is the fruit of crucifixion







I recently saw a video with a moving story: a beautiful woman in an expensive dress came to her psychiatrist saying that she was depressed and that her life was meaningless. The psychiatrist told her, "I am going to ask Mary to narrate her story as to how she found her happiness. All I want you to do is to listen to her." The psychiatrist called the old lady who cleaned the office floors. So, the old lady put her broom aside, sat on a chair and narrated her story.

"My husband died of cancer. Three months later my only son was also killed by a car... I had nobody... I had nothing left... I couldn't sleep, I couldn't eat. I never smiled at anyone. I even thought of taking my own life. Then one evening, a little kitten followed me when I was returning home from work. Somehow, I felt sorry for that kitten. It was cold outside, so I decided to let the kitten in. I got it some milk, and the kitten licked the plate clean. Then it rubbed against my leg, and, for the first time in months, I smiled... Then I stopped to think: if helping a little kitten could make me smile, may be doing something for people could make me happy. So, the next day I baked some biscuits and took them to a neighbour who was sick in bed. Every day I tried to do something nice for someone. It made me so happy to see them happy. Today I don't know of anybody, who sleeps better than I do. I have found happiness by giving it to others..." When the rich lady heard that she cried...

I am sure you have watched this video. The lesson of the story is clear. Your happiness does not depend on what you have, but on what others have because of you. Easter celebrates precisely this. It is in giving that the Lord receives everything. Resurrection is the fruit of crucifixion. In fact, the life and death of the Lord was defined by kenosis. He demonstrated it again in his resurrection. The risen Lord too went on doing good.

One of the attributes of God is Ananda, joy. God is the source and summit of joy. What makes God joyful? God is joyful because God gives till there is nothing left to give. We desire happiness, don't we? Pope Francis is categorical in this. He invited the religious to be joyful. He asked the Jesuits to pray for consolation. To be happy we need to reclaim our identity: image and likeness of God, reflect and represent God in our life. It is a decision to give happiness to others with what we are, with small little things. During this Easter shall we take this decision? Shall we make life around us happy? We should as we are Easter people.


The POSA had a meeting with all the Superiors and Directors of Works of the Conference Common Works and Secretaries with the members of the Apostolic Planning Committee.





Farewell for Fr Stanislaus Fernandes (PUN)



Meetings


