### **Education Meeting**

The Heads of our Province Schools reached Mariampahar Bhawan, Sitapahar on 20 August 2020 for a meeting. It was held in the Girls' Hostel due to lack of space at the Jesuit Residence. Fr Alban Minj, the PCE began the meeting with a short prayer and then welcomed Fr Provincial and the rest pointing out the purpose of the meeting. The two main points which had been raised in the previous meeting were taken up: viz the co-coordinators' role in preparation of Detailed Lesson Plans, and the Required School Data to be furnished and then to be submitted to Fr Hilary D'Souza.

A large majority of the heads of our schools said that there was not much progress in that regard owing to lack of communication, transport and remote places to be visited. After a short brainstorming session over the issue, it was decided to continue with Jharkhand



DIGI SATH, a Government programme and the preparation of lesson plans by teachers to be made at their respective places. The participants were asked to come back later on for further discussion. Since most of our children do not have smart phones, a suggestion was made to make available at least a smart phone in a village at the moment. It could be made use by the village group and the other text messages could be sent to the ordinary mobiles. Again it was insisted that we should be on the lookout for donors who would be willing to donate smart phones for that specific purpose.

After the coffee break Fr Provincial briefed the group on National Education Policy 2020 (NEP) and its implications on our schools and exhorted the group to read and become familiar with the text. The Vision of NEP 2020 seems to be (a) to make India a global educational hub, (b) to bring on Centralization of Education, (c) to speed up Saffronization of Education. NEP 2020 may increase the number of school dropouts and also create a Digital Divide. In the meeting we also decided that Santali as a subject should be taught up to class 6 in all our schools and that a committee would be formed to prepare a curriculum for the vernacular schools to suit local socio-political-cultural milieu.

We want to put on record our profound gratitude to the Host Team of our Holy Cross Sisters of Mercy for the hall arrangement and for provision of snacks to all of us. We also express our "Thank you" to our Jesuit companions of Mariampahar community for their delicious meal. AEMA SARHAO to all. (*Fr Alban Minj SJ*).

### **Social Action Commission Meeting**

Fr Provincial called for a meeting of the Social Action Commission on 30 August 2020 at Jisu Jaher, Dumka. It began with a prayer by Fr Vernard Anthony. Then Fr Provincial explained the procedure for the meeting pointing out five things: (1) Sharing by each on what he or she is doing in the social action ministry at the moment; (2) Expressing each one's opinion on where we find social action ministry today (3) Taking an Indicative vote for a New Social Action Coordinator (4) Sharing views on how we cope with the extraordinary situation of Covid-19 (5) Going through the final draft of the Province Apostolic Plan to be implemented by the Social Action Ministry.

The method of sharing was spiritual conversation with its stress on the need for active listening and intentional speaking. We all felt the sharing to be deep and enriching. The members felt, "Though we are doing a lot of work

in the social action field we still need to improve our approach according to the signs of the times. We are doing our ministry as individual units but need to come together more often to share our views and experiences to open our horizon further."

### **Jeevan Dhara News**

Though due to Covid-19 we had to cancel all the scheduled programmes from April 2020 onwards, some unscheduled retreats were conducted here with limited numbers. In the month of April, from 26-30, I preached a retreat to our pre-novices at Loyola Sadan. In the beginning of May Fr Thomas Kottackal preached a retreat to the SDP candidates and from 25-30 I directed a retreat for 3 Sisters of Providence. From June 14-20 Fr Varkey Chena preached a retreat to 6 Sisters of Divine Saviour. I directed a 5-day retreat to two deacons of Raiganj diocese from 14-19 and another one to 31 CTC pre-novices at Pushpabari from 28 June to 3 July. I also guided Br Sanjay Kisku of Raiganj diocese from 17-21 July in preparation for his diaconate ordination which was held on 20 July. In the month August, I preached two 8-day retreats to the M.C. Brothers of Kalyaganj who came two by two from 1 August to 18. I believe the pandemic has really brought people to their knees to become more prayerful and God-fearing.

Fr K.C. Stephen who was caught up in Kerala owing to the forced lockdown situation, managed to get a flight ticket after repeated cancellations and managed to arrive at Jeevan Dhara on 20 June and remained in self-imposed quarantine for 14 days. He left for Hazaribag via Dumka in order to prepare for the new batch of tertians who are scheduled to begin their tertianship from 1 August. He travelled by train from Dumka to Rampurhat and was lucky to get a free lift to Hazaribag by jeep. The number of tertians this year is 26, more than other years. Since Fr Ignatius Tete, the co-tertian master had to be hospitalized, Fr Stephen has to take Tete's classes also. We wish our prayerful best wishes to Fr Stephen. (*Fr George Uthira SJ*).

### **Renewal of Drooping Spirits**

Recollection, a day of recollecting the broken self, filling up the hollowness of our heart with the knowledge of the self, knowledge of God and the knowledge of the world around, sailed out our canoe from the stormy ocean of fear and phobias proceeded from the Pandemic Covid-19. Prior to the recollection on 28-29 August 2020 we lived like stranded individuals in the community



strictly executing the law social distancing, which, to an extent, left a deep scar in our behaviour. Thanks to Fr Dayal Lakra who asked us to follow the rules of non-proliferation with five specific points to build a better community: (1) Practicing non-partiality (2) Taming/bridling the tongue (3) Moving beyond selfishness (4) Transcending ego centrism (5) avoiding speaking evil of others. Albeit many more voltairs may rise to convict us, “Christians live together without knowing each other and depart without shedding tears.” The Faith Sharing on the second day was very significant. The outpouring of God-experience, through the promptings of the Holy Spirit, fastened us with bonds of love and affection. We, with much trust and adequate recompense for our attitudinal behaviour, proceeded for the Eucharistic celebration followed by a fellowship meal. ### **Paharia Seva Samiti, Satia**

Covid-19 has shaken the whole world but it has not affected much the works and livelihood movements of the Paharias. This year the villagers have practically cultivated all their lands. It looks green everywhere. It soothes the eyes of the viewers. Owing the lockdown the activities of the Paharia Seva Samiti have slowed down. But during the “unlock period” we could reach out to the 37 villages of our target area, conducting women group meetings regarding health and hygiene. We try to organize the youth group to tap the government schemes and benefits for the Paharias PVTGs (Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups). We managed to conduct tuitions for our school Jeevan Jyoti and other school children in 12 villages through the help of the student volunteers. It is one of the most important measures that was taken up to improve the nutritional status of the children in 6 villages. We run Crèches or Day Care services for six-month old kids and for 3-year old children. There are 106 children enrolled in the crèche. Owing to the unavoidable lockdown children are not kept in the crèche during the day but hot cooked food is served to them twice a day. Mothers bring the children and feed them at the centre and take them back. There are visible signs of improvement in physical health among 50% of the children who are enrolled in the crèche. Now the parents are happy and convinced of the benefits of the crèche. As the feeding time comes the children themselves ask their mothers to take them to eat *kichdi* (*hot cooked food*). Some mothers exclaimed, “After

starting to feed from the crèche my child has become healthy!” These experiences make me convinced of God working through us. God who had provided *manna* in the wilderness provides even today for the Paharias. We hope to see a healthy Paharia community in the coming days. (*Fr John Felix SJ*).

### **International Indigenous Day Celebration**

International Indigenous Day was celebrated in Johar HRD Centre, Dumka, on 9 August 2020. Prof. Dr. Sonajharia Minz, Vice Chancellor, S.K.M. University, Dumka, expressed her desire in developing the tribal languages in the universities. She also emphasized a learning process for the children in the schools through mother tongue. Mr. Nalin Soren, MLA Shikaripara, Government of Jharkhand, invited the tribal community to teach our younger generation to keep up the tribal culture and customs. Prof. Dr. Pramodini Hansdak, Ex-Principal, SP College, Dumka, spoke of the richness in Adivasi community and emphasized the strength of the Adivasi community in its culture, traditions, land and languages. Mrs. Joyes Besra, Chairperson, Dumka Zila Parishad, proudly said that we have contributed a lot to the society and we have to be proud that we are Adivasis. Dr. Louis Marandi, Ex-Minster, Government of Jharkhand, emphasized that knowing the Tribal Rights and teaching them to the villagers is our responsibility. Santali Language and Cultural Association took the initiative in organizing this program following the Covid-19 rules, keeping social distancing, wearing masks and using sanitizer. Jai Adivasi. ### **Webinar on Career Counseling and Information Sharing**

The I.G.N.O.U. study centres of St Xavier’s College, Maharo and S.P. College, Dumka, jointly organized a webinar on Career Counseling and Information Sharing on 14 August 2020. The patrons of this event were Dr. S.K. Sinha, Principal of S.P. College, and Rev. Dr. Stephen Raj, Principal of St Xavier’s College, Maharo. The programme started with the welcome address by Mr. Mahesh Kumar Deo, the Academic Councilor of St Xavier’s IGNOU centre, who formally introduced the topic and purpose of the webinar. This was followed by a speech by Dr. Arvind Manoj Kumar Singh, the regional director of IGNOU from Deoghar. Thereafter, the assistant regional director Dr. Saroj Kumar Mishra addressed the participants and elaborated on the various courses and career options available. The chief guest of



honour of this webinar was Prof. Amar Tigga who is the chief coordinator of placement cell at Xavier Institute of Social Services in Ranchi. In his lecture he enlightened the participants on the various aspects of career selection and job openings thereby guiding the youth towards a bright and secure path.
