Message from Fr Provincial

Dear friends, certain recent events unfolding in our country especially in the state of Jharkhand have made me reflect about God's plan for us and for the church in India. I was disturbed and am still disturbed to some extent but my reflection on such events have made me realize God's unfathomable love for humanity and His fatherly care for all of us. God is present and active in human lives and history and everything that happens, happens for good. We should have the patience to find meaning in all that take place. We have to learn to be much more reflective and attuned to God to realize His plan. The world is so noisy and action-oriented that we rarely reflect about what happens in and around us. As a result, we move on routinely doing what we do, living as we live and finding rarely any meaning for all our actions.

But once we change the course of our lives and become reflective of our lives and events that happen in and around us, our lives become much richer, meaningful and can perceive God's plan for humanity even in events that may look unpleasant and hard to accept. We have to learn to "live, move and have our being in God." My only prayer at this moment is that we, Jesuits, may rediscover the prophetic aspect of our religious life so that we can help others to make their lives richer, healthier and meaningful.

Feast of St Ignatius

Baghmara: 31st July was a memorable day not merely for Jesuits but also for the Priests and Religious of Purnea Diocese and for the Staff and the Students of our School. As a preparation for the feast, we had a Triduum in which all the hostel boys and Jesuits participated meaningfully. **Fr John Robinson SJ** led us on the 1st day using the theme, "The Legacy of St Ignatius of Loyola."

On the 2nd day, **Fr Jacob Chinnappan SJ** dealt with "St Ignatius, the Soldier" using the PowerPoint presentation which was liked by all. On the 3rd day, **Fr Ignacy Lazar SJ** dwelt on the theme "St Ignatius was born to fight."

On 31st July morning, we had the Holy Eucharist with **Bishop Angelus Kujur SJ** as the main celebrant while the Jesuits and Fathers from the Bishop's house were the concelebrants. After the Holy Eucharist, a beautiful felicitation program for the Jesuits was arranged by the Sisters and the Staff. Being the Hostel Day, a foot-ball match was arranged between the hostel boys and the day-scholars of our School which entertained all.

At 7:30 pm, we had an inspiring Prayer Service led by **Fr Jacob Chinnappan SJ**. The theme was: "Ignatius, a soldier of the earthly King became an ardent soldier of the heavenly King!" A PowerPoint presentation led all the participants into the mood of prayer. A fellowship meal for the invited guests was organized in the spacious ground at the main entrance of the house which was elegantly arranged by **Fr Damian Tudu SJ**. The Superior, **Fr Ignacy Lazar SJ**, extended a warm welcome to all. **Bp Angelus Kujur SJ** cut the festive cake. Different neighbouring communities sang wishing songs. A delicious festive dinner prepared by our School Staff and Sisters from St Joseph's convent was relished by all. At the end, the Bishop spoke on the importance of the Jesuit Order and its association with other orders. **Fr Damian Tudu SJ** concluded the program with the vote of thanks. (*Fr Ignacy Lazar SJ*).

St Xavier's, Maharo: In preparation for the auspicious occasion of the Feast Day of St Ignatius of Loyola on 31st July, a talk was organized on 29th July in the premises of St Xavier's College, Maharo, where the students were

acquainted with the life and works of St Ignatius, the founder of the Society of Jesus. The session was coordinated by the

On 31st July we had a solemn Mass in the School which was followed by a short cultural programme. In the afternoon, neighbouring Religious communities and Well-wishers joined us in the fellowship meal. We had formed a 'Magist' group to serve our guests as part of their learning process. Monica day Celebration

Banji-Kandor: St Francis de Sales Church, Banji-Kandor, witnessed active participation of 160 women from 30th August to 1st September 2019, to celebrate St Monika Feast. The resource person **Fr Vernard SJ** began the seminar focusing on St Monika's life and power of her prayer. He stressed the importance of Family Prayer, Word of God, and living an exemplary life in the villages by being part of *Ato Tola Kalisia* (Small Christian Community). The video clippings connected with these themes and the Present Life Situations helped the women to enter into a discussion in which they came out with action plans to put into practice in the coming year. Women's leadership and their responsibilities in the family and in the villages were stressed more where they found themselves empowered to lead a vibrant Christian Living.

The women devotedly took part in the Sunday Eucharistic Celebration in the presence of 600 faithful with songs and dances. During the Holy Eucharist, the women renewed their commitment and presented the report of the seminar and the action plan for the coming year. Enjoying the cultural programme after the Mass, they went back home with

Belwa: Belwa Mission celebrated St Monica Day at Belwa on 25th August and at Jhaweli, a sub-centre, on 27th August. About 200 faithful gathered at Belwa and 300 at Jhaweli.

He juxtaposed the family and the social situation of that time with the present context depicting evil practices and habits of the society and reflected on how, in such a situation, a mother like St Monica can bring transformation at personal and social level. I personally felt more close to the people with these celebrations. Inspired by this celebration 85 people went to Jeevan Dhara, Raiganj, to make a retreat and nourish themselves spiritually. Hansdiah: Little Flower Church, Hansdiah, run by Franciscan TOR Fathers, had a glorious celebration of the 'Mother's Day' on the occasion of the feast of St Monica. **Fr Vernard SJ**, the Director of Xavier Communications, Johar, Dumka, was the main resource person. More than 450 mothers actively participated in the seminar held on 24th-25th August. Fr Vernard used video clippings to make the women to understand the subject well and to participate actively in the interactions and in the group discussions. Video films on the life of St Monica, the life situations of the Tribals and their challenges and opportunities, and video songs on Santal culture and traditions made the women more attentive and able to respond in the group discussions, looking back from their life experiences. They desired to make their families as holy and agreed for a better life by having regular family prayers, regular Bible reading and sharing the word of God, practicing the virtue of forgiveness, visiting the sick and praying over the sick person, and participating in 'Ato Tola Kalisia' (Small Christian Community). **Fr Sunny TOR** in his interaction with the mother appreciated the mothers' contribution to the Church in evangelization and keeping up

the faith. Fr Vernard SJ also celebrated Holy Eucharist on Sunday on the occasion of Mother's Day celebration. Mariampahar: More than 750 mothers gathered together to celebrate Monika Divas on 1st September at Mariampahar. Kanke Parish: The parishners of Kanke Parish observed the feast of St Monica with great pomp on 25th August. The Eucharistic celebration started at 7:30 am with a beautiful entrance dance by mothers and women flag bearers' from different 'Tolas' planting the flags. **Mrs Fulgencia Kindo** briefed the life sketch of St Monica and her role in the transformation of the life of St Augustine. **Fr Ignatius Minj SJ**, the main celebrant, focused on the importance of the mothers in the physical and spiritual growth of everyone and invited all the mothers to be rooted in prayer life and play a role in building up Christ-centered families. De Nobili College, Pune: We, the brothers of Chotanagpur Cultural Association and Santal Association, celebrated Monica Porob on a grand scale on 25th August. 80 mothers along with their husbands and children took part in the celebration. Jeevan Dhara Retreat Ministry

The retreat ministry in Jeevan Dhara was in full swing during the months of June-July-August. From 2-8 June, we had 14 Sisters and one Deacon to attend the Biblical retreat preached by **Fr Varkey Chena SJ** and at the same time another retreat was preached by **Fr George Uthira SJ** to 5 CTC silver Jubilarians. It was followed by a ten-day retreat preached by **Fr Deonis Baghwar SJ** to 14 Brothers of Missionaries of Charity of Gaya region from 9-20 June and a healing retreat preached by **Fr Tom Kottackal SJ** from 12-18 June. From 11 July-11 August a 30-day retreat was preached by Fr George Uthira SJ to the tertians of 5 SCCG and 10 M.C. Brothers including two Africans and one South Korean. The Santali retreat preached by Fr Varkey and team from 28-31 August had a record number of 120 people, out of which 85 of them were sent by **Fr Silas Toppo SJ** from Belwa Mission station of Purnia Diocese.

The members of JD were also engaged in preaching retreats outside JD. During the past two months Fr Varkey preached two retreats to the M.C. Sisters in Ranchi, one in Raipur, one at Barasat to the Bambina Sisters and a Triduum to the M.C. Sisters of Raiganj. Fr Tom Kottackal preached a retreat to the Carmel Cloistered Sisters of Hazaribag in July and another one to the Ursuline Sisters of Tejpur in Assam. **Fr K.C. Stephen SJ** left for Sitagarha in the 1st week of June to guide the Jesuit tertians and at present is engaged in giving the long retreat to them and getting ready to go to Rome for the tertians Masters' meet. "Youth for Jesus" – "A fire that kindles other fires"

When the Province Jesuit Educators and their religious collaborators gathered together at Jisu Jaher, Dumka, on 16th July to engage in a process of apostolic planning in Education, **Fr Provincial Varghese Palli SJ** asked the congregation to find ways and means to strengthen the Alumni and to create awareness among the students especially the youth about the socio-political and economic situation of our country. Fr Provincial asked the core committee to begin the process of getting the youth of our parishes and schools together so that we could move forward in organizing the youth. Thereafter a meeting was called for on 18th August at St Xavier's School, Sahibganj. The core committee was engaged the whole day on how to go about in this venture. The participants divided themselves into eight different zones having a co-coordinator for each zone. The zonal coordinators are given the responsibility to identify at least ten leaders in their own zone and have the first leadership training programme on 27th- 28th October at St Xavier's School, Sahibganj, so that in turn the leaders can train others and have a youth group called "Youth for Jesus." Hostel Directors' Meet

The Hostel directors of our Province came together on 23rd August. After a long deliberation a vision statement was framed for running our hostels and a few action plans were chalked out to achieve our vision. Our hostels will aim for the character formation and personality development of our students through input sessions and greater personal care. Independence Day

Mr Paulus Malto emphasized how the Paharias should preserve their culture in the rapid changing time which is so much influenced by the other cultures. He also highlighted the possibilities of benefiting Government schemes that come in favour of rescuing the Paharia people. Bangalore: World Indigenous Day and Karam Festival were organized in Association with Indian Social Institution, Bangalore, on 1st September for the Migrants in Jigani, Bangalore. Different Tribal groups put up cultural programmes in languages such as Santali, Sadri, Uraon and Assamese. The programme was coordinated by **Schs Sushil Hansda SJ** and **Prakash Murmu SJ** who are actively involved in the Migrants Ministry apart from their college studies in St Joseph’s College.
