hitting the House helped both of them to make a fruitful and meaningful Retreat. After being spiritually nourished and re-energized, Nirmal came back to the Community of 8 August, and began preparing himself for the new Academic Year. After completing the Italian Language Course on 18 September, all the First Year Scholastics left for their Annual Retreat in one of the Retreat Houses in Rome. Almost all the Community members came back to Rome by 27 September, and once again the community life began in full swings with its normal time table. The entire community participated in the Orientation Program – all necessary information and guidelines were enunciated for the smooth flow of the community. Fr. Rector insisted on the community life based on collaboration and growth in intellectual as well as spiritual formation through mutual support and encouragement. Fr. Minister underlined the communitarian life to make a better community life. And finally, the Apostolate In-charge encouraged all to get actively involved in some apostolates for the integral growth. Nirmal was extremely happy to have Kuldeep Linda and Sandeep Bage as his new companions in Gesù Community from 3 October onwards. Since both of them had Negative Covid Test, they were immediately incorporated into the community activities. After one-day rest, Nirmal, Kuldeep and Sandeep joined the online regular classes from Monday 5 October. After one week, they hope to be physically present in the Class Rooms for the regular classes.

Unlike the other years, Collegio San Roberto Bellarmino, the community of Deepak and Kulwant, remained open during the summer holidays, and particularly in the month of August and September. Some stayed at home for the summer, others left for holidays or pastoral ministries. Those arriving in the community after being away from home had to submit to quarantine immediately on their arrival. The community continued and still continues to observe the necessary sanitary measures to help

protect everyone. However, in the middle of the month of September, one of the community members was found Covid-19 positive, which changed the whole atmosphere of the community. For nearly 20 days, all remained in their respective rooms and came together only for meals; thus restricted the movement in and out of the community. Probably, such restrictions came to most of them as a blessing in disguise to concentrate in studies and prepare themselves for the comprehensive exams. Kulwant is happy and content with his presentation in all the exams. At present, he is busy preparing himself to get enrolled for doctorate in the Faculty of Canon Law. Even though Deepak had a negative Covid Test on his arrival in Rome Airport, he had to undergo a Quarantine of 14 days. A precautionary measure, which will also help him to attend the Online classes with ease.

Anselm Ekka joined a group of 10 Curia Community members to go to Ischia Island for the Annual Retreat from 15 to 27 September. Fr. Superior also joined the group. The House of Passionist Fathers situated by the sea provided an excellent ambience and ideal place for silence, prayer and meditation. The warm hospitality of the Passionist Fathers was so extraordinary that three groups of Curia Fathers went there for their Annual Retreats on different dates. After the summer vacation, all the Jesuits and co-staffs have resumed their respective offices. Despite the extra care and precautionary measures, one of the JRS co-staffs was found infected with COVID-19. Immediately, the JRS Office was closed and the entire area was sanitized. All Jesuits and co-staffs went for Covid-19 check up and were asked to quarantine themselves in their house. To the relief of all, the test at the end of Quarantine Period showed negative reports. On 2 October, the Curia commemorated the feast of St. Francis Borgia, the Patron Saint of the General Curia. On such a solemn occasion Fr. General presided over the Holy Mass in the Aula and led all the Curia Jesuits to pray in special manner for all the Jesuits, benefactors, friends, deceased members of Jesuits, families and co-staffs.

All the Professors of Gregorian University had one week of formation course to learn the new method of distant teaching using Moodle Platform, which provides various methods of conducting classes, interacting with students through Online Forum and Chats. The First Week-classes from 5 October are being held online. From the Second Week, the odd-even Roll Numbers will be applied to ensure the physical presence of the students in the class rooms. For one week, the students with the Odd Roll Numbers will be allowed to be present in the class rooms, while the others will follow the lessons online; and vice-versa. A new innovative method will continue until the return of the normal situation.

Linus Kujur finds himself ready for the new teaching method. He has six courses altogether this academic year; some alone and others shared with Professors. Sharing of courses is one of the ways of becoming inter disciplinary, that is, studying one topic from different perspectives. This makes one comprehensive and open to other realities. He

belongs to the Faculty of Missiology, but is asked to help in the Centre for Inter-religious Studies, as originally it was part of the same Faculty. This faculty seeks to open up the doors of the Church to the world and bring them together on the way to holiness. His first course is on "Feast" aimed at explaining it as a means for sanctifying or evangelizing the world. It is nearly three years that one of his kidneys was transplanted. Day by day, his life with the community is becoming normal. Some consider it a miracle of the health care; it is certainly a new life, a gift from the Lord for His service. Praise the Lord!

Amman (Jordan)

Dear Frs., Jai yesu & greetings from Jordan. A quick news for RB before, I begin my 8 days' personal spiritual Exercises.

In the Near East and Morocco Province the new status is announced on 31st July. Based on this, the transfer procedure begins. At times, to travel from one Near East country to the other is not easy especially when the person is not from these countries. Ever since the spread of Covid-19 each country has its own policies according to the situations. Hence, it took me almost two months to reach the place of my destination.

Earlier Jesuits from American Provinces were here in Iraq and Jordan. Due to the war in the 1980s in Iraq, the Jesuits were ordered to leave. Some joined the Near East Province who knew Arabic language and were ready to learn French as it is the language of the Province. Jordan remained a place for connecting Jesuits from around the Provinces and giving their services to the Jordanians. Various factors have been a challenge for the majority of the Jesuits. Marc Stephan (Germany) and Sch. Moayad Maayah (Jordan). Fr. Stephan Curtin, a former Provincial of Australia, Mission Procurator, Tertian master is on a sabbatical re-finding his earlier JRS roots here. He had visited Hazaribagh many times.

OBITUARIES

FR. ERIK HENRY BREYE SJ (1940-2020)

Father Erik Henry Breye SJ, after completing three years of Philosophy at Leuven, left Belgium on 1 August 1964 as a young missionary to India. His companion was Fr Winant Callewaert SJ, who had completed just one year of philosophy. Callewaert went back to Belgium after a few years of stay in India but Erik remained till the end of his life, a desire he had always cherished.



Born on the 10th of December 1940 at Izegem (Belgium), Father Erik Henri Breye SJ was the only boy of his parents who grew up in a strong bond of love and understanding with his only sister who was elder to him. Whenever Erik visited his country, he would spend his time at her house. He enjoyed his stay in the good company of his brother-in-law, a very candid person, whose fateful death in December 2019 had affected him deeply. Ever since his affable brother-in-law's death, Erik would regularly call his sister to remain in constant

touch with her till his death parted ways from her on the 18th of September 2020.

Until he entered into the Jesuit Novitiate at Drongen, Belgium in 1959, Erik had no association with the Jesuits. Yet, once he had joined the novitiate, the Society of Jesus became his home for the rest of his life. At his small home-town of Izegem, his mother ran a fur shop and his father worked as a representative of a known Cake factory of the place. His parents had, thus, little time to inquire about young Erik's progress in the school. Besides, they were not highly educated either. This made Erik take upon himself the responsibility of managing the school affairs all by himself. He forged his father's signature on the class progress reports, thus presumed to spare his parents' time of monitoring his performance at the school. His parents knew nothing about it until one of his teachers inquired into the reason for his parents' detachment from his school education. When the report reached his parents, Erik's mother inquired from him about this and so came the truth to light. Erik had no other way than admit his mistake, explaining his intentions.

The new missionary, Fr. Erik went to St. Stanislaus' College, Sitagaraha (Hazaribag) to learn Hindi. A few months later, he was assigned to teach Hindi at St. John's School, Ranchi. Being a beginner himself at Hindi, how he managed to teach Hindi to the Middle school boys was an amusing comedy of errors. Erik narrated this funny experience a couple of times with a lot of interest along with its amusing moments.

Coming to India fulfilled one of Erik's aims— to be a missionary. Still, it was not the end of his goal and it was certainly not all that smooth and easy. He came to realize it sooner than later when he was given 5 consecutive years of regency without being promoted to theology. Of these five years, four years were spent in teaching Philosophy at St. Albert's Seminary, Ranchi. It might appear a little exceptional though Erik narrated it with a smile how he enjoyed it. The provincial himself reckoned that Erik would probably discontinue and leave the Society. However, Erik's positive attitude and his fortitude stood him in good stead to be unperturbed by such an opinion of his superiors. Besides, his interest in the seminarists made his superiors change their minds, finally promoting him to theology and earmarking him for teaching in the Seminary.

Erik was a kind and humble person. He readily acknowledged his mistakes like tricking his parents concerning his school progress report. So too was his acceptance of the judgment of his superiors without begrudging, arguing, or complaining. He looked always at the brighter side of things in life and work. One of the best-kept secrets was, perhaps, his sense of good humor, even when

faced with an odd situation. This positive outlook was part and parcel of his attitude and philosophy of life which remained so, till the end of his life. His last dinner in the community on the previous evening stamps the final seal to it when he had enjoyed the conversation at the table, interacting with his best of humor and making the company alive.

Erik had the panache and flair for looking at the positive side of things and accepting any hurtful or unpleasant situation with a peace of mind. He would seek all the time a point of concurrence and appreciation where things appeared disagreeable and opposite. This reflected in his observations or in his opinions in a statement that surprised his colleagues, wondering at his wisdom and depth of perception and understanding.

Despite holding a critical and variant opinion on some issues, Eric, as a man of the Church, had a deep respect for it, submitting himself to the authority of the orthodox teaching of the Church and its positions. As a theologian, his orthodoxy was commendable. At the same time, his critical views on certain matters were quite revealing which challenged one's faith and position. He would gently prod others to see a different perspective of things that one would otherwise simply ignore as a possibility. This indicates his openness to different opinions and thinking towards an understanding of one's faith. This was his way of understanding and responding to adapt theology effectively to the demands of new situations. He took great care and interest in reading new books and articles on theology and Scripture that contained somewhat critical and contrary views to critique and make a balanced assessment on them. He made a fine distinction between what was important and what was peripheral. In his sudden passing away, the Faculty of St. Albert's has lost an icon and stalwart of critical thinking who made the faculty of theology alive in spirit with his thinking and orientation, inspiring others open to differing opinions.

As a teacher of theology, Erik had the art of communicating the matters of faith in a simple way that even an average student could easily understand and feel encouraged to make effort to learn and progress in deepening one's faith. Although he would not remember the names of his students, yet in his assessment of each of them as persons, he was fair and objective and fatherly in personal guidance. He appreciated their strength and encouraged them. He was a compassionate formator for decades who moulded, guided, taught, and accompanied them with lots of love and dedication. Given the choice, the students would prefer him as their mentor and guide.

Erik was a man set apart for formation. Of the 56 years he lived in India, including 8 years spent in studies (B.Th., Licentiate, Doctorate), 46 years of his life were spent in teaching the seminarists at St.

Albert's College, Ranchi. Besides, he was socius to the Master of novices at St. Stanislaus, Sitagarh (Hazaribag) after his priestly ordination for two years (1973-1975). He served St. Albert's Seminary with distinction in various capacities— as a prefect of the Seminarists, as a librarian, as a teacher, moderator of the M.Th. students, and the president of the faculty. The best of his contributions, though, lay in inspiring the Seminarists by his person and life. His friendly and non-threatening dealing, his understanding of the students and staff endeared him as a good colleague and companion to members of the community and staff. His consistency in work was an inspiration to many. His spiritual guidance to the Seminarists and several others was much sought, loved, and appreciated.

It is only fair to delve into Erik's interior life— he and his God, his prayer and faith, and his relationship with Christ. He had an unflinching commitment to his prayers and devotion to celebrate the daily Eucharist with fervour. Since the outbreak of Covid 19 and the subsequent lockdown since 11 March 2020— during the entire period of this pandemic— he enriched the teaching staff for over five months, beautifully connecting the entrance hymn with the greeting and the reading, inviting the participants to celebrate their life in the Holy Eucharist. His succinct and precise interpretation of the word with its life application, daily motivated each one to deepen one's bond with their Master.

Besides teaching and guiding the Seminarists in the College, Eric dedicated his free time equally in the pastoral care of the souls. As a confessor and preacher of recollections, he was always much sought after. His regular talks on Sundays to the sisters of the Daughters of St. Anne for many years was a hallmark of his dedication to the spiritual care of souls. From the beginning of his theology at Jnana Deepa Vidyapitham (JDV) Pune (1969-1972), Erik developed and mastered the art and skill in giving such talks to different groups of religious and thus endeared himself by his acts of generosity. He further deepened his pastoral care as a confessor during his study for Licentiate (1975-1977). This remained for him a lifelong ministry at St. Albert's where he found time to render such services to numerous groups of religious, priests, brothers, and sisters in and around Ranchi. His way of communicating things across and his advice at the confessional was a great source of encouragement and spiritual strength for many. He knew how to assuage inner healing through the mercy of God and His forgiveness.

Eric had suffered from jaundice during his regency at St. Albert's Seminary (1965-1969) which taught a few new habits in his life. In the summer of 1965, he made a long tour of the Mission on a bicycle, visiting parts of Barway and Jashpur-Mission and came back to Ranchi via Kurdeg, Rengarih, Samtoli, and Noatoli. He enjoyed the tour, meeting

the number of his co-missionaries, and getting to know the expanse of the Chotanagpur Mission. He, however, did not realize the exhaustion of his body due to dehydration. It was aggravated by a bout of diarrhea. He had to be admitted to the Holy Family Hospital, Mandar (Ranchi). Worse still, he began growing pale. His condition deteriorated and lay critical in the hospital bed in a state of coma for almost two weeks. The sisters in the hospital, realizing the severity of his condition, made assiduous prayers for his recovery. On the fourteenth day, Erik unexpectedly opened his eyes to the great surprise of the sisters and himself, wondering why the sisters stood around his bed clapping their hands. Following this wondrous recovery, he was advised by the doctor to start smoking cigars. Later, he started smoking a pipe which he enjoyed at his leisure. He was happy about the critical event which gave him this opportunity to smoke a cigar or a pipe for the rest of his life to spend his pastime!

Erik maintained good health, free of any till 2018 when he was afflicted by dengue fever, causing thrombosis of his legs. It caused serious health hazards as the blood clots affected his lungs. In early 2019, his condition deteriorated, almost crippling his free movements due to the acute problem of breathing. Yet, his poise, patience, and calm were remarkable. After over six months of long treatment, he could regain his health, breathing a sigh of relief to savor normal life again. Moreover, he was delighted to lecture on Grace in February-March 2020 to the students of first-year theology, his very last in the Faculty before joining the rank of a professor emeritus. Ever since he was relieved from any teaching assignment or any other responsibility in the Seminary. Erik perceived subconsciously, the time had come for him slowly but graciously prepare himself for the last journey.

The pandemic of Covid-19 and subsequent "lock-down" since the 11 of March 2020, compelled the St. Albert's College to suspend all the academic activities. All the Seminarists were sent back to their respective dioceses while the teaching and administrative staff stay put in the House. It gave Erik the last of the opportunities to render his pleasant services to the community as the main celebrant at the daily Holy Eucharist for more than three months till he was suspected of contacting Covid-19 on 1 August 2020. On the following day, he was reportedly tested positive for the coronavirus, obliging him to home quarantine for two weeks, plus another week in isolation after testing negative. Erik came out of this pandemic without any of the symptoms of viral infection, rejoining once again, the regular life in the community.

Since 2010, Erik also showed signs of Parkinson's. It gradually became more evident. Yet he did not seem bothered much about it and, he managed

all the activities by himself unhindered, including driving his scooter with childlike joy.

Erik's sudden death on the 18th of September 2020 morning came as a rude shock to the community of St. Albert's college and the members of the staff miss his presence immensely. On that ill-fated morning, he went to the refectory at around 5:30 a.m., as he was used to, to drink a cup of coffee before his daily morning prayers in his room. One of the Seminarists who happened to be there at that moment, noticed Erik perspiring and having difficulty in breathing. He seated him into a chair and rushed to his room to get his cell-phone. Erik, meanwhile, fell unconscious on the floor. He probably collapsed struggling for his last breath. He was attended to immediately. The efforts to revive his system did not succeed as there was no response at all. Erik had already peacefully breathed his last. With his sudden demise, the last of the Belgian Jesuit missionaries service ended abruptly at the Faculty of St. Albert's College, having served for nearly 46 long years. With his departure from this earthly home, the last chapter of the illustrious history of the Belgian Jesuit missionaries, their contribution to the formation of the local clergy and the Church through this premier Institution of St. Albert's College has etched gloriously in the annals of this institutions' history.

A DISCIPLE'S FOND MEMORY OF FR. ERIK BREYE, SJ:

A Legendary Missionary

Father Erik Breye, the legendary Jesuit from Belgium, Passed away on September 18, 2020 leaving behind a rich legacy of scholarship, high learning and individual life of holiness perfected by simplicity and humility.

He was 80 and was a Jesuit for 61 years and a priest for 48 years. He served St. Albert's College Seminary, Ranchi for nearly 55 years. Meanwhile, he also taught Theology of grace and Christian Anthropology at Regional Theology Centre, Ranchi, Tarunoday, Kanke, Ranchi.

The first encounter I had with Father Breye was way back in 1996 when I had just completed my graduation at St. Xavier's College, Bombay and was getting ready to appear for the entrance exam for a Master's degree in English at the University of Bombay. Having enjoyed a short break I made my annual retreat (for eight days) under him. What an amazing experience I had, listening to him and interacting with him for eight glorious days, I cannot describe that in words.

He was soft spoken (extreme sweet voice), warm, friendly, fatherly, epitome of grace and simplicity and overall, a holy man. His brilliance as a scholar

of Theology never got to him, he was always down to earth. Those eight days that I spent with him are very precious to me and I would like to treasure them for the rest of my life. He would come to my room to give me the points for reflection for the whole day; I felt as if I was having spiritual conversation with the divine. He would say, "Vinod, it is God who has been accompanying you and I just a small vehicle. I still reckon that was the best annual retreat I have ever made."

My second serious interaction with him was when he engaged lectures on Grace and Christian Anthropology at Regional Theology Centre, Ranchi, Jharkhand. He was an eloquent speaker and a great orator. When he spoke, we felt like listening to him on and on and wished he never stopped talking. Very complex theological concepts were made to look ridiculously effortless and much easier to understand. He had a great sense of humor.

While responding to some of our questions, he would jokingly say, "Please do not ask this, I do not know, because when Jesus Christ was alive, I was not there." (He would eventually clarify our doubts all the same). Over the years I would meet him every summer I went back to the Province for our Province conventions. He would be extremely generous in his words, appreciative and encouraging. May Fr Erik enjoy the fullness of life in heaven he witnessed through his life and teaching here on earth.

FR. LOUIS FRANCKEN SJ (1964-2020)

Father Louis Francken SJ came from a family of solid Flemish farmer's stock: hard-working, two feet on the ground, honest, with a deep-seated piety, no fuss and with a heart for the less privileged. Father Louis has kept this precious legacy his whole life long, in the various capacities of his rich educational and social ministry. Works speak louder than words has been very much true for the quality of his life in the service to others.



He was born on 7th July 1938 on the farm in Wuustwezel, a village in North Belgium. He was the second of a family of three girls and two boys. At the end of his Secondary Education in a local diocesan High School, he made "the somewhat unfamiliar choice of joining the Jesuits with the request to be sent to India as a missionary. It was a very good choice indeed," so wrote his elder sister in her farewell letter a few days before his death. He left his family in Flanders 56 years ago: he left his large family and many friends in India on 5th

October 2020, when the Lord called him into His everlasting love.

Joining the Society in 1957, followed by juniorate and philosophy in Leuven (Louvain), he came to India in 1964. Two years regency in the just established XISS (1964-65), M.A in Economics in Delhi (1966-67), theology in Pune (1967-1971), ordination in Ranchi, tertianship (1972) followed by a year of teaching in the Novitiate (1973) in Sitagarha, Hazaribag.

Then started his long tryst with St Xavier's College, Ranchi, and especially with the new XISS which at that time was in the same premises. Mainly teaching Economics in the College and XISS, he was also in charge of the Juniors at Manresa House (1974-77), Registrar of the College (1978-82) and Principal of St Xavier's College (1982-87), and Director of XISS (1988-90). After a break as Socius to the Provincial (1990-1992), he was back at XISS as Director (1993), Assistant Director (1994-98), Professor and Head of the Research Department (1999-2003). He had a short spell as superior and faculty member at ISI Delhi which was not his cup of tea (2004). Back in the province, Fr Francken took charge of Province Projects while he also was in ATC (2005), Assistant Secretary to Fr Provincial (2006-09) Ranchi and Treasurer at ATC (2010-2011).

Then came his last assignment when as Director of Kishor Nagar from June 2011 till August 2020, he took on the tremendous task of succeeding Father Vic Van Bortel SJ, and that at a time when others think of retiring. He directed the 650 boys with a seriousness, a sense of duty, and especially a quiet and deep fatherly love so typical of him. He also took care of the much needed renewal of the infrastructure. Last year was as it were the 'swan song' of Fr Louis: the 50th anniversary of Kishor Nagar: a splendid celebration in all respects, witnessed by many visitors from Belgium and especially by many grateful old-students of Kishor Nagar. We saw a tired, yet contented and happy man!

A nagging stomach ulcer broke out a few weeks ago causing much bleeding. In spite of several Units of blood-transfusion he became too weak and succumbed on the 5th October at 11-00 pm. in Constant Lievens Hospital and Research Centre, Mandar.

Does his curriculum vitae not look like a typical Jesuit symphony of varied ministries with a consistent ground tune? Education and the care for self-development of the oppressed and underprivileged was his great passion. He loved much and was loved much by many. He was an example and inspiration, a faithful soldier/servant/lover of the Lord who returned to his true Home.
