From The Provincial's Desk

Dear Friends,

It is a moment of great joy for the Church of Gujarat and the Society of Jesus to celebrate in December 2021, the hundred years of the arrival of Spanish Jesuits in Gujarat.

The first Spanish Jesuit to arrive was **Fr. Ramón Grau**, a committed and zealous person, a great missionary who encountered the difficulties of all the beginnings but faced them with patience, hope and courage. The Spanish Jesuits had a local people centred approach. Since their arrival in 1921, one of their priorities was the promotion of local vocations; there were rapid results.

Today there are more than a thousand Gujarati nuns and hundreds of priests attached to different congregations, dioceses and religious orders. In 1921, there was not a single Catholic school of secondary education in Gujarat. Today the Church in Gujarat has more than a hundred High Schools: Jesuit institutions, diocesan schools and that of several congregations of men and women,

The Spanish Jesuits in a relatively short period of time have achieved much, what would have been impossible for others, in the field of education, social action and pastoral ministry. Leaving behind their family members, culture, language and material comforts they made Gujarat their home and worked tirelessly to spread the kingdom of God here in Gujarat.

In order to thank God for all the blessings received through our Spanish missionaries and to appreciate them for the difference they made in the life of the faithful we have constituted a committee comprising of **Frs. Francis Macwan, James Savarimuthu, Shaji Thekkemury** and **Sch. Aric Makwana** to plan and organize the celebration of this event which would culminate in December 2021. I am sure the celebration of the centenary of the arrival of the Spanish missionaries will inspire us to have that missionary zeal and come closer to the poor and the marginalized with a compassionate heart.

Further, I am pleased to announce that if the pandemic situation permits, we will have the **Province Sammelan** on the 30th November in Sevasi. The theme of the Sammelan is: *Ignatian Conversion and its Relevance in the Present Context.* Frs. Simon Thomas, James C. Dabhi and Jitendra D'Monte will form the Province Sammelan coordinating committee that will look into the various aspects of the Sammelan. The purpose of such a gathering is twofold: to deepen our companionship and to collectively reflect upon the ways to be more effective in our mission. With the help of the organizing committee let us enter into its preparation with whole-hearted willingness and generosity.

PROVINCE HIGHLIGHTS

MASS Movement

GVD (Gujarat Vidya Deep) has been closed down and the property and infrastructure have come back to the province. After a prolonged discernment a multipurpose centre, Manresa Adhyatmik Sadhana Sadan (MASS) has been launched. MASS is the overarching name of the Centre and the buildings have been 're-baptized' Inigo Bhavan (present Sneh Jyoti; though in the official documents the original name will continue), Xavier Bhavan (CMI house), Britto Bhavan (Rajkot Diocese house), Beschi Bhavan (Vianney Vihar) and De Nobili Bhavan (GVD block). While Jeevan Darshan Pastoral Centre has been merged into MASS, Vocation Promotion Office and Youth Ministry Office (GJYM) will function from the premises of MASS. The centre embraces a wider vision of what the Society of Jesus is called to do in today's context for the Church and society at large. As Jesuits are called to respond to the various needs of the people, the proposed centre would aim at reaching out to the holistic development of the Society and the state.

MASS is an institution that provides space for psychospiritual, socio-pastoral, theology and biblical programs which can empower the laity, religious and priests. While primarily responding to the needs of the Society of Jesus and the Church in Gujarat, it also extends its facilities to people of other faiths, groups and denominations in so far as it is used for activities which fall within the broad understanding of Kingdom values which promote justice, equality, peace, inter-culturality and dialogue. JEAG Meet

JEA-Gujarat (JEAG) met on 30 August at Sevasi. Fr. John Ravi, Secretary, JEA-South Asia was the resource person. In his key-note address he highlighted some of the



challenges faced in the education field with regard to NEP 2020, Minority Rights and the pandemic. He also stressed on the Apostolic Preferences of JEA-South Asia. He urged all to be vigilant and communicative in the context of what is happening in the country today. He also suggested to approach the existing situation with confidence, courage and renewed vigour to impart a holistic approach to our education by using the Ignatian Pedagogical Paradigm (IPP). School of the Heart

Sitagarha: We 24 Tertians arrived in Sitagarha by 30 July so that we could be together for the Feast of St Ignatius Loyola. We were warmly welcomed by the Rector Anil Aind and the Tertian Instructors Fr. Ignatius Tete and **Fr. M.I. Raj**. The St. Stanislaus College community consists of 85 members, including staff (14), Tertians (24), Juniors (27) and Novices (20). The first suggestion to us was to 'slow down'. The feast of St. Ignatius was very special this year. Soon after the feast we were quarantimed for a week in the house. There are 12 different congregations in the campus with their formation houses. We offer our services to them every alternate day by celebrating the Eucharist either in Hindi or English. It was a pleasant discovery for me that I could celebrate the Mass in Hindi as well.



Our Tertianship began on 1 August. The inaugural lecture was given by Fr. Santosh Minj, the Provincial of Hazaribag which put us in the right direction to begin the tertianship. We shared our graced history among the companions along with the study of St. Ignatius' autobiography. Similarly, we have done an in-depth study of the dynamics of the Spiritual Exercises, the discernment process as proposed by St. Ignatius and the Spiritual Diary of St. Ignatius. At present we are preparing for our long retreat which begins on 28 August and ends on 30 September. I request you to keep us 24 Tertians and the two Tertian Instructors in your prayers during our long retreat. (Fr. Ashvin Pandav SJ)

Shembaganur: After anxious days of uncertainties, delays, and postponements, our Tertianship at Shembaganur finally commenced on 3 August 2021. Fr. Arul Sivan from Madurai and Fr. Jose Jacob from Kerala are our Tertian Instructors. We are 20 tertians from 11 provinces & 2 regions: two each from Karnataka, Ranchi,

Andhra, MP, Madurai, Bombay, and Gujarat, and one each from Darjeeling, Kerala, Jamshedpur, Chennai, Delhi, and Kohima. During the first few weeks of classes, we have covered some basic information on the Third Probation and an overview of the tertianship programme, Writings of St. Ignatius such as the Autobiography, Letters, and Spiritual Diary, and a sharing of each one's "sacred history". We have also completed a four-day workshop on Intensive Journal. And now we are ready for the Long Retreat, which begins on 27 August and ends on 25 September. We (Patras Mundu and Sunil Macwan) with our companions and tertian instructors, request your prayers for us as we prepare to make the Spiritual Exercises. Clory of Gamits

It was a day of Glory for the Gamit Adivasis on 29 August when amidst an audience of about four hundred Adivasi literati, the latest book of **Fr. Raymund Alphonse Chauhan** was released in the Shyama Prasad Mukherjee Town Hall of Vyara by Prof. Dr. Madhukar Padvi, the Vice Chancellor of Birsa Munda Tribal University, Rajpipla. The book "Adivasi Gamit Sangeet Srushti" written by Fr. Raymund was published by Akhil Gujarat Gamit Samaj Seva Mandal, Vyara who bore the entire cost involved. The display and the rendition of various tribal musical instruments along with tribal dance outside the hall created a fitting atmosphere filled with the melodies of "Dovadu" and the rhythm of "Changio Dhol". The ceremony was





compered in Gamit language which added to the local taste of the occasion. Fr. Ishwan Gamit, the sole Gamit Jesuit Priest represented Fr. Provincial at the function. Fr. Ishwan in his fluent Gamit hailed the tribal research and writings of Fr. Raymund and thanked him on behalf of the Provincial, the Society of Jesus and the Gamit Adivasi Samaj for having dedicated thirty-five youthful years of his life towards this mission. Fr. Raymund in his 'Gamtado' (local Gamit) flair creatively demonstrated what the book was all about and showed how Gamit music had a classical structure like any other. "Music has a language and even science and the book is a humble effort to understand the Gamit world of music," he added. A series of Tribal leaders complimented Fr. Raymund for such an extraordinary achievement of coding tribal culture. Dr. Madhukar Padvi who gladly presided over the occasion recalled his own published review on Fr. Raymund's Gamit Grammar book written in 1997. The Jesuits present at the occasion felt proud to witness the exceptional honour of a 'Savaya Adivasi' received by their brother Raymund. RSSS Response

As part of our response to Covid-19 pandemic Rajpipla Social Service Society (RSSS) has been conducting regular training for its staff and other volunteers. On 18-20 August a training was held for 105 volunteers from 14 talukas of South Gujarat. Similar training programmes were also organised in June for all the 96 field staff of RSSS and in July for 35 Jai Adivasi Mahasangh leaders from fourteen talukas. Mr. Vijay Parmar and medical experts provided the necessary inputs such as i) basic orientation to human body: its structure, symptoms and functions ii) immunization system iii) various types of infectionsbacterial and viral iv) Covid-19: how it is different from other viral infections v) early detection of viral signs vi) how to use oximeter, infrared thermometer, BP monitor, glucometer vii) recording data, normal and abnormal and viii) Guidance, medicines and referral. All the participants were also provided with a training manual, posters and equipment for a primary check-up.



The basic concern of RSSS was to deal with the vaccination hesitancy among the people in its field area. The strategy is to educate people through proper communication and scientific information. Accordingly, the covid awareness service campaign is taken up through its regular staff and by setting up four mobile units to cover around 1600 Adivasi villages from seven districts of South Gujarat. All the mobile units are equipped with awareness material, medicines, equipment for primary check-ups and two qualified nurses. The mobile units operate and conduct their activities in and through the collaboration of local doctors, village CBOs, Asha workers and PHC/CHCs. The programme which is impacting the villages, will continue for one year. (Fr. Stanislaus Pinto SJ)

ORGANIC FARMING

The word 'organic' is being heard more often these days: organic farming, organic foods, organic certification, etc.

It is a matter of pride that one of our partners in the GJEM network, 'Shrishti Organics' has been appointed the "Regional Council" or the Certifying Agency for Organic Farming certification in the State of Gujarat (excluding Saurashtra), and in Diu, Daman and Dadra-Nagar Haveli. This is under the Participatory Guarantee System of India which is a Decentralized 'Organic Farming Certification System' of the Department of Agriculture, Cooperation & Farmers' Welfare [DA & FW], Government of India. The main objectives of the PGS are the promotion of Organic Farming, statutory quality control of biofertilizers and organic fertilizers, capacity building of all human involvement and documentation of the entire process round the year in digital format. PGS-India is a quality assurance initiative that is locally relevant. It emphasizes the participation of stakeholders while including producers and consumers; and it operates outside the frame of third-party certification.

'Shrishti Organics' deserves this new 'responsibility', having a rich experience in organic farming, biodiversity, rain water harvesting and capacity building. Shrishti has worked with over 3000 female farmers at Waghodia in Vadodara district. As a collaborator, it has worked at 24 different places in Gujarat State through the GJEM network. The latest being a series of training programs in Organic Kitchen Gardening in collaboration with the RSSS (Rajpipla). We are sure our farmers will benefit a great deal from the experience and professional guidance of Shrishti! - Fr. Lancelot D'Cruz SJ
