## Arrupe's Educational Ideas:



"Fr. Pedro Arrupe was concerned about the growing attitude in which the vocation of humankind is understood as making oneself the center of the universe, fearing that it has infiltrated into education and schools. Consequently, he set out to counteract this egoistic mindset by propounding an approach to education rooted in justice tempered with faith, in a bid to form fully human persons who are men and women for others. In this endeavour, Arrupe sought to realize the principles of Vatican II, which also advocated in the Pastoral Constitution on the Church in the Modern World the urgent need to form human persons who are both learned and benevolent. Arrupe's educational ideas can aid in correcting education systems given to economic and industrial imperatives as a main objective and which focus on examination results at the expense of well-rounded formation of the person. In short, the goal of education is here understood as forming people who are committed to respecting and caring for one another's well-being, lives and human dignity as persons."

Finally the long awaited day arrived, the 15<sup>th</sup> of August. # **CSC LOYOLA CAMPUS HATTON**

Feast of St. Ignatius: On 31<sup>st</sup> July, we the staff and students of Loyola Campus and the staff of CSC came together for the celebration. Sch. Nimesh presented a PPT on the life of St. Ignatius and Fr. Prem explained five principles of St. Ignatius; finding God in all things, magis, all for the greater glory of God, Discernment of the spirits and agere contra. Fr. Newman, the parish priest of Hatton was the main celebrant and Fr. Charles, the parish priest of Bogawantalawa preached the homily. In his homily, he thanked the Jesuits for providing opportunities to the students to enhance skills in

English, tailoring and computer. He shared how reading holy books caused the conversion of St. Ignatius and asked the students to be ready for



greater conversion in life. Frs. Xavier Cruz, director of the Hatton pastoral center and Mr. Anthony Fernando joined in the Eucharist. Sisters from the FMM Convent in Talawakale and Comboni congregation in Talawakale added joy to our celebration by their presence and gifts. About fifty people participated in the function and all went home after a sumptuous lunch.

**Cross cultural explorations**: On August 3rd, **Fr. Thushara** and the preschool teachers from Negombo paid us a short visit at the Center for Social Concern (CSC) for a little rest and relaxation



on their way to Nuwara Eliya. On the same day, CSC organized a tailoring training for the women of the tea plantations. Though the preschool teachers and the tailoring students are different in language and culture, they could still share their talents and skills with one another and it became all of a sudden a cultural event.

**Election monitoring evaluation:** Hundred polling station observers and twenty eight mobile observers monitored the parliamentary elections

in Nuwara Eliya District on August 5<sup>th</sup>. All the observers came to CSC on August 16<sup>th</sup> and to Ragala and Hangurankete on August 17<sup>th</sup> to submit their reports, collect the remuneration and sit for an evaluation. The observers stated that the election was peaceful in the district but people lack awareness in voting. Some of them were not clear about the voter ID and voting procedures. Since it was raining the whole day, the old and the sick struggled to reach the polling stations and observance of social distance was extremely difficult. The people especially the poor felt that it is their right to vote and they went through a lot of sacrifices in order to exercise their right to voting. The ordinary people do not fail the politicians but the politicians do.



Team building training with the support of Save the Children Organization: On August 20<sup>th</sup>, Mr. Dharma, the programme officer of Save the Children inaugurated the training at Indira Hotel, Hatton. Corona related health guidelines were strictly adhered to. In his inaugural address, Mr. Dharma raised the awareness of the participants on available employment training at various places in Nuwara Eliya district. He invited the staff of CSC to share the information in their estates and to stop the dropouts from becoming unskilled laborers in Colombo. They must rather become skilled entrepreneurs in the district. Premkumar trained the staff on team building through various games, videos and PPT. Though there is unity among the staff, they still lack conceptual clarity about CSC, its goals and their This training responsibilities. gave them awareness on their strength and the direction they need to move forward.

**Fr. Provincial meets the tailoring students:** On 3<sup>rd</sup> of August Fr. Provincial and Fr. Treasurer came to Hatton and visited a few lands for the future use

of the Jesuit mission in Hatton area. The incessant rain on that day made the visit rather difficult. The slush made their legs dirty and the leeches were merciless. They visited four locations and were satisfied with two. They are waiting for a few good souls to help us tpurchase the lands. After the visit to the lands, they came to the center and met the tailoring students. The poor tea plantation students who have been like sheep without a shepherd felt happy to see Fr. Provincial and expressed some of their concerns. Fr. Provincial listened to their cries and promised that he would take steps to get them tailoring machines when they complete the programme.

Skill training at CSC Loyola Campus: On August 21st, Sch. Nimesh started the skill training with a team building game. Fifteen students of the January batch and thirteen students of the August batch were the participants. Among them five are doing B1, fifteen A2 and eight A1. The skill training was meant for their self discovery and team building. Fr. Premkumar conducted another game and made the students aware of their gender behavior and fostered solidarity through mutual respect and self awareness. He affirmed that Jesuit worldwide Learning through CSC Loyola Campus aims to bring higher education at the margins and requested the students to have greater discipline and motivation and achieve higher goals in life.

## **MULLAITIVU DISTRICT**

Adampan Jesuit Community celebrated the feast of St. Ignatius at Mullaitivu. The celebration started with the Eucharist presided by **Fr. Lawrence**. **Sch. Solomon** gave a touching homily that was appreciated by all. Thereafter the fathers and the scholastics had a dip in the sea, and had an enjoyable time. **Fr. Emil**, our minister organized the happy hour and dinner in a grand style. It was a meaningful celebration.

Loyola Campus programme is going on well. The students sat for their final test in the beginning of August. All have performed well although some were not confident in the oral exam. The schools



have been reopened after the Corona pandemic. Now it is hard to admit a new batch because of the lack of students in Mullaitivu. We hope to start the GEL progamme for the new batch in November after the A/L exam. We are trying our best to promote some candidates for the on-line diploma programme.

The certificate awarding ceremony was held on August 22nd. **Fr. Yavis**, Dean of Mullaitivu was the chief guest and **Fr. Roy**, Country Director of Loyola Campus was the guest of honor. Their speeches were thought provoking. Some fathers, sisters,



scholastics, principals and parents participated in the function. Our dance and music class children and the students entertained the gathering with their inborn multiple talents. More than forty students received certificates. Fr. Lawrence recently visited **Rt. Rev. Dr. Justin Gnanapragasam**, Bishop of Jaffna. The Bishop wanted the Jesuits to educate the students who have completed A/L. He was highly appreciative of the educational Apostolate of the Jesuits all over the world. He feels sad that we gave up our famous colleges in Sri Lanka. Fr. Lawrence is becoming a well-known preacher and his charismatic style of prayer is liked by many.


I am truly grateful to Fr. Tom our International Director for assigning Fr. William O'Neil (pet name Bill) to our Kakuma Mission. Bill has been a
