From The Provincial's Desk

My dear friends in the Lord,

We've just completed the process to help Fr. General in appointing the next Provincial Superior for our Province. The process began with the letter of the Provincial to Fr. General, asking for permission to start the process; here is the timeline of the process:

- November 6, 2018: Fr. General granted permission to start the process to appoint the next Provincial.
- November 24, 2018: The Provincial informed the Consult.
- March 3, 2019: PCM & Local Superiors were informed and details of the process explained.
- March 13, 2019: Communities were asked to undertake the process of discernment, taking into consideration (i) the Challenges the Province is facing now and is likely to face in the years ahead and (ii) Qualities needed in the next Provincial Superior to respond to them. They were to do so by May 25, 2019.
- May 31, 2019: Last date for communities to send a short report of these meetings and for individuals to submit their 'terna' along with three significant qualities and limitations of the person they have voted for. These community reports were later summarised.
- June 13, 2019: The Provincial, the Socius and two other Consultors counted the indicative votes. The qualities and limitations of the persons voted for were then tabulated.
- August 6to 24, 2019: Visit of the Regional Assistant, Fr. Vernon D'Cunha. He met all the Jesuits who wanted to meet him. He also met Bishops and collaborating Sisters.
- August 25-26, 2019: Extended Consult. Members of PCM and Local Superiors. There were thirty-four in all, along with Frs. Provincial, his Consultors, Fr. Vernon D'Cunha, the Regional Assistant and Fr. George Pattery,

the President of JCSA. The group met together for communitarian and individual Discernment in a prayerful atmosphere, maintaining silence to create an atmosphere of prayer and recollection. The Provincial briefed the gathering about the 'Challenges/Needs' that arose from the community meetings, followed by comments from the floor. The main points would be sent to Fr. General. This was followed by profile of the Provincial that emerged from the community

meetings, followed by comments from the floor. The main elements would also be sent to Fr. General.

- The first day ended with a Holy Hour to thank God for what has happened in the recent past, to pray for the needs and challenges that lie ahead, for the grace to make a good discernment, for the candidates who would be considered and for the Province in general.
- The second day began with the Eucharist. Fr. Vernon D'Cunha exhorted the group about the attitude necessary for a good discernment. This was followed by considering candidates, their shadows and lights. Throughout the process, the Provincial, his Consultors, the Regional Assistant Fr. Vernon D'Cunha and the President of JCSA, Fr. George Pattery were expected to pay close attention, but not to participate in the proceedings. After silent reflection, all 34 members, except the seven mentioned above cast their secret ballots, writing up to three names.
- August 26-27, 2019: Canonical Consult to discuss recent 'informaciones' of the candidates, followed by arriving at a consensus 'terna'. Then each one wrote his personal 'terna'. He was free to accept the consensus 'terna' or opt for other names, briefly giving reasons in support of his choice.
- August 27-29, 2019: These days were set aside for the Provincial and the Socius to prepare the dossier to be sent to Fr. General. Fr. Vernon takes the dossier with him.

A total of 204/248 (82.26%) Jesuits had cast their indicative votes - the fact that such a large number cast their votes is also indicative of the keen interest shown by most. I congratulate all who have cast their votes. I also urge the small number of 44 who have not exercised this responsibility towards the governance of the Province to reflect as to why they opted out.

Regarding the communitarian discernment process, 14/23 (60.87% of our communities (along with their satellite communities) went through the process and sent in their responses. I express my gratitude to the members of these communities. One community sent in a letter saying that they did not have any meeting for the communitarian discernment. Seven others did not respond at all. Though a large number of individuals (204/248) have cast their indicative votes, 7 + 1 communities have not submitted their report of their communitarian discernment process. I urge the Superiors of those communities to reflect as a community as to why they showed so little interest in carrying out this basic Jesuit responsibility.

Fr. Vernon D'Cunha, the Regional Assistant responsible for Gujarat made a hectic visit to several communities of our Province and also made himself available for one-to-one conversation. He has expressed great satisfaction with his extensive visit stating that he has met as many as 125/248 (50.4%) of our men. If we leave out the men outside the Province, the percentage would be much higher. He also met some communities that wanted to meet him as a group. He is impressed by the spirit of the Province and very specifically by its generous hospitality. He has left with the dossier and has said that we can expect the appointment of the next Provincial Superior latest by the end of this November.

I am glad the whole process went off well. Please keep praying for the guidance of the Holy Spirit to get a wellsuited person to guide the Province.

 - **Teachers' Day:** We pray that we all may be teachers like the Lord.
- **07:** We join **Fr. Franco** in thanking God for granting him 60 long years in the Society.
- **08:** Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary: Being a Sunday, it may not be liturgically observed, yet we remember and pray to our loving Mother for her continued intercession and protection.
- **09: St. Peter Claver:** May this 'slave of slaves', inspired by St. Alphonsus Rodriguez inspire us to serve the downtrodden with humility and grace.
- **10: Bl. Francis Garate:** May this holy, pious, kind and courteous Brother inspire us to do small chores with great dedication.



PROVINCE HIGHLIGHTS

▶ Belgaum Blossoms

The reply was a unanimous "yes" from the eleven brothers. After the Eucharist, the new comers planted their vocation plants with help from their guardian angels. The evening culminated with an entertaining football match between the two batches. This year, the four provinces are blessed with twenty novices in all. On the feast of St. Ignatius, Fr. Vijay Chokar, our new socius, presided over the Festive Eucharist, which was also attended by some of the parishioners from around. His homily focused on following in the footsteps of St. Ignatius.



MONSOON BLESSINGS

Aadiaushadi (AA) has acquired a name as an Agricultural cooperative movement with expertise, commitment and reliability in the Gujarat State Agricultural, Forest and Horticultural and Departments and at the Central Govt. level. Officials are aware that whatever is offered to AA will reach genuine Adivasi small famers and will also be well utilised. At the end of June, 2019, fifty (40 of these women) Adivasi Farmers of AA were given a three-day training on 'Value addition training for Horticulture crops' by the Horticulture Dept., Gujarat.

In July, AA Farmers were given Rs.13.68 Lakh worth of Agricultural processing equipment and tools (a Multipurpose Processing Machine, a Distillation Unit, and a Packaging Machine) by the same Dept. These machines help AA Farmers to expedite production of aloe vera juice, shampoo, gel, and soap; energy drink from pomegranate and 'mukvas' from pomegranate seeds, hair oil from its peel; energy drink and chocolate from jamun; mango pulp and sherbet; carrot, cucumber, beetroot juices.

Besides, 157 Farmers were also given tarpaulin sheets, costing Rs. 3,000/- each; 353 farmers were given crates for gathering agricultural produce; mango cultivation subsidies of Rs. 60,000/- were given to 15 AA farmers. With the onset of monsoons in July, AA was given 4,500 Drumstick saplings. From those the Kanewal Farm planted 1,000, Zankhvav and Fokdi Farms 500 each; the rest by AA members.ww
