LOCAL REPORTS

Online Meeting of Education Commission

On the 18th of August 2021, the education commission members came together virtually for a meeting. **Fr. Norbert Menezes, SJ**, the chairperson of the commission, organized the meet and made sure all the members actively participated in it. We discussed certain aspects of ongoing online and offline classes, and the celebration of Ignatian Year in all our schools. One of the points of the agenda was the future plans and educational needs of St. Ignatius School, Aurangabad. All of us actively took part in the deliberations, and had certain valuable suggestions to offer. We also discussed the online registration of schools, a new project initiated by the government. There was a proposal to get help from each other in this task and to be well informed about the development of registering schools online. Another agenda was certain local challenges in different schools in recruiting new teachers since some of their staff members were leaving school after getting government employment.

Ara: As the government has allowed resumption of offline classes, both the campuses of Ara - old Catholic High School campus and new St. Xavier's School (ICSE) campus - are bustling with life once again. The energy and the enthusiasm of the children have enlivened the corona induced sagging spirit of the teachers as well as the Administrators. Hope it truly marks the end of the cocooned life that was imposed on us all due to no-other-alternative-other-than-online-classes.

The success story of St. Xavier's (ICSE) is something that makes our chest swell with pride. The glorious legacy of the Catholic School as a portal of learning where quality education is imparted by us Jesuits, so caught the imagination of the general public that it helped us immensely in the glorious take off of St. Xavier's. Within one and a half years of its inception we have more than 1100 students in the roll call, though it is only on 01

September that we had the first full-fledged classes for all sections, that is from LKG to V.

Both at Catholic High School and St. Xavier's, we conducted online classes very professionally during the Covid-19 lock down period. In both the schools, students appeared for online Class Tests and were given Home Tasks and Projects to be completed at regular intervals; they were evaluated and graded assiduously to the satisfaction of all. Art-Craft-Science Exhibition that was held at St. Xavier's during the pandemic was well organized and highly appreciated. During this time they also conducted Talent Search contest sponsored by HDFC Bank in which more than 350 medals and merit certificates were distributed to the winners in different contests - Music, Dance, speech, Declamation, Story Telling, Rhymes, Spell Bee, Quiz, and Painting. Fr. Amalan, a young priest of Buxar diocese; is a good organizer. He is part of the Jesuit community, A lot of construction work is going on in both the campuses. Lock down enabled us to complete a lot of work without much disruption.

With the relaxation in lockdown restrictions, our church is full once again. And Parishioners seem happy to be back together to worship the Eucharistic Lord. St. Ignatius' feast was celebrated with much solemnity. We invited all the Priests and Religious of our Shahabad Deanery for the Holy Eucharist and dinner that followed. The Feast of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, the Patroness of the MC Sisters, though it is replaced by Mary the Queen of the Universe, was celebrated with a large number of the faithful in attendance and thereafter we felicitated the Sisters. Women's Day celebration too was very solemn: women/mothers in large numbers dressed in their Sunday best, holding colorful candles, moving in procession to the altar singing sonorously, was a most heartening sight. - *Francis Palliparambil*

Barbigha: After a long break due to lockdown restrictions, the school opened on 7th August for the high school students and on 16th for the primary, and middle school students. Once again the campus became alive with the presence of students and staff. **Fr. Jose Thayil**, the new Secretary of the school was introduced by **Fr. Dominic** and welcomed joyfully by all the staff and students during the Assembly. Ranjan**. Cruzveer

meetings were held in the villages to bring the children back on track. **Dn. Jeevan** met the high school students to introduce YCS movement to them. St. Monica Diwas was celebrated on 29th Aug. Sunday with the sacrament of reconciliation for mothers followed by the Eucharistic celebration. Sr. Poonam, SSH, coordinated the women's celebration. All the mothers participated in a Bible Quiz competition and ended with sharing refreshments. - *Ranjan Lazarus*
