INTRODUCTION

Pope's Worldwide Prayer Network (Apostleship of Prayer) is an ecclesial service of the Holy See entrusted to the Society of Jesus. Its Mission is to mobilize Christians through prayer and action for the challenges of humanity and of the mission of the Church. These challenges are, discerned by the Pope, and are expressed under the form of prayer intentions which the Pope entrusts to the entire church. PWPN has its foundation the spirituality of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, spirituality for mission. It is present in 98 countries in the world with a 38 million Catholics. Eucharistic Youth Movement is an international movement for Christian formation for young people from age 5 to 25 with a goal of helping them to live like Jesus in a heart to heart friendship with Him in Eucharistic Spirituality. Its method is based on forming communities with a clear ecclesial awareness in the experience of prayer with three foundations: the Gospel, the Eucharist, and the Mission of the Church. EYM is the second Youth Movement of the Catholic Church with 1,112,000 children /young people present in 56 countries, in five continents. The Present International Director of this pontifical service is Fr Frederic Fornos SJ appointed by Pope Francis. Fr Jagdish Parmer is the South Asian Director and the National Director for India approved by CBCI of India.





MESSAGE FROM THE NATIONAL AND CONTINENTAL DIRECTOR

As we bring out this second edition of our E Bulletin 2019-20, my heart is filled with gratitude to God for showering many graces upon our Pontifical Organization. Corona Pandemic has forced us in lockdown but even this period is no less fruitful as we raise our hands to the Merciful Lord in prayer for all the victims, Corona Warriors, Administration and millions of Migrant Workers and slum dwellers who are badly affected. It is also a time to count our Blessings from God. Below I narrate those beautiful blessings from God:

1. Last year I was able to take this Organization to our neighbouring countries of Bangladesh, Nepal and Sri Lanka. In Bangladesh I was able to meet all 9 Bishops in their Annual Meeting and convince them of the need to have PWPN/EYM in their Dioceses and as a result they all have appointed Diocesan Directors in their Dioceses. This is a miracle. The International Director has appointed Fr. Milton Rozario as the National Director, proposed by the Catholic Bishops' Conference of Bangladesh. I also met the Papal Nuncio in Dhaka. I was able to reach out to the Major Seminarians and large number of the Religious Fathers, Brothers and Sisters and we are in constant contact.

2. Sri Lanka is another success story as the National Coordinator; Fr. Sanjeeva Fernando had done his homework to perfection. As a result I was able to meet all 12 Bishops in their Dioceses and the Papal Nuncio, Major Seminarians in Jaffna and the large numbers of Religious Fathers, Sisters and Brothers. Over and above I was able to give an interview on a Catholic TV Channel VERBUM which showed it in 3 installments. Now Fr. Sanjeeva goes every month to explain the Pope's Intention for 20 Minutes at the Channel.

One great good news is that Sri Lankan Jesuit Provincial has set apart Fr. Sanjeeva exclusively for our work and so the way to appointing him as National Director has opened up. In Nepal, the Bishop wanted me to address all the Clergy and the Religious but the lockdown has hampered this program. Hopefully in near future I will be able to do it.

- 3. Another Graced moment was participation in the 175th jubilee of the PWPN in Rome last June with Fr. Sanjeeva and Mr. Giby Joseph. Spending two hours with Pope Francis in the Papal Hall in the presence of more than 6000 children, youth and parents was an historic event, made still more personal and heart warming as the Pope came down to meet us the National and Continental and spending some time with each one of us.
- 4. Finding a good place in Indian Social Institute, Bangalore as our National Office is certainly an evidence of the interest shown by the higher authority in our Work. I was also invited by the CBCI President, Cardinal Oswald Gracias to address the 41st General Assembly of the CBCI at St. John's Medical College, Bangalore on 19th Feb. 2020.
- 5. Lastly but more importantly, my gratitude to you all as you participated in the Annual Training and meeting at De Nobili College, Pune in October. For the first time it was not a Jesuit event but the ecclesial event as more Diocesan Direct ors attended it. As more and more Bishops are appointing Diocesan Directors, our future seems bright and promising. Together we can make a difference even in this lockdown period due to Corona Virus by our prayers and inspiring others to pray and our prayers will initiate activities to enliven our Church in South Asia.



SHORT REPORT FOR THE YEAR 2019-2020 PWPN/EYM

It has been a year of grace for me and the Pontifical Organization for the following reasons:

- 1. I was able to meet 71 Bishops personally, addressed 192 Bishops in CBCI General Assembly in Feb. 2020 in Bangalore, 89 Bishops in 5 Regional Councils of Bishops, 488 Seminarians in 10 Major Seminaries, 56 Seminarians in 3 Minor Seminaries, 69 Novices in 5 Novitiates, 22 Jesuits in 2 Juniorate, 132 candidates in 8 Pre Novitiates, 16 Jesuit Tertians in Sri Lanka and 121 Men Religious, 932 Women Religious, 325 Diocesan priests in 5 Diocesses, 2391 youth in 3 Diocesses, 279 people in three Parishes in India, Nepal, Bangladesh United Arab Emirates and Sri Lanka.
- 2. Practically all Bishops accept and approve of this Pontifical Organization and support it
- 3. Dioceses in Jharkhand and Chhattisgarh have long tradition of having this Organization and are working well till today. These Dioceses have appointed either a priest or a Religious as Animators. They also have some budgetary allocation from the Diocese.
- 4. We were able to bring out our First E Bulletin of 2018 with a lot of help from Fr. Shin from Kerala and Mr. Giby Joseph
- Four of us, Mr. Giby, Frs. Selva and Sanjeeva and I were able to participate in the 175th Jubilee Year Celebrations in Rome.
- For the first time in our Annual meeting we had more Diocesan Priests than Jesuits Province Coordinators.
- We have been able to open a Savings Bank Account with Canara Bank in Bangalore now. We can initiate a campaign to raise fund online too.

- 8. Much work with regard to EYM is going on in Kerala. In fact Kerala is the first State where they have Regional Team with Plan of Action and Budget.
- India ranked first in viewing the POPE'S VIDEO in April 2019 and January 2020.



BUT

- Many Bishops did not know about this Organization or were confused with some other Organizations like Holy Childhood, Jesus Youth or Apostolic Union of Clergy.
- Out of 174 Dioceses in India, only 56 have appointed Diocesan Directors. As a result, our plan for the formation of Regional and Diocesan Resource Teams and training of the local people has not been realized.
- Out of 30 Major Seminaries, Seminarians in only 3 Seminaries knew what it was and were making
 use of it. All Minor Seminarians, Many Religious Congregations and sadly speaking Jesuit Novices
 and Scholastics did not about it.

 Majority of the people do not know about the publication of AP Leaflets and SOLDIER OF GOD.

- 5. After the closure of the Dindigul Press, translations in all Regional Languages, barring Hindi, has come to a standstill. Last year itself we had discussed this point but so far we have not been able to take any action as it depends on the Regional Director, Dindigul as well as those who were translating the materials into vernaculars.
- Lack of commitment on the part of some Province /Diocesan Directors too is an issue and those who are interested are overburdened with other responsibilities.
- Though it is a Vatican Appointment with the approval of the CBCI, CBCI has not yet taken any responsibility for this Pontifical Organization.





- Addressing students in all the Formation Houses in Bangalore. There are about 40 of them.
- Holding the Annual Meeting in November at ISI, Bangalore.
- 3. 2 meetings of the National team members.
- Blessing of the new Office in Bangalore and finding a secretary.
- Raising fund to enable to conduct Way of the Heart Seminars.
- 6. Bringing out the new Asian edition of the EYM.
- Getting many bishops to appoint Diocesan Directors.
- 8. Visits to seminaries in Kerala
- Visit to Bangladesh for training the Diocesan Directors and their teams.
- 10. Visit to Nepal to address the CRI there.
- 11. Visit to Pakistan if it is feasible.
- Concerted efforts to get the Soldiers of God, AP Leaflet and Formation Materials printed in Regional languages.

I am very happy to present to you this edition of the E Bulletin 2019-20. Let us work as one family to bring as many people as possible to commit them selves to Daily Offering, pray for the intentions of the Holy Father and spreading of the devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and through our Spirituality form the children and youth in true Christian values which will enable them to face the challenges of the Humanity and fulfill the Mission of the Church.



"I am the eternal life" KRUS VEER RALLY REPORT 2019, ARCHDIOCESE OF PATNA

At the outset let me express my deep sense of gratitude to all of you for your support and cooperation in recently held Patna Archdiocesan Krus Veer rally at Mokama from 25th -27th October. We had 701 children and 72 animators took part in Rally.

On 25th evening, after registration the practice for the inaugural session was conducted by St. Joseph's School, Nawada. With Eucharistic Adoration the rally began conducted by Fr. Stephen Ekka and Team. It was raining as we began the adoration, but God was very kind enough in providing the children very good weather, as most of the time, the children were out in open air for meals, activities, and prayers.

On 26th the day started with the Morning Prayer, Parade, and Flag Hoisting. All took active part in the inaugural session. The children from Maner and Basauni presented a prayer dance, and inspiring dance respectively.

The Archbishop William D'Souza SJ conducted the first input session, and encouraged the children with the example of St. Don Bosco, and called them to be true Eucharistic Crusader in daily life. Fr. A. Sebastian conducted the session on Word of God and Krus Veer.

The day was filled with many activities like dance competition, Quiz, and Action Songs. Most Rev. Sebastian Kallupura offered the Mass for the children. Holy Rosary began at shrine with lighted candle, ended at the parish church.





On 27th Sunday, the day began with Morning Prayer at Martinsek Hall. Fr. Rakesh Roshan in his input session spoke the children in simple way about the Eucharist and the importance in our lives. Archbishop offered the Eucharist for the children. In the evening there was the Eucharistic Procession from the Shrine to the Church. In the evening during the cultural program, the prizes were distributed.

At the end of each day we used to have a small evaluation with the animators. It was a way of getting the feedback from the children. He visited parishes, seminaries, schools, families etc to propagate PWPN and EYM. After the Mass, catechism students are met to distribute the brochures and explain a little more about PWPN and EYM. In the last year he visited 11 parishes,2 seminaries 2 schools of 6 dioceses of Kerala and covered nearly 3000 plus parishioners including the catechism students. He could very well combine this ministry with the vocation promotion as well. He participated in the national Annual seminar of PWPN & EYM held at De Nobili College Pune in the month of October.

Mr Giby Joseph, the National & Zonal Kerala Laity Coordinator represented in India at the 175th Annual celebrations of PWPN and later on the training programme both held at Rome in June and in the month of January. Besides his International representations, he was also active participant and contributed with his sessions in the different national meetings that held at Darjeeling,(National core team) Pune (annual national meeting) and Bangalore (EYM hand book commission). As a preacher of retreats, he conducted 14 youth retreats, 8 leadership programs, retreat for priests and religious of Odisha and mission at Kenya in Africa in which all the programs, he could give time to introduce PWPN & EYM and promote the spirituality.

We printed 1000 the brochures (small booklets of 8 pages) of PWPN & EYM and distributed at different parishes and schools as part of our promotion. We had also promotion of the Intention of POPE and the pope video by means of digital methods such as whatsapp etc.



ANNUAL MEETING OF POPE'S WORLDWIDE PRAYER NETWORK (PWPN) AND EUCHARISITC YOUTH MOVEMENT (EYM)

The Annual meeting of the PWPN/EYM took place at De Nobili College, Pune from 30th Sept. to 3rd Oct. 2019. The first two days' program was a training module for the newcomers and the last 2 days were devoted to the meeting proper.



The First day Program began with a welcome by the National Director of participants who were mainly from 14 Dioceses of India and new Province Coordinators. The Chief Guest was Fr. Bhausaheb Sansare, the Rector of the Papal Seminary who gave the keynote address. At the beginning some participants shared what activities were conducted in their Dioceses or Provinces regarding the PWPN/EYM. The sessions, conducted by 3 Frs. Jagdish, Selvaraj and Gerard were informative

as well as meant to make us also the resource persons in our Dioceses and Provinces. On the third day more Province Coordinators came for the meeting in which the international coordinator for EYM, Miss Giulia, gave us guidelines on how to prepare a handbook for the South Asia. Some urgent issues like printing of AP Leaflets and the SOLDIERS OF GOD as well as other formation materials in vernacular, formation of regional teams and preparingtraining modules were discussed. On the last day we had the privilege of having Fr. George Pattery SJ the Provincial of South Asia who celebrated the Mass and gave the keynote address. Fr. THE HEART OF CHURCH'S MISSION IS PRAYER

Genesis of Jesuit Presence in Sri Lanka

According to Fr. S. G. Perera, a well-known Jesuit Historian in the Church of Sri Lanka, the first arrival of the Jesuits in the country, then known as Ceylon, goes back to the time of St. Francis Xavier. It comm enced, first as a part of the Indian Province, in Mannar in 1561, which lasted until 1608, and subseq uently, in Colombo in 1610. Later on, The Dutch took possession of the land in 1658 and began perse cuting the Catholic Church and all the Catholic priests were Europeans at that time. Hence, they were forced to leave the country. The British defeated the Dutch and conquered Ceylon in 1796 and restored the freedom of the Catholics to practice their religion in 1806.

The second Jesuit era began when in 1893, Pope Leo XIII founded the Papal Seminary in Kandy, Sri Lanka, entrusting its direction and administration to the Society of Jesus and also with the contemporaneous founding of the two dioceses of Trincomalee-Batticaloa and Galle.

The responsibility of administering the two newly founded dioceses was entrusted to the Society of Jesus and the two dioceses were administered by Jesuits of Belgian Province. These two dioceses later exchanged their responsibility with two other provinces of the Society of Jesus, namely, Champaign in France in 1895 and Naples-Italy. Later in 1933, Champaign province handed the responsibility of Trincomalee-Batticaloa Diocese to New-Orleans Province of the USA. The two missions, namely, Naples and New Orleans, were amalgamated into a Vice-Province on 15th August 1962, which eventually, in 1984, became the Jesuit Province of Sri Lanka.

Apostleship of Prayer/Pope's Worldwide Prayer Network- Sri Lanka

The inception of the Apostleship of Prayer in Sri Lanka can be traced back to the 1960s. In desperate search of the pioneer who launched AP, all my hopes were redirected to the archives of Sri Lanka Province. The archives, to my surprise, did not unearth a legendary fire breathing dragon yet a



mortal being in the life of Fr. R. Chiriatti, S.J. who led the AP and promoted the mission. Due to the amalgamation of two missions in 1962, the Apostleship of Prayer got rooted and grounded in the local milieu more than ever, providing a huge scope for evangelization. At present, the work of the apostleship of prayer is mainly done through the publication of the monthly league leaflets in three languages, such as English, Sinhala, and Tamil. The leaflets are published every month regularly and we post it without fail to reach our subscribers a couple of days before the beginning of each month. A leaflet contains:

- The Daily Offering together with the Intentions of the Holy

Father for the month.



- The Liturgical Calendar of the month which includes the daily scripture readings.
- Inspirational quotations, a parable or a short story or methods of prayer that help towards meditation. The confraternity of the Sacred Heart takes a special interest in promoting the Apostleship of Prayer. They regularly pray for the intentions of the Holy Father. The seminarians too take the utmost interest in this apostolate. The sublime venture has been greatly supported by the juniors of the international Juniorate in Sri Lanka. They extend their help in typing and proofreading of the daily scripture readings. Our main mode of action is the publication of the Apostleship Prayer leaflets. We publish them in English, Sinhala, and Tamil.

We distribute around 5000 leaflets every month. The leaflets help the faithful to pray the Morning Prayer (OFFERING) and to pray for the intentions of the Holy Father for the month. It also carries an inspirational story that has been very much appreciated by many subscribers. They say it helps in their reflections and prayer. We also have included in it, the Mass readings of the day which is an asset to those who do not possess a missal. We distribute these leaflets, around 350 addresses and to a small number in Pakistan and other parts of the world where Sri Lankan expatriates dwell.

The Bishops of Sri Lanka immensely encourage this apostolate and the intentions of the Holy Father are published in the ORDO published by the Bishops Conference of Sri Lanka. We also send the intentions to the Catholic Weekly of Sri Lanka together with a short commentary on the intentions. In the future, we hope to publish a booklet with pictures outlining the main features of the Apostleship of Prayer so that we will be able to educate more people in spirituality. Further, we also maintain a web-page and Facebook account for a wide range of reach out. The webpage has attracted many viewers and it has been in the limelight of youth and adults alike. Through this web site, we try to reach out to the faithful who cannot receive the printed format. The prayer intentions are available online and so many do access regularly. Most recently we linked with a Verbum Television station to broadcast the monthly intention of the Holy Father thereby incorporating the Pope video with vernacular subtitles and voice. Secondly, Seth FM radio station has been welcoming us to share the monthly intentionabout half an hour. Moreover, through Click to Pray we have been able to air the problems, issues and challenges humanity faces in Sri Lanka.

Apostleship of Prayer is the Apostle in Prayer. Thereby, making 'the heart of the Church's mission to be, Prayer'. "When Prayer becomes a habit, miracles become a life-style."

POPE FRANCIS CELEBRATES 175 YEARS OF HIS WORLDWIDE PRAYER NETWORK AND 10 YEARS OF ITS RECREATION PROCESS

Ignatius Spirituality is at the service of the Church. It is creative and innovative, helping ordinary

people to follow God and even to be His mission aries. One of such innovations took place in 1844 in a Jesuit Scholasticate in France and was called APOSTLESHIP OF PRAYER. From the beginning the Popes saw immense value in it for the Church and encouraged and supported it. In 2016, Pope Francis renamed it as POPE'S WORLDWIDE PRAYER NETWORK and in 2018, raised it up as the Pontifical Organization with its Offices in the Vatican.

On the Occasion of its 175th Anniversary, there were grand celebrations, first one being in the Pope Paul VI Audience Hall on 28th June, Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus with more than 5000 people from 52 delegations in the presence of the Pope and the Father General of the Jesuits, Arturo Sosa. From South Asia



we were 4: National Director of Sri Lanka, Fr. Sanjeeva Fernando SJ, Fr. Selva Selvamanickam from Madurai, former Nation Director for India, Mr. Giby Joseph from Kerala, EYM in charge for India and myself. The Pope emphasized that the heart of the Church's Mission is Prayer and led the gathering into silence and prayer. He also met personally all the Continental Directors including me from the South Asia and also all the National Directors. It was a much graced time for me to shake hands with him, offer him Nepali Traditional Scarf and a brochure of the Movement in India.

The celebration continued at the Basilica of St. John Lateran-Pope's own Cathedral- with a solemn Mass by Fr. Arturo Sosa and concelebrated by all the Continental Directors. Fr. Frederic Fornos, the International Director gave the homily. Next there was a meeting of all National Directors of PWPN and its Youth Branch, EYM in General Congregation Hall of the Jesuits Curia with Father General joining in at the end. In evening the Italian Branch of the EYM had arranged a cultural program at La Sapienza University under the able leadership of Fr. Andrea Piccau, the National Director of EYM, Italy.

Fr. Frederic Fornos SJ emphasized that beyond the founding of the Apostleship of Prayer in 1844-in his words, "an event in our history"-what was celebrated during these two days was the PRESENT of the Pope's Worldwide Prayer Network, after 175 years and 10 years of the recreation process. "Our Birthday leads us to thank the Lord for His faithfulness, to look at the ways He acts today and to open ourselves even more to His Mission of Compassion for the world.
