What the Killer Flu tells us

Recently I came across an old issue of National Geographic Magazine dated October 2005. An article titled "The Next Killer Flue: Can we stop it?" written by Tim Appenzeller caught my attention. Based on scientific data, it predicted that sooner or later another deadly virus was likely to hit humanity. It was the context of the bird flu that swept Southeast Asia in 2005. Studies indicated that new variants of the virus could emerge any time leading to a global pandemic. Our experience with Covid-19 compels us to look back. Covid-19 was first identified in Wuhan in December 2019, WHO declared it a public emergency on 30 January 2020 and a global pandemic on 11 March 2020. After ten months we continue to fight it. It is not yet time to count the cost, both human and material. The prediction of 2005 was a warning to be vigilant, and we have obviously failed to heed it. We are yet to learn to read the signs of the times!

The recent advancements in the field of medicine and medical technology are astounding. Yet, in utter helplessness, we are forced to fall back on a simple mask and soap water. Is it not a sign of our lopsided priorities? Thinkers like Amartya Sen have been saying it for decades. The neglected area of public health and primary education is taking centre stage again. Lopsided priorities affect not only physical health but also mental health and spiritual health. Learning to discern the signs of the times has become a new urgency.


FROM OUR INSTITUTIONS

TRIPURA MISSION

St Mary's School, Jampuijala

With the arrival of **Schs Frangle and Dijin**, our mission team has grown five-member strong. We were introduced to Bishop Lumen and different missions of the diocese after our quarantine period.



We have begun classes for the students of the neighbouring villages from 7.30 to 10.0 and from 11.00 to 2.00. Our focus at present is on four major subjects - English, Maths, Science and Social studies. Students from faraway places are asked to come and stay in the hostel. We hope that by September the school will get back to normal functioning. Two sisters from the Congregation of Charity of St. Vincent De Paul take care of the girls' hostel and they also teach in the school. Fr Syriac Panjikaran is busy training the nursery teachers as he has already finished the first phase of training for all the other teachers. Fr Babu Paul is actively involved in his work as the Principal of the school. Dijin is in-charge of the hostel and teaches mathematics and science in the higher classes. As teaching in cluster groups was allowed, we

could conduct regular classes for two weeks along with the village outreach sessions. But currently, all such classes are stopped by the government. As people of the surrounding villages are very poor, smart phones are very rare. The internet facility in the villages also is very poor. Still, we are conducting online classes quite effectively.

the Meitei people. We have very few Catholic families around here. Online teaching is going on through Whatsapp with special attention to the tribal people on the mountains. I am continuing the classes of the previous regent. I am teaching English for class 4, 5, 7 and 8 and Environmental studies for class 5. We are reaching the end of the academic year. In addition to the teaching, I am also in-charge of the boarding and the Minister of the house. The community consist of two fathers and two pre-novices besides me. Three scholastics of Kohima region from Manipur state joined our community on August 22. They stay here to attend their online degree classes. We celebrated the birthday of Fr Felix Monteiro, principal of the school, on August 23. He will pronounce his final vows on September 5 and take charge as Mission Superior on the same day.

OBITUARY







Br Sebastian Valiamattam spent his last moments in a manner that appeared to be part of his daily routine. His evening tea was brought to his room at 3.30 pm on 06 August 2020. He got out of his bed by himself, sat on the chair beside his table, and slowly drank his cup of milk/Horlicks. Then he leaned against the table on his right and began breathing heavily. Alarmed by this sudden change, he was carried to his bed. He continued gasping for another ten minutes before he breathed his last. It was so peaceful.

During the past year, Br Sebastian was in a critical condition several times, and every time he would ask for the anointing of the sick and would regain his health. Then he would say, "The Lord has still some more plans for me and I have to finish them soon". He would get back to his routine of reading and writing during the day and at night. Br Sebastian had been suffering from several health complaints like non-alcoholic liver cirrhosis, cellulitis, chronic bleeding of piles, arthritis, and filarial swelling of legs. Despite the pain and discomfort,

Br Sebastian believed with a deep conviction that the Lord had a plan for him and he lived to fulfil that and thereby proclaim and spread His Kingdom. He served in almost all the Jesuit houses and institutions of the Province taking care of the property, buildings, and kitchen. He was known for his availability, devotion to his duties and loyalty to the Society. Development of the Ezhimala property ever stands as a monument of his dedicated hard work. Living all alone for many years in a humble abode with minimum conveniences, he transformed the barren land into a thriving plantation.

Though not an erudite academician, Br Sebastian was a self-made theologian. He dared to print and publish his insights and inspirations in book form or as audio records. Even when his weakening health didn't allow him to do active work, he continued his deep interest in study, reading, reflection and writing. He had an ardent desire to proclaim God's love through his writings, and that was the secret of his inner strength to stay active till his death. He has five books or

booklets to his credit, the latest being "Way of Salvation" published last year. This latest book contains the fruit of his study and reflections on the person of Christ. What Fr General wrote about Br Sebastian at the time of his jubilee is insightful. "You can be described in just one sentence. A man with a poetic heart, scientific bent of mind, theological sharpness and spiritual depth," he wrote.
