Province Apostolic Planning - Aug 24-26

On August 24 evening, the Superiors-Coordination and Commission Coordinators came to International Center, XLRI Jamshedpur for a two-day workshop on Province Apostolic Planning. Began with a short prayer by **Arockia Das** and **Tony John**, and followed by **Jerome Sequeira**, welcoming the participants and at the same time inviting all for complete openness and to maintain a positive disposition towards personalizing Society's tool of discernment process through 'Spiritual Conversation'. He highlighted the importance of spiritual conversation, which enables us to experience God's presence in our life and His Spirit at work in the world. This spiritual tool connects us with our affective feelings and gives us prophetic voice to articulate what God wants us to be here and now. Sometimes, what we disagree with may lead us to agreeing with a common shared mission as a corporate body in God's vineyard. To make it real in our day-to-day life, we need to own up this spiritual tool and be a discerning community for God's mission.

To set the tone for the workshop, **Christie Joseph**, the present Director of XLRI, explained the purpose of PAP and its process. So many change are taking place at a rapid speed and sometimes without our knowledge, and in this situation we need to ask how the Kingdom of God can be a reality in

Jamshedpur Province. As laborers in God's mission, we need to design new tools to be more relevant, meaningful, focused, efficient and effective. PAP is a way to improve the effectiveness of the mission and to discern what God wants us to do in the Province now. According to **Fr. General, Arturo Sosa**, "we are the administrators of somebody else's resources and are committed to do that work in the best possible way". He stressed that PAP offers us a strategic way of organizing time, responsibilities and actions for putting into effect all our decisions. We need to travel together using the steps of Ignatian way of discerning, so that we are able to choose the right direction. If we want to be relevant in the present context, the process is the most important element than completing another cerebral repetition.

The Provincial, while sharing the internal context, enlightened the participants the strengths, weaknesses and spiralling challenges in the Province in terms of cura personalis and cura apostolica, besides the external socio-economic-political challenges. "Our own Spiritual renewal, a necessary condition before we promote Ignatian Spirituality and other UAPs among our people", he said. Unless we are rooted in our own personal spiritual life, no preferences will bear fruit. We need to return to our roots and each one of us need to reflect on the original motive of becoming a religious. Each Jesuit needs to own up that original motive and be committed to the mission assigned to him. That is the way to collaborate in the Lord's mission, the best way to serve the Church at this time in the Province.

While speaking on external factors and presenting the regional and national situation, XLRI Professor Paramjot Singh who is actively involved in peace mission and tribal affairs in Jharkhand and Odisha, expressed his frustration, concerns and disappointments at turn of events that are unfolding in the country. Due to lack of a roadmap for development in the country, time and again, tribals are stripped off their indigenous rights and human dignity to fuel the national GDP engine. The country lacks social audit and needs educated youth with a sense of moral responsibility

towards fellow human beings. Further, he added that in the era of yellow journalism, our nation does not know the stories of ordinary citizens and there is no real social audit. He requested Jesuits to be involved in two important areas in shaping the future society: first to get involve actively in social auditing and the second to present stories of ordinary people and train young minds in our schools to be responsible citizens. Catch them young, he said and tell them stories of ordinary people rather than completing prescribed text books.

To streamline the process of spiritual conversation, a series of resources persons, viz., **Frs. Jerry Cutinha, Somy Mannoor, Joseph Kalathoor, Nelson D'Silva, Michael Fernandes and Arockia Das** provided sufficient food for our reflection and sharing. Praying over and reflecting on the inputs individually and in groups we realized that Jamshedpur Province is missioned to serve in a diverse terrain and the apostolic needs are unique in the Province. The participants unanimously agreed to initiate and strengthen the process of spiritual conversation in our communities, commissions and at the area level to arrive at Province Apostolic Planning.

The members are requested to spend enough time in prayer and reflection, rather than limit only to cerebral discussions. PAP is meant to serve people that we live and work with and hence they must be involved in our community and commission level deliberations. We shall follow the pattern of the First Fathers who worked and prayed, while discerning over two months. Hence, the community must spend at least 4-5 rounds of reflection and sharing, giving sufficient time, before arriving at concrete (actionable) proposals. The proposals could be made for three levels, i.e. community, ministry and the Province and present the same to the Province. The process is expected to be completed by April 2020 and the PAP draft will be presented at the "Province Assembly 2020".
